A MESSAGE FROM THE TOP

Whilst we all await the first 3 point maximum of the season the tough run of games continues as we host yet another ex-EFL side at the VBS Community Stadium.

The National League computer was certainly working overtime when compiling our tricky start to the season.

This will be the first meeting between the clubs outside of the Football League, but within it Sutton have created some great memories, home and away, against the Cumbrians. Indeed over 4 matches Carlisle are yet to win with the U's having 2 wins and 2 draws. Sutton may have felt a little unlucky not to win here on their most recent visit, with a late equaliser in front of over 1,300 travelling fans rubber-stamping Carlisle's place in the play-offs in the usual end-of-season roller coaster ride for so many clubs.

It was the first meeting though that shines brightest in the memories with a scarcely believable 4-0 demolition that perhaps confirmed our belonging in the EFL after a late and shaky start in our first season which saw us in about the same league position at the end of August as we find ourselves today. A season that saw us finish in 8th place and cruelly denied the play offs given the total points collected over 46 league games. Few predicted that - or were particularly negative about the Club generally - on 30th August 2021!

We welcome back one of the architects of that win, and the scorer of our last goal that day, in David Ajiboye. It won't be the first time he has featured in the opposition though. Perhaps less well known, but we also welcome back another ex-U in Terell Thomas who was at the heart of our defence in the 2017-18 season. Now at Carlisle but I'm sure he remembers that spell well and the resulting 3rd place finish in the National League. I can remember speaking to him on the pitch after his last match and willing him to stay. Sutton of course had just lost in the play offs, but "T" was off to league football the next season, where he stayed until earlier this year. In circular fashion our opponents that day, having finished 4th that day, were Boreham Wood. Our next opponents here. Few would have predicted the respective paths of both clubs correctly over the next 7 years that afternoon at the final whistle.

It's not just Sutton that will be facing an opponent familiar to them though as Jayden Harris will no doubt relish putting one up on his previous employer. There will also be familiar faces despite this being near the beginning of Carlisle's tenure in the National League with Regan Kinney and Luke Armstrong no doubt relishing as much the opportunity to add to their goal tallies against us as our defence are in wishing to thwart them. It will be hello once more to manager Mark Hughes returning to the away dugout.

Relatively few of today's supporters would have been at Rochdale earlier this week, but if the performance and effort today matches that at the Crown Oil Arena, and over the remainder of the season, our fan base will be happy with what they see. Let's all get behind our young group of players as they establish themselves at what for many is the highest level of Football they have performed at. From the pre-match warm up, to the walk out (accompanied by the music chosen by you), to the final whistle, let's be that 12th man and help turn our home into that "fortress" once more that visitors won't relish coming to.

Come on you U's.

He scouted for England under Glenn Hoddle's management as well as being Academy Director and assistant manager at Crystal Palace. Most recently he was chief scout at Millwall before leaving in 2021, when he joined Sutton as Director of Football. This is set to be a great evening.

