It was just over 100 days ago that we disappointingly lost in the final of the National League Cup hosted at the VBS Community Stadium.

We are up against West Ham tonight in the third of the four group matches, and realistically have now only a long shot at qualifying for the knock-out stages of the competition. Of course, it is always the goal to progress as far as we can in each competition we enter, we also want to win every match we can. It's also the case that in competitions such as these there are opportunities to assess player development, how our team fares against a different type of opponent and style of play, and also to introduce our club to new supporters. This competition in particular ticks all those boxes.

It is also the introduction to this competition for our new manager, Chris Agutter, and his staff and it will be interesting to contrast any difference in approach from the previous regime. The club certainly took the competition seriously last year under Steve, and secured the most prize money of any club in it last year, even if ultimately not being winners. That said, it was an opportunity for squad rotation and the introduction of many academy players as a proof of the pathway to the first team. Chris has clearly articulated

his desire to win every game, but also wants a clear and unblocked player pathway too. It is certainly the case that our U18 and U19 players have had first team opportunities already this season, and they continue to train across multiple teams including the first team. Those that attended will know that Chris watched that squad in their FA Youth Cup game at the VBS Community Stadium last week too.

Heading into tonight's fixture most will recognise progress, and a style of play and intensity that suggests a turn in fortunes. Unbeaten in four matches, and plenty of nerve jangling entertainment has been evident. The team looks to have plenty of goals in them, and will be looking to take advantage of a young defence, yet mindful (as evident in the multiple goals scored by Fulham) of how a young attack can go about its business too.

Unlike with Fulham, our first opponents, who we hadn't faced for around twelve years, it is less than twelve months since we last welcomed a Hammers side – and in this competition too. It wasn't our best result, but it did show how a stand out performance for a young player can lead to career progression. We only had Junior Robinson for a short while before he travelled back to West Ham, but in that match alone he showed his ability to launch a post-academy potential career. Junior now plays for Livingston in the Scottish Premiership, and has the opportunity to play against the likes of Celtic and Rangers at Celtic Park and Ibrox.

Junior isn't the only West Ham academy graduate that has played for Sutton United though. Kyel Reid left the Hammers youngsters on a career covering multiple clubs across the top seven tiers of the English football pyramid, including turning out 21 times in the league for the Ambers in the 2019-20 season. Currently Mehmet Halim is at our club – and other than being injured may have featured tonight against former team mates – having been released by West Ham in the summer. Already having featured in the first team travelling squad earlier in the season, Mehmet is another exciting prospect on our pathway.

Those of a different (ok, older, like me!) generation will recall Mark Watson who proved a prolific goalscorer in amber. It has been rare for Sutton United players to command transfer fees, and particularly from a top division team, but Mark made that transition and played for West Ham's first team, before further moves to other clubs and a subsequent return to us to become the last player before Craig Dundas to reach the 100 goal mark for the club.

Last season in the inaugural competition we welcomed thousands of school children (and parents) to their first taste of Sutton United, and we know many have returned for a second (or more) bite. We continue that project this season – and if you are one of them tonight please don't just support our team but grab a selfie or autograph from one of our players and tell your friends. Then come back with them!





Reece Byrne

Goalkeeper

Reece Byrne signed a one-year contract with West Ham United in September 2025, with an option for a further year. An Ireland youth international, he began at St Joseph's, progressed through Bohemian FC, debuted at 17, joined Newcastle U21s in 2023, overcame injury, and joined West Ham's development squad for 2025/26.

Tom Wooster

Goalkeeper

Tom Wooster signed a one-year contract with West Ham United in September 2025, with an option for another year. The Sheffield-born goalkeeper progressed through Barnsley's academy, joined Manchester United in 2020, won the 2022 FA Youth Cup, gained senior experience on loan, and joined West Ham's development squad for the 2025/26 season.

Ezra Mayers

Defender

Ezra Mayers signed his first professional contract in January 2024, previously impressing in the 2023-24 season for the U18s. Although only young, Mayers has not disappointed at all, winning the Doris Bell awards as the Academy's outstanding scholar.

Luis Brown

Defender

Luis Brown, former Arsenal defender and England youth international, signed a professional contract with West Ham United in July 2024. Son of Kenny Brown and grandson of Ken Brown Sr, he returned to the club after captaining Arsenal U18s, debuted in Premier League 2, and made nine appearances for West Ham U21s in his first full season.

Ryan Battrum

Defender

Being at the club since five years of age, Ryan Battrum is a lifelong Hammer. He's been an instrumental player to the U18s during the 2022-23 campaign which saw them win both the Premier League South and the FA Youth Cup.

