

We welcome this evening's visitors to the VBS Community Stadium, Hartlepool United, unusually for a Saturday being a 5:30pm kick-off with all but one of the day's other fixtures having been completed.

Whilst technically this is a televised fixture, and moved to accommodate DAZN's commitment to spread the availability of non-league matches to its public, other than the timing shift this is business as usual. The last time we played Hartlepool here on the television was under much different circumstances. Coming out of the Covid ban on spectators and sitting at the top of the table, around 1,000 supporters were welcomed back to witness a special game and the promotion as champions of the National League. That seems a lifetime ago now, and with it so much change across the Club has ensued.

Many aspects of the Club are unrecognisable from that meeting, most visibly in the physical infrastructure of the stadium. Including of course the pitch. Like many others I purchased a special piece of that pitch where Tanto scored that goal, where Jamie scored that penalty etc. Its less well trodden now being in my shed, with a lawnmower (ironically) for company. I'm sure other pieces remain cherished across the supporter base. I'm not sure how many of us could have predicted that day what our future would have looked like, or indeed that of many of its participants. Some never played for us again. Some went with us into the Football League. Some independently went in the same direction, with Dave Challinor swapping managerial hot seats taking the Stockport County job, and recruiting Isaac Olaofe,

one of the goalscorers that day. And of course, Hartlepool themselves won a crazy play-off final in Bristol to book their EFL slot.

It is sometimes mindboggling for supporters who are loyal to one club over multiple years to see the churn of players and managers over much shorter periods, and how histories are interwoven across clubs such as the two on show today, as we meet once more in the National League. That churn is currently being played out on the manager's front with our recent appointment of Chris Agutter, the second since Matt Gray's promotion into the Football League, and Hartlepool currently managerless themselves after losing their 12th manager since that televised game back in May 2021.

Today was also supposed to be Chris's first match in charge in front of the home fans, but that was changed following the dramatic match at Farnham last weekend. Just as dramatic was the replay here on Tuesday evening, with another Sutton goal at the death that kept us in the FA Cup. It's remarkable to think that over the 230 minutes of that cup tie we came out winners 6 – 5, having clawed back single goal leads by Farnham Town on five occasions before that winning goal. A remarkable show of tenacity and never say die attitude from the squad. We were in front for a solitary minute. But, of course, that was the most important minute of the match. Into the next round against AFC Telford United and the dream of another big name opponent – without wishing to be disrespectful to either Farnham Town or AFC Telford United – is alive.

Our unbeaten run is extended to three matches under the new manager. Hopes are high for only our second home league win of the season – the previous being back in August! I know the cliches of it being still early, and one game at a time, apply in Chris's eyes, but all fans are backing him in turning around our home form and restoring that belief that the VBS Community Stadium is a fortress once more, as it was in the 2020-21 season referred to above.

Across the Club mixed fortunes, and continuing journeys, are taking place in cup competitions. The Surrey Senior Cup match against Guildford City was unfortunately postponed, and will now be played on Wednesday 29th October. The U18s found themselves in another thriller just 24 hours after the First Team on the same pitch, and whilst the 120th minute goal was on that previous occasion scored in the Collingwood Road end to joy, it was a last kick of the game goal in the penalty shoot out into the same goal that knocked the Club out of the FA Youth Cup, with that joy belonging to Merstham and their supporters. Our Women have their own FA Cup knockout match to look forward to next Sunday – against Brentford away at Bedfont – but did progress in the Isthmian Cup at the expense of local rivals Carshalton Athletic last week. They also feature in the Combined Counties Cup this Wednesday away to Chessington & Hook United.

Finally, can I once again ask all supporters to respect the ground regulations in place both home and away when following the club we all love. In particular, the use of flares and pyrotechnics, as well as being dangerous and disrespectful to other supporters, can result in financial penalties that don't assist the Club or team at all over the season. It is clear from the feedback received since the incident in the Farnham match that the majority of our fans endorse that and it is pleasing to actually reflect on the superb atmosphere and respect shown all round during the return leg. I would like to publicly thank you all for that rather than to only make a statement, as I had to do, covering the negatives.

