A warm welcome to the supporters of AFC Croydon Athletic and their players, staff and club officials too as we host them at the VBS Community Stadium in the Surrey Senior Cup this evening.

Those of you that know me will know I have often referred to this as my favourite competition. I was first introduced to the club through an exciting cup tie and there is something about knockout football that always adds an edge to matches. With regular success in this competition in my formative years of support it always brings expectation and excitement to me each season.

One of the only downsides to the Club's successful rise up the football pyramid over the years is the relegation of this competition in importance, which whilst I understand (and gives me no desire to swap that journey), it has meant a long fallow period without that trophy. If Chris is true to his word of wanting to win every match and every piece of silverware available, that wait might be over.

That successful rise up the football pyramid to competing at a national level has also meant a decrease in the number of local games against long established rivals, and whilst some alternative derbies have come to replace those, it is always nice to play, albeit infrequently, against local clubs whose paths were crossed more frequently in the past of my youth.

Croydon have never won this competition – discounting the 2 wins for West Croydon in the 19th century – but we have made the final on 28 occasions (one less than Woking) being the victors 15 times. As a youngster I was fully convinced in the 1980s we would overhaul Dulwich (who haven't won it since their 16th success in 1975) to be the side with the most wins in this cup competition. It hasn't happened, at least yet, with our success stalling with our 15th win back as far now as 2003! That's the largest gap between successes since our first win in 1946.

Of course, despite Surrey FA having this marked as a first team competition the reality is it is now rarely treated as such by us. Even on rare occasions where a second team has progressed to the latter stages, or final, to be replaced by a first team, we have still come up short. And the days of hosting the final and ensuring a Sutton presence have also faded such that a large number of our supporters don't recognise our past glories. That will hopefully change this season.







Goalkeeper

Being of Ivory Coast descent, Amadou Tangara has been between plenty of non-league clubs before joining last season. Tangara has also spent time at Leatherhead, Horsham, Dulwich Hamlet & Grays Athletic.

Michael Kamara

Defender

Being one of the more senior members in the squad, 36-year-old Michael Kamara has spent plenty of time at higher levels of non-league, which includes spells at Woking & Boreham Wood. The central defender has also spent time at Farnborough, Dover Athletic & Tonbridge Angels.

Jerry Puemo

Defender

Fellow defender Jerry Puemo has also been experienced at decent levels of non-league. Double spells at Leatherhead & Kingstonian preceded him joining his current side across last season.

Noah Watson

Defender

Brother of former West Ham & Charlton midfielder Louie, Noah Watson was a regular at Crystal Palace's academy before being released. A spell at Aldershot at the start of this season saw him join the club midway through the start of this season.

Cian McCarthy

Defender

Cian McCarthy, the son of current Ireland & Crystal Palace assistant manager Patrick, had a spell with Bromley's academy before moving to Holmesdale, prior to joining his current side.

Pape Souaré

Defender

Arguably one of the most acclaimed members of this team, the wing-back spent time with Lille as a youngster before joining Crystal Palace for £5 million in 2014. Spells with Charlton, Morecambe & Motherwell followed, and he's now in his second spell with the club.

Jerome Binnom-Williams

Defender

Another Palace youngster on this list, four loan spells following across the EFL at Leyton Orient & Southend United, before bouncing around the lower northern EFL teams and returning south later on. The wing-back had spells at Barnet & Maidstone United, before arriving in Croydon.

David Boateng

Defender

Yet another Palace youngster on this list, the defender is also in his second spell with the club after a short spell in Germany with KFC Uerdingen.

Junior Savane

Defender

A graduate of the Boreham Wood PASE Academy, after a year of returning home to his native France, he spent plenty of time at Dulwich Hamlet & Leatherhead before joining his current club.

Harvey Kedwell

Midfielder

The son of manager Danny, after several years with Charlton's youth set-up and a loan spell at Dagenham & Redbridge, he joined his dad at the club at the start of this year.

James Dunne

Midfielder

Veteran midfielder James was part of the Arsenal youth set up during the early 2000s, before then playing two spells at Stevenage and Portsmouth and various other EFL clubs before joining Welling United and dropping slowly down the leagues.

