

HOW THINGS STAND

Albeit a very controversial topic amongst the non-league community, the National League Cup provides yet another chance at silverware for the 16 National League clubs who were happy to take part, and 16 of the best U21 professional development sides from across the country.

There's a lot of history to this competition, dating all the way back to the 1980s, introduced as the Bob Lord Challenge Trophy named after the former chairman of the formerly named Alliance Premier League. The first ever winners were once football league powerhouses and founders of the Second Division, Northwich Victoria, and other winners of this competition include the likes of Wycombe Wanderers, Doncaster Rovers & of course your U's, who achieved glory in 1991.

The competition was then axed in 2001 and brought back again in 2008 as the Setanta Shield for sponsorship reasons for two campaigns, and a poor response saw the competition axed again for the second time in its history.

With the competition being reviewed at the start of last season, the competition was brought back now in its current form with the best of youth talent of the Premier League & Championship alongside the best of what non-league has to offer.

The competition used to be a straight knockout system similar to the FA Cup however the revised format now sees groups of four National League and four Premier League 2 teams each, with each National League team playing four home games against the under-21 teams in their group. The top 2 teams from each group advance to the quarter-finals, and from then on, straight knockout games begin.



Goalkeeper

Josh Jeffries progressed through Southampton's academy after spells with AFC Totton and Eastleigh. He signed his first professional contract in 2025 and has featured for the Under-21s, gaining senior experience on loan at Worthing. Jeffries is known for his size, composure, and shot-stopping ability.

Khiani Shombe

Goalkeeper

Khiani Shombe is a goalkeeper at Southampton who progressed through the Kinetic Academy and gained senior experience with Lewisham Borough, making over 30 appearances. He signed his first professional contract with Southampton and now features for the Under-21s. Shombe is recognized for his composure, shot-stopping ability, and potential.

Will Armitage

Defender

Will Armitage joined Southampton at 16 from Cheltenham Town after making his senior debut in 2021. He featured in the Under-18s' Premier League South win, FA Youth Cup run, and Premier League 2 campaign. In 2024/25, he gained senior experience on loan at Aldershot, making 20 appearances and winning the FA Trophy.

Zach Awe

Defender

Zach Awe, a highly-rated centre-back, joined Southampton in summer 2023 after 11 years at Arsenal, where he progressed through the academy and became a key Under-21 player. He experienced the first-team environment at Arsenal, named on the bench against Wolves in 2022. In 2024/25, Awe joined Accrington Stanley on loan, making 27 appearances, including an FA Cup third-round match at Anfield against Liverpool, marking his first senior loan experience.

Nathanael Boot

Defender

Nathanael "Nat" Boot, a centre-back at Southampton, joined the academy from AFC Bournemouth in 2022 and signed his first professional contract in 2024. Overcoming a long-term injury, he impressed in the Under-21s and extended his deal through 2027. Boot is recognised for his composure, resilience, and maturity on the ball.

Sonnie Davis

Defender

Sonnie Davis, a defender in Southampton's academy since age ten, signed his first professional contract in 2023. He captained the Under-18s, helping them win the Premier League South and reach the FA Youth Cup semi-finals. In 2025, Davis gained senior experience on loan at Eastleigh in the National League.

Tommy Dobson-Ventura

Defender

Tommy Dobson-Ventura, a centre-back in Southampton's academy since age eight, signed his first professional contract in 2023, running until 2026. A natural leader, he has featured for the Under-21s and is recognised for his positional awareness, composure, and defensive maturity, establishing himself as a promising talent within the club's youth setup.

Max Fry

Defender

Max Fry, a versatile defender in Southampton's academy since age nine, can play as a centre-back, left-back, or in midfield. He was identified at the club's Bristol Development Centre and now features for the Under-21s. Fry is under contract with Southampton until June 2027 and is regarded as a promising talent.

Jayden Moore

Defender

Jayden Moore, a centre-back at Southampton since the Under-9s, signed his first professional contract in 2024. Known for his composure and ability on the ball, he has featured for both the Under-18s and Under-21s, establishing himself as a promising defensive talent within the club's academy system.

