A warm welcome to the Eastleigh directors, staff, players and supporters – we hope you have a safe journey to and from Gander Green Lane for this evening's game.



Eastleigh took part in the equivalent fixture to ours in the First Round last season, where we had a Sunday on television hosting Birmingham City, they faced Walsall at home in front of the cameras. Hopefully the benefits of some television money and greater exposure will be of some comfort as they exited the competition to opponents higher up the pyramid. By contrast we dispatched, albeit by a fine margin, contenders from lower in the pyramid in AFC Telford United, and receive the twin joys of winning prize money

and a Second Round tie – the doorway to the big boys if successful - when we will be hosting Shrewsbury Town. As at the time of writing we don't know if that is enticing enough to once again be featured on television.

Whilst Eastleigh have only become a club at the top tier of the football pyramid in recent seasons (in football terms at least) they have established themselves in the National League as consistent performers, and have ambitions for higher still, similar to ourselves.

In those years the two clubs have already created overlap in terms of past managers with Paul Doswell and Ian Baird occupants of both dugouts.

On the playing side a few familiar faces have signed for both clubs, one of whom was man of the match in our last National League fixture (a game I didn't think I would want to write about again) in Enzio Boldewijn. I have no doubt many Spitfires supporters will recognise a familiar face (or three!) in our current squad with Jayden Harris featuring on loan to them in the 2023-24 season from Carlisle United.

Noa Boutin was on loan last season at Eastleigh, and now features for the Ambers on loan this. Even more recently, in fact this week, Jake Taylor has joined us – and created the slightly unusual squad conundrum of having 2 J Taylors potentially on the teamsheet.

It is not just the players and coaching staff that have a connection to our club, as today's match referee is Emily Heaslip, who has officiated in games as important as the Women's FA Challenge Cup Final and the Women's League Cup Final, but made her National League debut last season when Sutton visited Yeovil. No doubt we would welcome a repeat of the scoreline, and that of our victory at the weekend, being a 2-1 scoreline.

Last season in the equivalent fixture it was a game of two penalties, with Sutton coming away with a 1–0 victory, Jack Sims sparing his namesake's blushes saving the effort after Jack Taylor's indiscretion was penalised, followed by Will Davies smashing the ball into the back of the net and promptly grabbing his York City inspired Gucci handbag to celebrate in front of a packed Collingwood Road end.

Here's hoping that end is rocking with celebration this evening too.





1 | Nick Townsend

Goalkeeper

Born in Solihull, Townsend joined Birmingham City's academy at nine. After loan spells at Oxford City and Lincoln, he moved to Barnsley in 2015, helping win promotion and the EFL Trophy. Later at Newport County, he made 200+ appearances and, in 2022, debuted internationally for Antigua and Barbuda.

22 | Josh McNamara

Goalkeeper

Josh McNamara began at Manchester City's academy, making 17 Premier League 2 appearances across development squads. He won the Under-18 Premier League 2 title in 2021/22, then joined Southampton in 2023, adding 17 Under-21 appearances and a loan spell at St Albans City, gaining valuable senior experience.

2 | Richard Brindley

Defender

Brindley joined the Spitfires at the start of the 2024/25 season after spending five years with Notts County.

The right-back is a product of Norwich City's youth system, and has played over 100 games in the National League during his career.

3 | Jake Vokins

Defender

Jake Vokins spent the back end of the 2023/24 season on loan with the Spitfires before signing a deal to join up permanently during the summer after that.

The left-back spent his youth career with Southampton and even went on to make appearances for them in the Premier League, and has also represented England at youth level 16 times.

4 | Luis Fernandez

Defender

Luis Fernandez embarked on his first season as a Spitfire, linking up with Kelvin Davis' squad following his transfer from Hampton & Richmond over the summer.

His performances during the 2023/24 season for his former club earned him the 'Player of The Season' award, and the centre-back has described himself as someone who "gets a lot of joy out of defending his goal."