Charlie Colkett

Midfielder

A product of the Chelsea academy, various loans followed at Swindon, Dutch side Vitesse & Bristol Rovers before a spell out in Sweden with Ostersund. After a spell in the EFL & a spell with National League Gateshead, following his release from the North-Eastern club, he returned back to London and joined Croydon at the start of this season.

Adam Khan Ahmed

Midfielder

Being of Pakistani descent, the midfielder has had a relatively short career so far, being part of Aldershot's reserve sides before joining The Rams two years ago.

Luke Dreher

Midfielder

Yet another Palace academy product, and one of very few to make Premier League first team appearances, after success with the U18s, a loan spell at Bromley came before his release, and later at Lewes whilst at Ebbsfleet and Wealdstone, before he joined Croydon last season.

Kadell Daniel

Midfielder

Crystal Palace product Daniel spent several years in their youth set up before joining Charlton & then later Woking. After bouncing around several non-league clubs in the South East, he joined The Rams last season.

Richard Afrane-Kesay

Midfielder

This left sided winger is also a product of the Charlton academy set up, where following his release from the Addicks, he s[ent time at Braintree, Concord Rangers and two spells at Westfield, before making the move to his current club.

Reo Griffiths

Forward

A product of Spurs' and later Lyon's youth academies, two spells at Doncaster in between time at Yeovil followed. Reo recently spent time with Portland Timbers' reserve side in the MLS Next, before returning home to the UK.

Louie Theophanous

Forward

Starting off in non-league with Histon & Staines Town, a short loan spell with the U's in 2015 later came for the striker from Farnborough before bouncing between Billericay, Woking & Chelmsford City, before keeping within London after a spell at Beckenham Town.

Reece Grant

Forward

After time with Wealdstone as a youngster, he spent time with plenty of non-league clubs including Aldershot, Ebbsfleet, Maidstone & Dagenham & Redbridge before a short spell with Sittingbourne led to him linking up with now manager Danny Kedwell.

David Bremang

Forward

A product of Coventry City's and later Barnsley's youth teams, the striker spent time with Farnborough & Dulwich Hamlet before settling in South London with Croydon at the start of this season. He is currently the Rams' top scorer with ten goals.

HISTORIC RAMBLINGS

Three from the 2nd December

As a senior club (since 1910) SUFC have played seventeen times on this date prior to this evening's county cup tie. Nine of these have been home matches, the first a 2-2 draw with Dorking in the South Suburban League (West) in 1911. One Surrey Senior Cup tie has been played at home, in 1944. U's lost a first round, first leg tie with Walton-on-Thames but bounced back a fortnight later to win the tie on aggregate. Other cup ties include progress in the London Senior Cup at the expense of Finchley (my debut as a ball boy in persistent heavy rain) and more recently, two years ago, the defeat of Horsham in the FA Cup second round. League football has brought three victories and two draws while a 1933 friendly with London Caledonians ended 2-2. The record is W5 D3 L1.

Away from Sutton, U's lost a SSC tie at Kingstonian by 1–0 in 1922. In the LSC, U's drew 0–0 with local rivals Tooting & Mitcham in 1967, winning the replay by 7–2aet!! Other cup ties include a defeat to Hereford United in the FA Cup second round in 1995 and a quick exit to Staines Town in the Isthmian Full Members Cup two years later. The most recent away tie was with the original Croydon Athletic in 2008. League football has produced two draws and one victory (featured below). The away record is W2 D3 L3.

The Match

Back to 1980 and a short trip to Hayes Lane for an Isthmian League fixture with Bromley. The Ravens had won at GGL by 4–3 two months earlier but U's took full revenge with a fine performance on a ground they had not tasted defeat at since September 1964 and wouldn't for another sixteen years (22 competitive matches).

Bromley were back in the Isthmian top-flight, a promotion helped by the goals of Ian Parsons, but he had joined Sutton earlier in the season and after taking a barracking from the home support, this would be an evening of personal triumph for him.

