A MESSAGE FROM THE TOP

The games are already coming thick and fast, as we face Scunthorpe United in our second home league match of the current campaign.

We may only have played them twice, in the single season overlap when we had been promoted to the English Football League before they were relegated for the first time out of the EFL and dropped to the National League. Those two games though produced some of the finest moments for our supporters in that season on our way to finishing 8th.

Whilst we had already (unluckily) lost our first match away at FGR, and secured our first point of the season with a 0-0 draw at Salford, our supporters were rewarded with a late equaliser away and were inches away from celebrating our first win as an EFL club in the dying moments with Craig Eastmond stabbing at a loose ball only to see it drift inches wide with not long left on the clock. The reverse fixture, by which time unlike our opponents we were comfortably above the drop zone, saw a 4-1 victory with Sutton players scoring all of the goals (sorry Harry Beautyman!).

After a brief hiatus we are reintroducing two of the features of Sutton United matchdays today. Firstly, our new chef – who many will already be familiar with from his new pitchside menu offer – hosts our first pre-match hospitality of the season. I am sure the 10 lucky recipients of complimentary hospitality courtesy of last Saturday's Club Shop raffle will be enjoying themselves. We have extended that raffle opportunity with tickets up for sale across the ground today so please take advantage for your chance of free hospitality at a future match.

At the risk of showing my age and recognising the majority of supporters at today's game won't have seen any football at the ground in the 20th century, it is great to have Robyn Jones as our hospitality special guest today. Robyn was one of the famous team that saw us beat Coventry in that famous FA Cup match from January 1989, and like many from that team a regular returner and ongoing supporter himself.

Secondly the Strikers Are Key draw returns to its post-match pride of place in Rowlen's Bar at just after 5pm. For those that have never witnessed this showpiece – and the regular showman that delivers it – can I recommend a visit to the Clubhouse after the game. With many new ball owners, and a double header after last week's "rollover" some serious money is already potentially on offer for the key winner. Will it open the safe though?

No doubt Steve will be looking at securing the first home win of the season, but it is pleasing that both the Under-18s and the Women's First Team have already delivered on that front. Indeed, emphatically so scoring tengoals between them in the process. I'm sure the football purists will wish to see this feat completed with a flurry of goals, but I for one would settle for a deflected scrappy effort if that's what it takes.

The table will still show the all-important three points regardless of "how". It would be great to see a move as good as that which nearly delivered a goal of the season contender narrowly missed by Alex Woodyard hitting the back of the net though. I can't have been the only one leaping for joy prematurely, can I?

