

It will be a familiar journey, and the last time they took the coach to London earlier this month they had perhaps the best result of their season, knocking out AFC Wimbledon in the 1st Round of the FA Cup. Whilst we wish them, and their supporters, safe travels, we do of course hope for a different footballing outcome today.

Their reward is to host an EFL League 2 side in Walsall, whilst we have opponents from the other end of the same division in Shrewsbury Town. It's important not to get distracted by the potential bright lights of a 3rd Round eye-catching draw though, and instead focus on the potential points to extend our winning run, and the gradual rise up the table since Chris was appointed a few weeks ago.

Gateshead at home won't be an easy tie though, with them having won more points on the road this season than we have at home, and looking at their matches against our opponents they have done better in many cases too. It's only goal difference that is keeping us apart in the National League table, where we have both conceded fewer and scored more. With our earlier in the season defensive frailties seemingly improved – albeit a clean sheet or two would reduce the nervousness of watching us when leading in the second half I'm sure – the form table has a green tinge for us, compared to their distinctive red. (A similar statement ahead of our Carlisle game though wouldn't have predicted

With our respective geographies, matches between the two clubs have not been plentiful, but those that have been played have produced some excitement and some unusual scorelines. A 3–3 home match in the 1990/91 season, after we led 3–0, was an exciting goalfest, but overshadowed by the reverse fixture a month earlier, which we won 9–0. Especially so, since we were ultimately relegated from the Conference (as was) that year. That was the joint highest ever win at this level at the time – which still holds with another three equivalent scorelines since – and remarkably away too! Only eight sides scored more goals than us that season – but with so many scored in that game rather than spread out to win points in other games we finished in the penultimate league position and dropped out of the top division of the national pyramid. Another demonstration of how strange that season was is that we won the National League Cup equivalent – the Bob Lord Trophy – that season too!

Last season "The Heed" did the double over us. The first game winning by the single goal of the game, but with Sutton camped around the visitors' box for most of the last fifteen minutes to no avail. The return leg was a remarkable affair also, with Gateshead going into the match without a win in several weeks and seemingly in freefall from the play off positions, and the Ambers – after a fixture schedule of playing Oldham away on Saturday, arriving home on Sunday, and setting off for Gateshead again without training – suffering from a sickness bug. Gateshead scampered to a 2-0 lead in an almost empty stadium, before Will Davies scored with almost the last kick of the half. Fifteen minutes rehydrating was followed by a quick rare goal from Alex Kirk (on a rare appearance!) before the goal of the season from Lewis Simper from way outside of the box sent the U's supporters ecstatic and into the lead. Two late goals as the suffering U's faded secured a 4-3 victory for the home side, before a very uncomfortable long coach journey home to round off a ridiculous week for the club.

Not playing that night, but joining us shortly afterwards after being recalled by Gateshead from his loan at Fylde, was Kain Adom. Kain left us at the end of the season, returning once more to Gateshead, and to date this season has been their star player, currently sitting in 5th place in the league top scorer chart with nine goals. Lewis Simper hunting him down two places lower with seven goals vying for the highest scoring midfielder moniker!

Since I last wrote notes for the programme the first team has been picking up the points needed to lift us out of the relegation places – hopefully permanently. But it's the cup competitions that are providing just as much excitement. No doubt many attending today – and many more who won't be – will be at the Shrewsbury Town FA Cup spectacle next weekend, but it's cup fever across the club with Surrey Senior Cup and FA Trophy adventures too for the men.

Our women will also be playing in the FA Cup having reached the 3rd Round of the competition for the first time, and rewarded with their first outing of the season at the VBS Community Stadium as a result on 14th December. With interest and support this season eclipsing previous ones it is hoped a record attendance for a home women's game will be achieved – and an overall record beating the 703 that saw us play at Guernsey might just be possible with your support!





1 | Tiernan Brooks

Goalkeeper

Tiernan Brooks joined Gateshead on a two-year deal in July 2024 from Notts County, and was part of the play-off promotion winning side from County in 2022. A host of loan spells preceded his move to the North-East, with the shot stopper also being capped by Ireland's U21s.

