# CHIEF OPERATING OFFICER, TIM ALLISON



**We welcome Boston United, this afternoon's visitors to the VBS Community Stadium, after what for them must have ultimately been a satisfactory first season back in the National League.**

Many would have written them off as relegation certainties with much of the season gone, alongside Ebbsfleet. With twenty points in nine games towards the close of the season manager Graham Coughlan achieved what to others had looked impossible and Boston maintained their status in the division with a game to spare. Season two started as just as challenging but a win on Wednesday night has seen the Pilgrims lift themselves away from the relegation places, with the hosts today finding themselves in a more worrying spot following just a point earned at Woking on Tuesday.

That league position was ultimately behind the concern leading to the mutually agreed departure of Steve Morison from his position as First Team Head Coach. Whilst undoubtedly the tough combination of fixtures over the first quarter of the season can justifiably excuse the difficulty in achieving points, in a results-driven business, and with confidence such an important component of success within sport, that difficult decision was arrived at early enough to allow a successor a full opportunity to turn fortunes



around. This was something of course that Steve recognised having been limited when he took over himself, ultimately falling just short in the battle to avoid relegation out of Division Two of the Football League.

It goes without saying the Board were thankful for everything Steve achieved whilst at the Club. His mission was not just one of managing the football side over successive matches, but he was a key driver of raising standards and the infrastructure required off the pitch in setting up a club ready for Football League participation once again in the future. This was something the Board conceded in hindsight we were insufficiently prepared for when promoted as champions of the National League in 2021, and over our three-season tenure in the EFL.

Jon has taken the team for the last two matches, alongside Terry Bullivant as Director of Football – no stranger to a dugout, but less recently – and our frustrations have continued. Just one point from the available six away from home, but in both matches we expected more and came away disappointed. Two penalty decisions particularly at Woking add to the sense of asymmetry in how the footballing gods are looking down on us this season. We can only look forward at the remaining fixtures and take comfort not just from the path of our opponents today over the 2024-25 season, but also consider clubs like Southend and how they started last season and where they finished it. With belief and a new manager, and an eventual change in luck, I remain confident of consolidating in a healthier league position soon enough.

Whilst this is Boston's second season in the National League in the current run, they are a club with a pedigree at this level and supporters of Sutton like myself will be familiar with past meetings between the clubs at this level. Indeed Boston's pedigree is stronger than ours and as National League – or Nationwide Conference – champions before us they took themselves into the Football League for a short stint, albeit longer than ours, in Division Two. It may be twenty years or so later we renew rivalries once more but many in the crowd will recall past matches and seasons competing against each other.

In previous programme notes I have made reference to other teams across the club, and it is particularly pleasing that the last three first team matches have showcased the pathway our young players are progressing along, demonstrating our longer term vision and execution as a Club. It is always tempting to look at the immediate ills of the first team and extrapolate the long term health on the back of them. Against Brighton Steve played many of our brightest academy prospects, and again a defeat can be argued to be harsh given the statistics. That has continued under Jon, and it was particularly pleasing to see Charlie Bell not just make his first team league debut, but in the process join a short list of Sutton United goalscorers aged under 18 in the process. Whoever ultimately comes in to take over will know the Board is committed to a policy of investing in young players and developing them for a future in the professional game, whether with us or other clubs.

Our women's team also progressed in the Women's FA Cup, and the dream of a home fixture against Crystal Palace in a future round remains on! Similarly, Jimmy Dack will be leading the youngsters in their pursuit of silverware with a home fixture in the FA Youth Cup against Knaphill scheduled for this Wednesday, 1st October, at the VBS. Without doubt both teams will be grateful for your support. Looking forward to a successful weekend across all of the club's teams.

Graham Coughlan has been at the helm of Boston United after previous management spells with Newport County, Mansfield Town and Bristol Rovers.

As a player, Coughlan was a central defender who came through the ranks in his native Republic of Ireland, turning out for Cherry Orchard and Bray Wanderers before making the switch to Blackburn Rovers in 1995, subsequently gaining Football League experience with the likes of Swindon Town, Plymouth Argyle, Sheffield Wednesday, Burnley, Rotherham United, Shrewsbury Town and Southend United.

After beginning his coaching career in 2018, Coughlan was appointed in Lincolnshire in November 2024, with Boston sitting seven points from safety in 23rd place. Under his leadership, the Pilgrims managed to secure safety in the penultimate game of the season, something which Coughlan himself dubbed a 'miracle'.