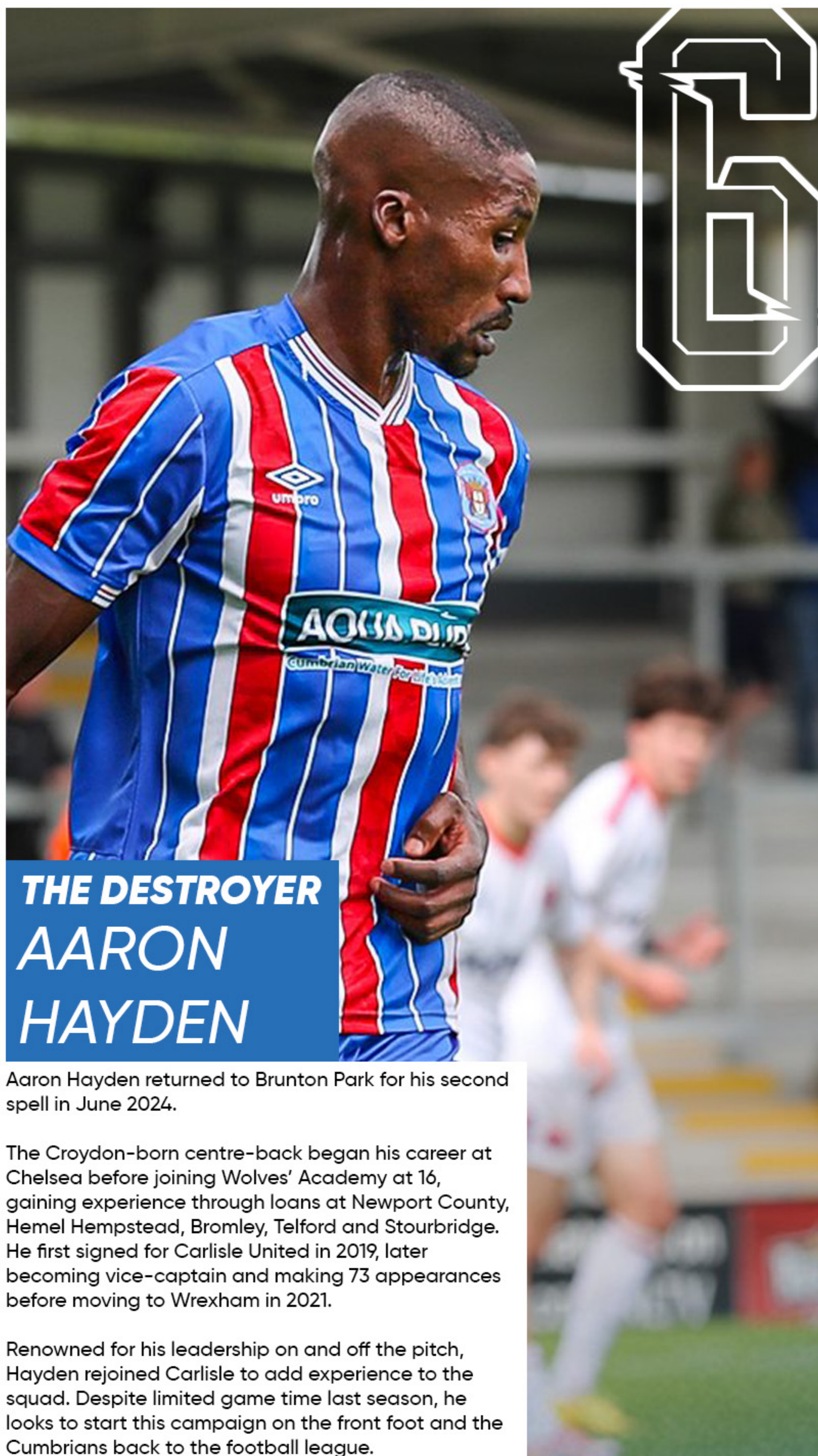
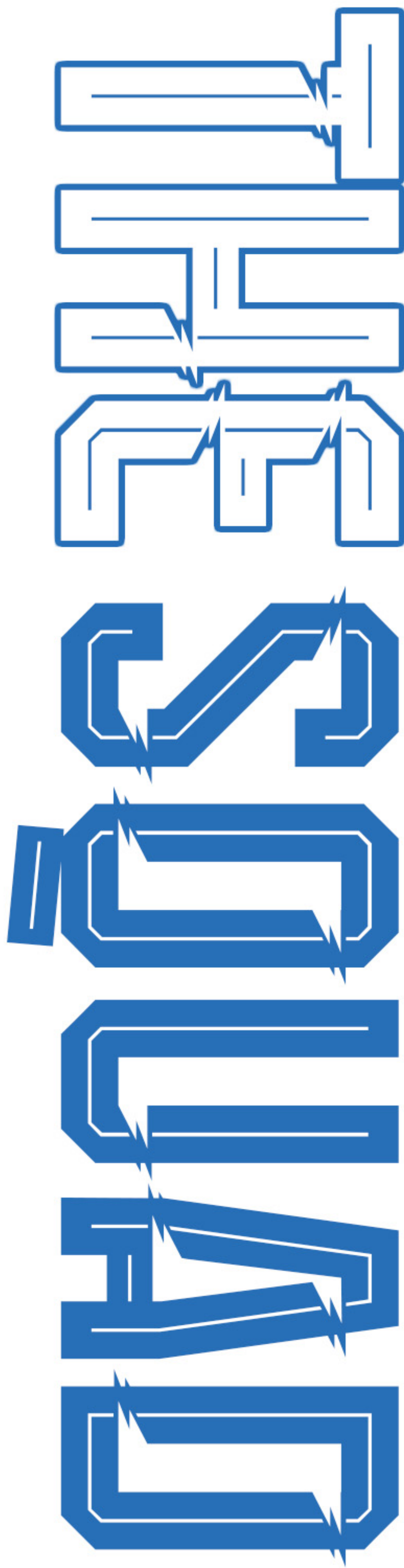