The hosts started well with former Sutton forward Tony White giving them a fourth minute lead. Because of an injury, Bromley had to make a fifteenth minute substitution and seven minutes later, Parsons levelled for U's with a low strike. In the 31st minute Ray Sunnucks, making just his third appearance following an injury hit start to the season, netted his first Sutton goal from a Graham Dennis pass. Just before the break, Parsons pounced on a loose ball to put United in command.

Around the hour mark, Sutton 'keeper Dave Collyer saved a Dave Lucas penalty following a foul on Derek Brown and five minutes later Bromley lost another player to injury leaving them to play out the last 25 minutes with ten men. And late in the game Parsons completed his hat-trick when he beat his marker to Keith Waldon's fine cross.

The Player

Scoring from his position of left back on this day in 1944 against Walton-on-Thames in the SSC was Les Austin. "Bunny", as he was known, played in either full back role or in the half-back line for Sutton. However, he made his United debut on 25th September 1943 against Charlton Rovers in the war-time SE Combination playing in the forward line alongside Charlie Vaughan. His first goal came two months later against Gravesend United and he ended that season with five from thirty appearances. Les continued at Sutton during the last war-time season including playing in Sutton's first appearance in the Surrey Senior Final in 1945, albeit on the losing side. The 1945/46 season would be Les's finest hour in a Sutton shirt as he captained the side to the Athenian League title and then became the first Sutton player in the club's history to lift the Surrey Senior Cup. He also captained the side in their first foray into the FA Cup competition "proper". Les continued as skipper the following season as U's missed out on the AL title

to Barnet on goal average. The 1947/48 season would be his last for Sutton as injury struck and he started the following season at Hounslow Town. While at Sutton Les represented the Surrey FA on numerous occasions and also the SE Combination. In later life, he moved to the West Country. Les played 137 times for Sutton, scoring 11 goals but will forever be the first U's man to lift the

Surrey Senior Cup.

The Programme

As mentioned above, by coincidence U's played Croydon Athletic on this day in 2008. That was in the Isthmian League Cup, Sutton defeating their Division One South hosts by 2–0. The programme for this match was a glossy, colourful thirty-six pages for £2. The inside cover listed the club's officers including co-owner, Mazhar Majeed (he would hit the national papers for all the wrong reasons two years later) and a history of the club. A welcome to the Keith Tuckey Stadium followed and centred on the relieving of manager and coach Daves Garland and Swindlehurst of their duties; so recent they were still listed in post in this programme.

The usual history and pen pics of the visiting club were spread over three pages followed by a couple of match reports and then a page that included Croydon Athletic's honours that took

in the various clubs that had amalgamated over the years to bring Croydon Athletic into being. Page sixteen held a player profile and how prophetic it was, being Tom Bolarinwa; he was just eighteen at the time. The middle spread displayed CA's fixtures, results and line ups and page twenty-one had the Suburban League South table and Athletic's reserve team results thus far. This was followed by a two page article from the club's chairman concentrating on the decision to change football management personnel. A youth team report appeared on page twenty-six and two pages on the Ryman (Isthmian) Premier and Division One South tables appeared. A preview of Croydon's next match, v Worthing, followed while a focus on "long serving" players followed and included two former Suttonians in Luke Adams and Richard Blackwell.

More youth focus on page thirty-two and the back cover displayed the teams and match officials. Excellent value. .

SUFC v The Rams

Sutton and the original Croydon Athletic first met in a pre-season match under the guise of the Paul Muir Memorial Trophy in August 2001, a 3-0 win for Sutton. Seven years on and United won another PSF at the KT Stadium by 2-1 and then came the afore-mentioned ILC tie four months later. In April 2010 U's again made the short trip to Thornton Heath to win a Surrey Senior tie by 6-0.

Seven months on and the two sides met in league football for the first time, U's winning by 3-0 at the KT and then in January 2011 won the return at GGL by 5-0 as Croydon Athletic's brief flirtation with the ILP headed for a bitter end following the arrest of their co-owner Mr Majeed in August 2010.

Bradley Woods-Garness is Sutton's top scorer in matches with The Rams with three goals.