13 | Preston Leech

Goalkeeper

Preston Leech penned a contract with the club in August 2025 after he progressed through the Gateshead academy setup. He was named on the bench twice during the 2024/25 National League season.

33 | George Shelvey

Goalkeeper

This 22-year-old goalkeeper has deputised for Tiernan Brooks across this season, and began his career with Nottingham Forest as a youngster. Loans with Mansfield, Wealdstone and Truro were followed by a few months with Dundalk in Ireland, before joining Gateshead.

2 | Callum Johnson

Defender

One of many new arrivals this season, the right-back arrived from Bradford City and was part of the squad that gained promotion to League One last year. With over 200 appearances at League One level with the likes of Fleetwood & Portsmouth, Callum Johnson has plenty to boast about.

3 | David Ferguson

Defender

Also joining at the start of this season, the 31-year-old was a regular at Hartlepool United for five years which included a promotion campaign to the EFL. The defender now joins his third club at this level, following his spell at Pools & York City.

4 | Aidan Elliot-Wheeler

Defender

Aidan Elliot-Wheeler is now into his eighth loan spell whilst being on the books with Oxford United. Four separate loan spells at Banbury preceded spells with Hemel Hempstead Town, Oxford City and Salisbury, before his recent move to Gateshead.

5 | Kenton Richardson

Defender

Being capped by England C and a regular in the Heed defence, he has become a key part of their defence over the last few seasons. The central defender made a further 45 appearances when Gateshead finished in the National League play-off places for the first time since 2014, and started at Wembley Stadium as The Heed lifted the 2024 Isuzu FA Trophy.

15 | Ibrahim Bakare

Defender

Both of English and Nigerian heritage, Ibrahim was scouted by Morecambe as a 16-year-old before joining in 2018. Since then, a brief spell at Cardiff City's youth set up followed various playing spells in non-league & a year in Canada, before joining Cheltenham & moving on loan to The Heed just last month.

18 | Joe Grayson

Defender

Joe Grayson joined the club in August 2023 in a deal until the end of the 2023/24 National League season and has extended his stay since then. The left back was a key part of the season where his side finished 6th in the National League and lifted the Isuzu FA Trophy at Wembley Stadium.

26 | Conor Pani

Defender

Although currently injured, Conor Pani has been with the club since progressing through the academy five seasons ago. Loan spells at Morpeth Town, Workington and Blyth Spartans, as well as returning and securing National League safety with his side have been major highlights so far in his career.

31 | Ben Williams

Defender

Another graduate from the Gateshead youth setup, Ben Williams penned a professional contract in 2024. The defender previously appeared for Sunderland U18s, for whom he made 44 appearances across three seasons.

34 | Max Melbourne

Defender

Left sided defender Max Melbourne has had a varied career since progressing through West Bromwich Albion's academy. Two spells in Scotland including time in several League Two outfits led him to take a year out of football, before joining his current side.

37 | Carter Milmore

Defender

The centre-back is one of several members of Armstrong's old U19 squad and made his first-team debut in November 2024, coming on as a substitute in a 5-0 win away to Maidenhead United. Being the former captain of the current gaffer's youth side, he's made a single appearance so far this season.

6 | Will Flint

Midfielder

Joining from Doncaster Rovers on loan at the start of the season, Flint is adept as both a central midfielder and a central defender. Flint has made four first team appearances for Rovers, and spent the 2024/25 campaign on loan with National League North side Darlington.

10 | Jacob Butterfield

Midfielder

A real journeyman, Jacob Butterfield began his career at Barnsley and went on to play at a high level, with spells at Norwich, Middlesbrough, Huddersfield, Derby and Crystal Palace, plus time in Australia and Scotland. He later joined Gateshead, becoming player-assistant manager and offering experience, control and leadership across midfield for the club's ongoing development on and off the pitch.

11 | Tyrelle Newton

Midfielder

22-year-old Tyrelle Newton progressed through Luton's youth academy before spending his first spells in senior football with Cheshunt & Hemel Hempstead. Following his release from the Hatters, he joined the north east side last summer.

