

A warm welcome to the Farnham Town directors, staff, players and supporters – we hope you have a safe journey to Gander Green Lane for this evening's FA Cup replay.



#### We welcome this evening's visitors to the VBS Community Stadium, Farnham Town, unexpectedly following Saturday's entertaining draw in the FA Challenge Cup competition.

It's not clear how long the discussion amongst the BBC executives took when they plumped for the original tie to be televised, but no doubt they will have been congratulating themselves come Saturday evening following a game where the teams shared six goals, and the outcome was only decided with a few seconds remaining. No doubt our visitors this evening will feel a little unfortunate on how things finished, but we know as a club that has been both victor and vanquished in the competition, as both underdog and giant, that this reflects the fascinating football on offer in this competition. I am sure there will be plenty that would settle for a single goal victory this evening, but an outcome that delivers as many goals and excitement will also be a spectacle.

Of course, this evening also presents an unexpected first introduction for Chris and his team in front of the home supporters. I am sure Chris will be a bit disappointed not to have achieved his first Sutton managerial win already, but offsetting that is knowing his Sutton tenure remains unbeaten,

and that he has had a couple of weeks to get to know his playing squad, and the task ahead of him. Whilst some of the huffing and puffing against Braintree might have been less ambition than many supporters might have wished to have seen under a new manager, the outcome was only the second clean sheet of the National League campaign to date, as well as a much needed away point. Something any manager would usually take regardless of league or opposition.

In the opposite dugout another managerial team are also on an unbeaten streak, this time covering the entire season, which puts into perspective any negativity around not being able to defeat a team two steps below at the first opportunity in this competition. Like the first leg, there is much to look forward to. Whilst 375 supporters occupied the sold out away section on Saturday, there are many more here this evening watching and willing our team to victory. Whilst there were many more examples of the type of play the new manager is wanting us to play, anything resembling the move that led to the third equalising goal will have the crowd backing the new regime. Most will be wishing such execution takes place long before the depths of added time though for sure.

As supporters we all want to be entertained and enthralled by exciting attacking football. I'm sure that is on its way, and the successes that approach brings. But it is also encouraging to see the attributes of tenacity and doggedness in fighting back in times of adversity too. Many times, and in many teams, you see players accepting defeat. To come back from being behind three times in a game, regardless of opposition and competition, shows the grit and determination not to lose that will please many on the terraces. If that is combined with tenacity, intensity, and a rediscovery of the ability our players have as individuals and a collective, that 98th minute display of total football could in hindsight prove to be the turning point everyone across the Club has been waiting for.

Farnham Town themselves will be hoping for a repeat of their last encounter at the VBS Community Stadium, also in a cup competition, that saw them as the 3-0 victors in the Surrey Senior Cup a couple of seasons ago. Since then, with respective relegations and promotions across the football pyramid, the gap between the teams has narrowed further, and our opposition will certainly feel they are worthy competitors and potential holders of ball number 80 in the draw for Round One. Following last evening's draw both clubs already know our potential opponents as we enter the competition proper, with AFC Telford United as the next step in the journey every non-league club sets out on to the potential glamorous third round tie against Premier League opposition.

It's not just the First Team that is in FA Cup mode this week, as 24 hours later the Academy will be fielding a team in the FA Youth Cup against Merstham, also at home at the VBS(7.30pm). A tougher opposition is expected against an opposition we have played a number of times before in knockout competitions. A repeat of the 8-0 result in the last round is unlikely, but like the First Team, the U18s know a potential league side awaits them as the competition enters its first round proper status.

Our Women too are not far away from FA Cup action, and after a draw at the weekend extended their unbeaten status to six games, they can draw comfort ahead of their tough draw against current league leaders Brentford Women in a week's time.





#### 1 | Zak Oualah

#### Goalkeeper

The shot stopper joined from Whitehawk, making his debut in 2025 after time at Chesham United helping them to win promotion from the Southern League Premier South. He kept 9 clean sheets in 16 appearances at the end of last season to help Farnham to the Isthmian South Central title.

