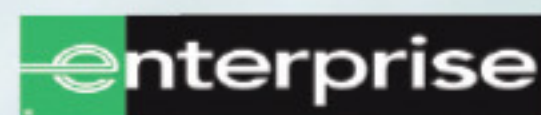

A MESSAGE FROM THE TOP



## **Another quick turnaround as the two-game-a-week season continues into September. Steve's won't be the only smiling face though as that first, and seemingly elusive, win of the season is now in the bag.**

Those that have seen every game of the season will have been confident it was coming – but maybe not against a team as strong as Carlisle. Whilst it is true and particularly said about this division in particular, that anybody can beat anybody, most will see our performances so far as justifying at least the point per game mark. With the opposition as strong as it has been to date it is comforting to be now not far off that mark. To be mid table, let alone a play-off side, that average needs to rise of course. Steve, and others, commented we were “average” last season, and a mark of progress will be to finish with more games won, than drawn or lost.

On that note we welcome Boreham Wood to the VBS Community Stadium, on what on paper at the start of the season, would have looked to have been one of the easier earlier fixtures. With no disrespect to them, having been recently promoted (following an unlucky relegation given the number of National League points they won over the course of that season), the test would be seen as less than the other strong contenders finishing in the play-offs of our own division last season.

That said our opponents today will likely be content with how 2025-26 has started as they find themselves in 11th place in the table with two wins and two draws from their opening five fixtures and three points above us. Indeed, with a game in hand over most of their rivals at the start of the week, and with some clubs having played last night that 11th place doesn't flatter them. With three points on offer to the victors though the U's will be looking to swap places with our rivals come tonight's final whistle. That not only requires a win but a three goal winning margin – so if achieved it will be a spectacular 90 minutes for supporters to witness!

We welcome once again Luke Garrard to the away dugout, who had a short spell away from managerial duties at the Wood in the summer of 2024. Since his return he has guided them back to the National league itself, but whilst away from the hotseat was a visitor on occasion to Sutton United, as he had been previously as a media presenter in our title winning season of 2020-21. Another familiar face, and one whose career never really kicked on under Steve last season, is Matt Rush. Although our first outing in last season's FA Cup saw him not just score, but have a perfectly fine goal disallowed – the referee concerned being one to show Steve a yellow card already this season. Pure coincidence, I'm sure!

It's the first league match of the season at home under the floodlights, and the turning of the month into September appears to have brought with it a change in the weather. With children returning to school we are entering Autumn, but I won't be alone in wishing for an Indian Summer full of points through the busy month with four more home league games after this one.

By the start of October half-term we will have a better idea of where our team will be judged over the course of the season than now. three points today will be a good start and reasserting that home fortress at Gander Green Lane once more.