Abdulhalim Okunola

Defender

Abdulhalim Okunola, a defender at Southampton since 2023 after joining from Chelsea, signed his first professional contract in 2025 until 2027. He played 27 times for the Under-18s, scoring in the FA Youth Cup. Versatile across the back line, he is known for his defending, physicality, and attacking threat.

Sam Tabares

Defender

Sam Tabares, a defender who joined Southampton from Fulham in 2024 on a contract until 2026, is a versatile left-footed centre-back or full-back. Developed in Fulham's academy, he has represented their youth sides and is eligible to play internationally for both England and Colombia, highlighting his potential and adaptability in defence.

Rory Whittaker

Defender

Rory Whittaker, an 18-year-old Scottish right-back, joined Southampton's Under-21s in 2025 from Hibernian on a three-year deal. He became Hibs' youngest-ever senior player at 16 and has represented Scotland at youth levels. Whittaker is known for his pace, attacking ability, and defensive maturity, making him a promising talent.

Cameron Bragg

Midfielder

Cameron Bragg joined Southampton at eight, progressing through the Academy. He helped the Under-18s win the Premier League South and reach the FA Youth Cup semi-finals, then contributed to the Under-21s' title. A centre-midfielder and Under-21 captain, he made his senior debut in the FA Cup and later joined Crawley Town on loan.

Brandon Charles

Midfielder

Brandon Charles, an attacking midfielder at Southampton, signed his first professional contract in 2024. He previously developed in the Brentford and Queens Park Rangers academies. After recovering from a significant injury, he has returned to full training and is impressing with the Under-21s, establishing himself as a promising talent in midfield.

Aston Daley

Midfielder

Aston Daley, a midfielder at Southampton since age six, signed his first professional contract in 2025 until 2027. Known for his creativity and work rate, he made 40 appearances during his scholarship years, contributing four goals and 12 assists, and is regarded as a promising talent progressing through the club's academy.

Sutara Kakay

Midfielder

Sutura Kakay, an 18-year-old midfielder, joined Southampton in 2025 from Sheffield Wednesday on his first professional contract. Having impressed in Wednesday's Under-18 and Under-21 sides, he also gained first-team training experience. Known for his athleticism, vision, and ability to influence play in transition, Kakay adds a dynamic edge to Saints' midfield.

Joe O'Brien-Whitmarsh

Midfielder

Joe O'Brien-Whitmarsh, a highly-rated midfielder, joined Southampton in January 2024 from Cork City after making 27 senior appearances and scoring four goals. A Republic of Ireland youth international, he initially played with the Under-21s, made his senior debut in the Carabao Cup against Cardiff, and later joined Accrington Stanley on loan.

Ben Marsh

Midfielder

Ben Reeves rejoined the club in 2024 to support the Under-21s. Having joined the Academy in 2001, he earned his first professional contract in 2011 and made 13 senior appearances, including three Premier League games. After an EFL career with MK Dons, Charlton, Plymouth, and Gillingham, Reeves returned to Saints and, in 2025, signed a new contract combining playing duties with a role as Individual Development Coach.

Baylee Dipepa

Forward

England youth international striker Baylee Dipepa joined Southampton from Port Vale on the 2024 summer transfer deadline. He made over 30 senior appearances for Vale, debuting at 16 and earning the Young Player of the Year award after scoring three goals in his first League One season.

Princewill Ehibhatiomhan

Forward

Princewill Ehibhatiomhan, an English centre-forward, progressed through Reading's academy before joining Southampton, signing his first professional contract in 2023. In 2025, he moved on loan to League Two side Swindon Town, where he impressed by scoring on his debut, showcasing his potential as a promising attacking talent for the future.

Will Merry

Forward

Will Merry, a forward in Southampton's academy since age eight, signed his first professional contract in 2024. Known for his goal-scoring and versatility in attack, he gained first senior experience on loan at Eastleigh, making his debut as a late substitute, and is regarded as a promising talent for the future.