16 | Aaron Pierre

Defender

Aaron Pierre, a 32-year-old centre-back joined the Spitfires with extensive EFL experience and over 15 caps for Grenada. Starting at Brentford in 2012, he later played for Wycombe, Northampton, Shrewsbury, Sutton, and AFC Wimbledon, earning multiple Player of the Season awards and competing internationally, including in the Concacaf Gold Cup.

21 | Sonnie Davis

Defender

The 20-year-old full-back joined on loan from Southampton, where he rose through the academy and became a U21/U23 regular. Davis made 20+ Premier League 2 appearances, scoring three goals and captaining the side. Son of former manager Kelvin, he extended his contract in 2023 and trained with the senior squad.

27 | Archie Harris

Defender

Archie Harris joined the Spitfires for 2025/26, having gained senior experience in the National League and South. A Bournemouth academy graduate, Harris had loan spells at Poole Town, Torquay United—earning BVEC Player of the Month—and Truro City. He is the son of former Eastleigh defender Andy Harris.

31 | Niall Maher

Defender

Niall Maher joined the Spitfires ahead of the 2024/25 National League season, debuting against Maidenhead United. A Bolton academy graduate of 13 years, he captained FC Halifax Town and earned 2021/22 National League Team of the Season honours. He later made 60+ League Two appearances over two years with Grimsby.

4 | Lloyd Humphries

Midfielder

Lloyd Humphries joined the Spitfires at the start of the 2024/25 season after spending five seasons with Weston-super-Mare.

He won their Player of the Season award in the 2022/23 and 2023/24 seasons, and played every single minute for them in the latter of the two campaigns.

7 | Kieron Evans

Midfielder

After turning down EFL interest, Kieron Evans joins the Spitfires ahead of the National League season. A technical midfielder from Cardiff City's Academy, he debuted in 2021 and gained experience on loan at Linfield, Torquay United—36 appearances, two goals—and Gateshead, helping secure an FA Trophy win in 2023/24 with three goals.

17 | Josh Lundstram

Midfielder

A Crewe Alexandra academy graduate, Josh Lundstram gained senior experience on loan at non-league clubs, notably helping Altrincham win the 2020 National League North play-offs. After standout seasons with Altrincham and Oldham, earning multiple Player of the Year awards, the 26-year-old also debuted internationally for England C in 2023.

18 | Angel Waruih

Midfielder

Angel Waruih joined the Spitfires upon the expiration of his contract at Brentford.

The 20-year-old central midfielder spent 13 years at Plymouth Argyle, featuring in the 2021/22 EFL Trophy squad, before moving to Brentford in 2022. He made six appearances in Brentford B's Premier League Cup-winning season and stayed through 2023/24.

24 | Jordan Cousins

Midfielder

Jordan Cousins began at Charlton Athletic, making over 125 appearances and winning 2014/15 Player of the Year. He later played for QPR, Stoke, Wigan—helping secure promotion in 2021/22—and Cambridge United. An England youth international, he now represents Jamaica, bringing over a decade of EFL experience with more than 250 senior appearances.

9 | Paul McCallum

Forward

Paul McCallum has excelled in his second spell with the Spitfires, scoring 35 goals to become the National League's top scorer in 2023/24. His FA Cup brace against Reading helped the club reach the third round, and across 111 appearances for the Spitfires, he has netted 70 goals.

15 | Harvey Saunders

Forward

Harvey Saunders offers extensive EFL experience, having played for Fleetwood Town, Bristol Rovers, and Tranmere Rovers. Beginning in Sunday League while working full-time, he progressed through local sides including Darlington Railway Athletic and Darlington FC, before establishing himself in League One and Two as a hardworking, consistent attacking threat.

HISTORIC RAMBLINGS

Three from the 5th November


A date for football puns so I will try to avoid them. Sutton's first match as a senior club was during the first season that they enjoyed that status, 1910/11. However, the match was a friendly with Fulham Amateurs, U's winning by 5-0 with Thornton netting three of the goals. Since then, another nineteen matches have been contested, the last that very disappointing afternoon at home to Farnborough in the FA Cup when U's tasted the other end of a giant-killing as an EFL club in 2022. The FA Cup first round features on three other occasions.