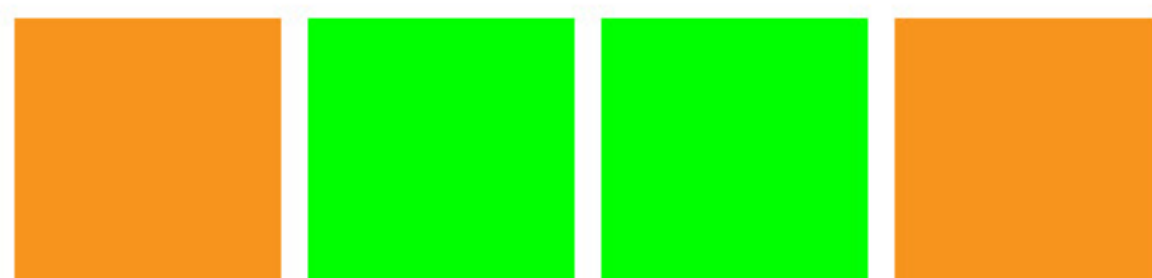

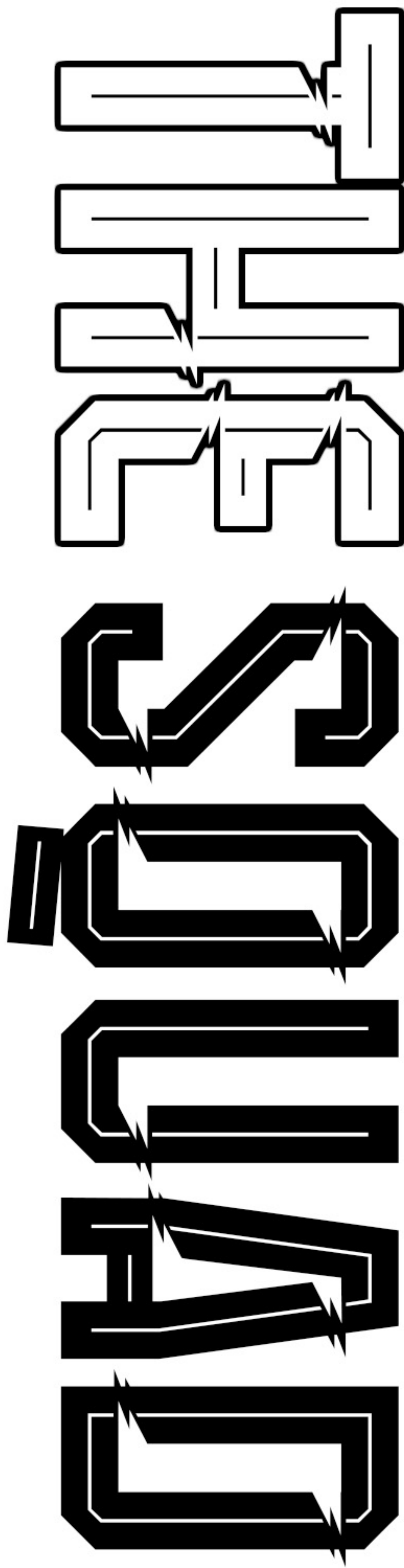
Luke Garrard returned to Meadow Park in September 2024, five months after his departure, having already served nine seasons as manager and 18 years with the Club in various capacities.

His first spell in charge, from October 2015 to April 2024, brought unprecedented success, including three National League play-off campaigns and a first appearance at Wembley.

Garrard also oversaw historic FA Cup achievements, most notably guiding the Wood to the fifth round in 2022 after a famous victory over AFC Bournemouth, before facing Everton at Goodison Park.

His return marked the continuation of a long and distinguished association with Boreham Wood, which most recently saw him win promotion last term.





## ***THE STOPPER*** ***NATHAN*** ***ASHMORE***

Nathan Ashmore began his football journey in Portsmouth's youth system before moving through Havant & Waterlooville and Gosport Borough. His impressive displays at Ebbsfleet United earned him back-to-back Player of the Season awards, showcasing his consistency and talent.

In 2019, he joined Boreham Wood initially on loan, where his performances cemented his place as a reliable figure at Meadow Park after making the move permanent. With the exception of a brief loan spell with Maidenhead United, Ashmore has been a mainstay for Boreham Wood over the past six years, building a reputation as one of the best goalkeepers in non-league, and has twice been named in the Team of the Season.





## **THE PLAYMAKER** **ABDUL** **ABDULMALIK**

Abdul Abdulmalik joined Boreham Wood in July 2024 from Championship side Millwall, having come through their academy and played a pivotal role in consecutive Premier League Professional Development League titles in 2022/23 and 2023/24.

An England youth international, he made his National League debut on loan at Wealdstone before joining the Wood, contributing to 15 goals in 34 games last season, including in the FA Cup Fourth Qualifying Round win over Carshalton Athletic. His performances earned him a contract extension in April 2025, committing him to the Wood until at least 2026/27.





## **THE FINISHER** **LUKE** **NORRIS**

Luke Norris returned to Meadow Park in July 2025 as Boreham Wood's newest striker, having departed Tranmere Rovers after solid spells in League Two.

A product of Luton Town, Hitchin Town and Brentford's academies, he made a notable impact during a 2012/13 loan at Wood, scoring three times in seven matches, before building his reputation as a reliable Football League striker across the next decade, scoring consistently for Gillingham, Swindon Town, Colchester United and playing a pivotal role in Stevenage's 2022/23 promotion. His arrival brings proven experience, goalscoring pedigree, and renewed ambition to the Boreham Wood attack.



## **22 | Finlay Herrick**

### **Goalkeeper**

Finlay Herrick joined West Ham's Academy at the age of six, signing professional terms in July 2023. He has starred in the Under-18s' FA Youth Cup and league double in 2022/23 before progressing through England's youth ranks and earned the PL2 Golden Glove last term.

In September 2025, he embarked on his first senior loan at Boreham Wood.