Jethro Madine

Defender

Jethro Medine, a quick and tenacious right-back, joined West Ham United in 2016. He progressed through the youth ranks, signed scholarship terms in 2023, and turned professional in January 2025. An England U17 international, Medine starred for the U18s, contributing goals and assists and helping them win the Premier League Cup.

Rayan Oydedabe

Defender

Rayan Oyebade, a strong and composed left-sided centre-back, joined West Ham United in 2021 and debuted for England U15s the same year. Despite injury setbacks, he impressed for the U18s, captaining the side in Premier League South and the Premier League Cup final, earning his first professional contract in April 2025.

Dan Rigge

Midfielder

Dan Rigge joined West Ham United's Academy as a scholar in June 2022. The creative midfielder helped the U18s win the FA Youth Cup and Premier League South in his debut season. After 19 goal contributions in 2023/24 and a Premier League 2 debut goal, he signed his first professional contract in October 2023.

Tyron Akpata

Midfielder

Dagenham-born midfielder Tyron Akpata joined West Ham United as an U15 and signed his first professional contract in July 2024. Energetic and committed, he helped the U18s win the FA Youth Cup and Premier League South, captained the side the following season, and made 32 U21 appearances, earning February's Club Goal of the Month.

Riley Hargan

Midfielder

A lifelong West Ham fan, Riley Hargan joined the Club's Academy at six and signed Scholarship terms in 2023. The intelligent central midfielder scored in consecutive U18 Premier League South matches, started the Premier League Cup final win over Reading, and signed his first professional contract ahead of joining the U21s.

Preston Fearon

Midfielder

Preston Fearon joined West Ham United from Chelsea as an U15 in 2021 and signed Scholarship terms in 2023. Despite early injury setbacks, he captained the U18s in 2024/25, starred in their Premier League Cup triumph, made his U21 debut, won the Dylan Tombides Award, and scored twice in the EFL Trophy.

Emeke Adiele

Midfielder

Emeka Adiele, a quick and versatile left-back or wing-back, signed Scholarship terms in 2023 and his first professional contract at 17 in 2024. He debuted in Premier League 2 that April, scored key goals for the U21s, helped the U18s win the Premier League Cup, and represented England at U17 and U18 level.

Gabriel Caliste

Midfielder

Gabriel Caliste joined West Ham United's Academy in 2021 and became Mauritius' first full international from the Club in 2024. A versatile defender or midfielder, he impressed for the U18s, helping win the Premier League Cup, and signed his first professional contract in January 2025 after debuting in CAF World Cup qualifying.

Daniel Cummings

Forward

Daniel Cummings joined West Ham United from Celtic in July 2025 after a prolific 14-year spell in Glasgow. A natural goalscorer, he netted 29 goals in 37 games for Celtic's B team in 2024/25, featured in the UEFA Youth League, and made his senior debut in the Champions League against Aston Villa.

Josh Ajala

Forward

Josh Ajala joined West Ham United from Chelsea ahead of the 2023/24 season and signed his first professional contract that November. A quick, two-footed striker, he scored 19 goals in his debut season, became the U21s' top scorer the following year, and netted seven goals in the U18s' Premier League Cup triumph, establishing himself as a potent attacking threat.

Elisha Sowunmi

Forward

Elisha Sowunmi, a skilful and hard-working attacker capable across the front line, signed Scholarship terms in 2023 and quickly impressed with a brace against Tottenham. He became the U18s' top scorer in 2024/25, helped win the Premier League Cup, and signed his first professional contract in June 2025 before joining the U21s.

HISTORIC RAMBLINGS

Three from the 21st October

The club's first match on this date as a senior outfit was in 1911, an Amateur Cup 2nd round tie against East Grinstead played at the London Road Ground that Sutton used back then. Goals from Harding 2 and Jackson produced a 3-0 success. Seven other home matches have been played since, four of which have been cup ties. The most recent two of those ties produced impressive victories. In 1972, emergency right winger Robin Gonzales was the hero scoring twice as amateurs U's defeated semi-professional Wimbledon by 3-1 and then in 1995 when Sutton defeated Crawley Town by 4-1 with Mark Hynes and Dominic Feltham both scoring twice. These were both in the FA Cup in the third and fourth qualifying rounds respectively. The most recent home game was a 2-3 reverse to Morecambe in EFL L2 in 2023. U's record is W4 D2 L2. Away from Sutton there has been a dozen matches with U's record standing at W7 D3 L2 with cup progress in the Surrey Charity Shield (1922), FA Cup (1959 and 1978) and the AC Delco (Isthmian League) Cup (1985). The league matches have produced just two victories both against Billericay Town, the first of which is featured below.