## **THE LEADER** **ZAK** **MILLS**

After spells in the EFL with Morecambe, Oldham Athletic, Port Vale and Walsall, Boston's Player of the Season for the 2024/25 season returned to the Pilgrims in 2022 after previously departing to join Grimsby Town.

Having previously been a part of the squad who lost in the play-offs twice during his first stint at the club, Mills was a part of the Boston team who came from behind in the 2023/24 National League North playoff final to beat Brackley Town.

A key player in Coughlan's squad he made 44 appearances last season and contributed 6 goals from defence.

**THE ENGINE**  
**DYLAN**  
**HILL**

Young, energetic midfielder who was a part of the Boston Under-23 side before quickly establishing himself as a first teamer in his breakout 2023/24 season. Previously of Northampton Town, Hill made his debut for the Cobblers in the EFL trophy as a substitute in a 2-0 defeat to Cambridge United.

Hill penned a two year in the summer of 2024 keeping him at the club until 2026 and made 51 appearances last term, before penning another two-year deal in the summer.





**THE FINISHER**  
**LENELL**  
**JOHN-LEWIS**

Boston's top scorer so far in the 2025/26 season with six goals in twelve appearances, Lenell John-Lewis joined in the summer from local rivals York City whom he had spent the last four seasons with.

John-Lewis began his career with Grantham Town before turning professional with Lincoln City. Known for his physicality, he played a pivotal part in York City's promotion to the national league scoring against Brackley town in the playoff semi final.



**1 | Rhys Lovett****Goalkeeper**

Goalkeeper who joined Boston United in the summer, having spent last season in the National League South with Welling United. Started his career at Cheltenham Town but has since spent time in non league with Tiverton Town, Shepton Mallet, Shortwood United, Gloucester City, Maidenhead United, Billericay Town and Torquay United.

**23 | Bobby Jones****Goalkeeper**

Bobby Jones joined the Pilgrims in the summer following a successful campaign with Curzton Ashton where he played all but one game in goal. Previous clubs include Brackley Town, AFC Fylde and Stockport County.

**2 | Ben Grist****Defender**

Young central defender who started his career at Grimsby before earning a move to Leicester City. Grist spent last season on loan at Worksop Town, helping the Tigers earn promotion to the National League North.

**3 | Michael Kelly****Defender**

Scottish left sided full back who gained promotion with Scunthorpe United to the National League last season. A product of the Aberdeen and Leicester City academies, he previously played under Coughlan at Bristol Rovers, before turning out for Bath City, Yeovil Town and Eastleigh prior to his move to the Iron.

**4 | Conor Teale****Defender**

Young central defender who started his career in the Fleetwood Town academy, and joined the Pilgrims in November 2024 from Altrincham. Previous clubs include Arbroath, Alfreton Town and Farsley Celtic.

**12 | Jacob Scott****Defender**

Formerly of Northampton Town, Jacob Scott initially linked up with Boston's Under-23 side but spent last season amongst the First Team. Scott made his debut in March 2025 in a 3-0 win at Yeovil Town.

**15 | Matty Carson****Defender**

Matty Carson progressed through Burnley's academy before moving on to Accrington Stanley and Reading. Carson made 13 appearances for Grimsby Town last season, where he also enjoyed loan spells Radcliffe and Alfreton Town.

**17 | Alex Lankshear****Defender**

Central defender who started his career with St Albans City before earning a professional contract with Blackpool in the summer of 2022. Whilst at the Seaside, Lankshear enjoyed loan spells with Dorking Wanderers, Welling United and Ebbsfleet United.

**18 | Tom Fogarty****Defender**

Young defender on loan from Birmingham City. Has spent time on loan with Ebbsfleet United and Dunfermline Athletic.

Internationally, Fogarty has 13 caps for Northern Ireland's youth sides.

**32 | Jordan Cropper****Defender**

Right sided fullback who joined in the summer after gaining promotion to the Football League with last season's champions, Barnet. Cropper was also part of the Grimsby Town side who gained promotion to the Football League in 2022. After starting his career at Burnley, he spent time on loan at Chesterfield prior to his move to the Mariners.

**6 | Greg Sloggett****Midfielder**

Greg Sloggett spent time with Boston on loan from Hartlepool United at the business end of last season, where he made nine appearances. Formerly of UCD, Derry City and Dundalk, the Irishman came over to England with a move to Cheltenham Town in 2024, and joined the Pilgrims permanently in the summer after leaving the Monkey Hangers.

**7 | Rocco Coyle****Midfielder**

Young midfielder who joined Boston on loan until January from Hull City for his first taste of senior football. Has been named on the Tigers' bench four times in a season where he also made 19 starts for the Under-21s.

