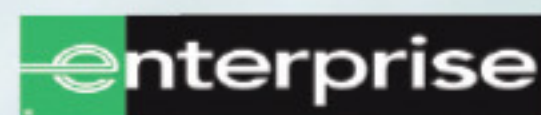

A MESSAGE FROM THE TOP

Our journey in this season's NL Cup competition continues this evening as we welcome the U21 side from Brighton & Hove Albion to the VBS Community Stadium.

Looking at where their first team are currently playing – both the stadium and the league – it is remarkable to think how recently they found themselves towards the bottom of EFL Division 2, and of the future they have created for themselves since. Those with a long term disposition and the vision might reflect on the future of our own club given our recent placement in that same area of tier 4 in the pyramid.

From a football perspective we have to be happy that unlike other cup competitions the NL Cup is one that starts with a group stage. With no exit after the loss to Fulham we get the chance to put that night behind us and search for the three points that start the progress to the knock out stages.

As in previous fixtures in this tournament, tonight will see the opportunity for some of our club's future talent to be on display. The club has consciously put in place a pathway to the first team under the auspices of the club's Academy, with a number of players already making their debuts. In past years such opportunities would have been limited to such occasions as the Surrey Senior Cup. It's testament to the long term thinking at the club that opportunities are being created for the talent of tomorrow to be seen earlier and by larger crowds than before.

Despite the relatively close distance between the clubs this will be the first competitive fixture between the two – something that was said ahead of last season's visit by Manchester United and I won't be the only one with a picture of the scoreboard from around 9pm that night! For some of our staff though, Jon Meeney in particular, this will be a fixture that raised the eyebrows when the draw was announced. Other club connections are somewhat scarce, although those that followed the club before the turn of the century will be aware of Paul Rogers, one of the few players that played non-league football for us before playing in the Premiership. Paul ended up playing over 100 times for Brighton as a player and subsequently stayed there in a non-playing capacity.

Once more we welcome many first time visitors to a Sutton United game as our schools initiative is repeated. If you are one of them you are of course welcome, but are also our future as your visitor status hopefully progresses to being a supporter and we look forward to a long association.