Sufianu Sillah Dibaga

Forward

Sufianu Sillah Dibaga, an 18-year-old winger at Southampton, joined from Crystal Palace after his Under-16s season. He excelled at Under-18 level in 2024/25, scoring nine goals and providing 11 assists, and has made appearances for the Under-21s in the Premier League Cup, establishing himself as a promising attacking talent.

HISTORIC RAMBLINGS

Three from the 25th November

A mixed bag for Sutton results wise on this day in the club's history. Of the previous four cup matches, Sutton's best return was a home defeat on penalties to Wingate & Finchley in the FA Trophy third qualifying round following a 2-2 replay draw. All three of the others ended in defeat including U's first match as a senior club on this day in 1911. That was a 3-0 reverse at home to Waltham in the London Senior Cup third qualifying round. This is United's twelfth home match on 25/11 and the record is W3 D2 L6. The last victory was in 1963, thrashing an Army XI by 7-1 in a friendly. Away from Sutton, U's have contested ten matches winning just three (one of which features below) with four draws and three defeats. The last match on this date was up at Grimsby in EFL L2 in 2023, Harry Smith's fine strike earning a point.

The Match


Back to 1972 and a trip to East London as U's were hosted by Leytonstone in an Isthmian League fixture. In the lead up to this match Sutton had lost forward Jim Brown, who had decided to rest from the game for domestic reasons (he ended up back at Bromley), while John Mears had played for Croydon Amateurs having not been officially released by Sutton, only to return to SUFC two days later. He was suspended for this IL match anyway.

U's sat in eighth place, their hosts fourteenth. Leytonstone had experienced a mixed bag of results, losing at home to then perennial strugglers

Corinthian-Casuals, but the previous Tuesday had held league leaders Hendon

1-1 away from home, extending a record of just one IL defeat in twelve matches.

For two thirds of this match, Leytonstone looked likely to build on that favourable




Goalless with sixteen minutes left, an error by home centre-back Mike Smith allowed Bob Low to advance and fire past Humphries. Three minutes later, Micky Newman evaded Smith's challenge to score with an angled drive. From nowhere U's had as good as secured victory and in the 86th minute Dennis met a fine square pass from Don Butterfill on the run to net with one of his trademark power strikes. Thus 3–0 to Sutton, leaving a bewildered Leytonstone ruing their missed opportunities, particularly in the first half.

The Player

Scoring twice on this day in 1939 in a SE Combination match against one of his former clubs Wimbledon (U's lost 3-2) was prolific forward Jack Lock. Jack joined Sutton from Leyton for the commencement of the 1937/8 season and made his debut on 4th September, a 6-0 home defeat of

Post Office Engineers in the FA Cup; he scored three of the goals. And that debut form would not desert him throughout his U's career. Jack had scored in the Amateur Cup semi-final for Leyton against Sutton the previous season. His arrival made up for U's losing the equally prolific Richard Tarrant who had accepted an invitation to a year-long trip around the globe with Islington Corinthians. That first hat-trick was followed by two more during his first season at GGL including a five goal performance against Clapton in the London Senior Cup (7-2). He ended the season with 37 goals in 39 matches (all comps).

His only winner's medal for U's came at the end of that term, as he netted in U's 5-2 defeat of Wimbledon in the Surrey Charity Shield final. The '38/9 campaign saw him produce similar end of season statistics including another five goal haul this time against Barking in the Athenian League. One of his goals came in the Surrey Charity Shield final, U's losing to Met Police by 4-1. He also represented the Surrey FA. The 1939/40 season started for U's with two Athenian matches against his old club, Leyton. Jack scored in the first, a 6-0 home win, but WWII broke out nine days later, although he was able to squeeze in an appearance for the Athenian League representative XI. When the season recommenced with a war-time competition (SE Combination), Jack continued to score goals on a regular basis staying with the club until the 1941/2 season. After WWII, and following spells with Epsom and Tooting & Mitcham, he returned late in the 1946/47 season adding more goals to his tally, this time from the left flank rather than as a centre or inside forward. The following season he was with Metropolitan Police for whom back then players had to be serving in the force in some manner. His impressive Sutton stats are 116 goals in 119 appearances.