**10 | Frankie Maguire****Midfielder**

Midfielder who joined Boston in the summer of 2024 after departing boyhood club Sheffield United. Has spent time on loan with Bradford Park Avenue, Kettering Town, Chester and Chorley.

**19 | Jordan Richards****Midfielder**

Jordan Richards came through the ranks at Notts County and had previously spent time on loan with the Pilgrims during the 2015/16 season. After departing Meadow Lane in 2017, Richards went on to feature for Gainsborough Trinity, King's Lynn Town and Brackley Town before returning to Boston in 2023



## **25 | Liam Waldock**

### **Midfielder**

Attacking midfielder who came through the Sheffield Wednesday academy. Since departing in 2022, Waldock has spent time with Alfreton Town and Gainsborough Trinity where he played a key part in their play-off push.

## **9 | Jacob Hazel**

### **Forward**

Jacob Hazel was the Pilgrims' top scorer last season, ending the campaign with 16 goals. A key player in Boston's hunt for promotion from the National League North, he scored in the penalty shootout wins against Alfreton Town and Scunthorpe United. Currently sidelined due to a knee injury sustained last season.

## **11 | Kieren Donnelly**

### **Forward**

Striker who joined in the summer after enjoying back-to-back prolific seasons with Halesowen Town, scoring 50 goals across his two seasons. Started his career at Aston Villa where his original position was at full back.

## **16 | Jordy Hiwula**

### **Forward**

Signed in the summer following a season without competitive football, after leaving Morecambe in 2024. After leaving the Manchester City youth setup, he gained EFL experience with the likes of Yeovil Town, Walsall, Huddersfield Town, Wigan Athletic, Bradford City, Fleetwood Town and Coventry City, where he hit double figures in goals. He later moved to Portsmouth and Doncaster Rovers before a brief stint in Scotland with Ross County.

## **27 | Manni Norkett**

### **Forward**

A former Manchester United and Nottingham Forest youth product who spent last season on loan with Cheltenham Town, scoring in a 2-1 win against Accrington Stanley. Norkett departed the Reds in the summer to join Boston United permanently.

# HISTORIC RAMBLINGS

## Three from the 27th September

A relatively quiet day on the Sutton football calendar with just seventeen previous matches on this date. The first two were against the Guards Depot played at Caterham Barracks. The South Suburban League (West) match was drawn (no other records found) but six years later, after WWI, Sutton won an FA Cup Preliminary Round tie by 5-1. Since that last fixture, U's have played five other away games winning three (the last of which is featured below) and losing once. That one reverse was in the FA Cup 2nd qual round at Yeading in 1986 and remains, for me anyway, the most humiliating defeat in the club's history as the London Spartan League leaders thrashed the new GMV Conference club, 4-1. Utterly depressing. Like the away encounters, the home list includes a number of cup ties with just four league matches played. U's are unbeaten (no pressure lads) winning seven of the ten matches.

## The Match

We travel back just eleven years to 2014 for today's featured match and a trip to Theobalds Lane, home of Cheshunt FC as Sutton took on FC Romania in the FA Cup 2nd qual round. The Romanians plied their trade in the Essex Senior League and their colourful and noisy home following had sparked some outside interest in this tie. Paul Doswell's NL South side was a shoe-in to progress and while that prophecy was realised it was not without some anxious moments. Indeed, but for a lack of discipline exhibited by the hosts, this may have relegated the Yeading debacle mentioned above into second place in the humiliation table.

As at Yeading back in 1986, all seemed well for U's as first Craig Dundas was unceremoniously hacked down to allow Glen Southam to net an 18th minute penalty, his first goal for the club. U's continued to show their superiority and in the 39th minute Dundas was again felled in the box and Southam duly obliged. Two minutes later, Michael Spillane fired the ball in after the forward thrust had been initiated by Dundas. All very comfortable, a case of how many goals would United net.

However, FA Cup football is, of course, not always that predictable and in the second back. In the 51st minute Vasile cut in and his shot deflected off Kevin Amankwaah to wrong foot Alan Julian in the Sutton goal. A very cynical and poor challenge by Jacobs, who had conceded both penalties, saw the end of the lively Dale Binns and U's began to lose their fluency. Even so, Jesse Reindorf and Nick Bignall both squandered decent opportunities but the Romanians, roared on by the home fan contingent (a gate of 242 was recorded but the noise level suggested double that figure) kept going and in the 79th minute, Bugui made a positive forward run to set up Valise to fire the ball across Julian and in. Long gone was the comfort zone of half-time but U's held on to win the match and avoid another Yeading.