Mark Hughes was a powerful striker who enjoyed an illustrious playing career with two spells at Manchester United, as well as stints at Barcelona, Bayern Munich, Chelsea, Southampton, Everton and Blackburn Rovers. He earned 72 caps for Wales, scoring 16 goals, and became one of the country's most celebrated players.

Moving into management, he led the Welsh national team from 1999 to 2004 before managing Blackburn Rovers, Manchester City, Fulham, QPR, Stoke City and Southampton.

After a spell at Bradford City beginning in 2022, he was appointed Carlisle United manager in 2025, failing to keep them up but staying with them for the new campaign.



THE DESTROYER **AARON** **HAYDEN**

Aaron Hayden returned to Brunton Park for his second spell in June 2024.

The Croydon-born centre-back began his career at Chelsea before joining Wolves' Academy at 16, gaining experience through loans at Newport County, Hemel Hempstead, Bromley, Telford and Stourbridge. He first signed for Carlisle United in 2019, later becoming vice-captain and making 73 appearances before moving to Wrexham in 2021.

Renowned for his leadership on and off the pitch, Hayden rejoined Carlisle to add experience to the squad. Despite limited game time last season, he looks to start this campaign on the front foot and the Cumbrians back to the football league.



LEADING THE LINE **LUKE** **ARMSTRONG**

Luke Armstrong joined Carlisle United from Harrogate Town in 2024 for an undisclosed fee, signing a contract through to 2027.

A striker born in Durham, he began his career at Middlesbrough before spells with Birmingham City and Cowdenbeath, later linking up with his father Alun at Blyth Spartans. His prolific form earned a return to Middlesbrough, followed by loans at Gateshead and Accrington Stanley. After a move to Salford City, he starred on loan at Hartlepool, scoring 15 goals and netting in their 2021 play-off final win. He then hit 31 goals in over 100 games for Harrogate Town before moving to Brunton Park, where he struggled for form, going on loan to Motherwell last term.



THE FINISHER **REGAN** **LINNEY**

Regan Linney joined Carlisle United this summer, bringing pace and attacking flair to Brunton Park.

A forward who came through the ranks at FC United of Manchester, he established himself as a consistent goalscorer at Broadhurst Park before earning a move to Altrincham in the National League where he scored 43 goals in 92 appearances, finishing runner up in the Golden Boot race last term.

Comfortable across the front line, he combines sharp movement with a strong work ethic, and his arrival added depth, creativity, and attacking options to Carlisle's forward unit.

1 | Gabriel Breeze

Goalkeeper

Gabriel Breeze, a local talent, rose through Carlisle United's Academy to make his senior debut in 2023/24. By 2024/25, he became first-choice goalkeeper, earning Man of the Match in the Barrow derby, saving a last-minute penalty, and receiving the club's PFA Community Champion award for leadership on and off the pitch.

25 | Harry Lewis

Goalkeeper

Harry Lewis joined Carlisle United from Bradford City in January 2024, signing until 2026. A Shrewsbury Town Academy graduate, he moved to Southampton in 2015, debuting in 2017 and gaining experience on loan at Dundee United. After Bradford, he brings valuable experience and goalkeeping depth to Brunton Park.

28 | Thomas Randall

Goalkeeper

Thomas Randall has progressed through Carlisle United's Academy, impressing with sharp reflexes, composure, and command in goal. Regularly training with the first team and featuring in youth and reserve matches, he has earned praise for his work ethic and continues gaining valuable experience while contributing to the squad's preparations.

30 | Jude Smith

Goalkeeper

Jude Smith joined Carlisle United in June 2024 to progress his development. A Celtic youth product, he played for East Fife before moving to Newcastle United in 2022, gaining experience in Premier League 2 and the EFL Trophy. He has also represented Scotland at under-21 level.

