

in the FA Challenge Cup in the First Round proper.

Whilst, helped by our EFL membership, this is our fifth successive first round appearance, our opponents are here for the first time in eight years. They will be hoping for a victory which will take them through to match their highest feature in the competition.

No strangers to the competition proper we will be hoping to progress once again, albeit an easier progression than in the previous round is to be hoped for. For nearly 250 minutes we traded blows with a Farnham Town outfit belying their place in the football pyramid. They led us by a single goal six times, before each time we equalised. We were saved a penalty knock out competition with a goal in the last possible minute, to lead the two-legged tie for only seconds – but ultimately when it mattered.

Whilst this our first meeting with AFC Telford United, as a phoenix club, their predecessors have a place in our club history being our first opponents in the National League equivalent, the Football Conference, way back in 1986. Clashes were limited in number with our last meeting at the end of the 1999/2000 season. Not quite last century!

Our season to date has perhaps not been auspicious in the league (albeit the first half last weekend must be the best 45 minutes seen this season – we aren't going to mention the second half!) but cup competitions in recent weeks have brought success.

Not just the aforementioned Farnham Town games, but also an entertaining draw over 90 minutes against West Ham in the National League Cup, and as recently as this week winning 5-0 against Guildford City in the Surrey Senior Cup. Arguably though our women take the award for best result of the season having disposed of Brentford in the Women's FA Cup – this time with the need for penalties – last weekend.

With today's fixture being required to finish on the day it is hoped come this evening we will be doubly represented in the hats for the second round. A win away from Premier League opposition. The men having been there before, of course, but I'm sure our women, and the club more generally, would relish a tie against Crystal Palace – home or away! I'm sure everyone will be behind the team this afternoon, and there is something special about cup football at the Lane for me.

My first match watching my team being an Anglo Italian Cup tie as a nine year old. Little did I know what that would lead to personally. Nor could I imagine 47 years later sharing the boardroom with representatives of our final opponents, which is what happened a few days ago. It's unlikely I will be here in 47 years' time, but I expect to see many famous cup victories over as much of that timeframe as I can. Hopefully starting as soon as today.







In October 2022, he became manager of AFC Telford United, soon reaching 100 games in charge and earning a contract extension to 2026/27. Renowned for developing young talent and building disciplined, competitive teams, Kevin has enjoyed success throughout non-league football.





Jordan Cranston began his career at Wolverhampton Wanderers before a spell in non-league with a number of different clubs, which culminated in a mid-season switch to Cheltenham Town during the 2015/16 campaign, where he became a fixture in the Robins' team as they went on to secure the National League Premier title that year.

He spent the next four years plying his trade in League Two, firstly for Cheltenham and then Morecambe, before a switch to Solihull Moors preceded spells at AFC Fylde and Hereford. He later moved to Redditch in 2024, being appointed captain, before making the switch to Telford in November 2024.





1 | Brandon Hall

Goalkeeper

Brandon Hall started at Charlton Athletic, then played for Hayes & Yeading, Ebbsfleet, and Woking, earning England C recognition. He joined Kidderminster, then Hereford, reaching the 2021 FA Trophy final, and Gloucester City. In 2023, he became the Bucks' first summer signing, keeping 17 clean sheets in the 2023/24 season.

12 | Josh Gracey

Goalkeeper

Josh Gracey joined the Bucks on loan from Wolverhampton Wanderers, having impressed in Wolves' pre-season game at the SEAH Stadium. A Portadown native, he moved to England in 2024 from Glenavon and has represented Northern Ireland U21s, though he didn't play in their recent Euros qualifier. Kevin Wilkin, having pursued him previously, secured his signing.

13 | Stan Amos

Goalkeeper

Stan Amos joined AFC Telford United on loan from Wolverhampton Wanderers. He began his football journey at Wolves at age 14 and signed a scholarship in 2022, securing his first professional contract in July 2024. During the 2023/24 season, Amos gained valuable experience on loan at Wolverhampton Casuals, where he featured prominently and impressed with his performances.

2 | Jahdahn Fridye-Harper

Defender

Jahdahn Fridye-Harper joined the Bucks initially on a deal for the remainder of the 2024/25 season.