The Match

Sutton travelled to New Lodge in 2000 proving hard to defeat but already nine points adrift of eventual Isthmian champions Farnborough Town, the club's hopes of a quick return to the GMV Conference dashed by a very poor run in the second half of the season. This afternoon would prove arguably the highlight of that IL campaign. Billericay sat one point above United unbeaten in their first five home league matches, while Sutton came into this match having suffered a disappointing FA Cup exit at Bath City. Manager John Rains gave a debut to forward Rob Haworth signed on loan from Dagenham.


U's started well and in the 8th minute Chris Boothe netted following a Dave Harlow corner. Linger missed a fine chance for the hosts before home custodian King could only parry a Danny Bolt shot and Richard Thompson was on hand to scramble the ball in. Sutton 'keeper Gareth Howells made a fantastic save to deny Dunwell but in the 27th minute King cleared, only for Harlow to return the ball with interest from a full forty yards to score a magnificent goal.

Although three goals to the good at the break the half had been far from one-sided but in the 51st minute Thompson headed his second goal from Bolt's free-kick delivery and the match was over. U's coasted until the 87th minute when Damien Panter anticipated a poor pass to set up Bolt to fire in a low twenty yard shot; 5–0 to Sutton and with the exception of a 1–0 defeat of Farnborough at GGL, it never got any better than this afternoon during the 2000/01 season. The attendance was 566.

The Player


Appearing in goal for Sutton on this day in 1959 in a fine FA Cup replay win at Woking (3-1) was Ray Watkins. Ray had started in junior football with a club called Union FC before a nomadic existence took him to Charlton Athletic, Plymouth Argyle, Crystal Palace, Kingstonian and finally Epsom from where he joined SUFC to make his debut on 4th April 1959 against Barnet in the Athenian League. He was the fourth 'keeper used by Sutton that season having signed a month before, initially turning out for the reserve XI. The following season, Ray was Sutton's first choice goalkeeper missing just three matches



and enjoying the club's post season trip to a Belgian Tournament, U's unbeaten over three matches. Certainly more than the shock 3-0 defeat to Dorking in the Surrey Senior Shield. The 1960/61 season saw Ray ever-present (48 matches) although he did miss the June trip to another summer tournament, this time in Holland. An apparent loss of confidence saw Ray step down for six matches during October/November 1961 as Wally Pearson returned to the club but once again he returned to claim the role as his own for the rest of the season, the "highlight" a Surrey Senior Cup finalists' medal as U's lost to Walton & Hersham. The 1962/3 season would be Ray's last at GGL. He started as the number one but the signing of Dave Roffey saw Ray lose that mantle and while he stayed with club for the rest of the season his opportunities for the first XI were limited, missing out on the Amateur Cup Final at Wembley, an Athenian League Cup winners' medal for the reserves scant consolation. The next season was U's first in the Isthmian League but Ray opted to stay in the Athenian League and joined neighbours Carshalton Athletic. He then spent two seasons at Tooting & Mitcham United before returning to Carshalton for the 1966/67 season. Ray made 136 appearances for Sutton keeping 28 clean sheets.

The Programme

1978 provides today's programme, that of Windsor & Eton, Sutton's hosts in the FA Cup 3rd qualifying round. The cover shown is printed on glossy paper. The rest of the programme was matt paper and the printing of the type used by schools back then; some sort of chemical process that gave off a pungent smell when relatively fresh. The inside cover and indeed the back were unused. The first inside page listed club officials, HRH The Duke of Edinburgh, the club's patron, appearing at the very top. The club notes announced as being from manager Brian Caterer but written by the club's secretary ran for three pages and referred to this being Sutton's first visit to Stag Meadow, located within Windsor Great Park, since the 1928/29 season. Appearances and goalscorers for both the hosts' teams featured next and included former Sutton forward Lance Cadogan, showing as their top scorer. The middle spread listed the two teams, and two pages on up to date Athenian and Middlesex Border League tables were printed, neither competition having yet encompassed three points per win. There was only two pages of adverts to ten pages of

content; an extremely good ratio. There was no price advertised but this was a good effort for the level.

SUFC v West Ham United

This is the second consecutive season in which we have played West Ham in the National League Cup, with The Hammers inflicting our only defeat of last season's group stage in December, winning 2-0. The scorer of their second goal, Junior Robinson, went on to spend the briefest of loan spells with us later in the season, and this season has been on loan with Scottish Premiership club Livingston.