#### 2 | Jack Dean

#### Defender

A defender who joined the Town in 2023 from Bracknell Town to join up with his brother. Known for big tackles, his aerial ability and overlapping runs, over three seasons he's made over 65 appearances and has been with the club since their Step 5 days.

#### 4 | Jack Stepney

#### Defender

Jordan Stepney re-joined Farnham Town in the summer of 2024, arriving from Raynes Park Vale. He played for The Town in Step 5 before he helped his current side keep 15 clean sheets, during the club's title winning season last campaign, scoring on 4 occasions.

#### 5 | Ryan Kinnane

#### Defender

Ryan Kinnane is a tall and dominant defender, often being the target for attacking set pieces. He joined the club in the summer of 2023 after captaining Berkhamsted to a league and cup double, making over 90 appearances for the Club, scoring nine times and captaining the side to back-to-back promotions.

#### 12 | Max Meaton

#### Defender

Max Meaton is known for being a modern right back but also possessing traditional qualities in terms of a hard working mentality and battling for every ball. He is a club veteran who has completed eight seasons at the Memorial Ground, known for scoring the goal that sent the club into Step 4 for the first time in their history.

#### 14 | Joe Jackson

#### Defender

Joe Jackson is a versatile player who can fulfill a whole variety of positions on the pitch with great effect who has been well counted on since arriving from Hanwell Town. Having had a lot of success under Paul Johnson and Jimmy Hibburt's management during his time at Bedfont Sports, Joe settled in quickly with the Town, scoring 10 goals in 95 appearances over the last two seasons.

#### 6 | Tom Leggett

#### Midfielder

Tom Leggett joined Farnham Town on a free transfer from National League South side Salisbury and is capable of playing across the back four and in a central midfield role. Leggett made 39 appearances for the Whites in the National League South as they established themselves in the division.

#### 8 | Harry Cooksley

#### Midfielder

Harry Cooksley is a midfield maestro, known for his sensational ball-playing abilities. After time at Aldershot Town, Farnborough and a stint in Austria for FC Pinzgau & his time in Love Island, Harry scored over 20 goals and provided over 30 assists, helping the Town achieve back-to-back promotions.

#### 10 | Darryl Sanders

#### Midfielder

Darryl Sanders is a midfield technician that can provide the killer ball for his teammates while also having a keen-eye for a goal. He joined from Bracknell Town at the beginning of the 2023/24 season, and scored twice against the U's in the 3-3 draw on Saturday.

#### 17 | Imran Uche

#### Midfielder

Imran Uche is a player familiar to Paul Johnson and his management team, having spent the 2019/20 campaign under their tutelage at Bedfont Sports where his impressive performances in the Isthmian South Central earned him a move to Hampton & Richmond Borough in the National League South. He's also spent time with Aveley, Eastbourne Borough & Billericay Town.

#### 18 | Andronicos Georgiou

#### Midfielder

A midfielder who has had plenty of stints around non-league. After time with Wycombe Wanderers and Stevenage, spells have followed at Wingate & Finchley, Hashtag United, Braintree Town, St Albans City, Hendon & Kings Langley.

#### 21 | Mat Mackenzie

#### Midfielder

Breaking through at Redhill, Hanwell Town spotted Mat Mackenzie's potential and brought him to the Club during the summer of 2022 where he quickly established himself as one of the best young players in the Southern League. He reeled in the Club's Supporter's, Committee's and Young Player of the Season award for the 2022/23 campaign, before joining the club this year.

#### 22 | Kai Tanner

#### Midfielder

Former U Kai Tanner came through the ranks at the Town before arriving at Gander Green Lane, before rejoining Farnham in 2023. He is a tricky attacker. He's known for scoring the goal that sparked the comeback for the 2-2 draw at Jersey Bulls which clinched their promotion to Step 4 for the first time.