17 | Josh Home

Midfielder

Josh Home first joined Gateshead on loan from Birmingham City for the remainder of the season in September 2024, and has since returned on a permanent deal following his release. He made seven appearances across all competitions during his four-month temporary stint at Gateshead International Stadium, before returning later in pre-season.

20 | Fenton John

Midfielder

Fenton John joined Gateshead in July 2024 ahead of the 2024/25 season, penning an initial one-year deal on Tyneside. He was a regular fixture in Middlesborough's U18 and U21 sides in recent years, racking up 49 appearances for the former and 23 appearances for the latter across the last four seasons before departing for the Heed.

22 | Curtis Edwards

Midfielder

Curtis Edwards developed at Middlesbrough before revitalising his career in Sweden with Östersund and Djurgården, winning domestic honours and earning a move to Norway's Stabæk. Returning to England, he played for Woking and Notts County before joining Gateshead in 2025, bringing experience, composure, and proven adaptability across the midfield.

35 | Callum Bone

Midfielder

Callum Bone is a young midfielder who rose through Gateshead's academy before signing his first professional contract in 2025. Comfortable as an attacking or central midfielder, he made early senior appearances during the 2024/25 season, and is viewed as a promising prospect for Gateshead's future with energy and composure on the ball.

39 | Oli Thompson

Midfielder

Yet another youth academy graduate, the forward was vital in both semi-final and winning runs in the FA Trophy back to back. Thompson signed a professional contract in 2023, alongside loans at Ashington and Blyth Spartans.

9 | Dom Telford

Forward

Yes, that Dom Telford who was a League Two Team of the Season member. 25 league goals in the 2021/22 season saw him in red hot form, before joining Crawley Town. After joining Barnet on loan in 2025 and being part of the squad that won the title, he now joins the Heed on a two-year deal.

14 | Frank Nouble

Forward

Frank Nouble is a forward whose journeyman career began at West Ham after time in Chelsea's academy. He has played for over 20 clubs, including Wolves, Ipswich, Coventry, Colchester, and Tianjin Songjiang in China. Versatile and industrious, he later moved through lower leagues before joining Gateshead in 2025.

16 | Lucas Lowery

Forward

This 18-year-old has made several appearances in senior football for the Heed already. Time with several local non-league sides has helped his progression, which includes time at Whitley Bay & Newton Aycliffe.

23 | Ethan Fitzhugh

Forward

The 23-year-old celebrated his birthday on Thursday and progressed through the Leicester City academy. Loans at Banbury, Mickleover and then later Buxton saw him impress, before he made the move up north.

27 | Kian Pennant

Forward

The striker arrived on loan from Leicester City in October and extended his loan stay until December on Monday. Being the nephew of Jermaine Pennant, the striker has made eight appearances for the club so far.

HISTORIC RAMBLINGS

Three from the 29th November

Prior to this afternoon, Sutton have played nineteen matches on this day as a senior club, today is the tenth at home. The first was in 1913, a defeat in the London Senior Cup 3rd qualifying round to Summerstown by 3-1 played at The Find in Grove Road. U's have enjoyed two spectacular home wins, the second of which is featured below. The first was a 7-2 defeat of Royal Corps of Signals in a war-time friendly in 1941. The last match played on this date was at GGL, a 6-0 thrashing by Dover in the National League in 2016; mitigating circumstances for that reverse, not least going down to ten men early in the piece. U's have won four and lost five of the home matches played. Away from The Find and GGL, of Sutton's ten fixtures four have been won and five ended in defeat, the only draw coming at Frickley Athletic in the GMV Conference in 1986. U's best away win came in 1919, a 5-1 defeat of 3rd Coldstream Guards in the South Suburban League (West). The heaviest defeat came at Southall in the Athenian League (3-0 in 1947).

The Match

Today's featured match doesn't just stand out because of the scoreline but for its incongruity amidst the rest of the season. As stated before, the 1952/53 proved a big challenge for the club and they finished second from bottom of the Athenian League. Cup football would provide little solace but the visit of Isthmian League Barking in the London Senior Cup first round produced the season's highlight.

