It's lovely again to welcome football back to the VBS Community Stadium after around 3 months for many – although, unlike last season, we have already hosted 4 pre-season fixtures, and an NL Cup match by way of an hors d'oeuvres.

Off the pitch it has been a particularly busy time with many improvements. Visually there has been plenty of cleaning and painting, as well as repurposing some of the stadium rooms and facilities. We have also invested again in the fanzone, making the stretch tent permanent, and moving the Club Shop in to provide access now before, during and after games. We also welcome our new caterer, with new outlets and a change in menu. We are confident supporters (who haven't experienced this already) will enjoy our new range, provided by an experienced chef with a background in sport, including time as Lewis Hamilton's personal chef. Please take the opportunity to reward your taste buds today, and once done, book a slot in our new pre-match hospitality offering too.

Once more we are participating in the marathon of seeking promotion to the EFL. The first of 23 home league fixtures kicks off today, Morecambe depending, and whilst a valuable away point was secured against the bookies favourites York City last weekend, for many the season starts today. Unlike last summer when a near complete turnover of players followed from our relegation, this summer we have kept the majority of our squad together, and only recruited around a third of the players that will feature this season. Furthermore, bar one late signing, all business was concluded early, and the settled squad have been together for over a month, and nearly 10 matches. We have said a few goodbyes, and welcome one departure back today as last season's captain joined today's opponents Solihull Moors. The Club has also said welcome back to Craig Dundas, the legend, who now has a role within the Academy despite having a "farewell" testimonial in the summer. The Academy is going through transition itself, a year later than the First Team, resulting from that EFL relegation. We say goodbye to some teams but have also strengthened our pathway to the First Team with the creation of a new U19 team that competes in the NL league system as well as retaining the U18s still representing the Club in the EFL set up.

This time last season – ahead of a stunning victory it would be nice to repeat, even if not by the same magnitude – I expressed not just a potential 5 year period of readjusting and consolidating in the National League before pushing once more to return to the EFL, but spelled out a key driver in making that happen was to embark on attracting new supporters and the fans of the future to join us on that journey. It was very pleasing last year to see the growth in young supporters, particularly utilising the new home end and fanzone at the Collingwood Road end of the ground. Our Family Stand alongside in the "yellow seats" has also proved a slow burn attraction with numbers watching from there growing gradually over the season. Whilst not being helped by the headwinds of better performances and results away from home unusually, our home attendance numbers last season only dropped by around 13%. I have created a workstream that is tasked with growing that once more, with a target of raising our average league attendance to 4,000 within 4 years. Challenging but achievable. Every assistance from our existing supporters, the best advert for being Sutton fans, is to be welcomed. Broadening and deepening the fan base is core to the future of the club.

Those supporters, new and old, are of course welcome to follow all of the Club's teams, and it is great to be able to welcome our Women's team back to the Borough. With the Club extending its use of the David Weir facility their matches will now be held there making it much easier for those wishing to watch their games too. Across all our teams can I thank you for your ongoing support, and in turn on behalf of you all, extend your best wishes for their successes over the coming months.

NEW KIDS ON THE BLOCK

Another season begins and for the second year in a row, there are a lot of new faces at Gander Green Lane with Steve Morison and his staff freshening up the playing squad after a somewhat indifferent 12th place finish last season.

Exits after the final game against Woking included Josh Coley, three goalkeepers including Steve Arnold and academy product Sam Roberts and full back Ryan Jackson, as well as loanees, with notable departures being Finley Barbook and Ashley Nadesan.

These gaps were filled in the form of Aldershot captain Aaron Jones at Right-Back, ex-Norwich academy goalkeeper David Aziaya and a trio of wide players in the form of Jaiden White from Hereford, Kane Crichlow from Chelmsford and David Ogbonna from Slough Town. All pacey, tricky wingers with the ability to beat their man, joining Dillon De Silva on the flanks, should prove to be fan favourites over the coming season at GGL.

Additional exits followed later in the summer, with captain Tyler French switching to today's opponents Solihull Moors, Harry Ransom heading off to Worthing, and perhaps most notably, top scorer Will Davies moving into the EFL with Fleetwood Town for an undisclosed fee.

This left gaps both in defence and leading the line, with the latter being filled by a man who is no stranger to the Amber Army: Ashley Nadesan, joining from Gillingham on a permanent deal after his spell which yielded 16 goal involvements last term.

The defence was further bolstered with the additions of Harry Phipps from recently relegated Dagenham & Redbridge, Will Tizzard from Scottish Championship side Queens Park and Edon Pruti, who was Morison's first signing of the summer and was one which saw him reunite with Ogbonna when he joined from Slough Town.

The departure of Besart Topallaj with the conclusion of his loan from Bromley left a space at left back, which was filled by Liam Vincent, formerly of Tonbridge Angels, where he netted nine goals last term, and was joined by his Angels teammate Mo Dabre who helped to strengthen the depth the U's have in midfield.

Finally, the youth academy once again showed their immense success in producing high quality young defenders, as shown by Jack Taylor, with Junior Eccleston signing his first procontract and Adam Reeves making appearances throughout pre-season, proving that the future is bright for the club's youth prospects.