The Programme

We stay with the above featured match for the programme paragraph. 'Stones had not produced much of a programme for over a decade and while this was an improvement, it was slight. This design was basically a double sized sheet, smaller than A4, folded to make six pages. Other than cover, each page had a banner top and bottom for adverts printed in red ink.

The folding resulted in club notes on inside cover, team layouts on page three and the hosts' reserve team's league table. Flip the programme over and the Isthmian table was followed by a listing of first and second team results. The advertisements were somewhat motor vehicle centric but if cars, their repairs or accessories and servicing of were not your bag, The Charcoal Grill in the High Road was open weekday lunchtimes as evenings all week; fully licensed too.

SUFC v Southampton

The Saints make their third visit to GGL this evening, the other two being when Southampton fan Paul Doswell was Sutton manager. They were both pre-season friendlies, although the first in 2010 was given a little more flavour as it was for the President's Cup (what happened to that?).



Continues

The match ended 1-1 (Craig Dundas for United) so I suspect the cup never left GGL that season. The second was two years later, U's defeating an "XI" by 4-0, Kezie Ibe scoring twice. Tonight is therefore the first competitive match between the two clubs, although some Sutton fans may question that such is their opinion of the NLC.

Players to have played for both clubs include Scottish international Paul Telfer, Welsh Under 21 and England youth international David Hughes, and defenders Chris Collins and Jack Smith while our assistant manager Dean Hammond played over 100 games for Saints – a previous holder of that role here, Ian Baird, also played for them in the old First Division. Of our current squad, Will Tizzard was with Southampton as a junior.

The latest news from David Weir Leisure Centre; the home of the Sutton Academy and Women's teams.

Sutton United fell to successive defeats in the National League U19 Alliance Division F and National League Football Academy S, before beating Maidenhead United last time out in the National League Football Academy Cup.

After losing 6-0 at Eastleigh Blues and 2-0 at Slough Town, goals from Leo Ginger and Mehmet Halim, along with a brace from Tae Bamidele, sealed a 4-1 victory against Maidenhead to progress to the Third Round.

Sutton United Women stormed into the next round of the Combined Counties Women's League Cup with a record-breaking away win over Chessington & Hook United Ladies.

On a bitterly cold evening, Sutton—despite several changes to their lineup—started with remarkable intensity. Brianna Gilbert-Lawal struck in the opening minute to set the tone, and moments later, Phoebe Langley produced a sensational goal directly from a corner. After missing a close-range chance, Becky Olumodeji quickly made amends, coolly finishing to put Sutton 3–0 ahead. She added another soon after, converting a rebound, before Sarah Chapman weaved through the defence and squeezed her shot past the goalkeeper for Sutton's fifth.

The second half brought no relief for the hosts. Substitute Tess Ciccardini scored swiftly after coming on, and Chapman netted her second to stretch the lead to 7-0. Ciccardini then grabbed another thanks to unselfish play from Gilbert-Lawal. Cassie Chase delivered the highlight of the night with a stunning long-range strike, even earning a compliment from the opposing keeper. Ella Khaldoun rounded the goalkeeper to score Sutton's tenth. Chessington pulled one back late, but Sutton had the final say as Ciccardini completed her hat-trick with an exquisite lob.

Sutton reached the third round of the Adobe Women's FA Cup for the first time ever with victory at Bowers & Pitsea, Millie Cutler scoring twice and earning the penalty for the first goal as the club enjoyed a second 3-2 away win of the weekend.

With both teams competing at the same level of the women's pyramid, a close match was expected, and the hosts started strongly, forcing Megan Taylor to tip over an early long-range effort. Sutton struck first, though, when Cutler was pulled back in the box and Beth Humphrey confidently converted the penalty. Bowers & Pitsea pushed for an equaliser, Taylor saving well from distance before a corner caused a scramble that rolled narrowly wide.

