A MESSAGE FROM THE TOP

It was just over 100 days ago that we disappointingly lost in the final of the NL Cup hosted at the VBS Community Stadium.

We are ready to go again in a competition that provided lots of spectacle – and important revenue for a club of our standing – last season. Whilst it might be a little premature to be forecasting another run to the final we are once again taking the competition seriously with a realistic ambition of adding some silverware to the Club's Trophy Cabinet.

Once again we face the prospect of (at least) 4 matches against the best youngsters at Premier League and Championship clubs, and the opportunity somewhere down the line as we watch the top division in the football pyramid, or a national team in a FIFA competition, being able to say "I saw him play at Gander Green Lane".

The draw has provided us with 3 new clubs to face in Fulham, Brighton and Southampton, as well as the return of West Ham. The competition gets under way tonight with the visit by The Cottagers. Its over 12 years since the last meeting between the 2 clubs, a friendly we lost to a single goal. We do have more recent connections with the club though with the loan signing of ex Fulham U21 Ollie Sanderson in Steve's first season as our manager. We also have more distant connections with ex-Sutton player Robert Scott playing nearly 100 games for the first team after leaving us and turning pro, as well as Terry Bullivant our Director of Football enjoying more than 100 matches for them. I wonder if in (many) years to come someone playing in the current Fulham apprenticeship equivalent will have as distinguished a career as Terry has.

Last season in the inaugural competition we welcomed 1,000s of school children (and parents) to their first taste of Sutton United, and we know many have returned for a second (or more) bite. We continue that project this season – and if you are one of them please don't just support our team but grab a selfie or autograph from one of our players and tell your friends. Then both come back!

We hope once more to progress to the final, and go one better, with what already looks like an exciting team, many of whom aren't much older than their opponents.

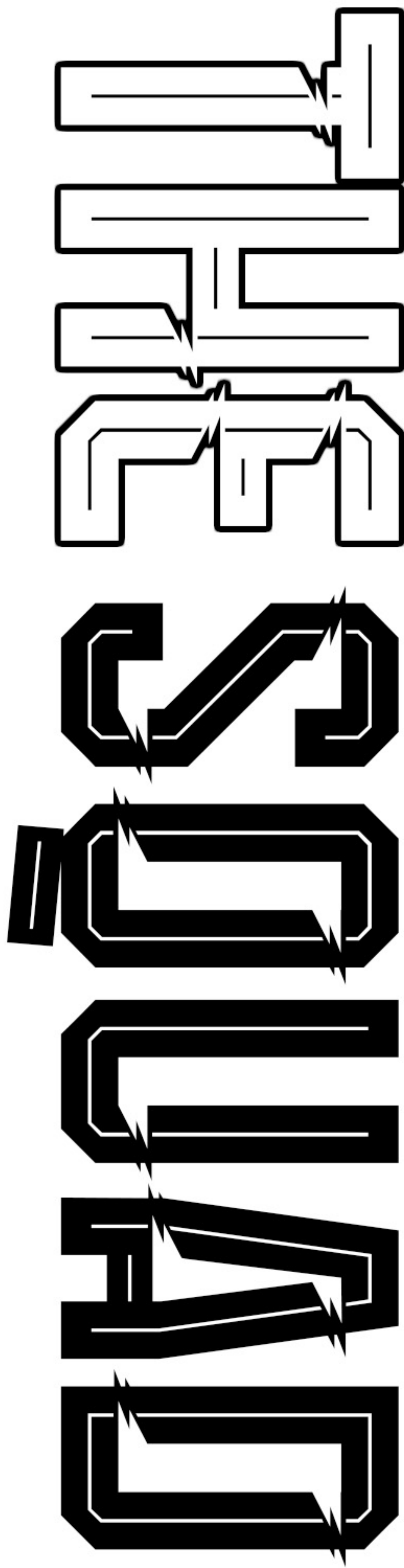




Formerly of Crystal Palace, West Ham United, Portsmouth, Reading, Birmingham City and Notts County as a player, Hayden Mullins hung up his boots in 2015 and took charge of the Fulham Under-21's in 2023.

His coaching career began with a long-term association with Watford, joining initially as Assistant of the Under-21's alongside Harry Kewell, before progressing to the Under-23 team. He also briefly took interim charge of the first team, before departing in 2020.

Spells in charge of Colchester United and the Turks and Caicos National Team followed, before being unveiled as Fulham's Under-21 Head Coach. He most notably led them to the 2024 Premier League Cup title with a 4-0 win over Tottenham Hotspur in the final.

