# CHIEF OPERATING OFFICER, TIM ALLISON



## A MESSAGE FROM THE TOP

**A warm welcome is extended to this evening's visitors to the VBS Community Stadium, Yeovil Town, who we host for the second time since both were able to describe themselves as ex-EFL clubs.**

Like ourselves Yeovil recently parted ways with their manager, and no doubt some home supporters will be drawing comfort from the change at the helm having resulted in two wins. It is still too early to have clarity on Steve's replacement, with Jon Meeney once again preparing the team and leading efforts from the home dugout. Jon won't have envisaged himself in that position following the pre-season conclusion, and it is credit to him as a person how he has carried himself professionally at this difficult time.

I am sure that gratitude has been expressed from Board to supporter across the VBS over the last couple of weeks. All no doubt will be willing him to record a home win and three points as a reward. On the back of those six points Yeovil find themselves in mid-table with around a quarter of the season already gone – before the end of September! It doesn't seem that long ago we were beating them in our final away league game of last season. A nervy first half with a sloppy goal conceded followed by a



more dominant second half display ending with a scoreline not reflecting the reality of that dominance. That followed a less exciting goalless encounter the last time the Glovers visited almost exactly a year ago.

The clubs find themselves similar in many ways – not just with departing managers – with both being their respective county's only clubs to have played in the EFL, and both having distinct FA Cup giant killing pedigrees as non-league sides. Many will remember Yeovil playing big sides whilst in the Football League but a 2-1 FA Cup victory over Sunderland in the 1948/49 season in front of a record crowd, and the subsequent trip to Manchester United and 8-0 defeat (incidentally played at their city rival's ground at Maine Road!), has parallels with our own 2-1 victory over Coventry City forty years later and departure in the next round against Norwich at Carrow Road when we lost 8-0.

Mark Frake's article elsewhere in the programme will cover players who have appeared for both teams but two I particularly remember are, firstly, Josh Neufville. Josh was on loan at Yeovil the season before joining us, also on loan from Luton, making more appearances and scoring more goals for them than us too. Pride suggests we were a better club at developing him perhaps as he has subsequently excelled at AFC Wimbledon in EFL League Two, and now at Bradford City a division higher – scoring in his last three league games too. Secondly, and more obviously a Sutton United player, and less obviously a Yeovil one, is club legend Craig Eastmond. I recall joking with Eastie on what must have been our 2020 visit to the Huish on his singular appearance for Yeovil before being released by them. His next club must have seen something in him though as he went on to play over 300 games for them in amber! I suspect he thinks his Arsenal and Champions League pedigree feature higher in his football career highlights than that solo outing in green.

Another regular returning to the ground this evening will be the match referee David Rock, who has been refereeing here in various first team competitions since 2008. I'm sure his welcome tonight will not just be familiar, but one in which he is reminded of previous matches and decisions!

Across the club there is cup fever. The women will be playing at the unfamiliar home ground of Meadowbank as they look to defeat Penn & Tylers Green in the 3rd Qualifying of the FA Women's Challenge Cup on Sunday(3.30pm), whilst we will have our youngsters at the VBS Stadium tomorrow evening in action in 2nd Qualifying Round of the FA Youth Cup against Knaphill (7.30pm). As I type this the draw for the 4th Qualifying Round of the FA Challenge Cup has just been made, with a resulting away draw at a not too distant Farnham. The outcome of our last meeting two seasons ago is to be avenged not repeated hopefully! Hopefully all three matches will be a welcome distraction from our troubles in the National League.

Hopefully you will be able to get to at least one of those three cup matches, but in supporting whichever of our teams the shout remains the same.

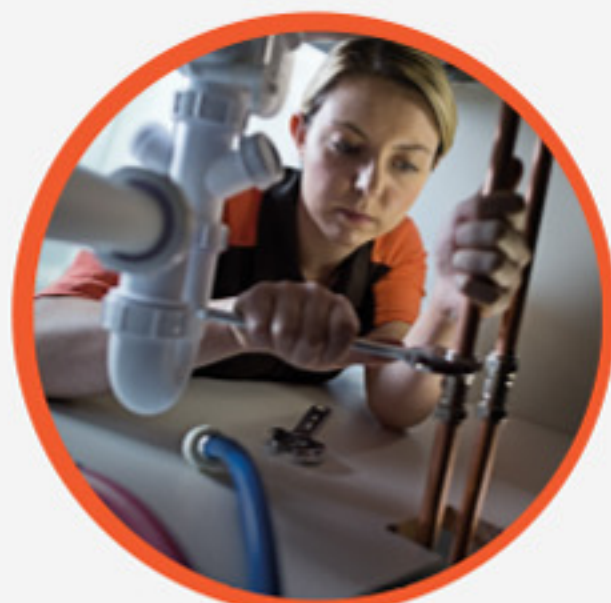

Richard Dryden has stepped into his first permanent managerial role in over a decade at Yeovil, taking charge after a brief caretaker spell following Danny Webb's resignation.