A home 2-2 draw with Romford in 1960 (lost replay 5-0), that amazing 6-3 success at Dartford in 2016 and the following year the narrow defeat at Cambridge United. The first competitive match was in 1921, a 2-0 away defeat of Burberry's in the Amateur Cup 2nd qualifying round and another cup tie was in 1927, a win at Enfield by 3-0 in the London Senior 1st qualifying round. Of the League matches, two stand out one of which is featured below. The other was at Walthamstow Avenue in the Athenian League in 1938. The strong host side won by 9-1, an eight goal deficit only matched in peace-time competitive league football by that 8-0 defeat at Stockport in 2023. Of the away matches, Sutton have won four, lost five and drawn one; at home the record is W5 L4 D1, even stevens.

The Match

We travel back just over thirty years to 1994 and the visit of Bishops Stortford in the Isthmian League. Neither side was enjoying life in the IL with the visitors just two points and two places above Sutton in 14th place. United had gone four league matches without a win and had not been successful at GGL since 23rd August. The match was played on a wet afternoon and started slowly before, in the 23rd minute, Dominic Feltham scored with a low shot and five minutes later David Jones headed in off the crossbar from a Steve Smart cross. Stortford's capitulation continued as in the 41st minute Paul Barrowcliff sent Feltham through and he rounded the 'keeper Gavin King to plant the ball in a vacant net.

Hat-trick Hero - Dominic Feltham




Stortford hit the crossbar early in the second period but in the 75th minute Kelly Haag headed home from a Micky Stephens delivery. The best goal was the last goal. The 89th minute saw Feltham produce one of his trademark chipped finishes to complete a fine hat-trick; 5–0 it finished in front of 547 people. This was to prove one of few bright spots in an IL campaign that saw the club flirt dangerously with relegation before being galvanised late in the term. The game also saw one of the shortest first-team careers for the club with former Wimbledon striker Leighton Allen's substitute's appearance his only fifteen minutes in a Sutton shirt.

The Player

Appearing and indeed scoring for Sutton on this day in 1968 was a young inside forward, Alan Gane. He was also the club's manager at the time of the above featured match. Alan joined U's during the summer of 1968 after being released by Chelsea. The 1968/9 season would be his only one at Sutton as a player, making his debut against Walton & Hersham in South of the Thames Cup on 10th September, scoring in a 3–1 win. Alan enjoyed a run of matches during which he netted another three times but the arrival of Peter Drabwell and the return to form of Micky Mellows saw his opportunities reduced to being often twelfth man. Perhaps that and the disappointment of being the unused substitute at the 1969 Amateur Cup Final was too much for a young footballer and the following season he joined Slough Town



before moving on to a semi-pro contract with Hereford United and then having a spell with Brentford moving on to Wycombe Wanderers during the '72/73 season.

A spell at Chelmsford City was followed by a return to Slough for the 1975/6 season and he remained at Wexham Park until moving to Staines Town in 1980 and then Walton & Hersham. In 1984 Alan cut his managerial teeth as assistant manager at Wycombe before taking full control during the 1985/6 season. Sacked by Wycombe he became Staines manager during the '87/8 term and then was seduced by Wealdstone during 1989/90 before being appointed as Sutton manager for the 1991/2 season. His mission was to return Sutton to the GMV Conference but despite some great football being played under him and it should be said spending a fair bit of money on transfer fees (unheard of at SUFC before) he never really got near.

Cup runs including the Trophy semi-final in 1993 and the FA Cup 3rd round in 1994 proved to be exciting highlights. Of those players he did bring to the club unarguably the best ironically cost the club nothing, Dominic Feltham. As stated above, the '94/5 season proved difficult for Sutton, and Alan and the club parted ways in early February.


Ganey loved Sutton (to be fair he was very popular with officials and fans alike himself) and such was his disappointment at having to leave in such a manner he never managed another football club. Under his stewardship Sutton won the Loctite (Isthmian Full Members) Cup in 1992 and reached two Surrey Senior finals, winning in 1993 but losing a year later. However, the IL title was, at the time, his (and the club's) Holy Grail. As a player, Alan made 32 appearances scoring 4 goals and he took control of 243 matches winning 122 split evenly home and away.

