We welcome this afternoon's visitors to the VBS Community Stadium, Tamworth, for their second league visit after completing what for them must have been a satisfactory first season in the National League.

As we found in our three-year spell in the Football League though, being unfancied as a newly promoted club in the first season doesn't mean the second time round is any easier.

Whilst they sit comfortably in mid-table, where they finished last season, with three wins under their belt already, it would be fair to say looking at the current table they have faced what would appear to be easier opposition than us to date. Points in the bank are all that matter and Steve will be looking to add to our total this afternoon and climb away from the wrong end of the table. Tamworth will of course be looking to take those points too, and with both clubs suffering 4-0 losses to title favourites, and also losing by the odd goal to Scunthorpe there doesn't appear much between the sides form wise.

Last season, in glorious sunshine we were taken to the final minutes of a frustrating encounter before Josh Coley spared our blushes on the opening day of the season. The reverse fixture here produced an even worse outcome, although no doubt delighted the 68 travelling supporters, who this time saw their team not just come back and equalise but go on to win after Will Davies' early goal for the U's. So Sutton will be looking for our first league victory over The Lambs although revenge of sorts was delivered a few weeks after that home loss with a victory in the FA Trophy by a single goal also scored by Will.

With Will having left, upwards, to pastures new in the summer, it will be up to someone else to step forward and try and score the winning goal today. Will's replacement Ashley Nadesan found the back of the net with a deft touch last weekend to get off the mark this season and will be wanting to add to that total for sure. Last weekend's game was another frustrating affair with another result losing by the odd goal despite, again, having led at one point in the match. Hopefully this afternoon's man in charge will be less busy, and dare I say bemusing, as the team in amber found ourselves the wrong side of a 6-0 scorecard from the card perspective in an otherwise even contest.

This weekend also marks the return of Crystal Palace Women to the VBS with their first home fixture since their disappointing relegation out of the Women's Super League earlier this year. They will welcome any support, although our own Women are also playing at home on Sunday at the David Weir Leisure Centre being their new home for this season. A much easier venue to get to and get behind them for most people this year. In another tough division (aren't they all?) Lucy has recruited an exciting team which is currently in mid-table with a win and a draw mixed with some losses to the top teams.





21 | Leon Phillips

Goalkeeper

Leon Phillips is a goalkeeper who joined Tamworth in July 2023 from Boston United.

Born in September 2001, he began his career at Alvechurch before moving into non-league football, on dual-registration deal with Stafford Rangers last campaign, making one appearance for the Lambs last term.

2 | Matt Curley

Defender

Matt Curley is a versatile defender who rejoined Tamworth in July 2022 after helping Buxton win the Northern Premier League Premier Division title, making 49 appearances. Aged 30, he can operate as a right-back, left-back, or central midfielder. In the 2024/25 season, Curley made 20 league appearances, providing 2 assists. As of the 2025/26 season, he has made 5 league appearances,

3 | Callum Cockerill-Mollett

Defender

Callum Cockerill-Mollett is a 26-year-old left-back who joined Tamworth in October 2021 after leaving Walsall. Born in Leicester, he has represented the Republic of Ireland at U18 and U19 levels. Since joining Tamworth, he has made 65 appearances and scored three goals.

5 | Kennedy Digie

Defender

Kennedy Digie is a central defender who joined Tamworth in July 2024 from Aldershot Town, having previously played for Solihull Moors, Eastleigh and Braintree Town. In the 2024/25 season, he made 27 league appearances, scoring 2 goals and providing 2 assists.

11 | Luke Fairlamb

Defender

Luke Fairlamb is a left-back who joined Tamworth in July 2022 from St Ives Town. In the 2024/25 National League season, he made 14 league appearances, providing one goal. He has appeared in every Lambs league game this season so far.

12 | Joe Rye

Defender

Joe Rye is a central defender who joined Tamworth in July 2025 on loan from Barnet, having previously played for Worthing and Chelmsford City. In the 2024/25 season, he made 27 league appearances, scoring 2 goals and providing 2 assists.

15 | Kwaku Donkor

Defender

Kwaku Donkor is a right back who joined Tamworth in July 2025 from Blackpool, having progressed through their academy and made his senior debut in the EFL Trophy. In the 2024–25 season, he was loaned to Welling United. As of September 2025, he has made 5 league appearances for the Lambs.