#### 23 | Ben Purcell

#### **Midfielder**

Ben Purcell is a Reading academy graduate and after arriving in November 2024, he helped the Club eclipse 100 points as they won the Isthmian South Central in 2024/25. His one and only goal for the Town came in the 4–0 away win at Kingstonian in February 2025, and was voted by the fans as the Club's Goal of the Season.

#### 9 | Sam Evans

#### **Forward**

Sam Evans became Farnham's record signing following his switch from Slough Town. A tall, physical and athletic centre-forward, Sam came through the ranks at Woking before joining Paul Johnson and Jimmy Hibburt at Bedfont Sports in the summer of 2022.

#### 11 | Ogo Obi

#### **Forward**

Ogo Obi came through Watford's youth academy before establishing himself in non–League football with Hampton & Richmond Borough. He impressed at Hanwell Town & Bedfont Sports before stepping up to the National League South with Hemel Hempstead & Slough Town. From there, he would join Wingate & Finchley in the Isthmian Premier Division, netting 27 goals and providing eight assists in 41 games, ending the season as the league's second top scorer.

#### 19 | Great Evans

#### **Forward**

Great Evans arrived at the Club in September 2024 from Bracknell Town having played for the likes of AFC Wimbledon, Leatherhead and Hayes & Yeading. Great comes in with plenty of experience at higher levels and has the ability to operate through the middle or in wider attacking areas.

#### 20 | Adam Liddle

#### **Forward**

Adam Liddle is an energetic striker who came through the ranks at Reading before working his way around non-league. Eventually joining the Town in September 2024, he started the season strong with seven goals in the opening few league fixtures.

## HISTORIC RAMBLINGS

#### Three from the 14th October

Away matches top and tail the list of fixtures Sutton have played on this date as a senior club. In 1911, U's lost 4–1 to Old Kingstonians in the South Suburban League (West) and most recently went down by the same scoreline to Doncaster Rovers in EFL L2 in 2023. Seven other away matches have been contested, four of which have been in the FA Cup. The most recent was the 2017 4th qualifying round struggle at Paulton Rovers, then three steps below U's in The Pyramid, Sutton winning by 3–2 while the first is described in more detail below. Between them they produced Sutton's only two away wins on this day with two draws and five defeats.

Tonight is U's thirteenth home fixture on 14/10 with only one defeat, a 2-1 friendly reverse to Redhill in 1939. The last home match on this day was in 2008, the only draw, against Heybridge Swifts in the Isthmian therefore the other ten have ended in victory including the 8-0 thumping of Kettering Town in the GMV Conference in 1986, Paul McKinnon scoring four goals.

#### The Match

Semi-pros v amateurs on this day in 1967 as U's made the trip to Broadhall Way to play Stevenage Town (forerunner to the current EFL L1 club) in the FA Cup third qualifying round. The hosts sat close to the foot of the Southern League Premier while Sutton had already thrashed another SLP club, Hillingdon Borough, by 5-1 in the previous round. United were able to select centre-half Adrian Webb, returning for the weekend from Manchester University, and with scant other cover in that vital role, manager Sid Cann would have been somewhat relieved.



Stevenage came into the match on the back of only their second SLP win of the season and with rain cascading down onto an already heavy pitch they took an 8th minute lead when Mills fired past Dave Roffey following a Brooks free-kick. Five minutes later, Trevor Bladon tricked his way through to net the equaliser with an angled drive. The rest of the half was very even although U's did carve out two presentable chances, Terry Howard prominent on both occasions.

As the second half progressed, the intensity of the occasion was palpable and in the 53rd minute Micky Mellows fired in off home defender Robinson following a Howard corner. Fifteen minutes later, Cutler netted after a Brooks dead ball delivery had caused mayhem in the U's goalmouth but Sutton was not to be denied a second SLP scalp as Howard applied the final

touch after Mellows had tried his luck. A 70th minute winner, 3-2. U's FA Cup journey ended in the next round after a replay against a third SLP outfit, Barnet.