Beginning his career at Weston-super-Mare, he later played for AFC Hornchurch, Torquay United, AFC Totton and Hemel Hempstead Town, before signing for with Barwell. He later moved to Telford in February 2025 on a short-term deal for the remainder of the 2024/25 season.

5 | Orrin Pendley

Defender

Orrin Pendley joined the Bucks in June 2023 and had a standout season, winning fans', players', and manager's Player of the Season awards. He began at Highgate United before moving to Redditch United, Kettering Town, and Rushall Olympic, where he played until 2021. After a year at Tamworth, he stepped up to Hereford FC for 2022/23. Known for his set-piece threat, Pendley scored crucial goals, and his return for a second season was considered a key retention by manager Kevin Wilkin.

16 | Oliver Cawthorne

Defender

Commanding young centre back Oliver Cawthorne joined the Bucks on a deal for the rest of the season. Born in Venezuela, where his English father was employed as a journalist, he has played in Venezuela and Panama, most recently with Alianza FC, based in Panama City.

25 | Ammar Dyer

Defender

Ammar Dyer joined the Bucks at the end of August 2025. Previously with Alvechurch, the pacy fullback came close to joining the Bucks earlier in 2025, but Kevin Wilkin didn't have to wait too long to finally get his man, offering much versatility at the back.

4 | Jordan Piggott

Midfielder

Jordan Piggott began his career at his boyhood club West Bromwich Albion but was released in 2017. He then joined Dundee in Scotland, had a loan spell at East Fife, and briefly played for Bangor City before returning to the Midlands. After impressing at Halesowen Town, he signed for Solihull Moors. Jordan joined the Bucks on loan in January 2022, with the move made permanent on an 18-month contract later that spring. A versatile and popular player, he can operate across defence and as a defensive midfielder.

6 | Alex Fletcher

Midfielder

Alex Fletcher joined AFC Telford United in July 2025 from Tamworth, having previously excelled at Rushall Olympic, where he won multiple awards, including Supporters' Player of the Year. Known for his technical skill and versatility, Fletcher is a vital presence in Telford's midfield, contributing creativity and stability.

7 | Charlie Williams

Midfielder

Charlie Williams joined AFC Telford United in summer 2025. Born in Redditch, he began his career at Aston Villa's academy before moving to Burton Albion at 15. After loan spells at Leamington, Banbury United, and Redditch United, he most recently played for Stratford Town. Versatile and creative, he strengthens Telford's squad.

8 | Luke Rowe

Midfielder

Signed from Bromsgrove Sporting in February 2025, Luke Rowe returned to the SEAH Stadium having played there in the 2022/23 season when he joined in mid-season from Hednesford Town. Following a seven-day approach, the midfielder agreed to terms with the Bucks, reacquainting with Kevin Wilkin, who he played for the Bucks under previously.

10 | Jamie Meddows

Midfielder

Jamie Meddows joined AFC Telford United in July 2025 from Bromsgrove Sporting. A versatile midfielder capable of playing centrally or as a forward, he impressed in Step 3 with 18 goals in 50 appearances. Known for his dynamic style and goal-scoring ability, Meddows is set to be a key player for Telford.

17 | Rhys Hilton

Midfielder

Rhys Hilton joined the Bucks in summer 2024 after nearly a year of pursuit following his impressive pre-season for Sutton Coldfield Town. A former Birmingham City academy player with a loan spell at Redditch United, he later played for Sutton Coldfield, Bedworth United, Coleshill Town, Halesowen Town, and Stamford before signing for Telford.

18 | Khanya Leshabela

Midfielder

Khanya Leshabela joined the Bucks ahead of their 2025 return to the National League North. Born in Soshanguve, South Africa, he moved to the UK at age two and developed at Leicester City, making a Premier League debut in 2021. After loan spells at Shrewsbury and Crewe, and a brief stint at Cape Town City, he returned to England, playing for Enfield Town, Spalding United, and Bedford Town during the 2024/25 season.