## **2 | Cameron Coxe**

### **Defender**

Cameron Coxe, a Cardiff City academy graduate, played briefly for the Bluebirds before moving to Solihull Moors and Colchester United. He joined Boreham Wood in October 2022, scoring on his debut and signing permanently in December. In 2024/25, he made 49 appearances, notching two assists, and has featured five times this season.

## **3 | Femi Ilesanmi**

### **Defender**

Femi Ilesanmi, a product of AFC Wimbledon's youth system, debuted at the age of 16 before moving to QPR, and later gained experience at Ashford Town and Dagenham & Redbridge. He later played for York City and joined Boreham Wood in 2016, returning in 2018 after a spell at Dover Athletic. He notably scored a dramatic winner in last season's Play-Off Eliminator victory over Dorking Wanderers.

## **5 | Chris Bush**

### **Defender**

Chris Bush, a Brentford academy graduate, gained experience on loan at Salisbury, Woking, AFC Wimbledon and Thurrock, before re-joining the Dons permanently in 2011. Spells at Gateshead, Hereford, Welling, Lincoln and Chelmsford followed, before impressing at Ebbsfleet and winning the FA Trophy with Bromley. Since joining Boreham Wood in December 2022, he has been a mainstay in their backline.

## **6 | Charlie O'Connell**

### **Defender**

Charlie O'Connell began his career in West Ham United's academy before joining Peterborough United in 2019. He captained their U18 and U21 sides and made his senior debut in May 2021. After several loan spells, he joined Boreham Wood in July 2023 and made 44 appearances last term.

## **12 | Joe Newton**

### **Defender**

Joe Newton began his career in the youth systems of AFC Wimbledon and later joined Peterborough United. Last season, Newton made 40 appearances for Solihull Moors, contributing three assists, before joining Boreham Wood in the summer.

## **15 | Jeff King**

### **Defender**

Jeff King, a versatile, attack-minded defender, began his career in non-league with the likes of Altrincham, Nantwich, Witton Albion, and Droylsden before joining Bolton Wanderers. He later starred at FC Halifax Town and Chesterfield—earning Player of the Season and National League Team of the Year honours, before turning out for Swindon and York City. He joined Boreham Wood on loan in the summer.

## **16 | Callum Reynolds**

### **Defender**

Callum Reynolds began his career in the youth setup at Rushden & Diamonds before joining Portsmouth, and later turned out for Luton, Basingstoke, Tamworth, Hinckley and Corby. He captained Boreham Wood to promotion in 2014/15, later playing for Aldershot, Barnet, Dagenham and Bromley, where he again won promotion. Returning to Boreham Wood in January, he added a third promotion to his CV last term.

## **4 | Jack Payne**

### **Midfielder**

Jack Payne began his career at Gillingham, earning a Young Player of the Season award, before joining Peterborough United permanently in 2013. After spells with Leyton Orient, Blackpool, Ebbsfleet, Eastleigh, and Crawley Town, he joined Boreham Wood in July 2022, and was appointed captain in 2023/24. He now serves as Player-Assistant Manager to Luke Garrard, replacing club legend Mark Ricketts in the role of Garrard's number two.

## **7 | Érico Sousa**

### **Midfielder**

Érico Sousa, a Portuguese midfielder, progressed through the ranks at Manchester City and Barnsley before playing for Hyde United, Tadcaster Albion, NK Celje, Tranmere Rovers, Accrington Stanley and Darlington. Joining Grimsby Town in 2021, he helped them earn promotion before joining Boreham Wood in 2022, and has gone on to appear 89 times for the club in the league.

## **8 | Zak Brunt**

### **Midfielder**

Zak Brunt spent time in the academies of Aston Villa, Manchester City, Manchester United and Derby County, before progressing the ranks at Sheffield United. After senior loans at Southend United, Notts County and Boreham Wood, he spent two years at Barnet before returning to Meadow Park on loan this summer.



**11 | Jon Benton****Midfielder**

Jon Benton began his career at Southend United, gaining experience on loan at Braintree Town and Aveley, before joining Solihull Moors in 2023/24. He made 25 league appearances and featured in the play-off final before joining Boreham Wood, appearing 39 times last season.

**14 | Aaron Henry****Midfielder**

Aaron Henry has spent the bulk of his career so far at Charlton Athletic, making his senior debut in 2020. He had loan spells at Wealdstone, Crawley Town and Rochdale, before joining Boreham Wood in July 2025.