#### **The Player**


Scoring twice in the 3–2 defeat of Paulton Rovers mentioned above, and shown in Paul Loughlin's picture setting up his first goal, was attacking wide man Kieron Cadogan. Having started at Crystal Palace and enjoyed spells at Aldershot Town and Barnet, Kieron spent three seasons in Sweden playing for G.A.I.S before making his Sutton debut on 4th March 2017 against Barrow in the National League. The first of his five goals in fourteen appearances that season came ten days later in a 2–1 defeat to Forest Green Rovers. The following season only Tommy Wright made more appearances for Sutton as Kieron registered nine goals. The 2018/19 season would be Kieron's last in Sutton colours and his last match was in the FA Trophy at Bromley ten days before Christmas. United lost that tie but were reinstated as the hosts fielded



an ineligible player. Kieron moved onto Billericay Town and had a loan spell with Woking. By 2021 he was with Corinthian-Casuals and the following season, Kingstonian. He was most recently back at Tolworth playing for Casuals. Kieron made 90 appearances for Sutton, a fair number from the substitutes bench, scoring 18 goals.

#### The Programme

Retaining the FA Cup theme, this evening's programme pick is Paulton Rovers. Rovers plied their trade in the Southern League South & West Division (as was) but the programme they produced for this match was above the expected from that level. A glossy jacket protected thirty-two matt pages to produce a thirty-six page production for £2. A list of contents was on page three, a practice I have never seen the point of, and club details were on page five. Stas and league table appeared on pages eight and nine. Pages eleven to sixteen focused exclusively on SUFC with the club's history release and pen pictures taking up much of the content. The middle spread was the by now usual fixtures and results plus line ups and a full squad photo of Paulton. Five pages were taken up by pen-pics of the home side including photos. A recent match report and then notes from the chairman followed; the manager had his say on page thirty-one while the final pages concentrated on Rovers community plus their youth and Sunday sides. The back page held the team line ups etc. There were few adverts and the photography was all printed in colour. A decent effort for Step Four.

#### **SUFC v Farnham Town**

The first Farnham based opponents were the United Breweries side way back in November, 1911. That was Sutton's first entry into the Surrey Senior Cup and U's won by 11-0. Revenge was taken by FUB thirteen years later as they kicked U's out of the SSC with a 4-1 success.

As for tonight's visitors, they make their fourth visit to GGL. The previous three were all in the Surrey Senior Cup. In 1998, Andy Salako netted a hat-trick in a 7-0 first round victory and five years later Sutton won by 5-0 in the second round. Their most recent visit was in April 2023 as the Combined Counties League champions reached their first SSC final defeating a very young U's team by 3-0. The Farnham team included five players who featured last Saturday and one assumes will do so tonight. Owen Dean who scored their third goal at the weekend scored the first back in April 2024. For Sutton, Junior Eccleston was involved. The two sides also met at Memorial Park in December 2004, Sutton prevailing by 3-1 in another second round tie.

#### **FA Cup 4th Qualifying Round**

While Farnham are looking to reach the first round of the FA Cup for the first time, for Sutton it would be the 28th time including three automatic inclusions as an EFL club and three for reaching Wembley in the Amateur Cup and FA Trophy. Sutton have lost at this stage on seventeen occasions, the most recent in 2020 at home to Bromley. That was one of four exits on home soil, prior to that the most recent was in a replay to Maidstone United in November, 1983. That was one of three replays in the fourth qualifying round played at GGL. The first was in 1951, a home reverse to Folkestone by 3–1 while the most recent was in 1991, a 3–0 defeat of Weymouth.





## THE DAVID WEIR DIARIES

### The latest news from David Weir Leisure Centre; the home of the Sutton Academy and Women's teams.

Sutton United's unbeaten run of six games in the EFL Youth Alliance ground to a halt with a 1–3 home defeat to a Barnet side who got back to winning ways after their 2–3 defeat to Wimbledon last time out.