21 | Ola Lawal

Midfielder

Ola Lawal, a midfielder with dual Irish and Nigerian citizenship, joined the Bucks in early 2025 from National League North side Marine. He began his youth career at Shelbourne and Drogheda United, then played for Chippenham Town before moving to Scottish Championship side Falkirk, including a loan spell at Cove Rangers, before returning south to Marine.

22 | Jimmy Armson

Midfielder

Jimmy Armson reunited with Kevin Wilkin for the third time when he joined the Bucks in summer 2024, having previously played under him at Nuneaton Town and Brackley Town. A former England C international, he has earned promotions with Nuneaton and Solihull Moors and won the 2018 FA Trophy with Brackley. Renowned for scoring spectacular and crucial goals from midfield, Jimmy made nearly 350 appearances for Brackley, netting almost 100 times. His move to the Bucks was seen as a major signing in their push to regain Step 2 status.

11 | Dylan Allen-Hadley

Forward

Dylan Allen-Hadley is a versatile forward who joined AFC Telford United in March 2025 from Alvechurch. He had previously impressed the Bucks by scoring twice in a 3–1 defeat at Lye Meadow in January 2025. Since his arrival, Dylan has made 13 appearances and scored 4 goals for Telford in the 2024/25 season. He is known for his pace, creativity, and ability to play across various attacking positions.

14 | Manny Ilesanmi

Forward

Emmanuel "Manny" llesanmi is a 20-year-old forward who joined AFC Telford United in July 2025 after leaving Derby County. Standing 6ft 2in tall, he brings physical presence and pace to the attack. Previously, he made brief appearances for Torquay United on loan during the 2024/25 season before his release from Derby. Ilesanmi is expected to bolster the Bucks' forward options as they aim to strengthen their squad in the National League North.

19 | Adan George

Forward

Adan George joined the Bucks after his release from FC Halifax Town at the end of his contract. He impressed during pre-season as the mystery trialist, scoring a first-half hat-trick in a 6-1 win over Connah's Quay Nomads XI. Returning from quadricep surgery, George quickly earned a move to the SEAH Stadium under manager Kevin Wilkin.

20 | Ricardo Dinanga

Forward

Ricardo Dinanga returned to the Bucks on loan for the 2025/26 season after limited opportunities at Shrewsbury Town, who signed him in January 2025 following a strong start to the 2024/25 campaign. An Irish winger with dual DR Congo citizenship, Ricardo began at Cork City, moved to Coventry City, and had loan spells at Hereford and Nuneaton. He first joined the Bucks in July 2023, impressing in pre-season, and played a key role in their second-place finish, earning a new deal for the 2024/25 season.

HISTORIC RAMBLINGS

Three from the 1st November

As a senior club (since 1910) and prior to this afternoon, Sutton have played seventeen times on this day. The first two were away fixtures either side of WWI, losing 4–1 at Redhill in 1913 and defeating Woolwich Polytechnic by 3–0 six years later, both in the South Suburban League (West). Of the four other away matches, only one was a league match while three have been FA Cup ties. In 1980, U's were dumped out at the 4th qualifying round stage by Minehead but in 1988 at the same stage U's defeated Larry Pritchard's Walton & Hersham by 3–0 in a replay at Stompond Lane. The third is revisited below.

At GGL, U's first played on this day in 1924 losing to Enfield by 3-1 in the London Senior Cup 3rd qualifying round. In the FA Cup, U's drew with Waterlooville in 1975 and lost a replay to Maidstone United (3-1) in 1983, both in the 4th qualifying round. Two friendlies against Fulham (3-0) in 1952 and 1-1 with AFC Wimbledon in 2006 have also been played. Five league fixtures have been contested with the standout being a 7-2 thrashing of Bath City in the GMV Conference in 1986. Of the other four two were won and two drawn.

Two goal Craig Watkins

The Match

Sutton's most recent fixture on this day back in 2011 and one of those glorious nights under the lights at Fetcham Grove for an FA Cup fourth qualifying round replay. Echoes of the recent Farnham tie with the initial match ending 3–3 with U's preventing a shock by Isthmian Premier basement boys Leatherhead. And this replay would provide a tense evening for all.