## The Player

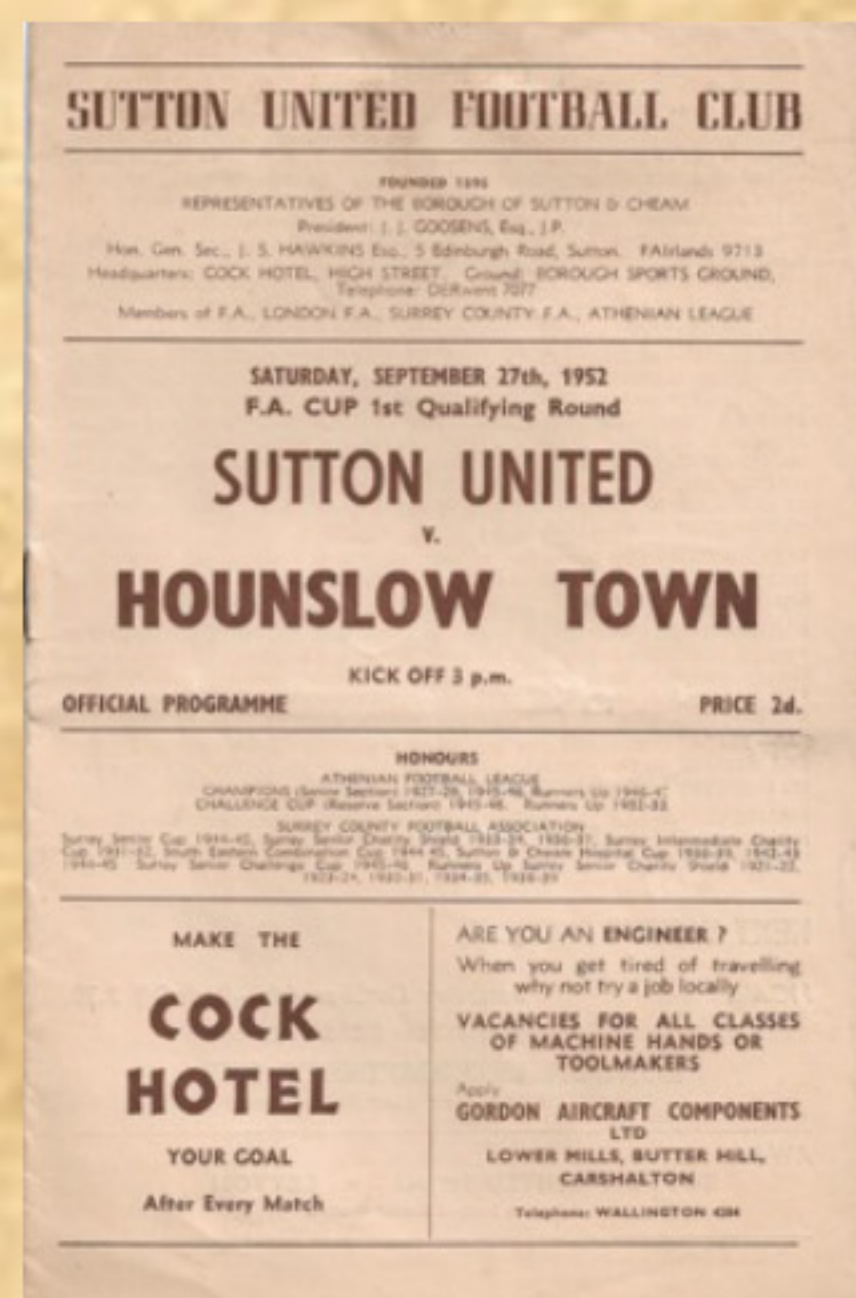
Scoring in a 2-1 home defeat of Hayes in the Athenian League on this day in 1947 was inside forward, Fred Boatwright. Pre-WWII, Fred had played for the strong Leyton side before joining Redhill for the 1938/9 season. He returned to Leyton to play for them in war-time but joined Sutton in November 1946 and having featured in a number of reserve team matches made his senior debut on Christmas Day, 1946 against Tooting & Mitcham and the following day netted his first goals (2) in the return match at Sandy Lane, U's winning that by 4-1 after losing the home game, 4-3. Those early matches saw Fred employed on the right flank but he later switched to his favoured no 8 role as U's quest to retain their AL title failed on goal average to new champions, Barnet. He netted five goals in seventeen appearances by the end of that season. The following campaign would be Fred's last at Sutton; a short-lived career at GGL.