Despite creating numerous chances, Sutton lacked composure in front of goal. Fennelow's close-range strike before halftime gave hope, but Barnet's superior finishing and a late counter sealed their win. Goalkeeper Muca impressed with key saves, yet defensive lapses proved costly.

K'Shaela Burch-Waldron's hat-trick fired Sutton United into the Isthmian League Cup quarter-finals with a 3-0 win over Carshalton Athletic.

Sutton, featuring five changes from their FA Cup win, started strongly, taking the lead within five minutes as Emma Spear set up Burch-Waldron for a simple finish. She doubled the advantage with a header from Phoebe Langley's free kick, before completing her treble midway through the second half from another Langley set piece; this time a corner. Sutton's pressing caused constant problems for Carshalton, who rarely threatened, as the U's controlled the game comfortably to seal a deserved victory.

This was then followed by a thrilling 1-1 draw with Dorking Wanderers Women on the weekend.

A tight first half saw few chances, with both sides guilty of errors in possession. Dorking took the lead through Izzy Franklin's stunning 30-yard free kick, but Sutton fought back late as Gabbie Williams' top-corner strike earned a deserved equaliser. Despite relentless pressure and a flurry of late chances, Sutton were denied a winner by Dorking goalkeeper Libby Stratton's heroics. The U's

### Three of Sutton United Women's cup competition opponents have been confirmed.


The tie is due to be played Sunday, 26 October at 2pm, with any further match details to follow in due course.

The U's will also will head to Bromley in the League Cup Second Round.


The Ravens triumphed over Eastbourne Borough in the First Round yesterday, with the deadlock being broken by the visitors shortly before the break courtesy of a long-range screamer, but parity was quickly restored, as Beth Hull slotted past Sophia Moule on the stroke of half time to make it 1-1.

Melanie Espinosa gave her side the lead on the hour-mark when she pounced on a loose ball in the penalty area – the Bromley number 11 guided the ball around Moule, before firing into an empty net for 2-1, and was enough to seal the South London side's place in the Second Round, which will once again take place at The CopperJax Community Stadium.

The tie will take place on Sunday, 9th November (1pm KO), with the U's looking to improve on last season's run to the Third Round.

Gander Green Lane now has a new man at the helm, and for U's supporters the timing of the appointment of Chris Agutter could not have come at a better time.

Following on from this weekend's late equaliser from Jayden Harris six minutes into added time, a maiden voyage awaits for him in SM1 in a second attempt to get his side into the first round of the FA Cup against an incredibly resilient Farnham Town side.

However it's been a long journey for our new first team manager, with a career that started at Brighton & Hove Albion with various roles as a youth development & community coach over two spells.

It was during the 12 months outside of the AMEX Stadium he **got** his first taste of senior football, joining Eastbourne Borough in 2015 as Assistant Manager whilst also juggling duties leading the Sports' academy set up the same year. His club finished 17th in the National League South, coincidentally the same season Paul Doswell led our U's to the league title, whilst picking up his first silverware of the season in the Sussex Senior Cup, beating future employers Worthing at an all too familiar stadium to Agutter in the final.

Following a brief return to the youth setup at The Albion the following campaign, Hastings United is where his big break in management arrived. Joining initially as Head of Academy Coaching and quickly promoted into first team management after the departure of now Worthing manager Adam Hinshelwood. The work he did at the club helped to raise attendance levels to some of the highest in the club's history, some of which hasn't been since.

Chris helped the club to come incredibly close to the Isthmian South East title before the league was curtailed following the outbreak of COVID-19. However, he wasn't denied for long as the season following

two null and voided seasons saw the very well named "U's" clinch promotion to the Isthmian Premier League after a long wait to be crowned champions. It seems very coincidental that "Agi" has success with "The U's". Could that be a sign of things to come?