16 | Joe Riley

Defnder

Joe Riley started his career in Manchester United's youth system, making his first-team debut in 2016, before having spells at Sheffield United, Bradford City, Carlisle United and Walsall. In June 2024 he dropped into non-league with a switch to AFC Fylde, and despite their relegation last term, remained in the fifth tier with a move to Tamworth in the summer.

18 | Jordan Cullinane-Liburd

Defender

Jordan Cullinane-Liburd is a central defender who rejoined Tamworth in 2023 from Brackley Town, having previously played for Leamington, Redditch United and Hereford. In 2024/25 he made 26 league appearances, scoring two goals and providing one assist, forming a key part of Tamworth's defence.

4 | Tom Tonks

Midfielder

Tom Tonks is a central midfielder who joined Tamworth in November 2023. Born in Walsall in 1991, he is renowned for his long throw-ins. In 2024/25, he made 45 league appearances, garnering 9 assists. Contracted until June 2026, he has started eight matches so far this season.

6 | Alfie Bates

Midfielder

Alfie Bates is a central midfielder who joined Tamworth in July 2025 from Brackley Town. He began his career at Walsall before moving to Finland's SJK and SJK Akatemia. At Brackley, he made 89 league appearances, scoring 5 goals and providing 9 assists. In the 2024–25 season, Bates made 42 league appearances, scoring 1 goal and providing 6 assists. This season, he has appeared in 6 Enterprise National League fixtures thus far.

7 | Harvey Sayer

Midfielder

Harvey Sayer is a right winger who joined Tamworth in July 2025 from Lowestoft Town. He began his career at Bungay Town before progressing through the youth systems of Norwich City and Colchester United. At Lowestoft Town, he made 78 appearances, scoring 39 goals. In the 2025–26 season so far, Sayer has made 7 league appearances for Tamworth, scoring 2 goals and providing 1 assist.

8 | Ben Milnes

Midfielder

Formerly of the Leicester youth setup, Ben Milnes has turned out for Boston United, Corby Town, Kettering Town and Buxton during his career, winning the league with Kettering, before joining Tamworth in 2022. He has won two promotions during his time with the Lambs, appearing 31 times last season as club captain.

10 | Beck-Ray Enoru

Midfielder

Beck-Ray Enoru, born in Cameroon, joined Tamworth in 2024 from Barwell. Last season he made 38 appearances with 7 goal involvement and has continued his momentum into this season, appearing in every Lambs game so far this season.

14 | Stefan Mols

Midfielder

Stefan Mols is a Spanish midfielder who joined Tamworth in July 2025 from Curzon Ashton. Born in Marbella, he began his career at Blackburn Rovers before playing for Intercity and Warrington Town. At Curzon Ashton, he scored 23 goals in 77 league appearances. He has made 6 appearances this season for the Lambs.

17 | Reuben Wyatt

Midfielder

Reuben Wyatt came through the Northampton Town academy, winning the League One Apprentice of the Year award in 2023/24, before gaining senior experience on loan at AFC Rushden & Diamonds, Redditch United and St Albans City. Wyatt moved to Tamworth in the summer.

19 | Tom McGlinchey

Midfielder


Tom McGlinchey is a right midfielder who joined Tamworth in July 2024 from Coalville Town. He began his career at Leicester City before moving into non-league football. He scored two goals against the U's at the VBS Community Stadium in December of last year.

20 | Tyler Roberts

Midfielde

A pacey, direct winger, Tyler Roberts developed at Wolverhampton Wanderers from early childhood before spending time on loan at Doncaster Rovers, which preceded a move to AFC Fylde on an initial loan move. Roberts returned to the Midlands with a move to Tamworth in the summer after a season on the Lancashire Coast.

Internationally, he represents Jamaica.



23 | Kai Lissimore

Midfielder

Kai Lissimore is a central midfielder who joined Tamworth permanently in July 2024 from Kidderminster Harriers. He began his career at Kidderminster and had loan spells at Tamworth and Halesowen Town. He is contracted with Tamworth until the end of the season.