Just before halftime the hosts missed another close-range chance, and Sutton capitalised after the break. Gilbert-Lawal shot straight at the keeper following fine work from K'Shaela Burch-Waldron, but moments later Emma Spear's run and low cross were expertly finished by Cutler. A defensive error let Bowers pull one back, though an offside flag denied them a quick second. Cutler restored Sutton's two-goal lead with a clever turn and finish. A late penalty set up a tense finish, but Sutton held firm to reach round three.

Sutton have been drawn at home to Chatham Town in the Third Round, with ties to take place on Sunday, 14th December.

Two players from Sutton's Women's team have been selected for international duty ahead of the upcoming November break.

K'Shaela Burch-Waldron has received a recall to the Bermuda team for their Gold Cup qualifying campaign.

Bermuda have been drawn into GroupC of the qualifying stage for the CONCACAF alongside Costa Rica, Guatemala, Grenada and Cayman Islands, and prepare for their first couple of of qualifiers against Cayman Islands (Thursday, 27th November; 7pm KO ET) and Guatemala (Monday, 1st December; 8pm KO ET).

In addition, Hannah Baptiste has been selected by the Guyana squad ahead of their own set of CONCACAF qualifiers, having been placed in Group B alongside Jamaica, Nicaragua, Dominica and Antigua & Barbuda.

The Golden Jaguars are set for a single match against Nicaragua on Monday, 1st December; 6pm KO ET) at the Leonora National Track & Field Center, and will be looking to qualify for the Championship for the first time since 2010; a historic achievement despite not making it past the Group Stage in Mexico.



A handful of Sutton players were in action around the globe during the final international break of the year.

Dillon De Silva played 90 minutes in a do or die clash against Thailand, with Sri Lanka's hopes of advancing to the final round of the AFC Asian Cup 2027 (Saudi Arabia qualifiers) being dashed after a 4-0 defeat against a strong Changsuek side.

Both sides needed a win to be in contention to qualify for the Asian Cup, and it was Thailand who got off to a great start, taking the lead after seven minutes thanks to a stunning Thanawat Suengchitthawon long range striker that swerved past a fully-stretched Kaveesh Fernando and nestled in the top corner.

Sri Lanka came close to an equaliser when the Sutton winger, currently on loan at Tamworth, followed up on a Jason Thayaparan low shot from outside the box which Patiwat Khammai had to push away, sending his effort wide of the target, with Thailand holding onto their slim advantage at the break.

However, despite Sri Lanka initially coming out for the second half looking hungrier, the South Asian side's inability to create during their period of dominance was punished by Thailand in the 65th minute when Supachok Sarachat produced a teasing cross to an unmarked Jude Soonsup-Bell to power a header home.


Anthony Hudson's side went on to romp past Sri Lanka, as the visitors made sure of the points with another header 12 minutes later, this time Look Saa Mickelson providing the cross from the right flank with Pansa Hemviboon towering over Garrett Kelly to nod past a rooted Fernando.

Soonsup-Bell claimed a second goal in the 90th minute,



sweeping home Suphanan's cross to seal a dominant win for Thailand, and their fate will be decided when they face Turkmenistan in their final Group D fixture.

Sri Lanka meanwhile, despite having one remaining second-leg match against Chinese Taipei on 31st March, 2026, have already been eliminated from the tournament.



Jay Coombes and Mikey Charvetto Parody featured for Gibraltar Under-19's, with Los Llanas starting their qualifying campaign for the 2026 UEFA Under-19 European Championships in Wales.

While Charvetto Parody appeared once – an 8-0 defeat to Croatia – Coombes captained the side and played every minute for Team 54, who began proceedings with a 4-0 defeat to Serbia. Srđan Borovina scoring a brace either side of a Uroš Djorđević goal to give Orlovi a 3-0 advantage at the break, before Aleksa Damjanović made the win safe with 16 minutes remaining.