As well as the above three players mentioned, there have been a fair few names to have appeared for both clubs. Goalkeeper Gareth Williams, defenders Romauld Bouadji and Ryan Gray, midfielder Rob Hughes and forwards Laurent Hamici and Steve Douglas are among them. Perhaps the better known to Sutton fans though, are defenders Ryan Palmer and Tony Quinton and forwards Charlie Ide and the prolific goal scorer Mark Hynes.

Sutton suffered a second defeat of the season in the National League Academy South Division, with Dartford's victory taking them to the top of a very congested league table, with Sutton in seventh place but only four points behind Dartford and with two games in hand.

Both sides made a fast start, scoring within the opening five minutes. Sutton struck first through Ronny Ruiz, set up by debutant Kai McKenzie, before Dartford quickly equalised from a low cross. Sutton nearly regained the lead when Ned Hepburn fired just wide and McKenzie and Rashaad Drysdale got in each other's way in front of an open goal. Instead, Dartford went ahead before halftime, converting a flicked-on corner at the far post.

Sutton levelled early in the second half when Charlie Emery volleyed in an Adam Reeves corner, but Dartford restored their lead with a low free kick after a foul on the edge of the box. Sutton pushed back, and substitute Jayden Oberotimi set up McKenzie for a composed equaliser with ten minutes left. However, Dartford responded immediately again, scoring from the penalty spot after a long throw wasn't cleared, sealing the win despite a late half-chance for McKenzie.

A date and kick-off time has been confirmed for Sutton United Women's Adobe FA Cup clash against Chatham Town.

The match will take place on Sunday, 14th December (2:30pm KO) at the VBS Community Stadium.

Lucy Clark's side made history with a 3-2 win over Bowers & Pitsea in the Second Round, with Beth Humphrey's opener paving the way for a Milly Cutler brace to send the U's to the Third Round for the first time, having previously only ever made it as far as the First Round.


With the 2025/26 season in full flow, we take another look at how Sutton's on-loan players have fared across the English non-league pyramid throughout November.

Kicking things off in the Isthmian League South Central Division, Mehmet Halim got off to a goalscoring start to life at Leatherhead, having joined the Tanners on a dual registration deal ahead of their clash with Hayes & Yeading United.

Despite just a few hours in the building before making his debut, the midfielder started against the Hillingdon-based side and got off to an extremely promising start, producing a great pass to pick out Nathan Hogan who smashed the ball past Arber Grosha to put Leatherhead ahead, before turning from provider to scorer, volleying home Louie Paget's cross to make it a goal and an assist on debut.

This was followed by a second successive start as the Tanners fell to a second defeat of the campaign against title rivals Westfield, with Halim playing 74 minutes at Fetcham Grove.





Moving up a step, George Vorster continued his superb spell at Burgess Hill Town with another two goals, helping the Hillians secure two wins and two draws, prior to being rewarded with his league debut for Sutton on Saturday.

He started with a substitute appearance against Welling United, before notching his fifth goal of the season with the winner against Cray Valley (Paper Mills), nipping ahead of his man before firing through a crowd and into the bottom corner, and this was followed by a couple of chances in a 1-1 draw with Dulwich Hamlet.

Further appearances against AFC Whyteleafe and Cray Wanderers then preceded another goal, this time in a dramatic 4–3 defeat to St. Albans City. Ben Pope did well to hold the ball up before finding Vorster on the break, dancing around his man with ease before nutmegging the goalkeeper.


Speaking of Cray Valley, Liam Moore made his return from injury by featuring as a substitute in a 1-1 draw with Lewes, and was followed by another appearance off

the bench against Aveley before starting in a 1-1 draw against Billericay Town, playing 73 minutes as Matthew Vigor's penalty rescued a point in Essex.

He then played 90 minutes against Vorster's Burgess Hill, before notching his first goal of the season inside the opening minute against Dulwich Hamlet, paving the way for the Millers to win 3-1 at Champion Hill, and preceded another cameo against Dartford.

Moving up non-league, Siju Odelusi has risen into the starting XI at Dover Athletic after starting his first game on the bench and missing out the following week with injury.