27 | Oliver Lynch

FORWEIG

Oliver Lynch developed through Luton Town's academy from Under–14 level, gaining experience on loan at Hitchin Town and Dulwich Hamlet, before moving to Hemel Hempstead Town in January 2025, where he scored 11 goals in the National League South. His form in the sixth tier earned him a switch to Tamworth in the summer.

38 | Jordan Ponticelli

Forward

Jordan Ponticelli is a forward who joined Tamworth in December 2024 from Halesowen Town. Born in Nuneaton on 10 September 1998, he began his career at Coventry City before moving to Wrexham, King's Lynn Town, and Halesowen Town. In the 2025–26 season, he has made 8 league appearances for Tamworth.

HISTORIC RAMBLINGS



Three from the 13th September

SUFC's first match on this date as a senior club was in 1913. A FA Cup extra-preliminary round tie at Camberley & Yorktown, U's exited the competition at its earliest stage by 5-3. Since then, twenty more matches have been contested, the most recent a 3-2 loss at Swindon Town in EFL, L2 in 2022. Of those in between, eleven have been at GGL including six wins and two defeats. Four of these matches have been in the FA Cup 1st qualifying round and include one of the draws, against Barnet in 1975. Away from The 'Lane, Sutton have played ten times including the two mentioned above. Two 4-0 wins have been recorded (in 1919 v Guards Depot in Southern Suburban League West and Cheshunt in the FA Cup, 1997) while the heaviest reverse was at Hendon in the Athenian League in 1952, 0-6. U's away record on this day of September is W5 D1 L4.

The Match

Forty-two years ago today, Sutton made the short trip to Sandy Lane for a local Isthmian League derby with Tooting & Mitcham United. Sutton had not won at Tooting in their previous nine visits in all competitions, the last victory being in November 1976 under the management of Dario Gradi. U's went into this match following a good start to their league programme having won three and drawn three in their half dozen matches. The 1983/4 season would be the last for club legend and record appearance maker, Larry Pritchard. He would hang up his boots a couple of months later and manager Barrie Williams was utilising his assistant manager in the unfamiliar role of right back.

The hosts took the lead in the 30th minute thanks to Dave Lucas's diving header but having seen two efforts cleared off the line, Micky Joyce flicked on a cross for John Rains to fire past future Sutton 'keeper Nicky Sullivan in the home goal. That was in the 65th minute and eleven minutes later, Micky Stephens curled a beauty past Sullivan to claim a rare IL win at Sandy Lane (just U's fourth in 21 visits to that point).

The Player

Son of local footballing personality of his day Johnny, Steve Bangs joined Sutton for the 1974/5 season having been coached by then U's manager Ted Powell as a schoolboy at Sutton Manor. Appearing on this day in 1977 against Carshalton Athletic in the Isthmian, Steve was comfortable at either left or centre back and having started that '74/5 term in the Suburban League side, he made his senior debut on 18th February '75 against Leatherhead in the Isthmian League and had

made 19 appearances come the end of that season. The following campaign his first goal arrived in an FA Cup tie against Chesham United (see above photo). Bangsy continued at Sutton until December 1977 and having lost his left back role to Paul McKinnon joined local rivals, Carshalton Athletic. He stayed at Colston Avenue, taking a fair bit of stick off the Sutton fans when the two sides met, before rejoining Sutton for the 1983/84 season. Steve played a major role in U's two


Steve Bangs (far right) heads his first goal for Sutton



Isthmian title successes of 1984/85 and 1985/86, winning the POY award for the former. Once ridiculed by the U's faithful he had become a much admired defender. Following the second of those two IL titles, Steve left the club and took a role as assistant manager at Dorking and then later a management role at Corinthian–Casuals. While at Sutton, Steve represented the FA in 1976/77 season and as well as those two IL titles he also won the Isthmian League and Surrey Senior Cups twice. Steve made 293 appearances for Sutton, scoring five goals. Away from football he returned to Sutton Manor as a Sports Master.