This was followed by an 8-0 loss against Croatia, with Vatreni scoring four goals in each half to breeze past the ten men of Gibraltar, who lost Owen Fortunato after his red card on the stroke of half time.

Luka Vrzić scored a hat-trick including two in the final 13 minutes, setting Croatia on their way with further goals from Lovro Chelfi, Bruno Durdov, Karlo Šimić and Marko Aščić securing the romp.


This was followed by a 1-0 defeat against Georgia courtesy of a second half Halid Doltmourziev strike, in a match that ended in controversial fashion as a total of seven players were sent off in the final minutes, including Sutton's Mikey Charvetto Parody, as well as Georgia manager Vasil Maisuradze.


With tensions high as they arrived into the final minutes, the red cards flew as they entered stoppage time with Georgia receiving a total of five red cards and Gibraltar three, two of them to Gibraltar goalkeepers, resulting in the referee signalling the end of the match immediately.







THE Group's In A Really Good Place"

Jake Taylor reflected on how crucial the 3-2 victory over Truro City felt for the squad, describing it as a defining moment in their early-season journey.

In difficult conditions, the team showed resilience and the ability to respond under pressure, with a brace from Kai Jennings sealing a dramatic win.

"It was a really important win. It's a tough place to come, I think, against a team who's desperate for points."

"Our away form hasn't been great, so it was great to get our first away win of the season as well."

"I thought we were really good in spells, could have probably scored a couple more, then showed really good character when it went back to 2-2 to have a bit of quality from Kai [Jennings]; a couple of bits of quality from Kai, he's a fantastic player and it's a really important win for us."

His words captured the sense of relief shared within the group, who had been striving to improve their away performances. The acknowledgement of the team's character, especially when pegged back to 2-2, highlighted the growing belief in their ability to react and overcome adversity.

The confidence gained from this breakthrough result, according to Taylor, could prove invaluable as they look to build momentum during a crucial stretch of fixtures.

"I think since I've come in, the results have been really positive, the group's in a really good place, lots of young boys working really hard to improve and we're seeing improvements for sure."

"It's important to not think this is enough, to keep working hard and keep picking points up because there's some really, really good players in there and it's about trying to show as many moments as possible, which we have done recently."

The midfielder stressed the importance of staying grounded, emphasising that continued hard work will be needed if they are to climb further up the table. His comments reflected

both ambition and the realism necessary for sustained success.

A pivotal moment arrived just before the interval, when Jayden Harris struck on the stroke of half time to give Sutton a deserved lead; the timing of the goal provided a much-needed lift and shifted the dynamic heading into the second half.

> "It was a really good time to score. Like I said, we created a few good opportunities but didn't quite break through in the first half, but just going 1-0 up in the first half was important and I thought we came out and we started the second half really well as well to manage to go 2-0 up."

"Disappointing to go 2-2 but like I said it shows there's really good belief and character in the squad to keep going knowing that we're going to keep scoring goals and thankfully Kai came up with, like I said, a little bit of magic."

The frustration of losing a two-goal advantage was clear, yet the response – capped by a match-winning contribution from Jennings – illustrated a growing maturity within the side after a performance built not solely on technical quality, but on fight, determination, and trust.

Since joining the club from Eastleigh, Taylor has quickly become integrated into the squad, and touched on his enjoyment and comfort within the group being evident both on and off the pitch, with strong relationships forming in a short period of time.

"I've loved it. The boys have been brilliant so far since I've come in."

"Obviously, the results have been really positive as well, which helps, but, yeah, I've settled in really well. I've really enjoyed my football. I'm learning a lot from the gaffer and the staff here. So, yeah, like I said, I'm really enjoying it so far."

"Kai's fantastic, he's a joy to play with. So is Jayden [Harris] and Simps [Lewis Simper], they always want the ball in tight situations. They can produce a little bit of magic and it's about trying to get the best out of everyone."

"It's really enjoyable playing with some really good footballers"