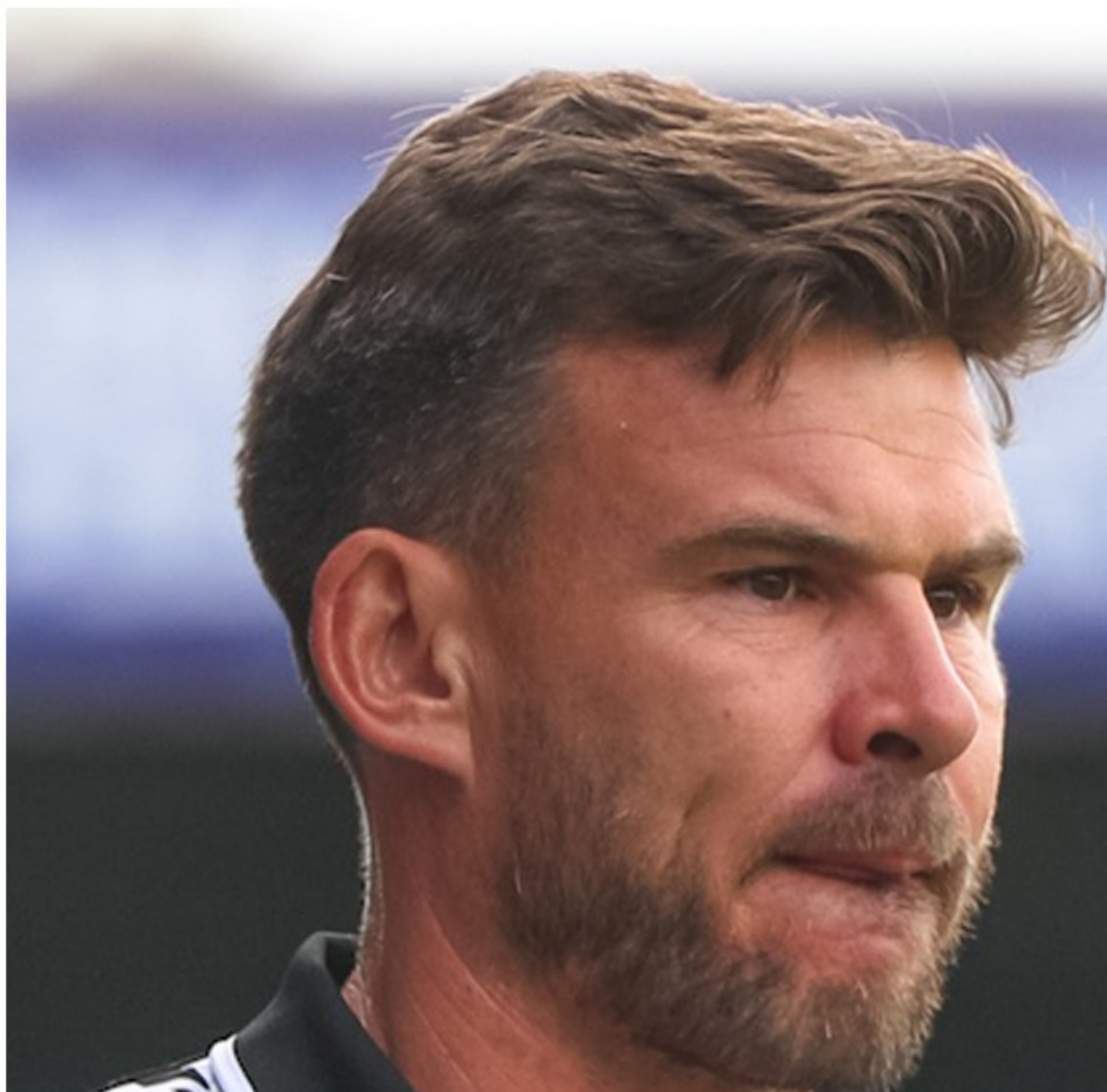

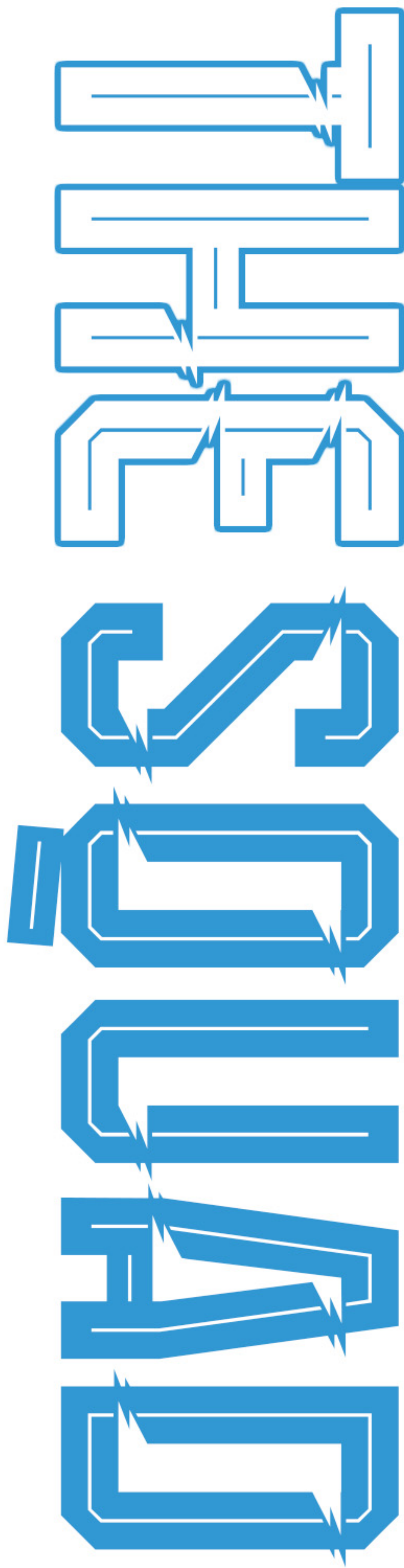


Andy Butler enjoyed a long-playing career as a commanding centre-back, making over 600 professional appearances.