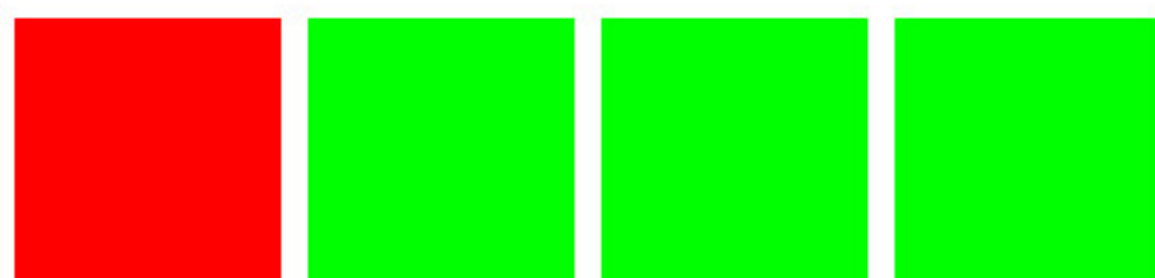

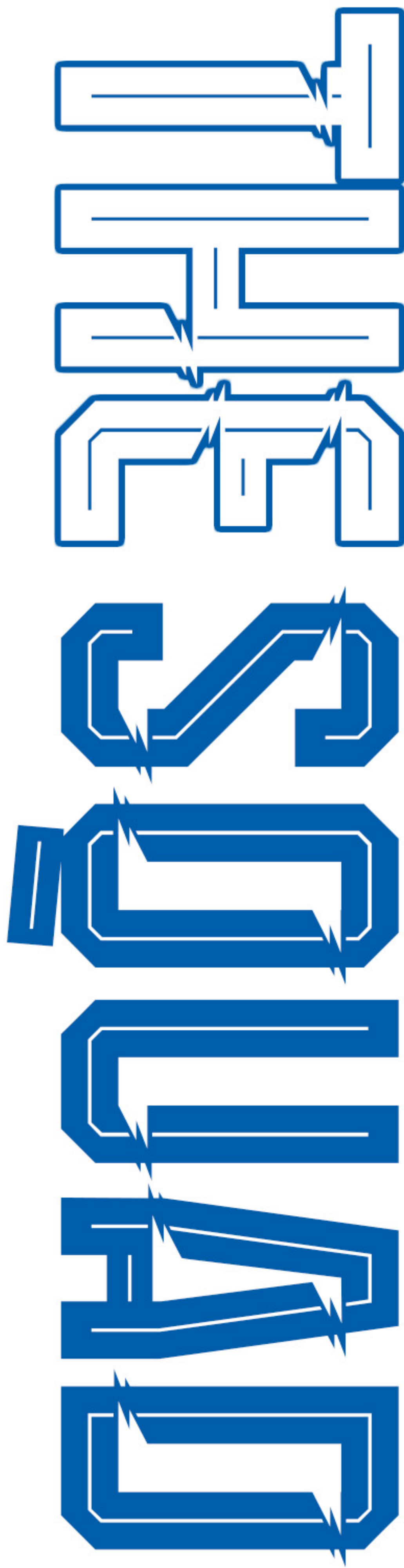


Shannon Ruth is Head Coach of Brighton & Hove Albion's Under-21s, a role he has held since 2022 after several years working within the club's academy.

Highly regarded for his coaching and player development, Ruth has played a key role in the progress of talents such as Ben White, Moisés Caicedo, Evan Ferguson, Robert Sánchez and Jack Hinshelwood. His U21 side play an attractive, progressive brand of football, highlighted by results like a 10-0 win over Crystal Palace in Premier League 2.

Seen as one of the country's brightest young coaches, Ruth is tipped for a strong managerial future.





THE DESTROYER **YUSSIF** **OWUSU**

Yussif Owusu is a dynamic defensive-midfielder for Brighton & Hove Albion's U21 side.

After moving from Chelsea in 2022, he impressed in the U18s and earned promotion last season. In July 2025 he signed his first professional contract, rewarded for consistency, physicality and strong performances. Tall, composed on the ball and tough in the tackle, Owusu combines aerial presence with defensive awareness.

Eligible for both England and Ghana, he is widely seen as one to watch as he develops.



THE PLAYMAKER **HARRY** **HOWELL**

Harry Howell is a highly promising attacking midfielder for Brighton & Hove Albion's U21s, who signed his first professional contract in July 2025.

A left-footed playmaker with flair, Howell began at Brighton's academy aged seven and has steadily risen through the ranks. He burst onto the scene in 2024-25 with standout performances in Premier League 2 and the EFL Trophy – including a hat-trick plus assist in a 5-1 win over Tottenham.

He made his Premier League debut last season off the bench against Liverpool and is regarded as one of the club's brightest young talents.



THE FINISHER **SHANE** **NTI**

Shane Nti is a rising forward in Brighton & Hove Albion's U21 setup, known for his sharp instincts and poise in front of goal.

He has starred in recent matches, scoring a hat-trick in a 4-0 Premier League 2 opener against West Brom—including a late penalty—and netted the winner in a National League Cup clash versus Aldershot.

Originally with the U18s, he's pushing through into full U21 roles, combining strength, movement and composure, with many seeing him as one of the brightest young attacking prospects in the academy.

Michael Dike**Goalkeeper**

Michael Dike is an 18-year-old goalkeeper who joined Brighton & Hove Albion's U21s from Treaty United in 2025. Calm, athletic and highly rated, he has already represented the Republic of Ireland at youth level.

Lorenz Ferdinand**Goalkeeper**

Lorenz Ferdinand is a goalkeeper who is the son of Rio Ferdinand, he spent time on loan at Havant & Waterlooville, gaining valuable experience while continuing his development.

Steven Hall**Goalkeeper**

Steven Hall is a 20-year-old goalkeeper who joined from Adelaide United in January 2024 and represented Australia at the 2025 U20 Asian Cup, saving the penalty that led the Aussies to glory in that competition.

Sebastian Jensen**Goalkeeper**

Sebastian Jensen is a young English-Danish goalkeeper, noted for his composure and shot-stopping, who developed through the youth systems at Bolton Wanderers and Stoke City before emerging as a promising talent for the Seagulls.