2 | Archie Davies

Defender

Archie Davies joined Carlisle United in July 2024 from Dundalk. A Brighton & Hove Albion academy graduate, he gained experience at Crawley Town and Aldershot Town before excelling in Ireland, making the 2023 League of Ireland Team of the Year. At Carlisle, he quickly became a key defensive figure last season.

3 | Cameron Harper

Defender

Cameron Harper joined Carlisle United in June 2024 from Inverness Caledonian Thistle. A lifelong Inverness player, he progressed through their Academy and made over 150 appearances, including the Scottish Cup final. At Carlisle, his technical ability and composure have impressed, and has started well this season.

4 | Terell Thomas

Defender

Terell Thomas joined Carlisle United from Charlton Athletic in July 2024. An Arsenal academy graduate, he gained experience at Wigan, AFC Wimbledon, Crewe and Reading. At Carlisle, his leadership and defensive presence have strengthened the backline, while he also mentors younger players. Internationally, he captains St. Lucia.

5 | Morgan Feeney

Defender

Morgan Feeney rejoined Carlisle United in June 2025. A product of Everton's academy, Morgan made his senior debut with the Toffees during the 2018/19 season. He gained further experience on loan at Sunderland in League One before moving to Forest Green Rovers, where he continued to develop his defensive skills. Having previously played for Carlisle, he returned to Brunton Park determined to build on his experience.

15 | Sam Murray

Defender

Sam Murray joined Carlisle United in June 2025 following his release from Manchester United. A product of the Red Devils' Academy, Sam is known for his pace and strong defensive abilities. His speed allows him to support both defensively and in attack down the left flank, making him a valuable asset in wide areas.

18 | Jack Ellis

Defender

Jack Ellis, a Kendal-born defender, signed his first professional contract with Carlisle United in January 2022. Former under-18 captain, he quickly progressed to first-team training, making his league debuts that season. After establishing himself in the squad, he signed a new two-year deal in summer 2023.

22 | Josh Williams

Defender

Josh Williams joined Carlisle United from Birmingham City in January 2025. A product of Birmingham's academy, he debuted in 2021/22 and had loan spells at Cheltenham Town and Gateshead, where he made ten appearances. At Carlisle, he quickly established himself, starting 10 league matches with consistent, impressive performances.

26 | Bevis Mugabi

Defender

Bevis Mugabi joined Carlisle United in July 2025 on a two-year deal. A product of Fulham and Southampton academies, he debuted professionally with Yeovil Town in 2016, making 85 appearances. He then spent five years at Motherwell, amassing 125 appearances, before a stint at Anorthosis Famagusta. Internationally, he has earned 20 caps for Uganda.

31 | Hayden Atkinson

Defender

Hayden Atkinson, 17, signed his first professional contract with Carlisle United in 2025, keeping him at Brunton Park until 2027. A West Cumbria native, he has progressed through the Academy since under-10 level, impressing with his defensive performances in pre-season, currently viewed as a promising future first-team player.

7 | David Aijboye

Midfielder

David Aijboye joined Carlisle United during the summer from Peterborough, having previously played for Sutton and Worthing. A forward known for his pace, versatility, and finishing ability, he has impressed at both non-league and professional levels, providing creativity, movement, and goal threat to strengthen Carlisle United's attacking options.

8 | Callum Whelan

Midfielder

Callum Whelan joined Carlisle United in January 2025. A Manchester United Academy graduate, he had brief spells at Watford and Oldham Athletic, making 89 appearances. He later played for Solihull Moors and Gateshead, where he made 63 appearances and scored 13 goals, bringing experience and attacking threat to Carlisle's midfield.

11 | Junior Luamba

Midfielder

Junior Luamba also made the switch this summer, having previously played for Oldham Athletic and Salford City. A forward known for his pace and direct attacking style, he was on loan at York last season making 17 appearances, scoring 1 goal.

14 | Elliot Embleton

Midfielder

Elliot Embleton joined Carlisle United from Blackpool in January 2025. A Sunderland academy graduate, he made 92 appearances and scored 11 goals, including the opener in their play-off final win over Wycombe. He also had loans at Grimsby, Blackpool, and Derby, and has represented England from U17 to U20 level.