It wasn't long until his work would go noticed, and so the football league came calling where his philosophies of youth development and providing a clear pathway into the first team would be brought to Hertfordshire in November 2021. Stevenage provided him with an opportunity to lead two strong U18 & U21 sides at "Boro", and for a brief stint as an Assistant Manager to the first team on a short term interim basis.

However, Sussex was always his resting place, and a third spell at The Seagulls to coach within their youth set-up led eventually to another return to Hastings United, where he inherited the side he built previously fighting relegation in the Isthmian Premier, which he steered to safety and battle the top seven for a place in the play-offs and a shot at the National League South. After finishing 7th, and guiding his Hastings side to a Sussex Senior Cup final narrowly missing out to Horsham in the final, although his side didn't get promoted, his promotion to the league above would soon arrive.

After Adam Hinshelwood's departure to York City, Worthing were on the hunt for a new successor to lead them into the National League. Up stepped Chris, the second manager from the Hastings United talent pipeline to take the reins at Woodside Road. Big shoes were to be filled with Hinshelwood being one of the most successful managers in club history, bringing the club into the National League system for the first time in their history alongside a Sussex Senior Cup title. However, with an ideology of bringing through youth talent into the first team and combining that with exciting football, Agutter took over "The Mackerel Men" in May of 2024.

An incredibly impressive debut season followed, with a record points tally for the club in the National League South with 88 points. Not only that but a First Round appearance in the FA Cup alongside leading an FA Trophy charge to the fifth round, the biggest run in the club's history. The Rebels entered a six way battle for the title with eventual winners Truro City, Torquay United, Dorking Wanderers, Eastbourne Borough & Boreham Wood. Although a single defeat in their last six to The Tinners, they finished 4th & entered the play-offs in the semi-final stage, losing out to Maidstone United at home via a 2-0 defeat. It was heartbreak, but Chris was determined to go again and get things right next time around. Worthing had suffered a play-off defeat for the second season in a row, and a third time wouldn't be ideal for him.

Despite signing a new contract with the club in the summer, interest wasn't going to stop and National League clubs no doubt would've been knocking on the door. However, it was The Ambers who won out, who in turn got a "buy one, get one free deal", with his assistant Dean Hammond also joining the club alongside the 37-year-old.


With possession based football played throughout his managerial and coaching career, keeping the ball and attacking consistently will be a key part of football at Sutton United. Quite simply put in his own words, "We'll attack and we'll attack and we'll attack some more. That's the attitude."










## FA CUP REVIEW

Twelve National League sides successfully navigated their way through to the Emirates FA Cup First Round on the weekend with four sides exiting at the first stage. Two of those sides suffered defeats at the hands of league rivals.

Boston suffered a 5–2 defeat on their trip to Carlisle. The home side raced into a 3–0 lead within 16 minutes and despite two quick goals from the Pilgrims in the second half, the Cumbrians found a way to progress. Chris Conn–Clarke bagged two on his Carlisle debut to take the game away from Boston, while the opener was scored by former U David Ajiboye.



Two National League promotion chasers went head-to-head as Rochdale lost 2-1 at home to York. A brace from Alex Newby, either side of an Emmanuel Dieseruvwe goal saw the Minstermen progress to the next round and make it twelve unbeaten away from home.





The other two National League sides who fell at the first hurdle were knocked out by National League South sides. In his second game in charge of Solihull Moors, Chris Millington suffered a 2-0 defeat to Ebbsfleet. Two goals either side of half-time were enough for Fleet to secure passage through to the first round for the first time since 2022.

The final one of the four National League sides who failed to progress was Yeovil who went out to Hertfordshire side Hemel Hempstead. The Tudors had Isiah Noel-Williams sent off with the game at 0-0 but found themselves 1-0 up at half-time thanks to Kyle Ajayi. Harvey Greenslade equalised for the Glovers with 20 minutes remaining but despite the man advantage, the Somerset side failed to capitalise and it was the home side who found the winner from Finley Wilkinson's header. Wins against Bishop's Stortford and Hereford prior to Yeovil have seen Hemel progress to the First Round for the first time in eleven years.