Born in Stroud, Dryden enjoyed a 20-year playing career that included spells at Bristol Rovers, Exeter City, Birmingham City, Bristol City, Southampton, and Luton Town, as well as winning the Football League Trophy during a loan at Stoke City. He finished his playing days in non-league football with Scarborough, Worksop Town, Tamworth, and Shepshed Dynamo before moving into coaching in 2007.

Dryden has worked extensively alongside Mark Cooper at clubs including Tamworth, Darlington, Barrow, and Aldershot Town, where he won the FA Trophy. He also held youth coaching roles at York City and Notts County, and spent a short spell in India with East Bengal. Since taking charge at Yeovil, he has enjoyed a winning start with two opening victories.





## **THE ENGINE** **LUKE** **MCCORMICK**

Luke McCormick began his youth career at Chelsea before moving to Shrewsbury Town on loan in 2019.

In the 2020/21 season, McCormick joined Bristol Rovers on loan, making 39 appearances and scoring six goals. His performances earned him a permanent move to AFC Wimbledon, where he played 40 matches and scored seven goals. In 2022, he returned to Bristol Rovers, making 96 appearances and scoring 10 goals.

McCormick had a brief loan spell at Forest Green Rovers in early 2025 before joining Yeovil Town in August 2025, continuing to develop as a dynamic midfielder.





**THE PLAYMAKER**  
**JOSH**  
**SIMS**

Yeovil Town midfielder Sims joined Southampton's Academy from the Elite Training Centre in 2011, making his senior debut in November 2016 with an assist in a 1–0 Premier League win over Everton.

He appeared in the Europa League and contributed to Southampton's EFL Cup semi-final win over Liverpool, before loan spells at Reading, New York Red Bulls—where he scored his first professional goal—and Doncaster Rovers. Released by Southampton in June 2021, he signed for Ross County in February 2022, before joining Yeovil Town, continuing his career in the National League.





## THE FINISHER JUNIOR MORIAS

Jamaican forward Junior Morias is a reliable National League striker who joined Yeovil in the summer.

Morias began his career at Wycombe Wanderers, making his professional debut in 2012, before loan spells at Hendon and Boreham Wood followed, where he scored the winning goal in the 2015 Conference South play-off final. Morias later joined St Albans City, then moved to Peterborough United in 2017.

Subsequent stints included Northampton Town, St Mirren, King's Lynn Town, Dagenham & Redbridge, Notts County and Woking, before rejoining Dagenham on loan in 2024 before joining Yeovil Town in August 2025.





### **1 | Jed Ward**

#### **Goalkeeper**

Jed Ward is a goalkeeper who progressed through Bristol Rovers' youth system, making his senior debut in 2021. After loan spells at Swindon Supermarine, Prescott Cables, Hungerford Town, and Wealdstone, he joined Yeovil Town on loan for the 2025–26 season.

### **22 | Matt Gould**

#### **Goalkeeper**

A New Zealand international, Matt Gould began his playing career with Hawke's Bay United in New Zealand in 2011 before playing for the likes of Cheltenham Town, Livingston, Stourbridge, Spennymoor Town, and Altrincham. In July 2024, he joined Yeovil Town on a two-year deal from Altrincham.

### **2 | Byron Pendleton**

#### **Defender**

Byron Pendleton is a 19-year-old English right-back currently on loan at Yeovil Town from Birmingham City. He joined Birmingham in January 2025 and captained their U21 side, showcasing strong leadership and defensive skills. In July 2025, he moved to Yeovil for the 2025–26 season, aiming to gain first-team experience in the National League.