The Programme

Back to 1952 for today's programme review and that of Hendon FC. Printed on green paper (the club's colours at the time), the front page (below) was refreshingly lacking in adverts. The inside cover had adverts at bottom and top but the middle was a team photo of the home club. Photos were rare in amateur programmes back then. Club notes followed including a paragraph asking supporters to stop children running on the pitch during the match! As was the design back then, the teams layout was in the centre spread (2–3–5 formation) surrounded by adverts including Jock's Café and G&E Potter, gentleman's hairdresser; both businesses based in Cricklewood. The Supporters' Association had notes on page 6; lapel badges were going at 2/6 (12.5p). Fixtures and results were listed on the inside back cover and Hendon's one hundred percent start to the season stretched to a fourth win as they thrashed Sutton, 6–0. The back page held up to date tables of the Athenian senior and reserve sections. Southall led the way



on goal average from Hendon while in the reserve section, U's had conceded 16 goals in just two matches. Priced at 2d, standard fare for the time with a couple of added extras.

SUFC vs Tamworth

Having met for the first time on the opening day of last season at The Lamb (1-1), Tamworth made two visits to Sutton, recording a 2-1 win in the NL here in December 2024 before losing out 1-0 in the FA Trophy 4th round just over a fortnight later. Will Davies scored for Sutton in both these matches, Josh Coley's late equaliser earning that opening day point.

MERNATIONAL

The September International Break is at an end, with three Sutton players across the First Team and Academy in action while on duty for three different nations.

Kane Crichlow notched his 12th goal for Bermuda as the Gombey Warriors fell to defeat against Curação in their second Concacaf World Cup Qualifier of the September international break.

The Sutton winger completed 90 minutes at Stadion Ergilio Hato and got the deftest of

touches after half-an-hour to turn home a Nejai Tucker cross, inspiring a first half comeback that saw Michael Findlay's men come from 2-0 down to go into the break level, with former West Ham United striker Djair Parfitt-Williams scoring on the stroke of half time to cancel out two opening goals from Sheffield United's Tahith Chong.

Despite this, Bermuda fell short 15 minutes from time as Tyrese Noslin struck for Curação, and condemned Crichlow's side to defeat against a team consisting of a



handful of familiar players within English football, including Chong, Leandro Bacuna, Juninho Bacuna, Ar'jany Martha and Jürgen Locadia.

As a result, the Gombey Warriors sit bottom of Group B after the first batch of Round Three Qualifiers, but are still a long way off elimination with further Qualifiers against Trinidad & Tobago and Jamaica to be played in October.

Crichlow had previously played 90 minutes as Bermuda fell to a 4-0 defeat against the Reggae Boyz four days earlier, with Damion Lowe, Renaldo Cephas, Kasey Palmer and Shamar Nicholson scoring the decisive goals at the Dame Flora Duffy National Sports Centre.



Over in Asia, Dillon De Silva's Sri Lanka were defeated in the South Asian Super Cup, with Maldives coming out of two international friendlies victorious against the Golden Army.

The Sutton winger started both matches, being deployed out wide as Abdullah Al Mutairi's side lost 3-0 in the first game, being condemned to defeat thanks to goals from Hassan Naiz, Hassan Ibrahim and Ali Fasir. This preceded a 1-1 draw in the second game, with Sri Lanka rescuing a result at the death when Oliver Kelaart scored in the 92nd minute to cancel out Naiz's second goal in as many games, but wasn't enough to prevent defeat overall in the cup.

The warm-up games sees the Golden Army continue to prepare for two AFC Asia Cup Play-Off games against Turkmenistan in October, looking to make it to the finals of the competition for the first time in 2027.

Back to Europe, Sutton Academy defender Jay Coombes made two substitute appearances for Gibraltar Under-21's as Los Llanis lost their first two Euro Under-21 Qualifiers against Bulgaria

and Czech Republic.

A Georgi Lazarov brace saw Lavovete race into a 2-0 lead at Stadion Georgi Benkovski, with Nikola lliev completing a 3-0 win, before Matyas Vojta and Lukas Masek scored two goals for Czech Republic to to complete the turnaround after a first half Kyle Clinton penalty, and condemn Gibraltar to a 2-1 defeat.

Team 54 currently sit 5th in Group B, and will be looking to close the gap on the top two with games against Scotland and Portugal next month.

Official: Three New Signings for Women


Sutton United confirmed the signings of Sophie Sunmer, Ines Jame and Tess Ciccardin for the Women's team last week.

The latest news from around the **Enterprise National** League.

It was a weekend of firsts in the National League last weekend with 35 goals scored across the 12 fixtures.