SETH
RIDGEON

Seth Ridgeon joined Fulham at the age of eight and worked his way through all the age groups, making his debut for the Under-18's just six years later, a few weeks before his 15th birthday.

An energetic and exciting box-to-box midfielder, Ridgeon notably travelled with the Whites to the United States to compete in the Dallas Cup, where they reached the Semi-Final, and signed a new deal with the club after a successful 2024/25 campaign.

The 2024/25 season saw him make the step up to Under-21s football aged just 16, as well as making moves on the international stage, captaining England Under-17's at the European Championship.



THE CREATOR TERRELL WORKS

Terrell Works has been at Fulham since Under-9s level.

An attacking player, he is very adaptable and can play in a number of different positions including right-wing, left-wing, centre-forward and number 10.

He enjoys taking people on, creating chances and can finish with both feet.

Since making the step up to U21s football, Terrell has claimed 20 goal contributions in two seasons, including two assists in the Premier League Cup Final win over Tottenham in 2024.



THE FINISHER **AARON** **LOUPALO-BI**

Aaron Loupalo-Bi is a physical striker who has been at Fulham since pre-Academy. He can play with his back to goal, drop in and make runs in behind, which makes him an all-round centre-forward. The team can utilise him as a focal point for their play.

In the 2022/23 season, he proved himself as the most prolific Under-18s striker in the country. His 18 league goals, with 25 in all competitions, saw him claim the Golden Boot.

He was rewarded with his first professional contract that summer and 14 goal contributions in 11 Under-18s appearances followed, before moving on loan to Dagenham & Redbridge last season.

Marco Underwood

Croatian goalkeeper who joined Fulham from Woking and signed his scholarship in January 2024.

He started seven games across all competitions in the second half of the season and he maintained that form in the 2024/25 campaign, featuring for both the U18s and U21s.

Alfie McNally

Alfie McNally joined Fulham from Brentford when they closed their Academy programme.

After going pro in October 2022, signing his contract at the same time as goalkeeping colleague Michael Allen, the 20-year-old has made 14 PL2 appearances over the last two seasons.

Alex Borto

Agile American Alex Borto joined Fulham in 2020 from Cedar Stars Academy. The goalkeeper had no problems settling into a new environment, immediately impressing between the sticks for the Under-18s and U21s sides.

He signed a new long-term deal at Fulham in 2022, just a year after he put pen to paper on his first professional contract.

Dino Kaiser

Dino Kaiser joined Fulham from Queens Park Rangers at the Under-16s stage, so he is still relatively new to the programme.

He made his debut for the U18s in the 2022/23 season against Sheffield United in the Premier League Cup.

Bradley De Jesus

Bradley De Jesus is a powerful, marauding full-back, who initially joined the Academy as an attacking player.

The 19-year-old, who has represented Portugal at youth level, signed his first professional contract at the start of 2024.

Charlie Robinson

Charlie Robinson has been at the Club since all the way back to Under-9s. He possesses great leadership qualities and is great at organising.

At 6'2", he's good in the air and is a solid, old-fashioned defender, yet is comfortable on the ball and likes to look for longer passes.

Harvey Araujo

A versatile defender, Harvey Araujo joined Fulham from Brentford.

He's a left-footed defender, with his athleticism and calmness in possession meaning he is comfortable at both centre-back and left-back.

Eddy Nsasi

Eddy Nasis has been at Craven Cottage since the age of eight and is a strong defender who enjoys the basics of defending, like getting tight to players, winning the ball and intercepting.

Samuel Amissah

Samuel joined us from Brentford when their Academy disbanded. A versatile defender who is comfortable on both feet, Samuel signed his first professional contract in May 2024 after an impressive season where he featured heavily for both the Under-18s and U21s.

Jon Asenga

Jon has been with Fulham since pre-Academy, so he's come through the whole pathway. He's comfortable at both left-back and centre-half and his biggest strength is his range of passing and ability to complement the team from set-plays.

Joe Waters

Joe Walters joined Fulham's Under-18s side at the start of 2025 following a successful trial period.

He earned his chance through the Fulham FC Foundation's Football and Education Programme – and trialled for the U18s when a defensive position needed filling.

Bradley Slade

Bradley Slade has been with Fulham since the Foundation Phase. Predominantly a left-back but also comfortable as a centre-half, he looks to affect all three thirds of the pitch from an attacking sense.