Nils Ramming**Goalkeeper**

Nils Ramming is an 18-year-old goalkeeper who developed through the youth academies at SC Hessen Dreieich and Eintracht Frankfurt before joining Brighton & Hove Albion, praised for his composure and potential.

Noel Atom**Defender**

Noel Atom is a 20-year-old German defender who joined Brighton & Hove Albion's U21s in August 2023 from RB Leipzig, following five years in their youth system.

Ben Barclay**Defender**

Ben Barclay is a 28-year-old central defender who began his career at Manchester City and Brighton & Hove Albion.

He has since gained experience at Notts County, Accrington Stanley, Stockport County, Yeovil Town, and Carlisle United. In July 2025, he rejoined Brighton & Hove Albion's U21s as an overage player and mentor, bringing valuable experience to the young Seagulls.

Sean Keogh**Defender**

Sean Keogh is a 19-year-old left-back from Skerries, Ireland. He joined Brighton & Hove Albion's U21s in August 2025 from Dundalk, having previously represented the Republic of Ireland U19s.

Freddie Simmonds**Defender**

Freddie Simmonds is a 17-year-old centre-back from England. He joined Brighton & Hove Albion's U21s in July 2024 and extended his contract in July 2025.

Harry Mills**Defender**

Harry Mills is a 19-year-old left-back from Brighton. He joined Brighton & Hove Albion's U21s in July 2024 and extended his contract in June 2025.

Callum Mackley**Defender**

Callum Mackley is an 18-year-old centre-back from England. He joined Brighton & Hove Albion's U21s in July 2025 from Southampton and is also capable of playing in defensive midfield.

Charlie Tasker**Midfielder**

Charlie Tasker is a 19-year-old right-back from Brighton. A youth product of Brighton & Hove Albion, he signed a youth contract in July 2024 and was promoted to the U21s thereafter.

Jacob Vickers**Defender**

Jacob Vickers is an 18-year-old centre-back from England. He joined Brighton & Hove Albion's U21s in July 2024 from Luton Town and is regarded as a promising defensive talent.

Zane Albarous**Midfielder**

Zane Albarous is a 19-year-old midfielder who joined Brighton & Hove Albion's U21s from MK Dons' youth system, known for his technical skill, vision, and ability to control midfield play.

Joe Knight**Midfielder**

Joe Knight is a 20-year-old winger who has progressed throughout the academy ranks up to Brighton & Hove Albion U21s, praised for pace, creativity, and his ability to influence games on the flanks.

Darius Lane**Midfielder**

Darius Lane is a 19-year-old central midfielder who moved from America joining Brighton & Hove Albion U21s, combining energy, passing range, and leadership in midfield, with swoops attempted by the likes of Chelsea and Manchester United in the summer, but the midfielder signing a contract to stay at the Seagulls.

Nehemiah Oriola**Midfielder**

Nemeiah Oriola is an 18-year-old midfielder who moved from Manchester United's youth system to Brighton & Hove Albion U21s in January of this year, noted for his pace, finishing, and goal-scoring instinct.

Aiden West**Midfielder**

Aiden West is a 19-year-old right winger who joined the Seagulls' academy, known for his defensive reliability and supporting attacks down the flank.

Josh Robertson**Midfielder**

Josh Robertson is a 20-year-old midfielder who moved from Sunderland's youth setup to Brighton & Hove Albion U21s, praised for his aerial ability, composure, and defensive consistency.

Kof Shaw**Midfielder**

Kofi Shaw is an 18-year-old winger who joined from Bristol Rovers, after a loan to Yeovil Town last season, in the summer, praised for being recognized for dribbling, pace, and calmness on the ball.

Joe Belmont**Forward**

Joe Belmont is a 19-year-old forward from Wales who joined Brighton & Hove Albion's U21s in January 2024 from Liverpool. He is known for his finishing and movement off the ball.

Tyler Silsby**Forward**

Tyler Silsby is a 17-year-old attacker who joined Brighton & Hove Albion's U21s in July 2025 after progressing through the club's academy, making his debut in the PL2 last term. He is known for his pace and dribbling.