Not surprisingly the previous four of West Ham's visits here have all been of the "friendly" variety. The first was in October 1992, U's winning by 1–0 (Andy Scott). Four years later a strong WHU side defeated Sutton by 4–0, the match part of the deal that took Mark Watson to The Boleyn Ground after he had impressed for U's against them in the Capital League. August 2011 saw a Hammers squad draw 2–2, a match given a bit more interest as the President's Cup was up for grabs, and their most recent visit in July 2014 ended in a 1–0 defeat for Sutton.

Competitively West Ham's only visits would have been in the Capital League although classed as reserve level by both clubs.

For U's the only competitive first team outing was in October 1969 in the London Challenge Cup played at the Boleyn Ground. While a reserve team fixture for the hosts they did include World Cup winners Geoff Hurst and Martin Peters in a strong line up. Sutton were considered unfortunate to have lost the match (2-1).

Apart from Junior Robinson, players to have worn the colours of both clubs include defenders Ronnie Fletcher and Richard Hooke, midfielders John Berry, Joe Durrell and Andy Parr and forwards Watson (the only one of this list that actually moved from Sutton to WHU rather than begin their careers either as amateurs or in Hammers' youth set up) and Paul Whitmarsh.



THE DAVID WEIR DIARIES

The latest news from David Weir Leisure Centre; the home of the Sutton Academy and Women's teams.

Sutton's hopes of reaching the FA Youth Cup competition proper were ended as Merstham produced a perfect set of penalties in the shootout following a goalless draw.

The ninety minutes that preceded the shootout saw few clear chances, with the best coming in the first half as Merstham's Shay Dunn shot wildly over from a right wing cross, while at the other end Omotolani Bello missed his kick and Charlie Bell's shot was saved by Merstham keeper Kieran Bassom before James Fennelow put a header over the top from a Dan Urpens cross.

Chances were at an even greater premium after the break, with Jaminda Robinson and Luyande Mafu both off target for Merstham and Sutton substitute Josh Jenkins seeing a shot saved in a goalmouth scramble.

The penalty shoot out took its decisive turn early, with Bell's shot saved well to his left by Bassom after Marcus Long had scored Merstham's first effort, and although Adam Reeves, Ned Hepburn and Bobby Sheargold made no mistake, Merstham's faultless performance meant that Harley Stuart-Forde's successful conversion of their fifth penalty saw them through.

A battling performance from U's enabled them to see the game out and extend their unbeaten league and cup run to seven games, six of which have been wins.



NATIONAL LEAGUE CUP

The National League Cup regroups for yet another season since its reintroduction, and our U's will be looking to go one step further to be crowned Champions this season.

Albeit a very controversial topic amongst the non-league community, this competition provides yet another chance at silverware for the 16 National League clubs who were happy to take part, and 16 of the best U21 professional development sides from across the country.

There's a lot of history to this competition, dating all the way back to the 1980s, introduced as the Bob Lord Challenge Trophy named after the former chairman of the formerly named Alliance Premier League. The first ever winners were once football league powerhouses and founders of the Second Division, Northwich Victoria, and other winners of this competition include the likes of Wycombe Wanderers, Doncaster Rovers & of course your U's, who achieved glory in 1991.

The competition was then axed in 2001 and brought back again in 2008 as the Setanta Shield for sponsorship reasons for two campaigns, and a poor response saw the competition axed again for the second time in its history.

With the competition being reviewed at the start of last season, the competition was brought back now in its current form with the best of youth talent of the Premier League & Championship alongside the best of what non-league has to offer.

The competition used to be a straight knockout system similar to the FA Cup however the revised format now sees groups of four National League and four Premier League 2 teams each, with each National League team playing four home games against the under-21 teams in their group. The top 2 teams from each group advance to the quarter-finals, and from then on, straight knockout games begin.

So, how have the U's been getting on this season?

With the club drawn into Group C, Southampton, West Ham United, Fulham & Brighton & Hove Albion's U21 sides will visit Gander Green Lane, two of which have already visited.

The Seagulls were the most recent of which, being Chris Agutter's former side well before he was appointed. Returns for several key figures allowed a strong line up to be posted up against one of the best academies in the country.

Although a strong performance in the opening hour, the U's were pegged twice, Robertson's pass was converted first time by Shane Nti & Ben Barclay headed in Howell's corner eight minutes later. Despite Pruti's long pass picking out Ashley Nadesan to hammer a powerful effort home, it wasn't to be for the U's as of yet, as they suffered a second successive defeat in a row in the competition.