The only remaining replay involving National League sides tonight takes place with Brackley and Woking having played out a 1-1 draw on Saturday. The remaining National League sides survived ties against lower league outfits. Scunthorpe came back from 2-0 down to win at half-time 4-2 at home to King's Lynn and Aldershot were tested away to Dorking but managed to come through with a 3-2 win.



Two sides succumbed to their opponents' pressure and conceded equalisers late on in their ties. Morecambe were denied a first clean sheet of the season by a 95th minute goal from Fin Shrimpton which sent the 1,300 Chester fans home happy. It made it five draws in a row for the Cheshire side and one win in twelve for Morecambe who head to the Deva Stadium tonight.



Truro rescued a replay late on in their tie at AFC Totton thanks to a goal from Tylor Love-Holmes with 10 minutes remaining. Having picked up their first away point of the season ten days ago, they picked up another draw on the road and will welcome the National League South side to Cornwall tonight.





Another side that scored late on to earn a replay is our opponents on Saturday, Hartlepool. An 84th minute equaliser from David Ferguson was enough to earn a 1-1 draw with Northern Premier League side Gainsborough Trinity. Gainsborough will fancy their chances in the replay tonight having lost once in their previous eight games, conceding only three times.

Five fifth tier sides won two nil, with Gateshead facing the long trip back from Aveley having secured a 3-0 win. Two goals in two minutes for Braintree saw off Farnborough and Boreham Wood continued their unbeaten run with a 3-0 win at an Eastbourne Borough side who parted company with former U's manager Matt Gray last week.

However, the Southern Premier Division Central leaders secured the unlikeliest of comebacks with 87th and 99th minute goals from Connor Kennedy and Elliot Putnam to make it 2-2. Altrincham's last victory came against the U's at the beginning of September and they won't be looking forward to the trip to Harborough tonight who are yet to face defeat so far this season.



Eastleigh extended their unbeaten run to five games with a 2-0 win at Hampton & Richmond and last season's non-league story of the FA Cup, Tamworth, secured passage to the next round with a 1-0 win over Hyde United.



Saturday's fixture against Farnham kept us all on our toes, and everyone who made the journey was treated to that last gasp excitement to bring us here for today's replay.



And whilst that equaliser brought much excitement, it is also important to ensure that celebrations don't then impact the club negatively.

The club published a statement yesterday on spectator behaviour and in particular the use of flares or pyrotechnics. It is a criminal offence to possess these items at a football match, and the consequences for those found to be in possession of them will result in criminal charges, as well as stadium bans across the footballing pyramid. Such incidents also cost the club severely with fines, and in a time when we all like to see investments made elsewhere around the club, please do think about how your actions could negatively impact the club we all care about.

Our "Meet the Manager" evening which was postponed from this evening to make way for tonight's fixture, will now take place next Monday, 20th October from 19:30 in the MBA Lounge. This will be your first opportunity to hear from Chris Agutter and his coaching team, with their reflections of their first few weeks in post and their plans for the coming months. Tickets are free (but required) for all fans through our ticketing website here.

Following our fixture against Boston we saw a triple draw for Strikers Are Key, with draws for our games against Boreham Wood, Tamworth and Boston. The first draw for Boreham Wood for £200, had Ball 45 pulled from the bag - Lennie's Size Nines, sadly no winner.

The second draw was £450 for the Tamworth game, Ball 21 - Hooked on U's - saw the safe opened. And the third and final draw for £250 for Saturday's fixture against Boston, saw Ball 4 - The Loughlin's saw the safe opened for a second time that day.

The next draw will be a double on October 18after the Hartlepool game, with a draw also taking place for today's fixture against Yeovil. Please do join us in the bar for the spectacle.