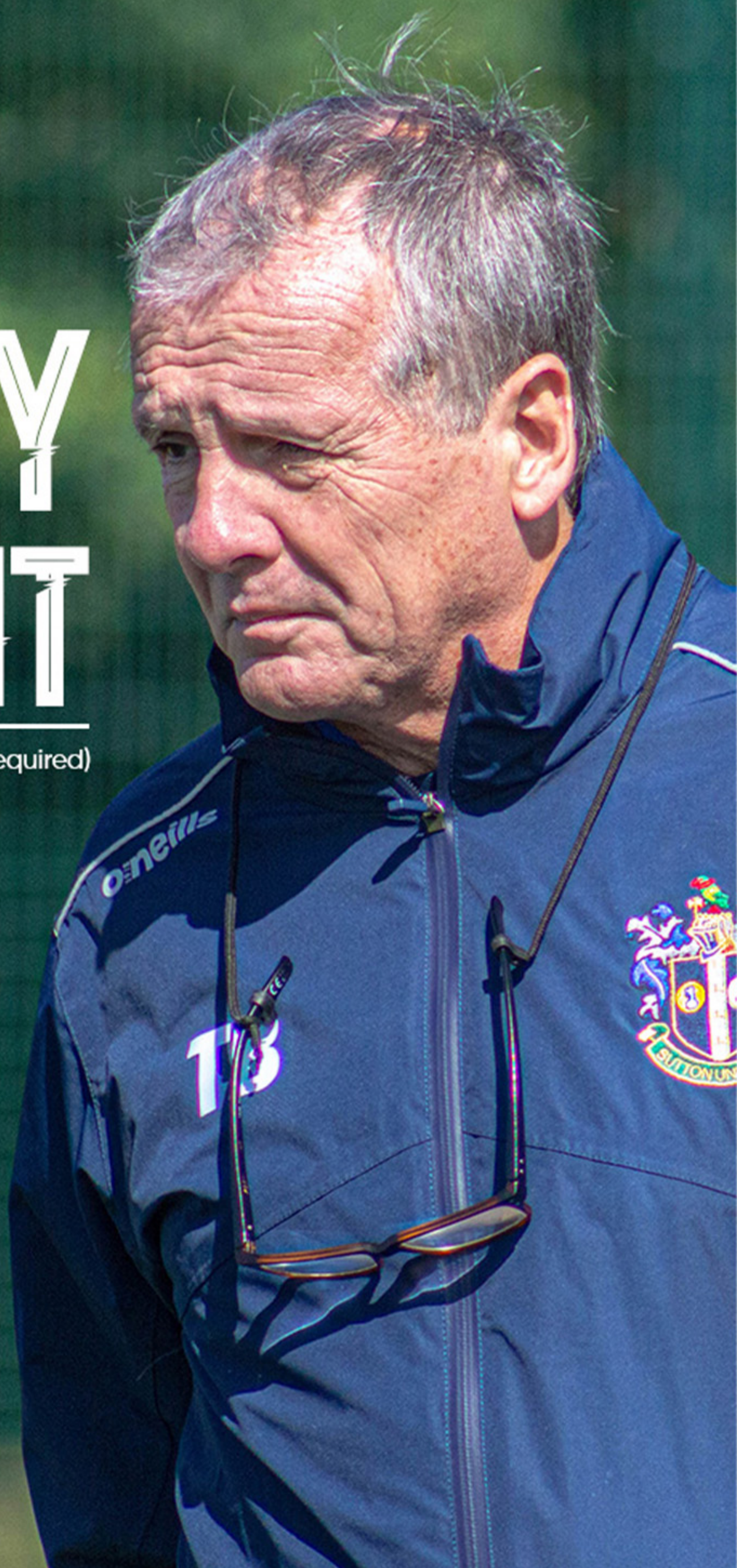

HISTORIC RAMBLINGS

Three from the 16th September

This evening's fixture is Sutton's 22nd match on this day as a senior club but just the eighth at GGL. The first was a 6-0 defeat at Redhill in 1911, a match that apparently served as both a South Suburban League (West) and FA Cup extra-preliminary round fixture. Therefore, a double whammy. It represents Sutton's heaviest defeat on this date while a 5-2 defeat at Southall in an Athenian match in 1961 and most recently (and the last time Sutton played on the 16th) a 4-1 loss at Accrington Stanley in EFL two years ago are the next heaviest. U's best win was a 5-1 thrashing of Marlow in the FA Cup 1st qual round with Jim Brown netting a treble, while Charlie Vaughan also netted a hat-trick in a 4-0 defeat of Tooting & Mitcham in 1944 in the SE Combination Cup. They were two of number of cup ties on this day, one of which is the featured match below. Of the previous seven matches at Sutton U's have won four and drawn three while away from home, U's have won four drawn one and lost nine.