**17 | Charles Clayden****Midfielder**

Charles Clayden began his career at Leyton Orient before joining Charlton Athletic in 2019, gaining loan experience at Dulwich Hamlet, Wealdstone and Bromley. He moved permanently to Wealdstone in March 2023 and signed for Boreham Wood in November 2023, notching eight goal contributions last season including the promotion-winning goal in the play-off final against Maidstone United.

**19 | Tom White****Midfielder**

Tom White began his career in the Gateshead and Blackburn Rovers' youth systems, with loan spells at Barrow, Bolton and Hartlepool before joining Barrow permanently in 2021. He later signed for Morecambe in 2024, making 34 appearances, and joined Boreham Wood in August 2025, where he has started in all of the Wood's league games.

**9 | Junior Dixon****Forward**

Junior Dixon began at Birmingham City's youth academy, making his senior debut in 2023.

He joined Boreham Wood on loan in August 2024, scoring 7 goals in 45 appearances, and signed permanently in July 2025.

**20 | Lewis Richardson****Forward**

Lewis Richardson developed through Burnley's academy, becoming the club's youngest Premier League debutant in 2021. He gained experience on loan at Grimsby Town in 2022/23 and York City (early 2025), where he scored four goals in 14 league appearances. He signed with Boreham Wood in September 2025 following his departure from Burnley.

**32 | Matt Rush****Forward**

Matt Rush began his career at Wickford Town and Billericay Town before joining Southend United's academy in 2014. After loans across non-league, he left Southend in 2022, with stints at Braintree Town, Aveley and Maidstone United, scoring 16 goals for the latter. After helping the Stones reach the play-offs, in which they were eliminated, Rush found himself in the National League anyway, albeit briefly, joined Sutton in 2024 and scoring once in the FA Cup Fourth Qualifying Round against Chertsey Town.

He later returned to Maidstone on loan before joining Boreham Wood the following month, and fired home 17 goals last term.







# HISTORIC RAMBLINGS

## Three from the 3rd September

This evening's match is the 27th fixture that Sutton have played on this date, seventeen of those as home matches. All but the first of those home games have been played here at GGL, that match being a friendly with Westminster City ended in a 2-0 Sutton win on a ground on London Road; 400 in attendance. The first fixture at GGL was the club's first ever home match in the Athenian League in 1921 and ended in a 2-0 defeat to Cheshunt. Since then, Sutton have recorded ten wins, three defeats and one draw. The most recent match was a 2-1 victory over Harrogate Town in EFL L2 in 2022. On their travels, U's have won three and lost six of the nine fixtures, the last victory being at Dulwich (2-0) in the Isthmian League in 1968.

## The Match

Back to 1966 and the first season that substitutes could be used but only on the occasion of an injury to a player. One of just two cup matches Sutton have played on this date, United entertained Hatfield Town in the FA Cup 1st qualifying round. Hatfield played in the Metropolitan League and were considered to be a semi-professional club. U's had started the season well boasting a 100% Isthmian record.

The hosts dominated from the start but a combination of the visiting 'keeper and the tactic of packing the defence with six or seven players made Hatfield a difficult prospect to break down. In the 32nd minute reward arrived when Rod Brookes crossed from the left for Dave Hutchins to head in. Hatfield had to change their approach from that point and three goals in 23 minutes starting in the 50th sent Sutton through to the next stage of the competition.

Micky Mellows scored the second, collecting Ted Powell's free-kick to net with an angled drive. The third goal was a marvellous swerving effort from Trevor Bladon in the 66th minute and seven minutes later, Mellows followed up to fire in after Larry Pritchard's forward surge had been halted; 4-0 it finished.