U's started well and led after 97 seconds when Craig Watkins headed Paul Telfer's cross past Chico Ramos in the home goal. However, Tanners responded well and placed United under some pressure for the next twenty minutes but rarely threatened a goal. Leroy Griffiths hit the woodwork for Sutton when he really should have scored but against the run of play Kev Terry broke through to be brought down by Sutton 'keeper Kevin Scriven,

Up stepped former Sutton youth forward Greg Andrews to net the 37th minute penalty. Half-time, 1-1.

The second half was mainly Sutton enjoying decent possession and in the 78th minute Watkins netted on the turn after Griffiths' low cross was poorly defended by the home side. U's looked to be setting up a first round tie with National League strugglers Kettering Town when Simon Downer sent a free kick straight into Ramos' arms and Jack McLeod raced onto the 'keeper's long clearance to set up Tom Hutchings for a 90th minute equaliser and send the home fans in a crowd of 940 into delirium. In the build up to Downer's free kick, U's sub 'keeper Wayne Shaw was red carded while on the bench.


Extra-time and in the seventh minute of the first period U's broke and Harry Beautyman found Fola Orilonishe who shifted the ball to fire across Ramos. The home 'keeper made another couple of fine saves during extra time but it was his opposite number Scriven who had to claw out a 30 yard strike from Andrews to ensure Sutton's progress. 3-2 it ended.

Referee David Rock produced his yellow card eleven times during the match but actually officiated proceedings very well.

The Player

Netting one of Sutton's goals in the W&H tie in 1988 mentioned above was centre-back Vernon Pratt. Vernon had started with Camberley Town and played for Egham Town before returning to Krooner Park. He had impressed for Camberley against Sutton in the Surrey Senior Cup in February 1987, scoring for them as they threatened a shock result before Micky Cornwell turned the tie around with two goals. Vern made his competitive debut against Boston United in the GMVC on 5th September 1987 coming off the bench for an injured Mark Golley. However, initially his opportunities were rare with Mark Golley and Stuart Hemsley the centre-back pairing.



He did start against his old club, scoring in a 4-1 SSC success before netting his first GMVC goal as U's defeated Dagenham by 1-0 even

though the Golley brothers were both sent off at 0–0. From that point he became Hemsley's regular partner and by the end of that 1987/88 season had made 35 appearances scoring five goals and won a Surrey Senior Cup medal too. The following season, Vernon started alongside Hemsley only to lose his place as Nigel Golley was shifted into the back four. However, a Boxing Day injury to Hemsley gave Vernon another chance and thus he played his not inconsiderable role in the downing of Coventry City in the FA Cup and retained the position for the second half of the season.

He scored a brace at Cheltenham Town in a 3-2 win. Vernon started the 1989/90 season with Sutton but a poor start to the season by the team saw him lose his place and he moved to Isthmian League Wokingham Town for a fee. He later joined Slough Town and then on to Basingstoke Town before joining Maidenhead United where he enjoyed some success, particular in cup football. Vernon made 92 appearances for Sutton scoring 12 goals but will of course always be remembered for his part on 7th January 1989. He still attends Sutton games from time to time.

The Programme

Back to 1947 for this afternoon's programme and the visit of Enfield in the Athenian League, a 1-1 draw. The club was still producing the programme they had used in the late WWII years, a four page smaller-sized effort that held all the relevant info in a neat design. The front cover is below while page two held league tables for both senior and reserve sections of the AL, U's in mid table.

Below were club notes written by SUFC legend Bill Shepherd, and they continued briefly on the bottom of the back page. These notes discussed the visitors' strengths, U's issues with the forward line, Charlie Vaughan's departure to Charlton Athletic still keenly felt some ten months on, and an appeal for local overnight accommodation for Bill Saunders who travelled from Watford to play. The teams were presented on page three topped and tailed by an advert with Milletts at the top and Lewis & Co Transport Contractors at the foot. On the back page first and second XI's fixtures and results were listed, the ressies suffering an 8-0 reverse at Bromley three weeks earlier. The Supporters' Club was afforded a tiny portion of that back page, offering FA Diaries for 2/9 (about 14p) and announcing the latest "Penny On The Ball winner who hailed from Denmark Road, Carshalton. The price, 2d (1p).