16 | Stephen Wearne

Midfielder

Stephen Wearne joined Carlisle United from MK Dons in January 2025. A Middlesbrough and Sunderland academy graduate, he had loan spells at Grimsby and Torquay, and later played for Gateshead and MK Dons under former Carlisle head coach Mike Williamson. Last season, he made 18 appearances, scoring 2 goals, adding experience and attacking threat to Carlisle's squad.

17 | Ethan Robson

Midfielder

Ethan Robson joined Carlisle United in June 2024 from Stadium MK. A Sunderland academy graduate, he had loan spells at Dundee and Grimsby before moving to Blackpool and then MK Dons, making 60 appearances. Last season, he made 10 appearances with a brief loan spell at the Heed where he made 3 appearances and scored 1 goal.

19 | Sam Hetherington

Midfielder

Sam Hetherington signed a pro contract with the Cumbrians at the end of last season, after spending a significant portion of last season on loan at Darlington and Workington, making 19 appearances in the Vanarama National League North for the former.

21 | Jordan Jones

Midfielder

Jordan Jones joined Carlisle United in summer 2024 from Wigan Athletic. A Middlesbrough academy graduate, he had loan spells at Hartlepool and Cambridge before playing 146 times for Kilmarnock. He also featured for Rangers, Sunderland, St Mirren, and Wigan, playing over half of the Blues league games last term.

24 | Josh Grant

Midfielder

Josh Grant joined Carlisle United in July 2025 on a one-year deal. A Chelsea academy graduate, he gained senior experience on loan at Yeovil Town and Plymouth Argyle. Grant later played four seasons with Bristol Rovers, making 84 appearances and scoring five goals, before a brief spell at Wealdstone.

27 | Jake Allan

Midfielder

Jake Allan signed his first pro contract in the summer, after making two appearances in the Vertu Trophy last campaign. After spending time on loan at Workington, the born and bred Carlisle fan will want to make an impact on the squad who hope to be at the sharp end of the Enterprise National League this season.

34 | Dan Hopper

Midfielder

Dan Hopper is an a versatile attacking midfielder who progressed through Carlisle's Academy, and signed a scholarship at under-16 level. He made his first team debut last season in an EFL Trophy match against Wigan Athletic, but otherwise spent time out on loan at Penrith and Darlington last season.

37 | Harvey MacAdam

Midfielder

Harvey MacAdam joined Carlisle United in August 2025 on a one-year deal, with an option for a further year. A Burnley-born midfielder, he progressed through Fulledge Colts, Burnley, Blackburn Rovers, and AFC Fylde academies, later playing for Nelson, Ashton United, Longridge Town, Fleetwood Town, and Morecambe, including a loan spell at Waterford. He made his debut for the Blues, on the opening day of the season against Woking.