Earlier this week the club published a statement on spectator behaviour and in particular the use of flares or pyrotechnics. It is a criminal offence to possess these items at a football match, and the consequences for those found to be in possession of them will result in criminal charges, as well as stadium bans across the footballing pyramid. Such incidents also cost the club severely with fines, and in a time when we all like to see investments made elsewhere around the club, please do think about how your actions could negatively impact the club we all care about.

Our "Meet the Manager" evening which was postponed from this evening to make way for tonight's fixture, will now take place on Monday, 20th October from 19:30 in the MBA Lounge. This will be your first opportunity to hear from Chris Agutter and his coaching team, with their reflections of their first few weeks in post and their plans for the coming months. 



1 | Harvey Cartwright

Goalkeeper

Harvey Cartwright joined Hartlepool this season in August from Championship side Hull City, with good EFL experience under his belt already for Wycombe Wanderers and Grimsby Town. The young goalkeeper also gained international appearances, already achieving caps for England at youth level.

12 | George Evans

Goalkeeper

Former Sutton loanee George Evans joined Hartlepool on loan from Millwall at the start of the month.

Evans gained experience on loan at Broadbridge Heath before moving to Sutton, and later rose into the First Team at Millwall at the back end of last season, before voted Man of the Match in his second game.

40 | Adam Smith

Goalkeeper

Adam Smith is a senior member of Hartlepool, joining as a goalkeeper in 2024, and also serves as the club's goalkeeping coach. Smith has previously turned out for a host of clubs, and played every game as Northampton Town gain promotion to League One in 2015/16, as well as reaching the play-offs with Yeovil and Cambridge.

2 | Jay Benn

Defender

Jay Benn is a right-sided defender who joined Hartlepool this season after spending last year on loan to League Two promotion winners Bradford City. Before that he helped Solihull Moors reach the National League play-offs in the 2023/24 season, and came through the ranks at FC Halifax Town, before spending time at Lincoln City and Irish side Bohemians.

3 | Cameron John

Defender

Cameron John came through Southend United's academy before joining Wolves in 2015. After spells with Doncaster and Rochdale, he moved to York in 2024, making 33 appearances and scoring twice. He has over 60 National League and 70 Football League appearances to his name.

4 | Tom Parkes

Defender

Tom Parkes made the move to Hartlepool back in 2024 after joining from Scottish side Livingston and also has experience playing at International level for the England youth team. He came through Leicester City's youth academy before enjoying a spell at Bristol Rovers, gaining promotion from the Conference League in 2015.

5 | Maxim Kouogun

Defender

The 28-year old Irish defender joined Hartlepool from Scunthorpe United after their promotion, having played 47 of 48 games and scored three goals. He has strong National League experience, with previous spells at Harrogate, Wealdstone, and York City, where he also achieved promotion from the National League North.

6 | Reiss McNaly

Defender

Reiss McNally is a highly rated defender who arrived at Hartlepool from Kidderminster after keeping 21 clean sheets for the side last season. McNally joined in the summer after already securing over 150 career league appearances.

21 | Louis Stephenson

Defender

Academy graduate Louis Stephenson turned professional with Hartlepool in December 2023. Within weeks, the young defender scored his first senior goal in the FA Trophy and made his league debut. That same season, he featured twice in the FA Cup, coming off the bench against Harrogate Town and Stoke City.

22 | Campbell Darcy

Defender

Campbell Darcy signed a professional contract alongside Louis Stephenson in December 2023 after impressing in the Academy. The defender made his senior debut, coming off the bench against Stoke City in the FA Cup, before making two league appearances during 2023/24.

23 | Besart Topallaj

Defender

Former Sutton Ioanee Besart Topallaj joined Hartlepool on Ioan from Bromley until the end of January.

He played 25 games on loan with the U's last season and was part of Bromley's 2024 promotion-winning side, having joined the Ravens from Millwall. Hartlepool is his third loan spell of his career, having previously played for Dagenham & Redbridge whilst at The Den.