SUFC v AFC Telford United

This is the first meeting between the two clubs, but the original Telford United were Sutton's first ever opponents at GMV Conference/National League level back in August 1986. That match finished 2–2 with Sutton turning round a two goal deficit. That was the first of six visits for Telford to GGL and they had mixed fortunes recording a 3–0 win on the opening day of the 1990/91 season but having lost by 6–1 (including a Steve Fowler treble) just ten months earlier. The last match between the two clubs here was in October 1999 and a rare win during that season by 2–1, Sammy Winston netting two penalties.

At Bucks Head, Sutton were unbeaten on their first four visits, winning the first in January 1987 by 2-0 (Francis Awaritefe 2), but lost the last two.

Lenny Dennis's four goal record is the most by a Sutton player in these fixtures.

Three players are shown as having played for both teams, none of whom were at either club for very long. They are defenders Anwar Uddin and Aaron Simpson, the latter a member of our 2021 National League championship squad, and midfielder Chris Nurse.

FA Cup First Round

Sutton's 28th entrance into the competition proper and the fifth consecutive season, somewhat helped by being an EFL club for three of those. That's short of the seven consecutive seasons starting from the 1987/8 season which again included some helpful exemptions generally to the 4th qualifying round based on, then, recent past performances in the competition. Sutton's record at GGL is not the best, it's not great across the round full stop.

At home U's have a record of W4 D5 L7 while away it is W5 D5 L9. Since defeating then Third Division Aldershot in 1987, United have won just two out of ten home ties including replays, although a third was successful after a penalty shoot-out. That was against Kidderminster Harriers in 1995, one of three draws. A draw today will mean another penalty competition and the only other one came at Slough Town in 2018 and went the way of the hosts.



Megan Taylor was the hero as Sutton United Women came from behind to beat Brentford Women on penalties, booking their place in the next round of the Adobe Women's FA Cup and inflicting Brentford's first defeat of the season.

In wet, windy conditions, Brentford started strongly and took the lead in the 10th minute when Esme Alaneme's cross from the right looped over Taylor and into the net. Missing three players through being cup-tied, Sutton struggled to find rhythm but gradually grew into the game. Gabrielle Williams was brought down in the box, only for appeals to be waved away, while Ella Meehan's header was tipped over by Tatiana Sanders. Sutton ended the half the stronger, with the whistle arriving at an unfortunate time for them.


In the second half, Taylor produced vital saves to keep Sutton in contention before Phoebe Langley struck the post. Sutton's persistence was rewarded when Williams capitalised on a misplaced pass to score her 12th goal of the season and level with 15 minutes remaining. Both sides pushed for a winner, but it finished 1–1, sending the tie to penalties.

Taylor then saved three of six spot kicks to seal Sutton's dramatic victory and a memorable place in the second round.

Sutton United Women have been drawn away at Bowers and Pitsea in the Adobe Women's FA Cup Second Round.

The U's reached this stage of the competition after a dramatic penalty shootout victory over Brentford in the First Round, which had followed stunning 9-0 and 5-2 wins over Burgess Hill Town and Penn & Tylers Green, and now will visit the Essex-based side in the Second Round.

BLACK HISTURY MONTH Icons of Visit suttonunited.net for the full article Sutton United

October is Black History Month, and as the month came to an end yesterday, we celebrate the black icons who are part of Sutton United history with this special feature.

Gavin Fraser – 181 appearances/16 goals

Gavin was the first black or mixed race player to appear in our first team. He joined for the 1973/74 season having represented England Schoolboys and made his debut at home to Hitchin in August 1973, opening his goalscoring account in a 2-1 defeat against Walton & Hersham in October. Later that season Gavin was joined in the team by striker Junior Crooks.

Gavin left the club and played briefly at Wycombe Wanderers whilst training as a PE teacher before returning to Gander Green Lane for the 1977/78 season, when he became pretty much a first team



regular, missing just two league games and scoring seven goals. Gavin continued to feature strongly the following year and played in the 1979 Anglo Italian Cup Final win over Chieti Calcio, which is widely seen as the springboard for so much of the success that followed. Gavin left the U's in 1980 after making a total of 181 appearances and scoring 16 goals and later played for Carshalton Athletic.