### **3 | Alex Whittle**

#### **Defender**

Alex Whittle is a left back who began his career at Liverpool before moving to Dunfermline Athletic. He later played for AFC Fylde, Southport, York City, Forest Green Rovers, Warrington Town, Boston United, Gloucester City, and Chesterfield, joining Yeovil Town in 2023.

### **4 | Morgan Williams**

#### **Defender**

Morgan Williams is a defender who began his career in the youth systems of Nottingham Forest and Mickleover Sports. He joined Coventry City in 2018, had two loan spells at Yeovil Town, and signed permanently in 2021, where he has remained ever since, making almost 150 appearances.

### **5 | Finn Cousins-Dawson**

#### **Defender**

Born in Stockton-on-Tees, Finn Cousins-Dawson progressed through Bradford City's youth system, made his senior debut in 2020, had multiple loans including Spennymoor and Blyth Spartans, and, after release in 2024, signed a two-year contract with Yeovil Town.

### **6 | Jake Wannell**

#### **Defender**

A towering defender, Wannell began at Exeter City Academy, had loan spells at Chippenham, Dorchester, and Poole, then permanent stints at Weymouth and Salisbury. Success at Taunton Town, including promotion and 19 clean sheets, led to his June 2023 move to the Glovers.

### **26 | Kyle Ferguson**

#### **Defender**

Kyle Ferguson is a central defender who began his career at Rangers, later playing for Clyde, Medaille College (USA), Ytterhogdal (Sweden), Waterford (Ireland), Altrincham, Harrogate Town, and Rochdale. He returned to Yeovil Town in 2025.

### **14 | Brett McGavin**

#### **Midfielder**

Scottish midfielder Brett McGavin joined Yeovil for the 2024/25 season. A product of Ipswich Town's academy, he had loan spells at Bury, Concord, Ayr, and King's Lynn, later signing with Torquay, before moving to Yeovil to continue his midfield development.

### **16 | Jacob Maddox**

#### **Midfielder**

Bristol-born midfielder Maddox progressed through Bristol City and Chelsea academies, debuted professionally at Cheltenham Town, had loans at Tranmere and Burton Albion, played in Portugal with Vitória de Guimarães, then joined Walsall and Forest Green Rovers before Huish Park.

### **18 | James Plant**

#### **Midfielder**

James Plant, a midfielder from Port Vale's academy, debuted in 2022, had loan spells at Nantwich Town and Salisbury, signed his first professional contract in 2023, and joined Yeovil Town on multiple loans, making over 40 senior appearances.

### **24 | Charlie Cooper**

#### **Midfielder**

A Birmingham City academy graduate, Charlie Cooper played in the Football League for Forest Green Rovers and Newport County, earned National League promotion with Forest Green, and made over 150 appearances across clubs including York City, Boreham Wood, FC Halifax, Woking, and Wealdstone.

### **9 | Aaron Jarvis**

#### **Forward**

Aaron Jarvis began his career with Basingstoke Town before spells at Luton Town, Falkirk, Sutton, Hemel Hempstead Town, and Scunthorpe United. A prolific stint at Torquay United followed, netting 24 goals in 56 games, before making the move to Yeovil Town in 2024.



**10 | Ben Wodskou****Midfielder**

Ben Wodskou, a forward from Truro City, progressed through Birmingham City's academy, signed his first professional contract in 2024, gained senior experience on loan at Rushall Olympic, and joined Yeovil Town on a season-long loan in August 2025.

**11 | James Daly****Forward**

James Daly, a versatile forward from Crystal Palace's academy, gained experience with Kingstonian, Bristol Rovers, Stevenage, Woking, Harrogate Town, and Aldershot Town, before joining Yeovil Town in July 2025, bringing Football League and National League experience to the squad.

**17 | Andrew Oluwabori****Forward**

Andrew Oluwabori is a forward who began his career in Huddersfield Town's academy. He has played for clubs including Peterborough United, Boreham Wood, Kettering Town, and FC Halifax Town, before joining Exeter City in 2025. In September 2025, he returned to Yeovil Town on loan until January 2026.

**21 | Harvey Greenslade****Forward**

Greenslade progressed through Bristol Rovers' academy, gained experience on loans at Cinderford, Tiverton, Tuffley Rovers, Chippenham, Truro City, and Oxford City, achieving promotion with Truro, before leaving Bristol Rovers in 2024 and signing for Yeovil Town.