The midfielder made his first appearance of November in a 4-1 win over Enfield Town, before making his first true contribution during his stint in Kent with his first goal of the season against Dorchester Town. A driving run from Francis Mampolo led to a deflected strike that dropped kindly for Odelusi, who made no



mistake from close range and seal a 2-0 win in the Isuzu FA Trophy Second Round.

He subsequently earned a third start for the Whites in a 2-1 win over Weston-super-Mare – a crucial win over the team who currently occupy second spot in the National League South – before making it five unbeaten with a 2-0 win over Slough Town, with Odelusi again starting, and almost getting off the mark for Dover shortly before the hour-mark.

Across to the National League North, Jaiden White was an unused substitute in Hereford's 1-1 draw with Chester, and was made to wait for his second debut for the Bulls after their game against Marine was postponed due to a waterlogged pitch.

Dillon De Silva appeared just once in November for Tamworth after his goalscoring debut against Boston United at the end of October, with a brief cameo against in the Lambs' FA Cup defeat to Leyton Orient preceding a trip to Sri Lanka, with the 23-year old joining up with Golden Army on international duty for a do or die Asia Cup qualifier against Thailand.


De Silva's loan at the Lamb Ground has since come to an end, and he has now returned to Sutton.



A BLAST FROM THE PAST

After a promising season for United, the Surrey Senior Cup Final gave the team the opportunity to finish the season in the perfect fashion.

Sutton were boosted by Tommy Dunn's return from injury to take his place between the sticks and Matt Gray and Paul Honey replaced Matt Hanlan and Craig Brown in the starting line-up, the latter two dropping to the bench.

The opening twenty minutes saw the play flow from end to end. Kingstonian had a few great chances, Phil Wingfield shooting high and wide on a couple of occasions and two dangerous crosses were headed wide when the forwards were well placed. United's attacking threat also seemed to be from crosses, Nick Bailey heading to the 'keeper under an aerial challenge from the defence and Gray hitting the side netting sliding in at the back post.

A goal was on the cards at either end but it was United that took the lead after twenty-eight minutes. A Danny Bolt right side corner drifted to the back of the area and Ryan Palmer lofted a header back towards the goal. Nick Bailey jumped in to challenge the goalkeeper for the ball and managed to trouble him enough that Palmer's header went through the 'keeper's hands and into the back of the net.

Five minutes later Sutton could have doubled the lead. Gray judged the flight of an inswinging free-kick beautifully but his firm downward header from seven yards went just the wrong side of the post. Half-time: U's 1, Kingstonian 0.

Sutton started the second half positively, Eddie Akuamoah making much more of an impression down the left flank against his former club and three minutes after the break, he was involved as the U's took a two-goal lead. Bolt looked up from the middle of the pitch to see Akuamoah in space on the left and placed a pass perfectly into space ahead of him. Akuamoah collected the ball and beat two K's defenders, taking the ball to the touchline before cutting it back to Mark Watson eight yards out, and he powerfully side-footed into the roof of the net for his 100th goal for the club.

The goal was not the start of a United landslide, though, and Kingstonian fought back, dominating possession and chances. Sutton managed to scramble the ball clear a number of times and frustrated the K's by trying to hit them on the break. Dean Hamlin, attempting to lead a Sutton counter attack, was involved in a clash on the half-way line and was stretchered off with what looked like a serious injury – Darren Beale came on to replace him.

Into the last fifteen minutes Sutton almost put the game beyond doubt but could not find the back of the net. Watson battled past two defenders to take the ball into the area but his off-balance strike went wide and Bolt had the 'keeper scrambling across goal when he placed a low curling free-kick just wide of the post.

With the fourth official indicating five minutes of added time, Kingstonian strangely did not throw everybody forward, leaving two or three men back on a couple of corners. Sutton's strategy remained to frustrate the Kingstonian players, now by holding the ball by the corner flag to good effect.

With the whistle nearly as the referee's lips, Kingstonian scored a consolation with a curled free-kick from twenty-five yards but no sooner had Sutton kicked-off than the ref' blew for full-time and the United fans raced onto the pitch to congratulate the Super U's.

After cheering the U's to victory, the loudest chants and cheers were reserved for the post-match scenes with captain Scott Corbett lifting the new Surrey Senior Cup to cap a great season with some silverware for the trophy cabinet. Full-time: U's 2, Kingstonian 1.