The Programme

Mid 1950s fare this evening and the home programme for an Athenian League match with Hounslow Town. The eight page production (cover below) was in its fourth season and maintained a rigorous presentation save for a few nuances. The inside cover held club notes (not accredited) and discussed the rise of Hounslow as a force in amateur football as well as considering the merits of a clutch of new signings including seventeen year old left back Eddie Speight. The Grandstand Fund (you may well be or have sat in it today) had raised £4 8/2 at the previous home match. At the bottom of the notes, a list of U's goal scorers saw Billy Robinson top with ten.

Continues

On page three adverts dominated the up to date Athenian tables (senior and reserve), R Knowler proprietor of The Jug House Off-Licence in Collingwood Road sat beneath them. As ever middle pages held the team line ups surrounded by more adverts including one for Shinners Ltd (I expect a nostalgic delight for some of the club's older patrons). Fixtures and results were presented on page six with mixed fortunes for the reserves losing 7-0 at Hayes but despatching Southall by 6-1 in a spell of under two months. Page seven had a Supporters' Club column reporting on the success of a "Games Evening" with the Barns Green and Itchingfield Social Club held at The Wandgas Sports Ground. Below that was the rare siting of the Surrey Combination table in which U's third team sat fourth and unbeaten. The back cover was mainly adverts but a middle band displayed club honours and next Saturday's fixture with Enfield reserves. A fair bit of information packed in alongside the plethora of local businesses renting advertisement space. Wonderful.



SUFC v Eastleigh

While Eastleigh's first visit to GGL was in the FA Cup in 2001, the two clubs have met regularly in league football since 2005/06 season. They did the double over U's that season winning by 3-0 here, a victory that remains their best at Sutton in league football. That was in the Conference South and their only win at Sutton in that competition. In the NL tonight is their sixth visit and they have just picked up one point in their previous five visits, a 1-1 draw in January 2017. Four years later, Sutton recorded their best score line against Eastleigh at Sutton, 3-0. U's record at The Silverlake is no better than Eastleigh's is here. The only victory was by 2-1 in September 2007 in the CS, ironically Sutton's worst season in just over eighty years. Last season's 1-1 draw on BH Monday in August (care of Eduino Vaz's brilliant strike) was only Sutton's second NL point at Eastleigh.

U's record at GGL (league only) W6 D4 L1 F15 A8

Ross Montague, Craig Dundas and Jamie Collins hold the joint top scorer record for Sutton versus Eastleigh with two each.

There is a long list of players to have appeared for both clubs influenced by Paul Doswell, particularly in his early seasons at GGL. They include 'keeper Gareth Howells; defenders Karim El-Salahi, Chris Collins, Dean Beckwith and Dan Spence and midfielders David Hughes (he also managed Eastleigh) Gavin Heeroo and Chris Piper. Wide men include the talented Matt Hann, Tony Taggart and Enzio Boldewijn while up front current coach Matt Tubbs will be remembered for a brief but important role during the 2016/17 season including that equaliser against Cheltenham in the FA Cup 2nd round. Steve Watts, Marvin Williams and Andy Forbes are other strikers to have worn both sets of colours. Finally, Jamie Collins partnered Beckwith for both clubs in the middle of the back four; Dos always called him his best signing and he delivered with that spot kick in January 2017 against Leeds United to set up that special evening with Arsenal.

There are plenty of others and as well as Tubbsy we welcome back Aaron Pierre this evening, while from our squad Noa Boutin and Jayden Harris have both had spells at the Silverlake Stadium.



The latest news from David Weir Leisure Centre; the home of the Sutton Academy and Women's teams.

Sutton fell to a second consecutive defeat in the EFL Youth Alliance South, with a 2-1 defeat away at Exeter City.

A Bobby Sheargold strike saw the U's keep the deficit close, but two goals from Tobias Allsop were enough to seal a victory for the Grecians.

Sutton are next in action in the EFL Youth Alliance on Saturday with the visit of Newport County, while the Academy were also in action in the National League Football Academy Cup this afternoon against Wealdstone.