7 | Jack Hunter

Midfielder

Jack Hunter has played over 100 games in the National League, and was part of the team who got Halifax to the play-offs last season. The midfielder, who can also play centre-back, won the FA Trophy during this time. Hunter enjoyed spells with Newcastle United and Gateshead earlier in his career.

18 | Jamie Miley

Midfielder

Jamie Miley joined Hartlepool in January 2025 from League Two side Newport County. The 21 year old spent nearly a decade at Newcastle, where he joined aged 11 and debuted for the U21s at 17 in the EFL Trophy, also featuring in first-team pre-season games.

28 | Matty Daly

Midfielder

Matty Daly returned to Hartlepool three years after spending time on loan in County Durham. A Huddersfield Town academy graduate, he has over 150 career games, mainly in the EFL, including loans at Hartlepool, Bradford City, and Harrogate Town.

30 | Joe Aungiers

Midfielder

The 18-year old has risen through the ranks as part of Hartlepool's Academy and shone during loan spells to Whitby Town and West Auckland Town, before returning to the club this season.

38 | Brad Walker

Midfielder

Brad Walker signed for Hartlepool following the expiration of his previous contract with Tranmere Rovers, after having made over 150 EFL appearances since his last spell with Hartlepool, where he rose through the Club's academy to compete in 123 appearances.

7 | Jermaine Francis

Forward

Jermaine Francis joined Hartlepool from League Two side Barnet after 34 league games on loan at Braintree in 2024/25. The 24-year-old Grenada international, capped 15 times since September 2023, scored eight National League goals before joining and has added two more this season.

9 | Danny Johnson

Forward

The experienced striker returns to Hartlepool on a permanent basis following his most recent spell at Walsall. The local has made over 350 appearances across England, Scotland, and Wales since departing Hartlepool's youth team.

10 | Adam Campbell

Forward

Adam Campbell, able to play as a winger or striker, joined Hartlepool after 45 appearances for Crawley Town, helping them earn League One promotion. An England U16–U19 international, he began at Newcastle, featuring in the Europa League at 17, and later played for Notts County, St Mirren, and Morecambe.

17 | Sam Folarin

Forward

Sam Folarin joined Hartlepool at the start of 2025, after 87 appearances for Harrogate since August 2022. He also gained senior experience at Queen of the South and previously played for Middlesbrough and non-league Tooting & Mitcham.

20 | Josh Donaldson

Forward

Josh Donaldson made the permanent move to Hartlepool for the 25/26 season after impressing in trials. The 19 year old has been a part of Newcastle United's academy, playing over 30 games in the U18 Premier League and 14 games in the Premier League.

29 | Kian Foreman

Forward

The Hartlepool-born striker made his team debut back in 2024 after spending his youth in the club's youth Academy. The youngster has made one appearance for the club this season.

HISTORIC RAMBLINGS


Three from the 18th October

This afternoon is SUFC's twentieth fixture on this date as a senior club. The first was in the South Suburban League (West) in 1913, a 4–2 defeat at Old Kingstonians. There have been some high scoring matches including today's featured match but that even doesn't match Sutton's 10–2 reverse to London Fire Force at GGL albeit in a friendly fixture in 1941. On the positive side, U's defeated Cheshunt by 6–2 in the Athenian League in 1930 also at Sutton. Archie Mason netted four of those goals, a feat that leaves him top of U's goal scoring charts for this day in history. That was one of nine home wins recorded while four games have been lost; no draws. The last of those wins was the last match on this day, a short hop back to 2022 as U's defeated Oxford United by 2–0 in the EFL Trophy group stage. Away from Sutton, U's have just two wins to their favour both by 1–0, while the other four games have ended in defeat on a date dominated by home football. Thus, Sutton are still waiting to record a draw on this day going back 112 years.

The Match

The FA Cup 3rd qualifying round in 1958 paired Sutton at home to local rivals Tooting & Mitcham United. Once Athenian adversaries, T&M had moved onto the Isthmian League and boasted a strong combination. Both sides had won their respective league titles the previous season but whereas Tooting had thrashed Ilford by 8-0 the previous week, Sutton had lost 3-0 at Leyton as the defence of their Athenian title floundered early in the campaign. The Terrors had already netted eleven goals in two FA Cup rounds and they were not going to be stopped from adding to that impressive figure.