## The Player

Appearing in two matches for Sutton this day in 1955 and again in 1957, Ken Harris was an inside forward (no 8 or 10) who had previously played for West Ham United on amateur terms. Having appeared in the pre-season trial, Ken made his debut against Tooting & Mitcham United in the South of the Thames Cup in September 1954, scoring his first senior goals in his third appearance against Walton & Hersham. Ken was an instant hit with the home crowd, exhibiting some fine skill and a creative footballing brain. He ended the 1954/55 season with 11 goals in 18 matches (7 in 10 AL games) and a South of the Thames Cup winners medal, scoring in a 3-2 defeat of Bromley. The following season Ken was a permanent fixture in the starting XI, however he sustained an injury in the Boxing Day reverse to Tooting & Mitcham and did not make another appearance for the club that season. However, during that period of activity for the first team he was selected to represent Surrey FA. The whereabouts of Ken for the 1956/7 season are not known (by me anyway) although he may well have been injured but he was at the club for the '57/8 trial and remained a mainstay of the side until October when he again picked up another injury. After that he made sporadic appearances for the reserves thereafter before appearing three more times for the first team during February. He then left the club to join Epsom and then later Kingstonian before spending the early to mid-1960's at Leatherhead. Ken made 54 appearances for Sutton scoring a healthy 21 goals. But for his unfortunate injury record it would probably have been a fair few more.

## The Programme

Back to the early 1990's for the programme this evening and the visit midweek visit of neighbours Carshalton Athletic in the Isthmian League (normally a Yuletide fixture back then). The programme cover was designed on the home shirt of the era with main sponsors, Securicor, prominent as well as having a full advert on the back page. A 48 page production the programme held all the usual features including notes from then manager Alan Gane on page 5. They were comprehensive too. Editor Tony Dolbear had club chat on page 8 while an appearance chart and a detailed fixtures and results page spread over two pages but not in the middle as has been the





case in recent years, those pages were where the team line ups were presented surrounded by adverts including Langley Motor Spares and, of course, W A Truelove. This now expanded programme had space for a hand produced map for an up and coming away fixture (Chris Ball the artist I believe) while non-league football was covered by Pyramid Patter on page 32 and In Conference on the adjacent leaf. From The Archives (a fore runner of this article) looked at matches in August/September five and ten years ago (1986 and 1981) while the recent Suburban team's thrashing of Banstead was well covered. The Supporters' Club enjoyed two pages. Other adverts included Jack Brabham in Worcester Park and Symingtons Estate Agents. All on glossy paper for £1. Bloody marvellous.

### **SUFC v Boreham Wood**

The Wood make their 22nd league visit to GGL this evening and their fifth as a National League club. Of those five they have won just once but it was an impressive 4-0 score line in September 2018. Their last visit was during the Covid 2020/21 season arriving in the February to go down by 2-0 including that stunning individual goal by Will Randall (now retired from football according to Omar Bugiel). Prior to that the two clubs had met in the Isthmian and National/Conference South. Their first match at GGL was in April 1978 in the IL and ended goal less. That was one of six draws here in the Isthmian with U's winning four and losing three of the others contested. In the lower level of the NL Wood have won once by 3-1 in August 2014 while U's have recorded three victories. Sutton's best win against BW at GGL was by 5-2 in April 1980 while that 4-0 match mentioned above is Wood's best performance. However, perhaps their finest hour here was the 3-2 win in the 2018 NL play-off semi-final only to go down 1-0 to ten man Tranmere in the final itself.

At Meadow Park, the teams have met in 22 league encounters, the 2019/20 GGL fixture not played because of Covid. U's have won twelve of those matches losing six. There have been a number of cup ties between the two sides and the first ever meeting was at Boreham Wood in December 1973, U's appalling London Senior Cup record continued by a 2-1 exit in the second round. Sutton's top scorer in league football against The Wood (both venues) is Micky Joyce with seven goals.

### **U's home record (league only) W9 D7 L5 F31 A29**

We welcome back Matt Rush (and no doubt his dad, Mark) to GGL this afternoon. Other players to have appeared for both clubs include attacking players Joe Baker, Scott Forrester and Junior Haynes, goalkeeper Kenny Addai and defender Robyn Jones. Former U's defender Tommy Sampson managed Boreham Wood many years ago.

# INTRODUCING: NOA BOUTIN

**Sutton United Football Club confirmed the loan signing of Noa Boutin last week, joining from AFC Bournemouth until January.**

Born in Paris, Boutin began his career in his native France with Régional 2 side AC Boulogne-Billancour, before being offered a place in the Under-18 squad at AFC Bournemouth in 2020, joining the Cherries at the age of 16.

He subsequently gained experience on loan at Poole Town, Weymouth and Gosport Borough whilst continuing his progression to the Under-21s at Dean Court in the summer of 2022.

Boutin later spent the 2024/25 campaign on loan in the National League with Eastleigh, joining initially on a short-term deal, before going on to appear 34 times during a season-long stint at the Silverlake Stadium.