The Match

As this a midweek cup tie, I have opted for another played back in 1959 played at Plough Lane. The South of the Thames Cup was a competition thought up and commenced by a couple of Bromley officials in the early 1950's and Sutton had won it in 1954/55.

Wimbledon were the reigning champions of the Isthmian League but their Athenian League visitors had matched them until an ankle injury to centre-half Malcolm Robbins after just 30 minutes reduced Sutton to ten men.



Prior to that Brian Jenkins had chipped U's into a second minute lead before U's future Wembley nemesis, Eddie Reynolds, had levelled six minutes later. U's first used Pike at centre-half before moving inside-right Percy Vince to the back but Reynolds again scored in the 37th minute from a Wallis pass. Two minutes later, Burton finished powerfully from a left wing cross.

Robbins did return after the break but as a passenger on the wing and this futile gesture didn't last long as he hobbled off. The ten men marshalled superbly by Vince held out for the rest of the match to exit the competition by a score of 3-1.

The Player

Unfortunately, I don't have a photograph of this evening's player in the spotlight. That is because Ron Crowe played for Sutton during WWII and newspaper reporting in those days had greater priorities than SUFC let alone sports photography. Playing in that 4-0 victory over T&M in the SE Combination mentioned above, Ron Crowe had played for Romford before WWII but he joined Sutton for the 1942/43 season making his debut on 26th September against Erith & Belvedere in the SE Combination. After scoring his first goal in a friendly, inside forward Ron's first competitive goals (a brace) came in a SEC match against Bromley that ended 5-5. Such were the times, a good percentage of the football season involved playing friendly matches against teams from the various services that made up the military. Ron scored 20 goals in 11 of these matches, netting five against a RAF XI (7-3) and four against an Irish Guards team (10-6!). He did also net 13 SEC goals in 14 appearances. These goal scoring exploits calmed down the following season as

THE DAVID WEIR DIARIES

The latest news from David Weir Leisure Centre; the home of the Sutton Academy and Women's teams.

Goals from Mehmet Halim, Omotolani Bello and Bobby Sheargold saw Sutton secure a thrilling 3-3 draw with Bristol Rovers in the EFL Youth Alliance South.

A point at the The Quarters (Almondsbury) sees the U's sit eighth in the division, and are back in action on Wednesday, 17th September with a National League U19 Alliance, Division F clash with Dorking Wanderers at Cheam Sports Club.

The U's were initially meant to take on the Surrey-based side at Meadowbank in the NL Football Academy South, but this game has been postponed.

A stoppage time goal by Ella Meehan direct from a free kick saw Sutton end a run of three consecutive defeats in the London & South Eastern Regional League.

It seemed that victory had been snatched from U's when visitors Barking came from 2-0 down to level in the 90th minute, and looked the likelier to grab the late winner, but Meehan's long range effort eluded everyone in the penalty area to find the net and give Sutton the points.

U's were on top for much of the first half and went ahead when Gabby Williams raced on to a ball over the top, and although her first shot was saved she was able to fire the loose ball in to the net, before seeming to have clinched the points when, after substitute Becky Olumodeji had finished off a good run with a shot that was deflected wide, Emma Spear's corner ricocheted in to the net off a Barking defender.

Within a minute the referee ruled that Meehan had fouled a Barking striker in clearing the ball, giving the visitors a chance to reduce the arrears from the penalty spot, and it looked as though Barking had grabbed a point when a quick counter attack ended with a fine finish in off the underside of the bar. In stoppage time it was Barking pressing for the winner, but Sutton defended well and when they were awarded a free kick just inside the Barking half Meehan sent the ball goalwards and it evaded everyone to end up in the net.

The next round of games will take place on 11th October where the U's will play Norwich City and Burton. The games will be held in The Nest Community Hub in Norwich.