The visitors fielded Wally Pearson in goal after he had jumped ship from Sutton during the summer. He would have a quiet afternoon, which could not be said of his successor in the home goal, Ron Vosper. U's held the T&M front line spearheaded by Paddy Hasty for 23 minutes and then the dam was breached. Flanagan (23) and Slade (30) got the ball rolling before Hasty netted the rebound after Vosper had saved his penalty (43). And in the 44th minute, Hasty netted his second with a powerful strike.

The visitors did not let up after the break, although Brian Jenkins missed a 46th minute penalty for Sutton (photo below) Grainger headed in from a Flanagan cross (52) and Viney finished off Hasty's fine approach work (61). Hasty completed his treble by racing onto a Flanagan pass to fire past Vosper (68) and added a fourth for good measure when he headed in from another Flanagan cross (79). U's had the final say when Reg Walker scored from a penalty immediately

after. Thus, the match ended 8-1 to T&M and it remains the equal heaviest peace-time competitive defeat for U's at GGL; Fulham came very close to taking that crown outright a few weeks back.


A crowd of 5,000 was recorded but T&M would play in front of far bigger crowds as they progressed to the 3rd round, holding Nottingham Forest to a 2-2 draw at The City Ground before losing the replay by 3-0 at Highbury. They had knocked out Bournemouth and Northampton on the way.

The Player

The less celebrated of the two brothers who joined Sutton from Leyton for the 1947/8 season, Cliff Hockaday was, however, supposedly the better player. They had both played for Leyton before WWII and returned there for the resumption of peace-time football but were somehow enticed to travel south of the river. While brother Les stayed at Sutton until the 1952/3 season, Cliff would


spend this one term at Sutton and appeared on this day at Finchley in the Athenian League in 1947 – one of the only two away wins on this day. Cliff actually joined Sutton before Les, making his debut at right half against Carshalton Athletic in the FA Cup on 4th October, a 3–1 defeat, completing a miserable first appearance by missing a penalty and being given the "run around" by diminutive Dennis Ford, husband of dear old Rose. He was soon ensconced in his preferred centre–half role and come December was playing alongside his brother. U's had an Easter Tour of Holland and during the first match against Sports Club Enschede, Cliff cracked a rib. That would be his last appearance for Sutton as the following term he was back in east London



this time for Isthmian club Leytonstone, where he stayed until the end of the '52/3 campaign. Cliff never really settled at Sutton and exhibited little of the form he was capable of. He made just 27 appearances.

The Programme

An away programme from 1952 as U's made what was back then a rather long journey to Cambridge to play City (formerly Town) in the Athenian League. The City programme was a small sized eight pager with blue print on white paper. The cover is pictured below and the inside held adverts including one for the Eastern Counties Bus Company offering day return trips to London for 8/9 (45p). Notes appeared on page three and focused on their midweek FA Cup replay exit to Kings Lynn to the tune of 5-1. The middle spread presented the teams in the 2-3-5 format surrounded by more adverts; The Regal was showing "Son of Paleface" and the following week's entertainment would be "The Importance of Being Earnest" starring Michael Redgrave. Page six provided an up to date AL table with both sides sitting in the bottom half. The notes continued on half of page seven while Supporters' Club notes appeared on the back page. There was no price advertised. This format would serve City throughout their stay in the AL until they opted to turn semi-pro and joined the Southern

League later in the decade. U's lost the match by 3-1.

SUFC v Hartlepool United

Hartlepool make their 8th visit to GGL this afternoon, the sixth in the National League. Two of those matches stand out in U's recent history. The first was the March 2020 fixture, which was the last played before the league was suspended because of Covid. The second, in May 2021, was not only just the third match that season that allowed any sort of attendance, it was of course the day U's confirmed the NL title and promotion to the EFL for the first time; U's winning by 3–0. Prior to that, all three matches here at GGL including that 2020 match had ended as draws. Last season 'Pools won for the first time here by 2–1. The two EFL matches ended in home wins, 1–0 in September 2021 and 2–0 just over a year later. Last season's thrilling 3–4 defeat was Sutton's first in front of a crowd at Victoria Park, the other by 1–0 coming during the 2020/21 Covid hit season. In the NL Sutton won in October 2018 and on the opening day of the 2019/20 season.