The week before that however it was the young Lilywhites' turn to visit the VBS Community Stadium, however a blistering second half turned away a relatively strong Sutton United side. 6 goals in the second half was definitely some turn around, and it was definitely a kick up the backside and snap back down to earth.

Tom Olyott got Fulham's U21 side off and running with a composed finish following Farhaan Ali Wahid's defence-splitting pass, before Aaron Loupalo-Bi's quickfire double after the break put them well in control of proceedings.

There was no let-up from former Watford caretaker manager Hayden Mullins' side, with Terrell Works and Olyott adding another two, before Loupalo-Bi notched his third and Macauley Zepa also got in on the act to cap a rampant performance from the visitors.




The cup fever is definitely in SM1, but it will be up to a new look Sutton United side to get themselves back up and running to win the cup rather than losing out in the final this time around.







HAYDEN MULLER

"I Felt Like I Took My Chance"

Hayden Muller was encouraged by Sutton United's 3–3 draw with Hartlepool United on his return to the team, taking plenty of positives from an entertaining afternoon in what was his first Sutton appearance of the season.

Muller had been deemed to not be a part of Steve Morison's plans after signing at the start of the 2024/25 campaign, and was subsequently loaned out to Salisbury in order to maintain match fitness, having not trained with the First Team at all in 2025/26.

However, the arrival of Chris Agutter brought a new-found faith in the former Millwall youngster, who has been impressed by the 23-year old in training and was rewarded with a recall from his loan in Wiltshire, before coming straight in from the start against Hartlepool.

Reflecting on the game, the defender, who played in a more advanced role in midfield, felt Sutton's early play showed the hard work being done on the training pitch.

"I thought the first 25-30 minutes you could see what we'd been working on in training" he said.

"I thought the patterns were really coming through and what the gaffer wanted. We were clean on transition, we really created quite a few chances to be fair, and then I thought the second half they changed shape, they matched us up with a four-box-two and then it kind of nullified what we were trying to do when we were playing out."

"We should have got our full backs out more, we should have spotted that earlier. I felt like it took a while for us to really see that that was the out ball, and then obviously, football's in moments, we just didn't defend well enough on, I think, all three goals, but especially the final two goals that they scored, the second and third."



In what was a slightly different role for Muller, who operated further forward than usual after spending much of last season in defence, he comfortably pulled the strings alongside Jack Wadham and showed his ability on the ball with plenty of good work in transition, showing why he was brought in to the club from Dundalk in the first place.

"I found it comfortable to be fair," he said. "I played there for a spell in Ireland about a year and a half ago and I thought I did well. When I was growing up, I played midfield quite a lot, so I've always had that in me, but I feel that after a run of games, I'll just get better and better in there."

In what was a quick turnaround for him too, Muller has quickly returned from his loan at Salisbury to start after training over the last couple of weeks with the First Team, and the 23-year-old spoke positively about his new manager's influence since his arrival, while admitting that the last few months hadn't been straight-forward but felt his return offered a fresh start.

"Football's about having someone that backs you," he added. "From the moment I stepped into training with Agi [Agutter], he took a liking to me for whatever reason. I'm looking forward to building a good relationship with him and with the new players we've brought in. I feel like we've got a really strong group and can definitely progress forward."

"Obviously it's been tough, I came back for pre-season and was told I wouldn't be training with the group for whatever reason. Football's about opinions, and I felt the previous manager just had the wrong opinion on me. So I worked hard, got myself on loan to stay fit, and I feel like I took my chance today."

Looking ahead, Muller believes his presence in midfield can help Sutton find balance and stability as the team continues to evolve.

"I think I can bring a bit of steel into the midfield," he said. "I'm good on the ball, and I think me and Jack Wadham brought good balance in the two pivots today. Skip [Aaron Jones] played some really nice passes to me, you can see that they're all talented, it's just about gelling. Football, especially in the back five, it's just about moments; we switched off three times and they scored three goals, we got punished. Other than that, we didn't really give up many chances, so yeah, those partnerships, obviously between the back five and me and Wads are just going to carry on building as we play more games, and I think we'll just get better and better."

Muller also took the chance to address the personal difficulties he's faced during the current campaign, but has shown plenty of determination to prove himself once more, starting with his maiden appearance of the season for the U's.

"It's been tough" he said. "I came back for pre-season and was told I wouldn't be training with the group for whatever reason. Football's about opinions at the end of the day and I feel like the previous manager just had the wrong opinion on me from my point of view."

"So I've had to work hard, take it on the chin, got myself on loan to get game time, stay fit, snd yeah, I felt like I took my chance today.

"I feel like I just need to keep doing that and proving this manager right and the previous one wrong."