He began his playing career at Scunthorpe, helping them earn promotion in 2005, before spells with Huddersfield Town, Walsall, Sheffield United and Doncaster Rovers, where he became club captain and a fans' favourite. This preceded a brief stint at Burton Albion prior to a return to Scunthorpe late in his career.

Transitioning into management, he took charge of Doncaster Women in 2020, before spells at Peterborough United and Doncaster preceded a return to Scunthorpe with the academy. In 2024 he took charge of the first team, guiding them to promotion to National League last term.





THE MAESTRO **ALFIE** **BEESTIN**

Alfie Beestin is a creative, hard-working attacking midfielder who joined Scunthorpe United in 2020 after spells with Doncaster Rovers and Chesterfield.

Starting out at Tadcaster Albion, he made the step into the professional game with Doncaster, where he showed his eye for goal and versatility across midfield and forward roles. Since arriving at the Iron, Beestin has become a mainstay with over 150 appearances, valued for his energy, vision, and knack for popping up with crucial goals.

He has also thrived in more advanced position for the Iron, playing as a striker at points last season, scoring 8 and assisting 4, making 42 appearances in their promotion campaign.



THE TARGET MAN **DANNY** **WHITEHALL**

Danny Whitehall is a powerful, instinctive centre forward who brought goals, flair and experience to Scunthorpe United in July 2023, arriving from Eastleigh, following a varied career in non-league and earning a reputation for composed finishing.

Before that, he starred in the U.S. college game at Hastings College, bagging an impressive 93 goals in 75 games and winning NAIA Player of the Year. Since joining the Iron, he's racked up 40 goals in 78 games, including a decisive brace in the play-off semi-final and the opener in the final to help clinch National League North promotion for Scunthorpe. Starting off the season with two in two, he'll be looking to add to his tally today.

THE FINISHER CALLUM ROBERTS

Scunthorpe forward Callum Roberts was pivotal in the Iron's promotion last season, scoring 20 goals to secure their return to the National League.

Born in South Shields, he spent 14 years at Newcastle United but never made a senior appearance, gaining experience on loan at Gateshead, Kilmarnock, and Colchester United. He left Newcastle permanently in 2019, joining Blyth Spartans, where nine goals in nine games earned him a move to Notts County.

After scoring 20 goals in over 50 matches and a brief stint at Aberdeen, Roberts joined Scunthorpe in 2023, playing a key role in their National League North play-off success.

1 | Maison Campbell

Goalkeeper

Highly-rated 20-year-old goalkeeper Campbell joined Scunthorpe from Mansfield via a York City loan in 2023. After two appearances that season, he signed permanently in 2024, featuring in multiple cup games. With Ross Fitzsimons departing after promotion, Campbell was handed the number one shirt for the 2025-26 National

31 | Rory Watson

Goalkeeper

Watson, 29, began at Leeds and Hull before loans, including an early stint with Scunthorpe. After spells at North Ferriby, Wrexham, Doncaster, and York—where he earned a 2026 contract—he rejoined the Iron on loan in July, having already made over 100 appearances in his first spell at the club.

2 | Oli Rose

Defender

Oli Rose joined Scunthorpe United on loan from Peterborough United in January 2025, making 12 appearances and contributing three assists during the promotion-winning campaign. In August 2025, he signed a permanent two-year deal.

3 | Branden Horton

Defender

Branden Horton was a product of Doncaster Rovers' youth system, making 31 appearances and scoring two goals for the club. Horton also had loan spells at Gainsborough Trinity and Redditch United. In 2022, he moved to Chesterfield, where he made 69 appearances and contributed to their promotion to the EFL, returning to Scunthorpe this summer. Moors in 2024.

4 | Jean Belehouan

Defender

Belehouan, 24, joined Scunthorpe United from Gateshead after spells at Tranmere, Boston United, and Farsley Celtic. A product of Manchester United and Sheffield United academies, the vocal, quick, and passionate centre-back made 26 league appearances last season, bringing leadership, one-on-one strength, and experience to the Iron's defence.

5 | Will Evans

Defender

Will Evans, a commanding 6'2 central defender, joined Scunthorpe United in 2023, becoming a defensive leader.