Because of injuries, Sutton had to reshuffle their half back line with skipper Don Stoker moving to the right from the centre. The first half saw both sides miss decent opportunities until the 41st minute when Colombo profited from a Bernard Orwin error. Three minutes later Reg Sentance collected from Stoker to fire a swerving shot past Mason in the Barking goal. The real fireworks started after the break.

Scorer of the goal of the game,

In the 48th minute Sentance scored his second from a low Dennis Dodd cross. It was 2–2 in the 61st minute as Holdeman had a tap in but immediately Stoker surged forward to net with a thirty yard strike. And a minute had yet to elapse when Ron Sheppard netted at the third attempt. Sheppard saw his shot spilled into the net by Mason in 70th minute and two minutes later, under heavy Sutton pressure, Leary placed the ball into his own net. Four minutes later Sheppard completed his hat-trick by lobbing the ball over Mason and Sentance repeated the treble feat with a simple task after Wilf Solari's pile driver had been pushed out by Mason. That completed the scoring in the 83rd minute; 8–2 to Sutton.

That would be U's last cup win of the season, losing 5-1 at Finchley in the next round and losing in the first round of Amateur and Surrey Senior Cups and the Surrey Charity Shield.

The Match

Appearing for Sutton on two occasions on this day in history was the exciting and clever footballer and immensely likeable Eddie Akuamoah. Eddie spent most of his career playing locally starting at Carshalton Athletic in 1991 before joining Kingstonian in 1993 where he stayed for the rest of the decade experiencing all the success that K's enjoyed, albeit at an eventual costly expense. He joined Sutton for the 2001/02 season making his full debut at Braintree Town in the Isthmian League on the opening day of that season, scoring his first goal at



Hitchin Town in mid–September. Eddie was a diminutive but pacey and lively left wing forward but he would later play a role as a wing back. He scored arguably the goal of the season against his old club Kingstonian in April and finished top scorer with 19 goals in all competitions. The best way to describe his goal against K's is to compare it with Ryan Giggs incredible winner in an FA Cup semi-final replay against Arsenal. That earned U's a late point. Eddie joined Bromley for the 2002/03 season but ended it back at GGL where he stayed for the following season, during that stay winning one Surrey Senior final and losing another (2003 and 2004). He stayed at Sutton until the end of the 2006/7 season, a campaign hampered by injury. Eddie made 279 appearances for U's scoring 38 goals. Three of those came in an FA Cup tie against Eastleigh in September 2001, his only hat-trick for U's. He also can boast the distinction of scoring in every competition he appeared in for Sutton; that's seven different competitions plus friendly fixtures too.

The Programme

The late 1950s and the only time U's played Corinthian League side Wembley FC on their Vale Farm ground although they would visit it half a century later to play then lodgers, Hendon. The programme was a "newspaper" style size consisting of four pages. The cover is below and the back cover was printed in a similar colour scheme but all adverts.

The Mulberry Inn offered provision for weddings and Masonic meetings. The middle two pages were quite well set out. Printed in black the first page contained News from the Lions Den (a nod to Wembley's nickname) and below that first and second XI results on one half while the teams layout was placed on the other half with a Watneys advert above. The second page was mostly adverts including a large one for Wrigley's chewing gum and in the top right hand corner an up to date Corinthian

League table. An odd publication for 3d (1.5p). For the record, U's London Senior Cup jinx struck again. U's, the LSC holders, surrendered a two goal lead to exit the '58/9 competition by 3-2 to a team playing in a league considered inferior to the Athenian, making the 1958 success more an aberration for Sutton than the norm.

SUFC v Gateshead

The Heed make their seventh visit to GGL, last season's narrow victory via a controversial penalty decision their first here. The first match between the sides at Sutton was in April 1987, U's winning by 3-0. In October 1990, U's burst into an early three goal lead before being pegged back to 3-3. Fast forward to April 2017 and Sutton recorded another 3-0 success.