Oliver Gofford

Oliver Gofford joined Fulham at Under-9s level and is coming off the back of a season where he played lots of minutes for the U21s.

Signing his first professional contract at the start of 2024, Oliver scored on his U21s debut while still a second-year scholar.

Jayden Quashie

Jayden Quashie joined Fulham from Junior Elite at the Under-10s stage and has played a lot of football throughout his time here.

He's a box-to-box central-midfielder who's very balanced in terms of being able to affect the game with and without the ball. He has really good detail and quality around the box which helps him to create chances for his teammates.

Chibby Nwoko

Chibby Nwoko joined Fulham at Under-12s level from rivals Chelsea and he's a calm and composed midfielder who has a strong range of passing.

He featured heavily throughout the 2023/24 season for the U18s – scoring a stunning goal against former club Chelsea early into the campaign.

Alfie White

Alfie White joined Fulham at Under-14s level from London Elite Youth. He's a versatile player, capable of playing in a number of different midfield roles, as well as at full-back.

The all-action midfielder, who idolises Jude Bellingham, played 19 times for our U18s last season, while featuring in a number of U21s squads.

Tom Olyott

Tom Olyott joined Fulham from Manchester City in 2022, where he spent most of his years after joining from Liverpool, where he was born and raised.

The promising youngster is a left-footed winger, who likes to play down the right and cut in to help create danger.

Farhaan Ali Wahid

Farhaan Ali Wahid joined Fulham from Chelsea at Under-12s level. He's a really exciting winger who loves a one-v-one situation and taking players on.

That's a huge part of his identity and, coupled with his ability to finish when chopping in or going down the outside, makes him an effective attacker.

Macauley Zepa

Macauley Zepa joined Fulham in February 2024 after a successful trial period at Motspur Park.

He immediately made his mark, impressing for the Under-16s and then ending the season by scoring in four consecutive matches for the U18s.

Tom Wingate

Tom Wingate is another player who joined us from Brentford. An out-and-out striker, he has always scored goals throughout his time in the pathway.

At the 2025 REWE Junior Cup, a five-a-side tournament held in Germany, Wingate won the competition's Golden Boot – an award that has previously been won by Mesut Özil and Jonas Wind. He scored 12 times in eight matches.

DIFFERENT LEAGUE

HISTORIC RAMBLINGS

Tonight's fixture is the first time that U's have opened their home competitive season with a cup match (pre-season shield and one-off matches for a trophy aside) since 4th September 1937 when they defeated Post Office Engineers in an FA Cup Extra-Preliminary Round tie by 6-0. Boosted by the summer captures of former Leyton players Jack Burns and Jack Lock, the hosts crushed their London League opponents. Burns had 15 amateur international caps to his name and both he and Lock scored goals for Leyton in the s-f and replay against Sutton in the Amateur Cup the previous season, the East London club prevailing. This time it was U's that would benefit with Lock (3) and Burns (2) netting, skipper Bill Shepherd scored United's other goal.

Three from the 12th August

Predominantly a date for pre-season friendlies, Sutton have played four competitive matches on this date. Most recently they lost at Holker Street in 2023 in EFL L2 by 2-1 as Barrow took full advantage of Harry Smith's dismissal to overcome Lee Angol's 33rd minute strike. Craig Dundas netted the only goal up at Tranmere in a NL fixture in 2017 and prior to that in 2006, John Scarborough scored late as U's defeated Braintree Town in the Nationwide South by 1-0 at a wet Cressing Road. However, United's first competitive match on this date is below.

The Match

This was a short midweek trip to Sandy Lane in 1969 but not to play rivals Tooting & Mitcham but their lodgers, Corinthian-Casuals. Casuals' decline had already started as their staunch but noble approach to amateurism was exposed by the clubs with money

willing to drop a few shillings in a player's boots, a practice that would end amateurism for most levels of the games by the mid-'70s. Contrasting that with Sutton's combination in that era of the club's history, there should have been little doubt as to the outcome of this Isthmian League match and there wasn't. After 20 minutes Mick Mellows headed in from Peter Drabwell's flick following a Terry Howard

free-kick. The home 'keeper Swain kept out numerous further attempts until just before the break, when his one handed attempt to thwart a Trevor Bladon effort proved inadequate.

In the 49th minute, home centre-back Joy turned the ball into his own net in an attempt to block Drabwell's effort after a Bladon shot had come off the crossbar. In the 75th minute John McBryde netted his first goal for Sutton and in the 89th minute McBryde crossed for Howard to complete a 5-0 win.