ROUND-UF

October proved to be a difficult international break for Sutton's overseas players, with only one able to contribute to a win.

Dillon De Silva started in Sri Lanka's narrow 1-0 win over Turkmenistan in the first of a crucial double-header against the Emerald, with Leon Pereira continuing his fine form for the Golden Army by scoring the decisive goal at the Racecourse International Stadium in Colombo.

This sent Abudallah Al Mutairi's side joint-top of Group D as Sri Lanka took a huge step towards qualification for the 2027 Asia Cup in Saudi Arabia, but they suffered one step back a few days later with the return fixture Arkadag Stadiony, in which De Silva once again started and marked his appearance with a goal.

Two quickfire goals from Elman Tagayev and Mekan Saparov gave Turkmenistan a comfortable advantage at the start of the second half, but the Sutton winger managed to set up a tense finale after Pereira's initial effort took a wicked



the ball inside the near post from a tight angle to halve the deficit.

However, the hosts were able to see out a narrow victory of their own and condemn the Golden Army to third place heading into the next set of Asia Cup qualifiers, with De Silva set to face Thailand in November, before a gap sees them take on Chinese Taipei in March 2026.





Kane Crichlow fared little better over in North America, with Bermuda suffering two defeats in the Concacaf World Cup Qualifiers.

The midfielder played 76 minutes against Trinidad & Tobago as the Gombey Warriors fell to a disappointing 3–0 loss, having fallen two goals behind within the opening half-an-hour thanks to goals from Dante Sealy and Tyrese Spicer, before Kobi Henry made the win safe at the start of the second half.

Crichlow followed this up with 90 minutes in their second qualifier of the international break – an away game against Jamaica – with Bermuda

looking to get revenge over the Reggae Boyz after a 4-0 defeat just last month.

However, Steve McClaren's side were able to replicate that scoreline, with Dante Leverock and Bobby Decordova-Reid scoring twice in as many minutes, before Shamar Nicholson added a third before the half was out.


This put Jamaica in the driving seat at Independence Park, with Dujuan Richards sealing another comfortable win over Bermuda with a fourth goal with 14 minutes left.

Back in Europe, Jay Coombes and Mikey Charvetto Parody were dealt a tough couple of fixtures for Gibraltar Under-21's, though the former only started one game and the latter didn't feature at all.

Coombes started and played 76 minutes as Los Llanas lost 12-0 to Scotland, before being followed by an 11-0 defeat to Portugal five days later in which he was named on the bench alongside Charvetto Parody.

Gibraltar still have another game against Azerbaijan (Tuesday, 18th October) to play this international break, before returning to action in March 2026 with Euro Under-21's qualifiers against Bulgaria and Czech Republic.




In the only tie between two National League sides, Brackley thumped Woking 6-2 at St James Park in a game that saw three players score braces. The visitors took the lead through Jake Forster-Caskey in the second minute but sixteen minutes later, the Cardinals were 2-1 down thanks to goals for Matt Lowe and Daniel Waldron.

Despite going down to 10 men after Joshua Osude's sending off, Woking went in at half-time level thanks to Forster-Caskey's second of the game. The Saints took the tie away from Woking in the second half as Lowe and Waldron completed their braces before Scott Pollock and Kyle Morrison added to the scoreline.

The victory for Brackley was their first in five games and will see them host League Two Notts County in the next round. For Woking, it is the first time they've conceded six goals in a fixture since the 1st January 2020 when they lost by the same scoreline here at the **VBS Community Stadium.**



In one of the shocks of the night, Chester saw off National League basement boys, Morecambe 2-0. Having failed to take their chances in the original tie, Morecambe did not lay a glove on the Seals and the National League North side deservedly took the lead ten minutes from time with a Dylan Mottley-Henry goal. A stunning strike in injury time from Jack Bainbridge ended a run of five successive draws for Chester and a visit to Cambridge United awaits them in Round One.