**29 | Tahvon Campbell****Forward**

Tahvon Campbell, a forward from West Bromwich Albion's academy, gained experience with Yeovil Town, Forest Green Rovers, Cheltenham Town, Woking, Rochdale, Aldershot Town, Wealdstone, and Solihull Moors, returning to Yeovil in June 2025 to provide pace, power, and goal threat.

# HISTORIC RAMBLINGS

## Three from the 30th September

We reach the quarter century of matches for U's on this date since they became a senior club. The first was the second season with senior status, a 2-2 home draw with Kingston in the South Suburban League (West) in 1911, the most recent a 3-0 reverse at Crawley in the EFL L2 just two years ago. Sutton have produced some decent performances on the 30th over the years. The biggest result was a 7-1 defeat of Hayes in the Athenian League in 1933, and perhaps the best the 5-1 thrashing of Southern League Hillingdon Borough in the FA Cup 2nd qualifying round in 1967 with Micky Mellows netting a hat-trick. Two away defeats at Barnet (0-4) in 1961 in the AL and 3-6 at Hendon ('keeper Dave Roffey stretchered off during that one) in the Isthmian League in 1965. Of the previous twenty-four matches, thirteen have been at home including eight wins and three defeats. Away from Sutton, four wins and five defeats have been recorded, one of those wins was at Griffin Park as U's defeated Brentford by 1-0 in the London Challenge Cup in 1968.

## The Match

Considering where I am typing this article, I really couldn't select any other match for today's programme an FA Cup 2nd qualifying round tie at Littlehampton Town in 2000. The Sportsfield has become well known to me over the past few years and but for a new seated stand has changed little with the cricket field adjacent leaving a rather open aspect to surroundings. Sutton were still recovering from relegation from the GMV Conference the previous season, and John Rains' team had started well losing just one in ten Isthmian matches. As the Cricket Club was given priority over ground use (still is), the Sussex County League hosts had played all their league matches away from home and had recorded just one win, at Saltdean. U's struggled to break down the home rearguard and the match was goalless at half time, but immediately after the break Scott Forrester scored with a low shot. In the 48th minute Richard Thompson headed in from close range. The Gold frustrated U's further until the 71st minute when Danny Bolt netted a penalty following a handling offence. Two goals in the last five minutes gave the score some respectability for U's with Paul Sears heading in from a Bolt corner and Thompson striking a fine 90th minute volley from another Bolt corner. U's went out in the next round to Bath City.

## The Player

Appearing twice at GGL on this day was goalkeeper Alan Thomas. Alan appeared for Fulham in the London Challenge Cup in 1969, conceding five goals but three years later kept a clean sheet as U's defeated St Albans City by 3-0 in the Isthmian League. He made his Sutton debut in the FA Cup 4th qualifying round against Witney Town at Sutton in November 1971, replacing 'flu victim, Dave Roffey.