The other two matches finished 1-1 and 4-2 to U's, Craig Dobson inspiring Sutton from a two goal deficit to victory; September 2017 and March 2019 respectively. At the International Stadium, the record is W2 D2 L2. This includes last season's thrilling 3-4 reverse, Lewis Simper's goal of the season included, and that 9-0 win in September 1990 still the equal highest away victory in GMVC/NL history.

Robin Seagroatt is U's top scorer for Sutton in matches against Gateshead with three, all scored in that 9-0 in the North East.

We should be welcoming back Kain Adom this afternoon but hope his fine goal scoring form so far this season takes a day off. Others to have worn the colours of both clubs include defender Sam Rents and forward Paul Whitmarsh.



IFIN SIMS For The Boys"

Jack Sims reflected on a productive afternoon after Sutton's 4–1 win over Southampton, a performance that provided much-needed minutes for several players and further strengthened the growing momentum within the squad.

The goalkeeper returned from a back injury to make his first appearance under Chris Agutter, as well as his first since September, playing his role in a third successive victory, to which he emphasised the professionalism that ran through Sutton's display.

"It was a good game, a good run out for the boys. A lot of us needed minutes; it's been a while."

"There's a few of us that really needed today and I think you could see, by the way that we approached it, that we were very professional about it and didn't sack it off, basically."

The win served not only as a confidence boost but also as a clear indication of a squad determined to maintain standards, regardless of the opposition or circumstances, while returning to action was also a significant personal milestone for Sims, who has been waiting since the end of September to play again.

"It was a bit longer than I thought it would be and I've been training for the last two weeks now. I've just been wanting to get going. The more games, the better."

His eagerness highlighted the frustration of his layoff, but also the renewed energy he brings back into the group following his successful return to training. A key talking point this season has been the reshaped goalkeeper union, one Sims said he values highly.

"It's always good having goalies out to train, especially because I'm a big goalie fan, it's always just the GK Union's always good."

"You push each other, it makes the sessions a lot easier when you've got a good group around you because you bounce off of each other so it's been nice having Tommy [Reid] here, he's done really well, and Dave [Aziaya] keeps trying, so it's been good."

Sims also discussed the recent managerial transition, praising the clarity and positivity brought in by Agutter since his arrival, with that shift being evident across the club as improved performances have helped to build belief and restore confidence in the squad's direction.

"It's different, he asks us to do something slightly different. I'm sure you can probably see that from watching the games so it's quite nice to get a feel for it because I've only been watching it for the last few months"

"The biggest thing is the atmosphere, everyone seems to be a lot more positive and that comes from winning games, doesn't it?"

Having endured a tough start to the season, as well as suffering injury just as Agutter took charge, Sims said he firmly understands the journey the players have been on.

"It took a while because obviously a lot of heads were down the way we started, so it was a difficult thing to do."


"But I think after performance, after performance everyone started to believe in it a little bit. And then once people start buying in, results start happening, it's a lot easier to be happy."







The National League delivered another weekend full of drama and unpredictability with 34 goals scored and seven away victories across the 12 games.


Rochdale moved back on top of the National League with a 2-1 victory at Tamworth in one of the early kick-offs. Kyron Gordon opened the scoring for the Manchester side just before half-time with Emmanuel Dieseruvwe scoring Dale's second and his twelfth league goal of the season. Dan Creaney added a consolation for the Lambs on his return to the club but the defeat made it five consecutive games without a win at home for Tamworth.

Rochdale moved top of the division thanks to Forest Green dropping points in a 1-1 draw at Wealdstone. Isaac Moore gave Robbie Savage's side the lead at half-time but Micah Obiero's equaliser just past the hour mark made it eleven points acquired from their previous five games. The dropped points for Forest Green saw them move from first to fourth thanks to wins on the road for York and Carlisle.





The latter picked up the three points in the late kick-off on DAZN in a 2-1 victory at Boston. A brace for Harvey MaCadam either side of Lenell John-Lewis' strike extended the Cumbrians' unbeaten run to ten games in all competitions with eight wins during that run.