9 | Georgie Kelly

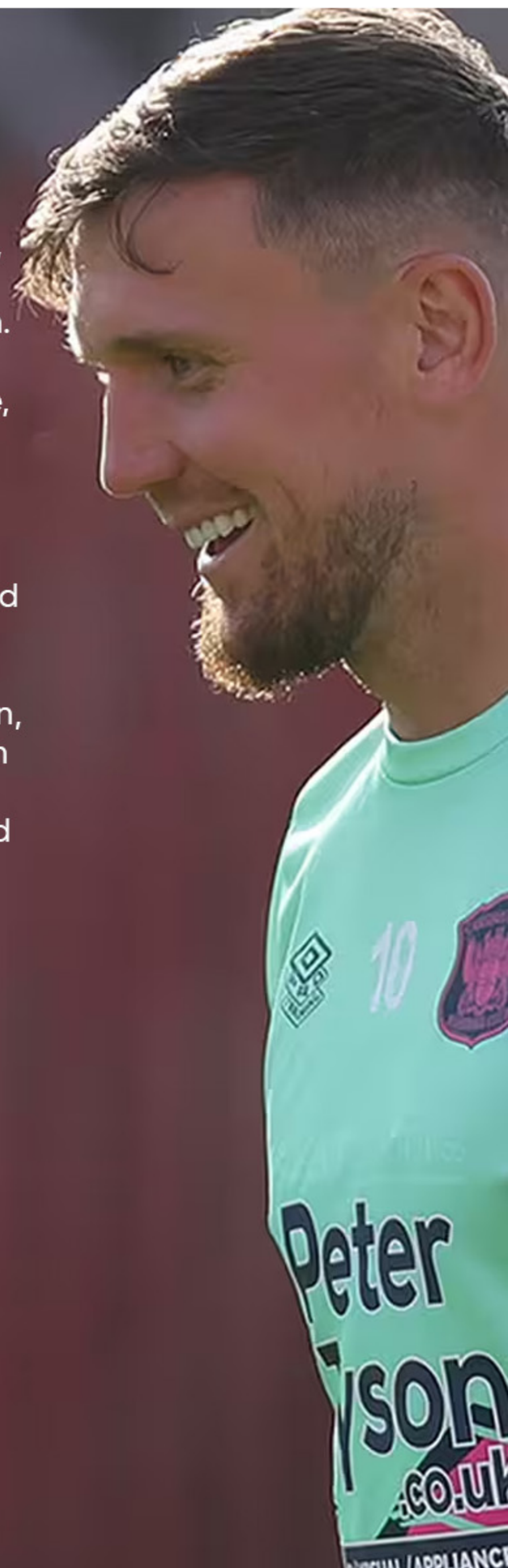
Forward

Georgie Kelly joined Carlisle United in January 2024 on a three-and-a-half-year deal. A product of Derry City, UCD, Dundalk, St. Patrick's, and Bohemians, he later played for Rotherham United. Last season, he scored 5 goals in 18 appearances as Carlisle were relegated, after failing to score in his first half-season at the club.

23 | Charlie Wyke

Forward

Charlie Wyke returned to Carlisle United in July 2024 for his second spell, becoming team captain this season. A Middlesbrough academy graduate, he had loans at Kettering, Hartlepool, and Wimbledon. Previously, he scored 39 goals in 89 appearances for Carlisle. Last season, he scored 2 goals in 14 games following spells at Wigan and Rotherham and Bradford.



HISTORIC RAMBLINGS

Three from the 30th August

This afternoon is U's twentieth competitive match on this day, the first being at home to Windsor & Eton in the Athenian League in 1924. U's won by 4-0 and the hat-trick hero of that afternoon is featured below. Nine of these matches have been at GGL so today evens the numbers up and the Sutton players will be hoping to protect an unbeaten record. The only cup tie was in the Hitachi (Isthmian League) Cup, U's thrashing Southall by 8-0 in 1983. Of the previous nine, seven have been won and two drawn. Of the ten away matches, United lost the first five but have not lost since hence U's are unbeaten on 30th August since losing at Wycombe Wanderers in the Isthmian by 2-1 in 1975.

U's have played one friendly on this day, back in 1919, against Page Green at GGL (which commenced the club's full-time tenure of what was then known as The Adult Ground), Sutton winning by 4-1.

The Match

Twenty-one years ago, Sutton travelled over the Severn Crossing to take on Newport County for a Bank Holiday Nationwide South fixture. Sutton's start to the season had been a concern with no wins in the first five matches and just two points secured. The hosts had won both their home matches recording a 6-1 aggregate in the process. A tough prospect but Sutton started well and in the 8th minute Andrew Martin steered the ball in from Craig Watkins' flick.

Ten minutes later County levelled when former Welsh international Jason Bowen set up Jonathan Coates, and four minutes later prospects worsened when Jamie Moralee fired into the roof of the net. However, by the interval Sutton had turned the match around. Peter Fear curled in direct from a free-kick in the 39th minute and right on half-time Lewis Gonsalves netted with a diving header after another Fear dead ball delivery had come back off a post.

Two minutes after the break Sutton went further ahead when Watkins headed home from a Martin cross. U's had to endure pressure for much of the second half but held their hosts to register a more than welcome first win of the season. Newport included future Welsh captain Ashley Williams in their squad; he joined the fray in the 47th minute.