Southern Premier Division Central leaders Harborough Town's gameplan would have been thrown out the window within the first ten minutes after Riley O'Sullivan's red card in their game against Altrincham. Despite this, their opponents failed to break the hosts down and with the game finishing 0-0, it went to extra-time. A Jimmy Knowles brace either side of Sam Reed's goal secured a 3-0 win in extra-time at Bowdon Park and secured them a trip to Slough in the next round.



Today's visitors Hartlepool suffered the biggest shock of the round after their 3-1 defeat at home to Gainsborough Trinity. Despite parting company with Simon Grayson after the original tie, the Monkey Hangers were second best throughout. A Fraser Preston brace alongside a Sisa Tuntulwana opener gave the Northern Premier League side a 3-0 lead within 49 mins. Luke Charman scored a consolation goal in the ninetieth minute for the home side but Gainsborough progressed through and will host Accrington Stanley in the next round.



With the same league record in their respective divisions (three wins, draws and defeats), it is little surprise that St Albans drew with Banbury after ninety minutes (0-0). Leo Sery netted in the first minute of extra-time for the home side and despite having a man advantage for the last ten minutes of extra-time, Banbury failed to equalise. The victory sent the Hertfordshire side through to face Burton.



Another side that failed to take advantage of an extra man in their tie was Truro. Tony Lee gave AFC Totton the lead in Cornwall but a Joe Oastler red card in first half injury-time changed the game. Lirak Hasani drew level on sixty minutes but in the remaining sixty minutes of play, the Tinners failed to find the winner and Totton secured a 5-3 victory on penalties. The National League South side will travel to Macclesfield in the next round as they look to equal their best ever run in the FA Cup which was set fourteen years ago.



In National League news, the eighth managerial departure of the season occurred with Tommy Widdrington leaving Aldershot. A 40% win rate in 134 matches for the Hampshire side helped him secure FA Trophy success last season. The 54 year old was confirmed a day later as Eastbourne Borough manager, returning to the club he had a five year spell at between 2012 and 2017.

A BLAST FROM THE PAST

As we look ahead to today's game, this fixture still stirs powerful emotions from that day in May 2021 when Sutton's 3–0 win over Hartlepool clinched the National League title and secured the U's first ever promotion to the English Football League in the club's 123 year history.

Sutton took control early and delivered three decisive blows. The opener arrived through Rob Milsom's set piece invention in the 35th minute, the second came via Louis John later in the second half, and Isaac Olaofe completed the scoring with a composed finish around the 80th minute to seal a memorable victory.

The defining moments were grounded in moments of technique and intent. Milsom's low, bending free kick forced a spill from the Hartlepool keeper, creating the breakthrough that lifted the home terraces and shifted momentum entirely. From that platform Sutton grew in confidence: a well worked corner and aerial dominance produced the second, and a calm, clinical finish from Olaofe ended any lingering doubt. When the final whistle went the scenes were visceral. Players embraced on the pitch and the manager shared the moment with supporters in the stands, who due to COVID-19 restrictions had not been allowed in the ground since December, as the club celebrated promotion in emphatic style.

The manager on the day; Matt Gray described it as a day that he and everyone connected to Sutton United will never forget: "We've created history and I'm so proud." A feeling which everyone looking back on that day can surely resonate with.

Club legend Craig Dundas, who featured in two title-winning teams attributed the team's discipline as the key to "getting them over the line" that season. Dundas is one of only five players in the club's history to have completed the double of 500 appearances and 100 goals, reaching his centenary of goals in September 2017 and making his 550th appearance on the first day of the 2023/24 season.

A history-making game was also epitomised by Clive Baxter, affectionately known as Kit Man Clive, who described it as the "best moment of his sporting life". He was fittingly inducted into the club's Hall of Fame upon his retirement in 2024, recognising his 63 years of service, and hailed the team on this day for being "organised, knowing exactly what their opponents were going to do, and their detail". Qualities which this current team will be looking to emulate.