Stuart Maynard took charge of his first game as York City manager in their trip to Yeovil. The trip to Somerset yielded his first win in charge of the Minstermen as they came away from Huish Park 3-1 winners. Despite the two week break between fixtures, York were 2-0 up at half-time and Hiram Boateng scored first in York colours to make it 3-1 late in the game.

They followed this up at their first home game since our opening day draw (2-2) at the LNER Community Stadium. Their 4-0 victory in midweek against today's visitors Tamworth was Maynard's first home win and moved them up to 8th with games in hand over most of the sides above them.



Two unbeaten sides went head-to-head at the New Lawn and Forest Green inflicted a first defeat of the season on Simon Grayson's Hartlepool. Kairo Mitchell scored the only goal of the game and put Robbie Savage's side on 20 points from their opening eight games.




Another side who experienced a first win last weekend was Solihull Moors. The Moors picked up their first victory of the season with a 2-1 win at Boston United. Having sacked Matt Taylor after a winless 7 game start, they moved off the bottom thanks to a brace from Jacob Wakeling (his first goals for the club).



There was a second abandonment in a week for Scunthorpe United after their game against Wealdstone ended prematurely. In the closing stages of the game, Wealdstone's player suffered a shoulder injury which led to a stoppage in play. Despite the league and referee demanding the game be completed, the Stones players refused to return to the field. This followed on from Scunthorpe's midweek visit to Eastleigh ending prematurely after a clash of heads between two opposing players.

The League have since decided that their trip to Eastleigh must be replayed in full, a long trip to fulfil on another Tuesday night having completed it the other week. In contrast, the Iron have been awarded the three points for their game against Wealdstone but the goals for and against will not be added to the table.



Credit must be given to Truro City on their first visit to Carlisle United. The Cornish club's 878 mile round trip to Brunton Park was completed by 78 Tinners fans (more than Boreham Wood brought to the VBS 10 days ago). Sadly for the Truro fans, the game was all but over in the 12th minute as Luke Armstrong's brace gave Carlisle a 2-0 lead. The league's joint-top scorer, Regan Linney, added the final goal of the game in the second half to give the Cumbrians a 3-0 win.



In the National League South, result of the day went to Worthing who comprehensively beat Dagenham & Redbridge 5-2 in East London. The win was the Mackerel Men's first back-to-back successes of the season. On the flip side, it has been a dreadful start to the season for the Daggers. Despite the media attention in the summer after the signing of Andy Carroll, they have only picked up one win this season and find themselves in the relegation zone.

It doesn't look as though it will get much easier for them. Fixtures against Dorking Wanderers, Maidstone United and Torquay United in their next three could add more pressure onto the side with the joint-worst defence in the National League South.



Entertainers in the National League North in recent weeks have been Radcliffe. The Manchester side continued that last weekend with a 4-1 win over Marine. So far this season, Radcliffe's games have had an average of 3.25 goals-per-game.

Ex-Salford City managers Bernard Morley and Anthony Johnson have implemented an attacking brand of football which has led them to have the highest expected goals (xG) in the top six tiers. The Boro have totalled 18.02 xG and will be hoping to keep that statistic going in their trip to South Wales next week when they visit Merthyr Town.





FA CUP PREVIEW

This weekend sees the National League South and North sides join the FA Cup with a number of interesting ties taking place.

The one that should appeal to Sutton fans is Eastbourne Borough hosting Epsom and Ewell.

The fixture sees two Sutton legends go up against each other in the dugout with Matt Gray and Craig Dundas looking to manage their sides to the FA Cup 3rd Qualifying Round. Dundas' side may fancy their chances of causing an upset as Eastbourne sit bottom of the National League South with three points from their opening eight games.



Another standout fixture is the Enfield derby. Enfield Town will travel to Hertford Town's ground to take on Enfield FC. The Towners were formed in 2001 by disaffected Enfield fans and became the country's first fan-led club. It will be a first meeting between the two clubs since 2011 and the Es will have to perform at their best to cause an upset having started their league season with one win from their opening three games.





Other notable ties include former EFL side Macclesfield's home tie against Atherton Laburnum Rovers who came through their Flat Cap Derby against Atherton Collieries in the previous round. Finally a local derby of 2.5 miles is taking place in Wiltshire between Salisbury and Leverstock & Ford. The step five side visit Salisbury having scored twelve goals in their last three games.