After signing for the U's, Boutin made his debut the following day, and played a key role in last Saturday's win over Carlisle United.





After taking part in his first training session on Friday afternoon, Boutin got his media duties underway, receiving a tour of his new home as he posed for a host of photographs, before sitting down with Sutton United FCtv to discuss his journey so far.

**Noa, welcome to Sutton United. How does it feel to be here?**

I'm buzzing to be here. "I had a little conversation with the gaffer yesterday, so yeah, can't wait to get started.

**Did the move come about quickly?**

Yeah, to be fair, I wasn't ready for the move to come about, I was at home, got a call from my agent, and yeah, so it happened really quickly.

**You were born in Paris, over in France, what was it like growing up over there?**

Yeah, it was just...normal, to be fair. Growing up there, playing my football there as well. It's a bit different compared to England, but I enjoyed it as well.

**You came over to England at quite an early age, as a teenager. Was that a difficult decision?**

It was a difficult decision to be fair. My first year was really hard, I couldn't speak English, but after my first year I really started to enjoy it.

**You joined AFC Bournemouth, a club who have played in the Premier League for a number of years now. What have you learned from playing at such a high level in the youth team?**

I've learned a lot; the intensity, quality on the ball, all the hard stuff.

**You spent quite a bit of time out on loan; Poole Town, Gosport Borough, Weymouth. What have you learned from playing at the lower echelons of non-league football and how did it differ to your time at Eastleigh last year?**

I learned a lot to be fair, the dirty part of football, because it's not just clean all the time. So, yes, that's what I've learned.

**And for those who may not have seen you before, how would you describe your style of play?**

I'm really passionate on the pitch, quick, powerful, like to run a lot as well, a hard worker.

**Is there anyone in particular you model your game off or look up to?**

I'd say Alphonso Davies.

**And you're here until January, what are your aims during your time at Sutton?**

Otherwise, I just want to play as many games as possible and make sure we give everything for the fans.

We would like to welcome Noa to Sutton and wish him all the best!



# LOAN WATCH: AUGUST

**August saw the 2025/26 campaign get underway for clubs across the whole of domestic football, and allowed four Sutton players to gain crucial minutes and experience away from Gander Green Lane.**

Exciting forward George Vorster featured in all but one of Burgess Hill Town's games during August, and scored just seven minutes into his debut for the Hillians before ending the month with a further three goals.

His first came by latching onto a great through ball before rounding the Cray Valley PM goalkeeper and coolly slotting home, and he later displayed an unbelievable skill to pluck a ball out the sky perfectly, before spinning and firing a 50-yard diagonal ball that set up a chance for Martyn Box.

Vorster then continued his fine form into his second appearance for the Hillians with two goals in as many games in similar circumstances to his maiden goal for the club, as the forward nipped round the Aveley goalkeeper before keeping composure and tucking the ball home to give Burgess Hill the lead at Parkside in a match which ultimately ended 3-3.



The Sutton man would end the month with four goals to his name though, putting the cherry on top of an extremely successful start to life in Sussex as he scored two goals in five minutes to set the Hillians on their way to a 5-1 win over Wokingham Town in the FA Cup First Qualifying Round.

One defeat from their opening games to the season sees Burgess Hill sit 12th in the Isthmian League, one place above Liam Moore's Cray Valley Paper Mills.

The U's youngest ever captain made his competitive debut for the Millers while still on trial, playing the final 12 minutes in the 2-1 defeat to Vorster's Burgess Hill.

He was subsequently formally announced as the club's newest signing, before making his full debut in an impressive 3-0 win over rivals Welling United, although he was forced to go off after 15 minutes due to injury.

Moore has subsequently returned to Sutton, with the academy coaching staff set to assess his condition.

Over in Wiltshire, Hayden Muller played four times for Salisbury, including two starts, as his month-long loan with the Whites saw him contribute to three draws.

He made his Salisbury debut as a late substitute in a goalless draw with Dagenham & Redbridge, before making his first start against Dover Athletic, where he notably cleared a shot off the line just after the hour-mark, although it wasn't enough to prevent a 2-0 defeat in Kent.

Finally, Henry Sandat played 90 minutes as Hornchurch beat Chippenham Town after goals from Angelo Balanta and Sean Scannell sealed a 2-0 win. Sandat had come straight into the starting XI after signing the previous day, and marked his debut with a yellow card midway through the second half.