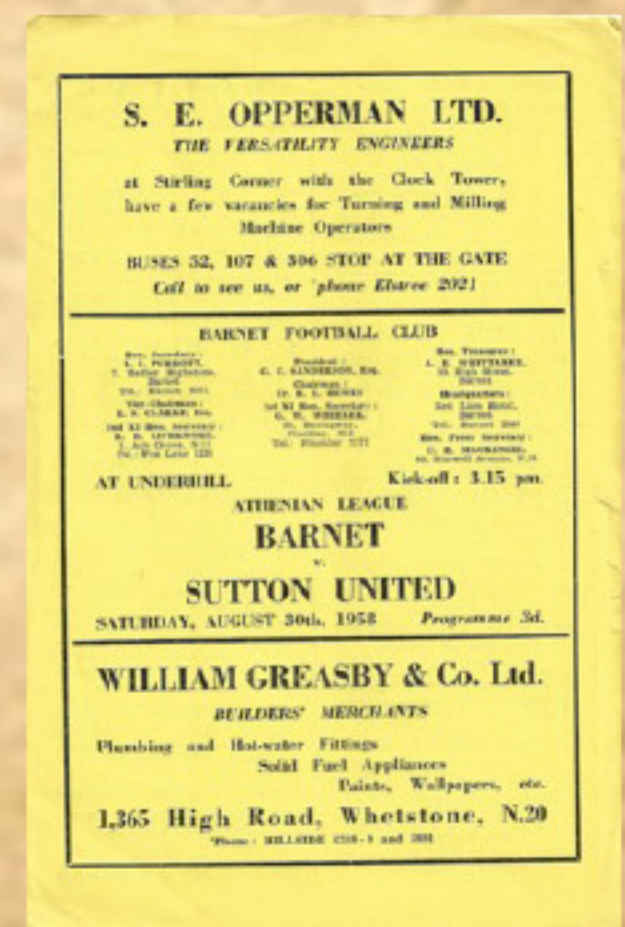


The Player

Scoring the club's only hat-trick on this day was Fred Newby. Fred originated from Norfolk and his first taste of adult football came with Great Yarmouth reserves, winning the North Norfolk Junior Cup. He moved onto Gorleston and in 1912 represented the Norfolk FA. WWI halted, as it did everybody else, his football career and he saw service in France and latterly Afghanistan. Demobbed, he returned to Gorleston before heading for London in 1920 and appeared for Catford, Southend and then Cray Wanderers. The above was all as a winger, left or right but on joining Sutton (debut v Windsor & Eton in December 1923) he converted to an inside forward role. It was as a number ten he netted the treble on this day in 1924. Fred played for Sutton that season although missed a fair chunk of it through injury. He left Sutton at the end of the 1924/25 term thus missing out on the trials of the next campaign (arguably U's worst as a senior club). While in Norfolk he won some silverware and at Sutton a runners-up medal in the Surrey Charity Shield of 1924. He made 35 appearances scoring 15 goals.

The Programme

An opponent's programme for today and back to 1958 and a trip to Barnet. The Bees' programme hardly changed format from the late 1940s to the early '70s. Like Sutton's prog for much of that same era, it was an eight page production, the cover shown below. The inside page held adverts for the likes of Tollys hardware store and the exotic sounding Zodiac Coffee Lounge. Extensive club notes followed on page three but included another advert at the bottom. This was for Vactric Ltd, a precision tool manufacturer and my mother worked for them in Garth Road throughout much of the '60s. This advert was for the Cricklewood base. The centre pages held the teams in 2-3-5 format surrounded by more adverts. A fixture and result list was topped and tailed by adverts on page six while the inside back cover continued the note section and a Supporters' Association column. No league table as only one match had been played. Sutton commenced the season as Athenian Champions but lost this match by 4-3.



SUFC vs Carlisle United

Carlisle make their third visit to GGL this afternoon. In September 2021, U's felt they had really arrived in the EFL as they won by 4-0. Alistair Smith scored twice while David Ajiboye and Donavan Wilson also netted. In May 2023, U's end their faltering second L2 season with a 1-1 (Kylian Kouassi) draw in front of a healthy 4,771 audience. U's record at Brunton Park is a 2-0 win on their first visit and a 1-1 draw.

David Ajiboye scored in both matches in that first EFL season (2021/22) and we welcome him back this afternoon hoping he doesn't add to that scoring record in this fixture. Also likely to be in the Cumbrians' squad is defender Terell Thomas, who made 22 league and cup appearances for us, scoring once, while on loan from Wigan Athletic in the second half of the 2017-18 season. Of the Sutton squad today Jayden Harris and Ashley Nadesan have both spent time at Brunton Park, the latter on loan while at Fleetwood. Other players to have worn the colours of both clubs include Dean Bouzanis, Omari Patrick, Rob Scott and Tobi Sho-Silva.