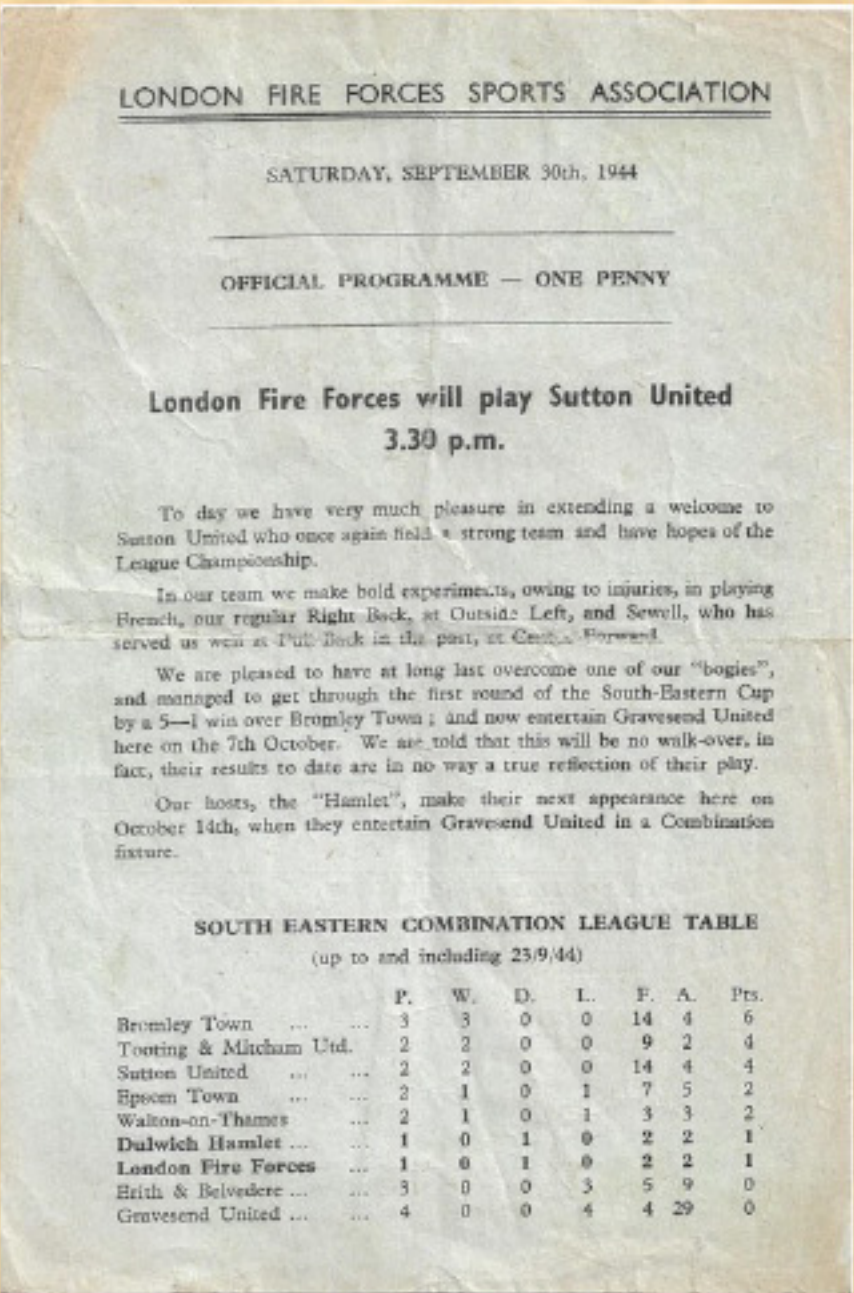


It wasn't a happy debut as U's lost a match they should have won by 1-0. He had signed earlier in the season and made a handful of appearances in the Suburban League team having spent the 1970/71 term with Wealdstone. He played the next match, another defeat, before Roffey returned but manager Sid Cann quickly opted for youth over legend and Thomas became U's first choice in December, even recovering within a week of being stretchered off at Hendon, ironically a fate experienced by Roffey as mentioned above. The following season, Alan missed just one match, himself a victim of 'flu picking up a losing finalists medal in the 1973 London Charity Cup. Ted Powell took charge of the SUFC team early in the 1973/4 season but Alan continued as first choice 'keeper, missing just three games up to the New Year. However, he was lured away by an approach from Dulwich Hamlet citing travelling problems although there were suspicions that the money Hamlet were throwing around at the time may have been an inducement difficult to disregard, after all this was still amateur football. His resignation came a week before the Amateur Cup started and thus he didn't leave the club on the best of terms (as far as the fans were concerned, anyway). His last match was on 29th December 1973, a 2-1 defeat at Boreham Wood in the London Senior Cup. Alan was a decent 'keeper and stayed at Champion Hill before joining Hendon for the 1978/9 season and then Cheshunt during the 1979/80 campaign. Alan made 116 appearances for Sutton, keeping 31 clean sheets.



**The Programme**

A war-time treat for this evening's old programme and one printed by the London Fire Force, U's hosts in the SE Combination on this day in 1944. Being war-time, paper was a scarce commodity and it was a surprise to me that clubs at this level could manage to churn anything out, so this one page, double-sided issue is, as I say, a treat to have in my collection. The size was smaller than A5. The front page (image, below) held brief notes, including reference to their surprise 5-1 thrashing of Bromley in the League Cup. The up to date table below the notes offers a snapshot of those local clubs who were able to continue throughout much of WWII. The rear listed the two line ups and a reminder in bold print that matches would only be halted in the event of enemy aircraft overhead and shelters were under the main stand; that stand being made of wood, I wouldn't have fancied the chances of anybody if a V1 dropped out of the sky. The LFF won this match by 3-1 and the return was scheduled for a fortnight later.