Except for the injured Larry Pritchard for McBryde this was the team that would later in the season play Leeds United in the FA Cup fourth round at GGL with 14,000 in attendance.

The Player

Appearing in a PSF at Chesham for U's on this day in 1995, Giles Marchant was a right back although could also be pressed into a wing back role. He signed for Sutton from Walton & Hersham late in the 1993/94 season making his debut against Dulwich Hamlet in the Isthmian League in the April. Previously at Wimbledon, Giles went onto make 95 appearances for Sutton scoring just the once against Harrow Borough in the IL in December 1994. He was in the team that defeated



Carshalton Athletic by 3-1 in the Surrey Senior Cup Final at Woking (April '95) and also in the side that won the 1996 Carlton Cup (Isthmian Full Members) scoring one of the goals in the successful penalty shoot-out after a 2-2

draw. He was also selected for the Isthmian League during the 1994/95 term. His time at Sutton had its downsides through injury and suspension as he picked up a number of yellow cards generally from robust challenges. In the 1996/7 season he appeared in pre-season but was not favoured by new boss John Rains and joined Wokingham Town and later Bracknell Town, where he was in the team that reached the first round of the FA Cup during the 2000/01 term but missed the tie at Lincoln City through suspension.

The Programme

1967 and Sutton's first ever fixture on this date brought a Crystal Palace side to The 'Lane for U's only PSF that season. Palace selected a strong side with five players having Football League experience while Sutton were without Derek Gamblin, Ted Powell and Pritchard who were on tour with England Amateurs. The match ended 1-1 with Bladon levelling a Barry Dyson first half goal. Sutton opted to produce what was then their full programme for this fixture rather than the four page reserve production that was generally used for pre-season matches back then.

The front cover is pictured below and was typical of the club's programmes for the best part of twenty years until the mid-1970s. The inside cover held club notes and included an update on the upgrade of the PA system following complaints about its lack of quality. Fifty-eight years on..... The final Isthmian tables from the 1966/7 season were displayed on page 3, Sutton sitting proudly at the top and second only after losing a play/off to Kingstonian in the reserve section. The team lay out was across the middle pages surrounded by adverts for the likes of Starduster Coaches and obligatory W A Truelove (funeral directors). Early fixtures appeared on the next page and a list of Vice-Presidents (club members) on page 7. The back page held a notice of future home matches plus more adverts. Eight pages for 4d (2p). An insert advertised season tickets for £3 and 15 shillings (£3.75) offering 34 first and reserve



SUFC vs Fulham

While matches between the two clubs have been mainly of the “friendly” variety, there have been two competitive fixtures, both in the first round of the London Challenge Cup, a competition that drew the cream of London professional football alongside the capital’s amateur and semi-pro clubs that had featured well in various competitions.

As London Senior Cup winners in 1958, Sutton’s first appearance in this competition was in October 1958. The match was played at Craven Cottage and U’s gave a good account of themselves before going down 2-1. Mike Johnson and Alan Jones gave the hosts an early two goal advantage but Sutton, missing four regulars, came back with right back Reg Peck firing in from 20 yards and in the last minute Fulham ‘keeper Hewkins pushed a Ron Bloom corner onto the crossbar. Fulham included former Sutton winger Tony Barton in their XI.

U’s appearance in the 1969 London Charity Cup Final allowed them a third entry into the London Challenge Cup having previously made their second appearance the previous season. Late September 1969 and U’s hosted The Cottagers who fielded future Sutton ‘keeper Alan Thomas in goal and Vic Halom, who would win the FA Cup with Sunderland in 1973, up front. In front of a crowd of 2,745 Sutton proved far too strong for the Fulham side winning by 5-0. Larry Pritchard and Trevor Bladon proved superior to anything that The Cottagers had to offer and the latter netted a hat-trick including a penalty with Trevor Waughman and Terry Howard completing the scoring.

Fulham teams of varying strengths have visited GGL nine times for friendly fixtures, the first back in September 1935 (programme centre pages below). That ended 1-1 with a young Fulham side cancelling out Basil Solly's opener. Another 1-1 scoreline was recorded in May '38. Of the other seven, Sutton have won two but lost the last five, most recently by 3-1 to an U18 squad in July 2016.

There have been a number of players to have played for both clubs although many of them would not have appeared in Fulham's first team. Arguably the most familiar to both sets of fans would be forwards Kelly Haag and Aiden Newhouse, wide player Rob Scott and half-back Mike Pentecost.