Our paths would cross again in 2015 when the squad went on a pre-season trip to Jersey and Gavin was one of our hosts as an official of the Jersey FA and later joined the board of the island's FA.

Lennie Dennis – 264 appearances/144 goals

Lennie joined the U's in 1985, a slightly surprising signing by Barrie Williams to replace the prolific Micky Joyce after low key spells with Bromley and Dulwich Hamlet.

However, partnering Paul McKinnon in attack Lennie formed a spearhead that helped the club to retain the Isthmian League title and win promotion into the Conference, bagging 32 goals in his first season.

Lennie was an all-action centre-forward, not dissimilar in style to Omar Bugiel but with a keener eye for goal. It didn't seem to matter whether Lennie played alongside McKinnon or Joyce, the goals kept coming for all three. Famously, Lennie featured in the team that beat Coventry City in 1989. The broken leg suffered by Lennie at Barnet was a key factor in the club's relegation in 1991, and he later left for spells with Welling and Woking before returning to Sutton to accumulate a total of 144 goals in just 264 appearances.

In 1988 Lennie was invited to represent Jamaica, and gained one international cap in a World Cup qualifier against the United States.



Craig Dundas – 586 appearances/109 goals

The club legend that is "Dundo" is without doubt the most successful legacy of Ernie Howe's brief and unproductive stay as Sutton manager. Quickly making a name for himself at Carshalton, after six years with Croydon, Craig was already 26 years old when he joined the U's in November 2007 and scored in an encouraging 3–3 draw away to Hayes & Yeading.

It was a false dawn for Sutton as relegation beckoned at the end of a dismal season but Craig was one of the few players retained by new manager Paul Doswell after grabbing twelve goals in a half a season. Craig featured regularly in the Isthmian League the next season, his great strength and determination making him a firm favourite with the fans, but the U's lost out in the play-offs and Craig left for a year with Hampton & Richmond. This U's knocked the Beavers out of the FA Cup and by the time the 2010/11 season started Craig was back at The Lane. He played a vital part in the U's winning the Isthmian League title and Conference South crowds soon became used to the cry of "Dundo's gonna get yer". In an eight-year spell bringing almost 300 appearances Craig scored over 60 goals but it was his workrate as much as his finishing that endeared him to Sutton fans and he was a vital part of the success that the team enjoyed in the mid 2010s: winning the National League in 2016 and reaching the last 16 of the FA Cup in 2017.

Already 36, Craig then alternated briefly between Hampton and Sutton but new U's boss Matt Gray retained Craig as a fitness coach and as a player and he enjoyed the National League title success of 2021. On 11th September 2021, aged 40, Craig become the oldest player to make their EFL debut since the 2nd World War, in a game against Stevenage. Remarkably Craig remained an active member of the first team squad during our three years in the EFL, finishing his career with us on 586 appearances (fifth in the all-time list) with 109 goals. In 2024 he joined Epsom & Ewell and at the start of this season took up the manager's role with them, but he retains his Sutton connections, enjoying a testimonial game in May and now involved in a coaching role with our academy.



LOAN WATCHE

Three First Team players continued to gain crucial minutes away on loan last month, along with one Academy player who continued to showcase his talent down in non-league.

Dillon De Silva got off to a scoring start to life at Tamworth, notching his first goal of the season against Boston United on the weekend.

The Sri Lanka international joined Andy Peaks' side on a month-long deal and came on with his new side 3-0 down to the Pilgrims, playing the final 14 minutes in a last gasp attempt to avoid losing their ten-game unbeaten run.

And while it proved to be too little, too late, De Silva did have an immediate impact for the Lambs, capping his debut with a close range finish deep into stoppage time after his initial shot had been blocked to get off the mark for both his new club and for the campaign.





Down in the National League South, Siju Odelusi twice came off the bench as he began life on loan at Dover Athletic.

The midfielder contributed to the Whites securing a 2-2 draw with Dorking Wanderers, with a brace from Decarry Sheriff seeing Jake Leberl's side climb to within two points of the play-off spots. Odelusi came on with 20 minutes to go, and played another 26 minutes four days later against Worthing.