Pre-season came with no business in or out of the club until the penultimate week of pre-season where Morison made one final addition to the attacking unit with the capture of Brandon Njoku, formerly of Cambridge United, a signing who has already proved popular with fans, especially after scoring on his debut away at York City last weekend - and at a crucial time too.

That provides a whistlestop tour of the business made this summer, not quite last season, but still very busy. It's a very exciting group with a lot of potential and we look to today's game to build on the performance from last week.



1 | Laurie Walker

Veteran goalkeeper who built his career in non-league and the lower tiers. Joined Solihull Moors in 2024, previously featuring for Barnet and Oxford City (loan). Renowned for his leadership and experience, he played a vital role in helping Moors stay up in 2024/25.

13 | Rory Brown

Northern Irish goalkeeper Rory Brown was a scholar at both Wolverhampton Wanderers and Huddersfield Town, before turning out for Institute, Ballinamallard United, Glentoran, Glenavon and Colerain.

He joined Solihull in January 2025.

2 | James Clarke

After starting his career at Burnley, James Clarke moved to Mansfield Town in 2019, before making the switch to Solihull Moors on loan two years later.

He made the move permanent in 2022, and has since appeared over 120 times for the club.

3 | Cameron Green

Afer progressing through the Reading academy, Cameron Green enjoyed before spells at Wrexham, Bromley, Braintree Town and Welling United, before a consistent season at Boston United led to a move to Solihull in the summer.

5 | Alex Whitmore

A product of Burnley's youth system, Alex Whitmore gained experience on loan at Chester, Gateshead, Morecambe and Bury, before departing permanently with spells at Chesterfield and Grimsby.

He subsequently established himself as a solid presence at AFC Fylde before signing for Moors in 2023.

6 | Brad Nicholson

Former Chesterfield defender Brad Nicholson caught the eye with some dominant performances for Guiseley, leading to a transfer to Boston United in 2022 where he was an integral past of the Pilgrims' promotion-winning side in 2024.

After a short spell at Scunthorpe United he returned to Boston in February this year, before joining Solihull in the summer.

16 | Olly Tipton

A former Wolverhampton Wanderers academy captain at U18 and U23 levels, Olly Tipton gained experience on loan experience at Notts County in 2023, before joining Solihull Moors in 2024.

21 | Oscar Rutherford

A right back who emerged from the Plymouth academy, Oscar Rutherford made his name at Eastleigh with over 70 appearances and a Young Player of the Season award.

After exiting Hampshire in 2024 he spent a season at Dagenham & Redbridge, before moving to Solihull in the summer.

23 | Finn Howell

A local lad from Solihull, Finn Howell joined the Moors at the age of 15 and rose through the club's academy, progressing into the first team squad with a string of impressive performances.

He was rewarded with a new two-year deal in the summer.

26 | Tyler French

Tyler French rose through non-league with AFC Sudbury, before progressing into the league with Bradford City and Wrexham, before moving to Sotland with stints at Dundee, and Greenock Morton (loan).

French captained Sutton last season, having arrived from Dundee in the summer of 2024, before departing for Solihull after just a single campaign.

27 | Szhem Whyte-Hall

Szhem Whyte-Hall joined Solihull from Studley in February 2025, after impressing lower down non-league football.

Initially joining on a deal until the end of the season, the forward extended his contract in the summer after a positive start to life at Damson Park.

8 | Sam Bowen

A technical midfielder, Sam Bowen began his career with the Cardiff City academy where he spent 15 years, before departing for Newport County having previously gained experience on loan at Barry Town United.

Bowen spent the 2024/25 season on loan at Wealdstone, before joining Solihull in the summer.

11 | Ben Worman

After developing in the Cambridge United academy, energetic midfielder Ben Worman spent six years with the U's, appearing sporadically alongside loan spells with St. Neots Town, Bishop's Stortford, Chelmsford City and Weymouth.

A brief stint at Cork City preceded a season with Gateshead, before moving to Solihull in the summer.

12 | Darius Lipsiuc

Dublin-born midfielder Darius Lipsiuc spent his youth career at St Mochta's and St Patrick's Athletic, before joinng Stoke City in 2024.

He spent the second half of the 2024/25 season on loan at Walsall before joining Solihull on loan in July.

24 | Fin Holmes

A midfielder who impressed after being recalled from a loan at Bromsgrove, Fin Holmes joined Solihull at the age of 18 ahead of the 2024/25 season.

The attacker had enjoyed an exhilarating season in the non-league pyramid with both Studley and Stourbridge's U18s, going on to make his debut for the Glassboys in their final league game of the season.

25 | Kian Ryley

An academy product who debuted in 2022, Kian Ryley spent time out on loan at Hereford, Mickleover, Stourbridge, Brackley Town and Rushall Olympic, gaining a host of experience over the last two years.

28 | Billy Corns

Young box-to-box midfielder Billy Corns signed his first pro deal after spending three years as a scholar with the club, being rewarded for his good performances in the academy.