**SUFC v Yeovil Town**

The Glovers make their eleventh league visit to GGL this evening, the eighth in the GMVC/NL. The first was in the Isthmian League in March 1986 as the two clubs battled it out for the IL title. Sutton won by 3-1 but lost the return late in April by 2-0 in front of a crowd of over 5,000, although the title ended up at Sutton. Still in the Isthmian, the two sides drew 1-1 in February '96 but Yeovil were heading for the title when they won here by 3-0 in April 1997. At the current level of football, Sutton have won five of the seven matches played at GGL. Yeovil's only win was by 1-0 in November 1999. U's best victory was by 5-2 in December '88. Yeovil did win the Isthmian Charity Shield here in August 1986, taking some revenge for Sutton winning that IL title battle by thrashing U's 5-1.

At Huish and Huish Park, U's record over their ten league visits is three victories and five defeats. The third of those successes came last season by 2-1, the home match being drawn 0-0.

**Sutton's academy team warmed up for Wednesday's FA Youth Cup tie against Knaphill with another impressive victory in the EFL Youth Alliance.**

Sutton took the lead through Bobby Sheargold's deflected strike before Forest Green equalised from a short corner. After the break, Tito Salaam's header restored Sutton's advantage, and Sheargold's stunning volley sealed the victory. Rashaad Drysdale did miss a good chance late on, but Sutton's strong finish secured a 3-1 win, extending their unbeaten EFL Youth Alliance run to six.

**The weekend provided its usual drama on the weekend with 27 goals across the 12 games.**

There was a crunch fixture between two of the league's big hitters with York coming away from Forest Green with a 1-1 in the late DAZN kick-off.

Kairo Mitchell opened the scoring on five minutes with a good finish into the bottom corner. Ollie Pearce equalised for the Minstermen ten minutes later from the penalty spot and despite the game not having any more goals, both sides had significant chances to win the game.

The draw kept Forest Green top of the division and saw them equal their longest unbeaten start to any season. York fans will be happy with four points from games against Carlisle and Forest Green ahead of another tough game against Scunthorpe tomorrow.



Another set of promotion hopefuls took each other on at Brunton Park and Rochdale came away with a 2-0 win.

A Emmanuel Diseruvwe brace took his goals total for the season to nine and level with top scorer Regan Linney at the top of the goalscoring charts. The Dale have won six on the bounce with two goals conceded and will be looking to extend that run this midweek ahead of a visit to Forest Green this weekend.



Last season's North and South's play-off winners sit comfortably in the play-offs with Boreham Wood extending their unbeaten run to ten games with a 1-0 win against Woking. Ex-U's striker Matt Rush bagged his fifth goal of the season and left Woking with one win in their last six games.



National League North play-off winners Scunthorpe remain unbeaten in the fifth tier this season and sit in fifth place after a 2-0 win away to Southend. Two goals in five minutes from Alfie Beestin and Tyrell Sellars-Flemming secured the three points for the Iron and extended their impressive start to the season. For Southend, they will hope they can put a poor run of one win in five to one side ahead of a trip to third place Boreham Wood tonight.



The two teams with the league's worst defences came away from long trips with defeats on the weekend. Morecambe have the worst defence in the league with an average of three goals conceded per game which wasn't helped by a 5-0 thrashing at Truro. The side above Morecambe with the second worst defence is Aldershot and with their goals drying up, they suffered a 4-2 defeat at Halifax. Two goals in the opening 11 minutes gave Halifax a headstart and despite getting one back before half-time, the Shots fell apart in the second half and succumbed to the Shaymen's third win in a row.



Gateshead picked up their first win in seven with a 2-1 win at Braintree. Former Sutton loanee, Kain Adom, scored his eighth goal of the season in all competitions in the third minute before Kyle Hurst made it 2-0. Despite Fulham loanee, Terrell Works, scoring with 30 mins remaining, the Essex side failed to find an equaliser and the Heed headed back up North with three points.



Elsewhere, Solihull Moors inflicted a first defeat in five on Brackley with Dan Creaney's 80th minute goal securing a 1-0 win and Vadaine Oliver scored his first goal for Hartlepool to secure them a 1-1 draw at home to Tamworth.



Another new manager picked up his first points on the weekend as well. Eastleigh appointed Scott Bartlett as their new man in charge last week and despite former Sutton defender Aaron Pierre's red card in the second half, the Spitfires held on for a 0-0 draw at Wealdstone.
