

A look back at how both teams reached this afternoon's game.

2nd Qualifying Round

Burgess Hill Town O Sutton United 9

Gabby Williams and Emma Spear each score four as Sutton cruised through their opening tie. It was 3-0 after ten minutes and 5-0 at half time, Spear having completed a hat-trick, and Williams matched her early in the second half. Both then added further goals before Beth Humphrey rounded off the scoring from the penalty spot.

3rd Qualifying Round Sutton United 5 Penn & Tyler's Green 2

There were early goals in this game as well, with Penn & Tyler's Green ahead after two minutes and Milly Cutler equalising immediately. Two goals from K'Shaela Burch-Waldron(right, heading the first) before half time put Sutton in control, and in the second half she was then brought down to give Beth Humphrey the chance to extend the lead from a penalty. The visitors pulled one back, but Gabby Williams made it 5-2 late on.

Beaconsfield Town 0 Chatham Town 6

After a goalless first half, Chatham went in front in the second period through Karesha Iton and Jessica King before two goals in five minutes from Amelia Woodgate and two in two from Madison Woodgate rounded off an ultimately convincing victory.

First Round

Brentford 1 Sutton United 1 (Sutton won 4-3 on penalties)

Having already been beaten on a league visit to Brentford, Sutton gained revenge despite going behind in only the 10th minute. It stayed that way until fifteen minutes from time when Gabby Williams pounced on a defensive mistake and rewarded Sutton for a performance that got better as the game went on. Goalkeeper Megan Taylor then took centre stage, saving three penalties to allow Zoe Walters to clinch U's second round place with her spot kick.

AFC Wimbledon 3 Chatham Town 3 (Chatham won 4-2 on penalties)

Chatham were indebted to a goal by Amy Russ two minutes from time which forced a penalty shootout in which they prevailed against higher ranked opposition. Wimbledon had scored first but two goals from Ellie Jeffkins saw Chatham lead at half time, only to concede twice in the last twenty minutes before Russ's late leveller set up the shootout which Chatham won 4-2.

Second Round Bowers & Pitsea 2 Sutton United 3

Beth Humphrey was on the spot again here, converting an early penalty after Milly Cutler had been fouled.

Cutler herself doubled the lead early in the second half with a fine goal, turning in Emma Spear's cross, and although Bowers & Pitsea immediately responded, Cutler was quickly on target again to restore the two goal advantage. A late penalty for the home side ensured a nervous last ten minutes but Sutton held on to secure a first-ever third round place.



Exeter City 2 Chatham Town 2 (Chatham won 4-3 on penalties)

Chatham again put out higher ranked opposition, coming from behind twice to force a penalty shoot out. Ellie Jeffkins continued her form from the previous round with both Chatham's goals, the second coming with just five minutes left, and again Chatham came through in the shootout, Simone Eligon making two fine saves.

- Third Round Proper: By 15 December
- Fourth Round Proper: By 19 January
- Fifth Round Proper: By 23 February
- Quarter-finals: By 22 March
- Semi-finals: 20 April
- Final: 25 May