29 | Bradley Stevenson

A Gillingham academy product, Bradley Stevenson spent time on loan at Hastings United, Cray Wanderers, Tonbridge Angels, Margate and again at Hastings, before joning Herne Bay.

This was followed by stints at Chelmsford City, Welling United and Billericay Town, before moving to Solihull in 2024.

7 | Callum McFarlane

A product of Fulham youth system, Callum McFarlane joined the Whites in 2022 and made a couple of appearances on the bench for the Premier League side.

He later spent time at Wealdstone on loan under Moors' Boss Matt Taylor, who reunited with the forward when he brought him to Damson Park in the summer.





HISTORIC RAMBLINGS

Three from the 16th August

This afternoon's match is Sutton's eleventh competitive fixture on this day, the first a home defeat to Wycombe Wanderers by 2-1 in the Isthmian League back in 1969. The most recent also ended in a narrow reverse, 0-1 at Crewe Alexandra in the EFL L2 in 2022. Sutton have also contested three Tom Fuller Trophy matches, an annual match against borough neighbours Carshalton Athletic that started in the mid-'70s. Sutton won one and lost two of those matches. Three friendly fixtures have also been played, U's winning two and drawing one. That draw, against Dagenham, saw United's Richard Evans and then later Daggers Tony Pamphlett sent off (I was running one of the lines at the time after the scheduled assistant failed to materialise).



A comparatively short hop back in time for me and 2011 and a midweek trip to Tonbridge Angels. Sutton's return to the Conference South level of football had been given a real examination on the opening day with Woking winning at GGL, 5-0. However, Paul Doswell brought in Harry Beautyman for his debut and his 8th minute goal (pictured) set Sutton onto a fine "bounce-back" victory. Fola Orilonishe rounded home 'keeper Worgan to net a


second four minutes later and while U's remained reasonably comfortable, they had to wait until the 75th minute to confirm their superiority. Orilonishe was again on target after Beautyman's effort had been parried by Worgan. Frannie Collin gave Angels an 84th minute consolation but three minutes later Anthony Riviere received from Leroy Griffiths to fire the ball home from 20 yards.

The Player

Keeping a clean sheet on this day (one of 42 in competitive Sutton matches) back in 2016 was goalkeeper Ross Worner. The match was against Torquay United in the club's first season back at National League level since the year 2000. He had made his Sutton debut on the opening day of the previous season against Maidstone United ending it with a NLS champions medal and the Supporters' Club Player of the Year award (see photo). Ross had been at AFC Wimbledon prior to Sutton and had also appeared for Woking and Aldershot Town. He was, of course, ever-present in Sutton's 2016/17 FA Cup run to the fifth round but five days after that tie at home to Arsenal, he injured his ACL at Torquay and was thus out of the game for



a lengthy period. He did return to playing at the commencement of the 2017/18 pre-season campaign but the extent of his injury became more apparent and his next appearance for U's wasn't until September 2018 in the Irn-Bru Cup at Airdrieonians. That season included a loan spell at Chelmsford City but he did finish it as U's 'keeper playing what proved to be his last match for Sutton at Dover Athletic in April 2019; a 3-0 defeat. Ross joined Paul Doswell at Havant & Waterlooville for the 2019/20 season staying five seasons before again joining Dos last season this time at Sholing. In all Ross made 130 appearances (but for that injury it would have been nearer 200) for Sutton enjoying those deserved successes mentioned above as he was a very good 'keeper.

SUFC v Solihull Moors


Moors' 1-0 reverse here in November of last season stretched their winless run at GGL to a fifth match as Jack Wadham's first goal for the club separated the two sides. Prior to that Solihull won on their first here in August 2016 as the battle of the promoted clubs went the way of the visitors by 3-1. A Tom Bolarinwa goal saw U's to a narrow victory here in March 2018 before the sides shared the points the next two seasons. Sutton's best win against Solihull came in December 2020 on one of those rare occasions that spectators were permitted to attend during that Covid hit season. That was by 4-1 with Aaron Simpson netting his only goal in Sutton colours and what a strike it was.

Of course, we welcome back our skipper from last season, Tyler French, and wish him well for the rest of the season, if not for today.

The Programme

On this day in 2003, Sutton and Hayes fought out a goal less draw in the Isthmian League Premier Division at Church Road. Hayes had upped their game with regards to the programme in recent years and this forty page effort for £2 was very good value. All glossy with a mix of colour and black and white printing there was sixteen pages of adverts but they shouldn't detract from otherwise good content. This being the opening day of the season, the four page layout of statistics provided for a comprehensive view of the previous season while the four pages on Sutton were equally good with various additions to the obligatory pen pictures including a look at U's record in the last decade. Of those pen pics, Mark Watson was given "Star Man" status. The most interesting article was arguably the list of pre-season transfer activity in the ILPD although Sutton being described as having no signings was inaccurate as the inclusion of Rob Collins in the squad attested. The middle pages began an A-Z series on former Hayes players while the back page displayed the players and officials for the match.





Here's to another fantastic season both on and off the pitch.