Sutton United Women extended their unbeaten run to eight games with a statement win against Dartford Women at the David Weir.

Both sides began brightly, trading early chances in an even contest. Dartford struck first when Amina Hanif hit the post, before Sutton's K'Shaela Burch-Waldren tested goalkeeper Charlton. The visitors looked dangerous, but Lizzie Adams' timely clearance denied Gabby Williams a clear opportunity. After half an hour, Dartford began to dominate, with Ekwo posing constant problems down the left. Just before half time, she set up Shauni Griffiths, who fired over.

Sutton regrouped after the break and took a surprise lead through Burch-Waldren, who lobbed Charlton following a clever free kick from Lucy Clark's side. Dartford immediately pushed for an equaliser, Leen Ekwo forcing a fine save from Megan Taylor. Despite pressure, clear chances were limited.

Ekwo came closest late on, volleying inches wide in the 83rd minute, sparking a late Dartford surge.

London & South East Regional Football League Cup Second Round



Taylor's brilliant save and Tessa Allen's last-ditch clearance in stoppage time secured Sutton's 1–0 victory, extending their unbeaten run since September.



Sutton United Women Manager Lucy Clark has been nominated for the London & South East Regional Football League Premier Division Manager of the Month award.

The recognition for the U's boss comes after she guided the club to four points from a possible six during October, with Sutton extending their unbeaten run to eight in all competitions, including four in the league.

Clark's side began the month with a 5-2 win over Penn and Tylers Green in the Women's FA Cup, and was followed by a 3-0 win over Carshalton Athletic in the Isthmian Cup.

This preceded their first league game of the month, with a Gabby Williams goal securing a 1-1 draw with Dorking Wanderers, before an Emma Spear brace sealed a 2-1 win over Barking the following week.

More recently, Clark guided Sutton to the FA Cup Second Round, with a 1-1 draw with Brentford leading to a successful shootout win courtesy of some heroics from Megan Taylor.

Brentford's Carly Williams and Millwall's Ted Jones have also been nominated for the prize.

Jay Coombes and Mikey Charvetto Parody are set to return to international action, having been called up to the Gibraltar Under-21 squad for the November international break.

Los Llanas are set to take on Serbia (12th November), Croatia (15th November) and Georgia (18th November) in the UEFA Under-19 European Championship Qualifiers.






"It's been really good under Chris," he added. "Training has been high intensity and very focused. The lads are enjoying it and we're looking forward to every game."










FA CUP REVIEW

The FA Cup delivered a number of shocks and impressive performances from National League sides on the weekend.

Arguably the biggest shock of the round was Gateshead's 2-0 victory at League One side AFC Wimbledon. The Dons sat sixth in League One ahead of the tie but the National League side made up the 57 places between the two sides with an impressive away performance.

Former U's forward Kain Adom bagged his eleventh of the season in all competitions to give the North East side the lead. A second from Fenton John just after half-time gave them a 2-0 lead which saw them progress to the Second Round to host Walsall who beat Eastleigh 3-0 on Sunday.



Boreham Wood made it ten games unbeaten at Meadow Park after winning 3-0 against League Two strugglers Crawley. Matt Rush's thirteenth of the season and Zak Brunt's penalty gave the Hertfordshire side a 2-0 lead within fifteen minutes and a Ryan Loft red card in first-half injury time killed any hope of a comeback for the Sussex side. A sixth away game without a win on the road for Crawley was confirmed when October's National League player of the month, Abdul Abdulmalik added a third for Wood midway through the second half. Garrard's side will fancy their chances of progressing to the third round with a home tie against Newport in the next round.



The form book was turned upside down in the Saturday evening kick-off as Brackley (picking up one point in their previous five games) beat Notts County (ten points from their previous four games). Despite twice going behind to goals from Alassana Jatta and Jodi Jones, Matt Lowe and Callum Stewart's ninety-sixth minute penalty took the game to extra-time and a penalty-shoot out. Jatta and Bennett failed to convert their penalties for the League Two side and Zak Brown scored to give the National League side a 4-3 victory in the shootout. The current National League North champions have a home tie in the next round against League One's Burton who thumped Isthmian League side St Albans City 6-0 on the weekend.