Known for aerial strength, composure, and organisation, he made 42 appearances in his debut season. With nearly 400 senior games and 27 goals across Boreham Wood, Chesterfield, and Aldershot, he is a reliable, vocal cornerstone of the defence.

6 | Andrew Boyce

Defender

Andrew Boyce rejoined Scunthorpe in June 2022 from Eastleigh, signing a two-year deal. A commanding centre-back, he made 38 league starts in 2023-24, scoring three goals, and featured heavily in the Iron's promotion-winning 2024-25 campaign with 40 appearances, earning a one-year contract extension through 2025-26.

21 | Joe Starbuck

Defender

Joe Starbuck, 23, began at Grimsby Town, with loan spells at Kidderminster and Boston United.

After joining Sheffield United and a brief stint at Tranmere Rovers, he signed for Scunthorpe in February 2025, becoming a regular starter and helping the team secure promotion to the National League.

33 | Tyler Denton

Defender

Tyler Denton joined Scunthorpe United from King's Lynn in 2023, bringing versatility across defence and midfield. A Leeds academy graduate, he has 154 senior appearances, scoring four goals. Denton played a key role in the Iron's 2024 25 promotion, impressing with leadership playing slightly further forward showing his adaptability as Scunthorpe went up.

44 | Ross Barrows

Defender

Ross Barrows, a Sheffield-born right-back, returned to Scunthorpe in 2023 after spells with FC Halifax, King's Lynn, and Altrincham. A former academy player, he became a first-team regular before an ACL injury in December 2024. Known for determination and coaching experience, Barrows earned a six-month contract extension to regain fitness.

11 | Joe Rowley

Midfielder

Joe Rowley joined Scunthorpe United in 2024 after leaving Fylde, where he helped secure National League North promotion. A Sheffield-born Chesterfield academy graduate, he made over 100 appearances for the Spireites and had a spell with King's Lynn.

Making 34 appearances last season, he was an important squad player in the Iron's promotion.

15 | Dubem Eze

Midfielder

Eze, 20, joined Scunthorpe United on a season-long loan from Bolton Wanderers in 2025. A Chelsea and Derby County youth product, he has impressed during loans at Warrington Town, Chorley, and FC Halifax Town.

17 | Oli Ewing

Midfielder

Oli Ewing joined Scunthorpe United from Leicester City in 2025 after impressing on loan at Buxton, scoring three goals in 19 appearances. A Fulham academy graduate and Welsh youth international, the versatile midfielder is technical, creative, and goal-minded, and has made an immediate impact at the Iron scoring on the opening day against Tamworth.

18 | Maz Brogan

Midfielder

Max Brogan joined Scunthorpe from Solihull Moors in 2024 after loan spells with Tamworth and Buxton and earlier stints at Barwell and Nuneaton Borough. Energetic and versatile in midfield, he became a fan favourite at Telford, and returned to the Iron for the play-offs last season.

20 | Kian Scales

Midfielder

Scales, 23, joined Scunthorpe United from Bradford City in 2023 after progressing through their academy and spending loan spells at Farsley Celtic. Energetic and versatile across midfield and right-back, he made over 40 appearances in 2024/25, helping the Iron secure promotion and earning a new two-year contract for his tireless performances.

23 | Billy Chadwick

Midfielder

Billy Chadwick began at Hull City's academy, with loan spells at Gainsborough Trinity and Halifax Town. He excelled at Linfield and Boston United, scoring 11 in 20 for the latter. After moves to Stockport County and Gateshead, he joined York City, making 39 appearances before signing a six-month loan with Scunthorpe United in summer 2025.

7 | Declan Howe

Forward

Declan Howe returned to Scunthorpe United from Gainsborough Trinity in 2025 after prolific spells at Staveley Miners Welfare, Cleethorpes Town, Darlington, and Alfreton. A relentless forward, he scored 67 goals in two seasons, topping the FA Trophy charts, and started his season well with two in two to start the season.

14 | Carlton Ubaezuonu

Forward

Carlton Ubaezuonu, 26, joined Scunthorpe United from Chorley in 2024 after prolific spells at Farsley Celtic and in Ireland with Dundalk, Galway United, and Athlone Town.