The former Aveley man reunited with former boss Jon Meeney and former teammate Harry Ransom as the Rebels condemned Dover to a 3-1 defeat, with goals from Joe Cook, Razzaq Coleman De-Graft and Brad Dolaghan seeing Adam Hinshelwood's side turn out comfortable winners, while Odelusi received a booking with 19 minutes remaining.

Back in London, Henry Sandat appeared just once for highflying Hornchurch, making his first start for the club in their Essex Senior Cup win over Redbridge.

The former Hull City man completed 90 minutes as the Urchins reached the Third Round of the competition, having a few efforts go amiss before turning provider, notching an assist for Darren McQueen's hat-trick-sealing goal midway through an impressive 3-1 win.

He was otherwise named as unused substitute in their 1-1 draw with Horsham along with a 3-2 win over Bath City and 2-1 win over Hampton & Richmond Borough, with Daryl McMahon's side extending their unbeaten start to their National League South season, though they briefly dropped to second in the division on goal difference after Weston-super-Mare's 5-1 win over Slough Town.


However, their win over Hampton & Richmond on the weekend saw them retain their status at the top of the table due to the Seagulls' draw with Tonbridge Angels, and kick-start November with a crucial top-of-the-table clash against promotion-chasing Torquay United.

Down in Step 3, George Vorster has continued his outstanding start to life at Burgess Hill Town.

The Sutton winger was at the centre of controversy when a clash with Joe Christou led to the latter being sent off for Hashtag United, much to the dismay of the Essex-based side, before topping off an electric performance by skinning his man and whipping in a low cross in which was cleared as far as Chris Whelpdale who smashed it hard and low to doubles the Hillian's lead.

Vorster continued his fine display by going close to a goal himself, before being substituted with two minutes to spare, and brought an end to a superb outing which saw him named Man of the Match.












BRANDON NUCKU:

"It's My Job As A Striker To Get Those Goals"

Brandon Njoku said Sutton deserved to secure an impressive 5-0 win over Guildford City, doing so in dominant fashion at the Spectrum

The striker added two goals to his 2025/26 tally as Sutton reached the Surrey Senior Cup Second Round, scoring twice and helping his side bounce back from a tough, albeit improved run of results.

"It was a good game overall. I think we controlled the tempo throughout, did what we needed to do, and eventually got the win we deserved," Brandon said after the match.

"The first one, I read Charlie Bell getting onto it, so I nipped behind; obviously a good finish with my left foot, and the second one, I tried to make the chance for myself, and sometimes you get a deflection, and that's what happened today."

After a challenging few weeks, the win was a timely boost for both confidence and momentum, with Sutton making it just one defeat in seven under Chris Agutter, while adding a second win in Surrey, aided by Njoku's recent run of form, making it eight goals in all competitions with his brace against the Sweeney.

"We've had a tough few games recently and just needed a match like this to kick some momentum in. We'll take that into Saturday and hopefully get another good result," he added, reflecting on his personal progress.





"It's my job as a striker to get those goals, whether I'm starting or coming off the bench. I'm just here to help the team, and I think I'm doing that pretty well - long may it continue."

While he is keen to secure a regular starting spot, Brandon emphasised his team-first mindset, and also highlighted the importance of building chemistry with his teammates.

"Everyone wants to be a starter, but if it means coming off the bench sometimes to nick a goal or assist to help win the game, then so be it. That's the main objective - helping the team."

"It's good to develop a relationship with everyone, whether in league games or cup games. I just want to play, score goals, whether that's with [Lewis] Simper behind me, Jayden Harris, Charlie Bell, I think it's good to get those relationships and I thought I had a really good one today as well.

Looking ahead to Saturday's clash with AFC Telford United in the FA Cup, Njoku put full focus on continuing the positive momentum, and will be looking to build on the win over Guildford in another cup competition.

"It'll be the same prep as always – control the game, control the tempo. We know we can score goals; it's just about keeping them out of our net. We're more than capable of doing so and hopefully we can get a good result."