Comeback of the First Round ties arguably came from Mark Hughes' Carlisle. A long journey to Reading looked to be ending in disappointment when they were 2-0 down after sixty-eight minutes. An inspired substitute from the birthday boy Hughes saw the game change as Regan Linney bagged twice in injury time to take the tie to extra-time. Linney completed his hat trick early in extra time and the Cumbrians saw out the victory to earn a trip to Blackpool who saw off another National League side Scunthorpe 1-0.



A number of National League sides were dumped out of the competition by lower league sides as well. Braintree suffered an embarrassing 4-1 defeat to local rivals Chelmsford. Just thirteen miles separate the two sides but there was a huge gap between the two sides on the pitch as a Lyle Taylor brace put the National League South through. The Clarets secured their revenge for the play-off semi-final defeat to Braintree two seasons ago and will host fellow National League South side Weston-Super-Mare in the Second Round after they caused a shock by beating National League side Aldershot.



John Coleman's first game in charge of the Hampshire side got off to a good start with Kiban Rai scoring to give them a 1-0 lead until the eighty-fourth minute. Pressure paid off for the Somerset side as Emlyn Lewis equalised to take the tie to extra-time. James Waite scored in the second period of extra-time to send the home side through to the second round for the first time since the 2003-04 season.



The lowest ranked side left in the competition are Slough who dispatched Altrincham at Arbour Park. Two quickfire goals in four minutes from Ansu Janneh and Wiktor Makowski gave Scott Davies' side a 2-0 lead until James Gale's goal in the sixty-fifth minute. A sending off for Altrincham's Elliot Osborne ten minutes from time allowed Slough to see out a 2-1 win.





Their victory earned them another home tie against Altrincham's rivals Macclesfield who came through the tie of the round against AFC Totton. A Danny Elliott treble for the Silkmen made it 3-3 at half-time before the Cheshire side ran away with it in the second half winning 6-3.



Sutton United Football Club are delighted to confirm the signing of Jake Taylor, who joins on a permanent transfer from today's opponents Eastleigh.

The experienced midfielder can boast more than a decade of professional experience having turned out for a host of clubs within the EFL, including more than 300 appearances in League Two, and will offer bite, tenacity and years of wisdom to Chris Agutter's youthful Sutton team.

The 33-year old began his career at the Madejski Stadium, joining the Royals at the age of eight and going on to spend ten years in their youth system. After scoring 20 goals for the Under-18's in the 2009/10 campaign, he was rewarded with senior debut in a League Cup game against Northampton Town, and was followed by his league debut at the end of the same season.

He subsequently spent seven further years in Berkshire, being at the club during their promotion-winning campaign in 2011/12 and their resulting season in the Premier League, though he largely spent this period out on loan with stints at Aldershot Town, Exeter City, Cheltenham Town and Crawley Town.

He later enjoyed further loans away at Leyton Orient and Motherwell two years later, and brought a permanent end to his time at Reading when he opted to return to Exeter in 2016.

This led to a hugely successful spell in Devon, spending the next five years with the Grecians in which he appeared over 200 times, as well as captaining the club between 2018 and his departure in 2021, which saw him join fellow League Two club Stevenage.

A brief stint playing under Agutter during the Head Coach's temporary charge of the Boro's first team led to Taylor being a regular fixture in the heart of the team during his first season in Hertfordshire, as well as in their promotion-winning season in 2022/23, adding to his 43 appearances during the previous campaign, before being released upon their first year in League One in nearly ten years.

A move to Eastleigh followed for the midfielder, who opted to drop into non-league as his approached his twilight years, and he was named the Spitfires' club captain following the retirement of Aaron Martin, a mark of the trust instilled in him from Head Coach Kelvin Davis after just a year in Hampshire, with Taylor going on to rack up almost 100 appearances for the club.

Internationally, Taylor has also represented Wales on a single occasion, making his debut when he replaced Hal Robson-Kanu in a European qualification victory against Cyprus in 2014.