A robust, pressing forward, he scored 15 goals in 44 games for Chorley two seasons ago and wrote his name into Iron folklore, scoring the promotion-winning goal against Chester, sending Scunthorpe to the National League.

19 | Mark Beck

Forward

Mark Beck, 31, joined Scunthorpe United from Solihull Moors in 2024 after a career spanning Carlisle, Yeovil, Wrexham, Darlington, Harrogate, and Gateshead.

A 6ft 5in target man, he has National League North experience, Scotland U19 caps, and scored crucial goals for the Iron, including a promotion-chasing winner against Brackley Town.

22 | Joey Dawson

Forward

Joey Dawson returned to Scunthorpe United from Celtic in 2025. A former academy product, he debuted for the Iron at 16 and later featured for Celtic's first team and B side, scoring 20 goals in 21 Lowland League appearances.



HISTORIC RAMBLINGS

Three from the 23rd August.

This afternoon is U's nineteenth match on this day, all since WWII, the first being at Enfield in the Athenian League in 1947. U's lost by 3-2 with Pat Edleston scoring both the goals. This is the twelfth played at GGL and the last three (the most recent in 2011 against Staines Town in the Nationwide South) have all finished in 1-0 home victories. The most recent match on this date was in 2014 at Chelmsford City in the Vanarama Conference South. That ended 1-1, U's playing much of the match with ten men after 'keeper Tom Lovelock's dismissal. We go travelling again for my chosen match.