The club's post-WWII promise evaporated over the '47/8 season and by the New Year they had scored just eleven AL goals in nineteen matches. Fred scored just one of those, the Hayes match mentioned above and while he was a permanent fixture in the side playing on either flank or inside, he didn't register another goal. For the last few weeks of the season, he joined Epsom Town. The 1948/9 season saw him at Redhill and then Erith & Belvedere before returning to Epsom for the '50/1 term. Fred played 48 times for Sutton scoring eight goals.

## The Programme

The early 1950's features today and the programme for the FA Cup tie with Hounslow Town in 1952 that Sutton won, 3-2. Following a season of "newspaper" style issues, the club produced it's first bigger size eight page programme (bigger than the two late '40's early '50's progs featured recently). Printed in brown on beige paper (cover below) this would be the standard issue for much of the period up to and including the 1973/4 season. In terms of presentation, this was arguably the best version. The inside cover held club notes written by WGR, Bill Roberts. The notes referenced the signing of George Rumble by Aston Villa, Don Stoker's obligatory inclusion in the Surrey FA squad and a paragraph on the reserves managed by club legend, Claude Pettitt. Below the notes, the following Saturday's senior and reserve fixtures were advertised.



The top half of page 3 showed the current AL tables with just one win in a combined nine matches across senior and reserve teams; the '52/3 season would be one of the worst in the club's history. One of the adverts was for the programme printers, C Evans & Sons Ltd based in New Malden. The middle pages presented the teams surrounded by adverts, Sutton Times, a decent alternative to The Advertiser and Herald for local sports coverage of the time had a square in the top left corner. Page 6 showed fixtures and results including an opening day 3-11 reverse for the reserve XI at Hitchin Town. The inside back page was given over to the Supporters' Club announcing the life-membership for a Mr R Adams of Sydney, Australia after his kind financial donation. A forerunner to Smithy Down Under perhaps? These notes were compiled by another club legend, Arthur "Toffee" Evenden. ### **SUFC v Boston United**

Last season Boston completed a National League double over U's. While the 3-0 win at GGL just over a year ago was comprehensive in score line at least, The Pilgrims were arguably a tad fortunate with their 2-1 home win, scoring late on, on a windy afternoon at the Jakemans Community Stadium. Those two matches were the first between the two clubs since March 1991 and in the interim period both have enjoyed EFL status. Prior to last season all ten matches between the two sides had been in the NL forerunner, the GMV Conference.

As last season, Boston have the upper hand being unbeaten against Sutton at their old York Street stadium, U's picking up three draws in five visits while at GGL, they recorded one win in September 1987. Of the other four Sutton won two by 3-1 in January '87 and 2-0 also in January, this time 1990. That was U's last success against Boston and look to end a five match winless run, albeit over a twenty-five year period, this afternoon. U's top goal scorer in matches with Boston is Paul McKinnon with three goals.

# THE LATEST FROM THE LEAGUE

The latest news from around the Enterprise National League.

## Four managers have joined the National League departure lounge over the last week.

Danny Webb's departure from Yeovil Town was as sudden as it was surprising. Appointed in mid-September 2025, he was in charge for just ten days and oversaw only one game, a 1–0 defeat to Tamworth. The club announced his resignation citing "personal and family reasons," with no suggestion of conflict or performance-related issues. Yeovil expressed regret at losing him so quickly, describing the circumstances as unfortunate but understandable.

The decision forced the Glovers into an early reshuffle, with Richard Dryden stepping in to steady the team for the remainder of the campaign and maintain continuity.



James Rowe and Craig Nelson both endured short, turbulent spells in charge of their clubs in the sixth tier. Rowe resigned from King's Lynn Town after a training-ground incident just four months into his tenure, while Nelson was dismissed by Tonbridge Angels after only 11 games, with the board prioritising long-term stability over his recent unbeaten run.



Kelvin Davis left Eastleigh in September 2025 after a disappointing start to the new National League season. The former Southampton goalkeeper had been appointed in 2024 and initially impressed, securing stability and earning a long-term contract. However, expectations were raised, and early results in 2025–26 fell well short. With Eastleigh languishing near the lower reaches of the table and performances lacking cohesion, the board lost patience. A home defeat to Braintree Town appeared to seal his fate. Both Davis and assistant Danny Butterfield were dismissed, with the club citing the urgent need for change to meet ambitions, and he has since been replaced by former Weston-super-Mare boss Scott Bartlett.