Lewis Simper hailed his team's resilience and attacking quality after they overturned an early deficit to beat Gateshead 4–2, with the midfielder once again finding the net in spectacular fashion.

After initially going behind to a Kian Pennant goal, Sutton fought back through Jayden Harris' leveller, before Simper struck another an outstanding effort to add to his personal collection, with further goals from Harris and Jack Taylor going on to seal an unbeaten November for Chris Agutter's side, as well as making it a third win on the spin.

"It was a slow start, we went 1-0 down, but I thought the boys showed great character second half and our quality shone through and yeah, great three points. I remember it going out to Junior [Eccleston] and there was one thing was on my mind when it got cut back to me, get off an early shot, so as soon as it left my foot I thought I had a chance and yeah, luckily it went in the back of the net."

With the team trailing at the break, the dressing room message remained calm and focused, with Simper revealing that the coaching staff stressed belief and consistency rather than drastic change.

"They just said, a slow start, but just keep doing what we know we're good at and we will score goals, we always score goals, so just stay at it. The last, like, 30 minutes of the first half was much better, so just carry that on into the second half."

The midfielder also believes he has flourished under Agutter's system, which has pushed him into more advanced areas and allowed his natural attacking instincts to shine, and Simper spoke highly of the freedom and encouragement he has been given.

"I've really enjoyed it. Playing slightly further forward, managing to chip in with more goals and assists, so yeah, just really enjoying my football at the moment. Long may it continue. It's something that I felt like I could always do, score goals, help the team in that way. So yeah, hopefully I just carry on chipping in and hopefully we keep on winning."

"I just don't want to stop there [at ten goals]. I need to keep on scoring, keep on working hard for the team and Yeah, as I say, hopefully we just keep on winning games."

With December nearly upon us, and Christmas just around the corner, why not plan ahead and think about having some Christmas drinks with us on the 6th December following our FA Cup fixture against Shrewsbury.



THE SURREY SENIOR CUP

Tonight we continue in our quest to win the Surrey Senior Cup for a 16th time, matching Dulwich Hamlet's record for the most County Cup wins. Here's a reminder of our previous fifteen.

1945-46

Our first success came after a first round bye due to Crystal Palace withdrawing. We beat Guildford 10-1, then Vickers Armstrong 6-1 in the semi final, and under the captaincy of Les Austin, featured elsewhere in tonight's programme, beat Woking 1-0 in the final at Kingstonian's Richmond Road ground thanks to a goal by Charlie Vaughan, who had scored four in the demolition of Guildford, completing an Athenian League/County Cup double.

1964-65

Two 5-1 wins, at Carshalton and at home to Dulwich, set us on the way to end a run of three successive final defeats. It took three games to get past Kingstonian in the semi final(no penalty shootouts then), and we then had to come from two down in the final against Leatherhead, again at Richmond Road. Both their goals were scored by future Sutton legend Larry Pritchard, but two from Trevor Bladon and one from Keith Blunt turned the game round.

1967-68

We reached the final without conceding a goal, home wins against Woking (2-0) and Croydon Amateurs (5-0) sandwiching a single goal success at Redhill. After Bladon's goal in a 1-1 draw in the final against Dulwich at Walton's Stompond Lane, Dave Hutchins scored the only goal of the replay at Richmond Road.

1969–70. Another defensively unblemished run to the final, beating Leatherhead 3–0 a week after playing Leeds, then winning at Carshalton and at home to Kingstonian, all in the space of five weeks. Again the final went to a replay, with Bladon scoring a penalty in the first 1–1 draw against Walton at Dulwich, and then also on target in the 4–0 replay win at Leatherhead, with Pritchard and Terry Howard(2) completing the scoring.

1979-80

An 8-1 mauling of Addlestone, who earlier in the season had stunned us in the FA Cup, started this run, Paul McKinnon scoring four. A fine 2-1 win at Woking and a single goal win at home to Croydon took us to the final against Tooting at Leatherhead, where Micky Joyce scrambled the only goal of the game.