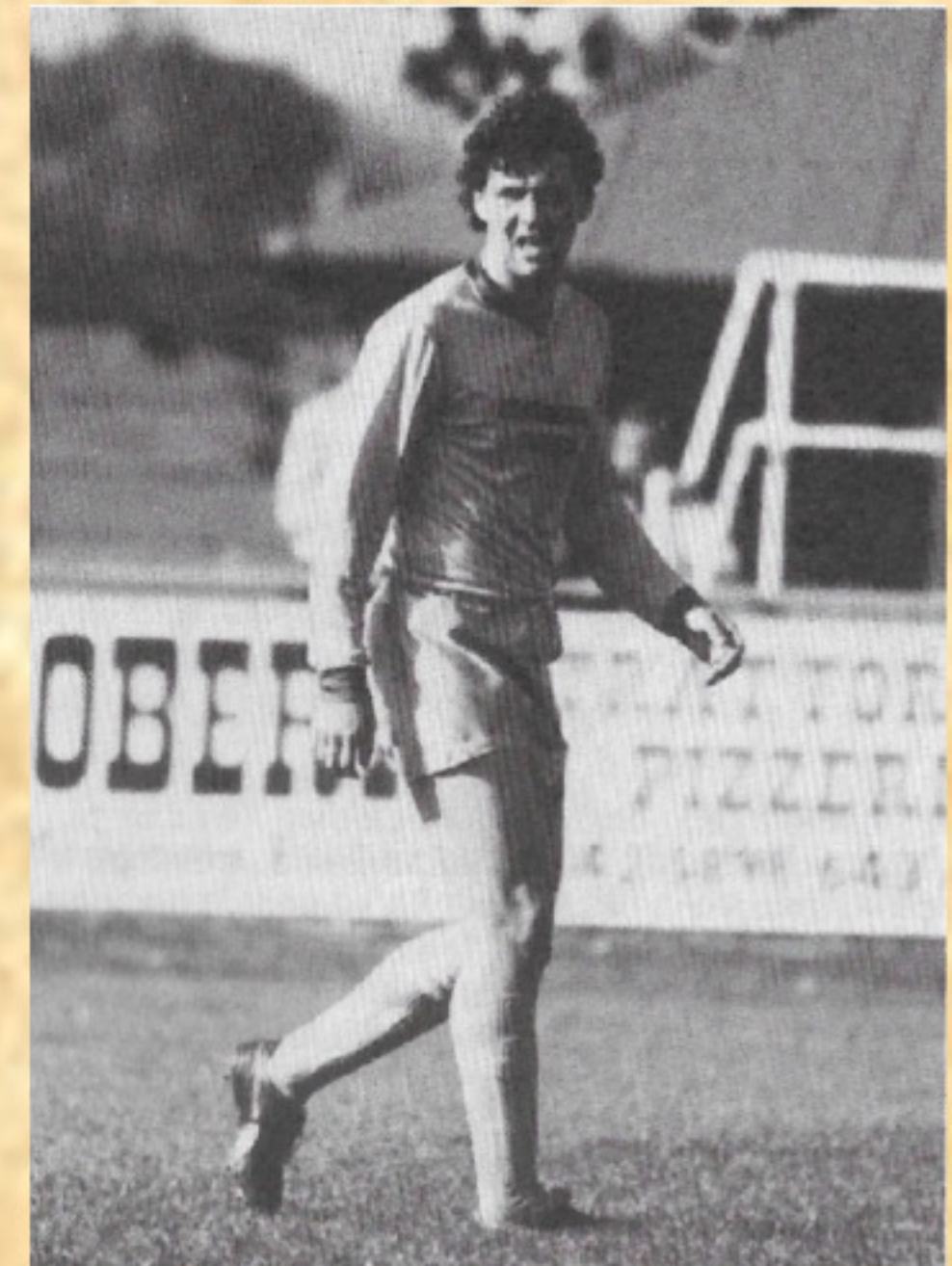
The Match

Sutton's first visit to Manor Park (there would only be one more) to take on Nuneaton Borough in the GMV Conference in 1986. It was U's first away match at GMVC/NL level and they had started with a draw and a defeat at GGL. Borough had started the season with an opening 3-0 victory against eventual champions Scarborough (then managed by Neil Warnock) and they began this match brimming with confidence. Mike Cornwell was forced to pull out on the morning of the match and Team Manager, Larry Pritchard, named himself as one of the substitutes. The first half hour saw U's under the cosh with Ron Fearon busy in goal and Phil Dawson clearing off the line. The best chance though fell to Lenny Dennis who miskicked in front of an open goal.

The second half commenced with Sutton on top and home 'keeper Corder saved from Dennis and Paul Thornton. In the 76th minute, Nigel Golley headed on Tony Rains' long throw-in and Mark Golley netted with a diving header. What appeared to be a fantastic first ever GMVC victory was scuppered in the last minute when Hutchinson broke onto a quick free-kick to cross for Morrison (two R's not one!) to head in.

Nuneaton were expelled from the GMVC before the following season for failing to obtain a fire certificate for Manor Park, a venue that had recorded a crowd of 22,114 in the FA Cup nineteen years earlier.

The Player

Scoring for Sutton on this day in 1997 in a 2-4 reverse at St Albans City in the Isthmian League was Danny Brooker. Danny was a right sided player adept at either full-back or wing back, and also played on the right of a back three when called upon to do so. He started his career in Wimbledon's youth set up, captaining the team, and played for U's reserves in 1994 before joining Dorking (the defunct one) and then Kingstonian where he spent three seasons before making his full Sutton debut on 16th August 1997 against Hitchin Town in the IL. The goal at St Albans was his second having registered in the midweek clash at Purfleet as U's romped to a 6-0 victory. This was John Rains' second season in charge and Danny remained a mainstay under JR topping the appearance chart in that 1997/98 season. The following season he netted twice again as U's took the IL title, and he held the right back berth for much of U's one season return to the GMV Conference. The following season Danny was hampered by injury making just 31 appearances and the 2001/02 season was even worse for him with regards to injury. The issue persisted as he missed half of the 2002/03 season and made just one appearance in a pre-season friendly before having to make the decision to retire at the age of just 27. As well as the IL title, Danny also won the Isthmian League Cup (1997/8) and the Surrey Senior Cup (1998/99 and 2002/03) although even the latter final saw him leave the field through injury. Danny was a solid, reliable performer for U's and has been an occasional visitor to GGL over the years. He made 256 appearances scoring 5 goals. I have no doubt but for that persistent knee problem he would have become a member of U's "300 Club".



The Programme

SUFC has PRINTED some fine programmes over the years with a decent publication in the late 1930s and then later from the mid-'70s onwards picking up a number of awards along the journey. However, today's pick isn't one of them and is probably the second worst produced since WWII. On this day U's hosted Walton & Hersham in the Athenian League winning by 3-1. The programme (cover below) was a four page newspaper style design and as you can see by the image, looked more like an advertising pamphlet. While the outer columns of the middle spread did hold fixtures and results on one side and league tables on the other, the rest was sectioned out for more adverts and many