1982-83

Six years of domination of the competition might not have happened but for the snow which caused the abandonment of the home second round tie against Redhill when we were 2-0 down. We won the rearranged game 2-0, a John Rains hat trick contributed to a 5-0 demolition of Carshalton in the semi final and Tooting were also swept aside in the final at Richmond Road, where Lee Batt's goal to round off a 4-0 win was particularly satisfying for a player sent off when the sides had met in the league in January. Epsom & Ewell had been beaten in the first round and this was the first leg of a cup treble that season which would also include the League Cup and the London Senior Cup.

1983-84

Single goal wins at Walton and at home to Kingstonian, and a 2-0 win at Whyteleafe saw low-key progress to the final, where Epsom, who would join us in the Isthmian Premier Division at the end of the season, were comfortably

beaten at Imber Court, Steve Galloway scoring twice in a 4-0 win which saw us win the cup without conceding a goal.

1984-85

An unusual and weather-affected season in which we required replays to beat Kingstonian and Epsom, the latter in a game played two days after the original goalless draw and two days before a scheduled semi-final with Tooting from which our opponents withdrew on the day of the game and which was subsequently awarded to us. A forgettable final against Addlestone & Weybridge at Croydon was goalless until extra time, when John Rains and McKinnon scored for a 2-0 win.

1985-86. The weather played havoc with this season as well, although as in the previous season it didn't prevent a league and County Cup double. A replay win at Croydon was followed by high scoring wins at Carshalton (5-3) and Kingstonian (4-1), Lenny Dennis scoring a hat trick against Carshalton and two at Kingston. The final was against Chertsey at Richmond Road and saw a comfortable 2-0 win thanks to McKinnon and Mark Golley.

1986-87

Another five goal performance at Carshalton started this run, Francis Awaritefe this time the hat-trick scorer, and after a scare at home to Camberley, who led through future Sutton defender Vernon Pratt before we won 2-1, there were another five goals at home to Epsom in the semi final and four without reply against Woking in the final at Imber Court.

1987-88

Camberley featured in this run as well, a 4-1 win at Krooner Park in the first round then matched at Metropolitan Police a fortnight later. Four were also scored at home to Cobham in the semi final, and a quartet of quartets was completed in the final against Whyteleafe at Tooting's Sandy Lane. Former Sutton defender Barry Constable's penalty for Whyteleafe was the only goal we conceded in the six finals between 1983 and 1988.

1992-93

A home win against Epsom was followed by a 6-0 win at Leatherhead, but it required a replay to get past Metropolitan Police in the semi final, the 3-2 replay win coming at Imber Court. The final was played here just two days after the shattering FA Trophy defeat against Wycombe, but a stirring performance against Carshalton saw a 2-1 win thanks to Nigel Golley and Gary Thomas. It was one of six games we played here in a 14 day spell in April, with six away games in less than a fortnight then ending the season.

1994-95

Unlike previous campaigns this was played out to the backdrop of a fight against relegation, as well as another weather-affected fixture pile-up. A 3-1 win at Netherne was followed by success after a replay against Whyteleafe and a 2-0 semi final win at Kingstonian, again a replay. In a remarkable final against Carshalton at Woking, just two days after we had recorded a crucial league win against them, it seemed as though our current academy manager Jimmy Dack's goal would see the cup heading to Colston Avenue, but Mark Watson equalised close to the end and in stoppage time he and Dominic Feltham clinched a 3-1 win.

1998-99


Another league and County Cup double, and one more round than previously, with goals flowing against Farnham (7-0), Redhill (6-1) and Woking, who we would join in the Nationwide Conference, (6-0) as well as a 2-1 win on a freezing night at Ashford. The final came after the league success had been clinched, and for the third final running it was Carshalton who provided the opposition as we won 3-0 at Imber Court.

2002-03

Carshalton were quarter final opponents this time, beaten 2-0 at Sutton after an earlier 3-1 win at Walton which was marred by a serious injury to defender Mike Hollands. A 2-1 win at Dulwich in the semi final set up a final against Kingstonian at Imber Court, again after the league season had ended, in which Mark Watson scored his 100th goal for the club in a 2-1 win.


