Just under a month since we've played at home and wow it feels like a lifetime ago.....Gander Green Lane has been a really happy hunting ground for us and we're absolutely delighted to get back on our home patch.


We come into today's game 6th in the form guide and with one league loss in well over a month, we have been great of late and a mad ten minutes against Solihull Moors isn't going to blur that perspective - we're improving, and we're winning.....the progress the players have made has been magnificent, and for that they deserve massive credit.

The last couple of weeks has been frustrating, the injuries and suspensions we've incurred have been the biggest factor in that frustration.....the injuries and suspensions are the main reason we have faltered over the last two games. We saw in November that when we get a certain team out we win games.....the challenge when we're faced with so many absentees is for the players coming into the side to deliver a comparable performance to those that come out of the side who have played a key part in our recent run of form.....sink or swim.

The fact that 80% of our goals conceded come in the second half of games is a reflection of our squad depth, when other teams can make changes we're not quite able to with where the squad is at.....the amount of players we've loaned out may lead to the obvious statement of, that's why we lack depth which means we can't make changes. However our belief is that most of the players we've loaned aren't at the level to help strengthen our performances on the pitch at this level, which means we'd rather have a tired-stronger player on the pitch than a fresh-weaker player – it's a difficult conundrum. We 100% need to add to the squad.....BUT we have to add the right players that CAN break into our starting lineup, and rest assured we're working on it.

I hope the Amber Army have all had a very happy Christmas with friends and family, you guys truly are absolute legends - every single one of you....we thank you for your support as always and we look forward to hearing you all singing from the stands, I also personally look forward to hearing our brilliant drummer who really adds to the Gander Green Lane atmosphere - you're top!

A warm welcome is extended to this afternoon's visitors to the VBS Community Stadium, Aldershot Town, making the short trip for this season's festive fixture.

You would think with Boxing Day fixtures being the norm each season, and with a 50% chance of being home or away, there would be little remarkable to say about the algorithms that decide the scheduling. However it is barely credible to consider this will be the first home Boxing Day fixture for our supporters to enjoy – hopefully! – for seven years.

Last year we undertook the relatively short trip to North London to play the eventual champions Barnet. In a season that felt like the proverbial curate's egg – good in parts – we nearly managed to do something no other team did. Barnet were unbeaten at home in their title winning year, yet with the eight minutes added time already accounted for we were leading by the odd goal in five. With the proverbial last kick of the game the home team, as champions often do, found a way (dubiously it still feels) to score the equaliser.

In the three previous seasons, covering the entirety of our stay in the Football League, we played away on Boxing Day twice, facing Crawley Town and AFC Wimbledon, and managed to win on each occasion. It would have been all three times but for our scheduled visit to Bristol Rovers in 2021 being postponed due to a Covid outbreak among the home team. The Wimbledon win – in a relegation season of low bars – was particularly pleasing having released the manager following that heavy away defeat at Stockport. A single goal victory felt enormously important, and even more so over the local rivals.

Given the geographical closeness between the two clubs one might expect a rich history and abundance of fixtures between today's two opponents. However, with Aldershot competing for much of its history in the Football league, and Sutton not getting there until after Shots' relegation and administration took them down the pyramid, matches are few in number. As Aldershot Town (as now known) rose again to the "Conference" and National League we found ourselves in the Conference South. Only in those years between South Champions and our EFL 2 days did our paths cross with any frequency. A few friendlies and an FA cup clash aside.

The 20/21 season stands out as being Covid disrupted with very few getting the opportunity to see the games, which both resulted in Sutton victories. The first of those, our away tie, being particularly enjoyable with that late own-goal winner showing (as Barnet above) how champions find the way to win. My own personal memory being the third part of a Ben Goodliffe and Dean Bouzanis triumvirate discussing and convincing ourselves that the National League was ours for the taking after the match. Ultimately we were proved sage soothsayers, or lucky emotionally driven speculators. Last season of course that "rivalry" re-established itself and the latest iteration of competition stands at an away draw apiece as both fixtures resulted in 1-1 outcomes.

Both teams, of course, find themselves at the unwelcoming end of the league table, both probably expecting to be higher given the thoughts at the start of the season. A new manager has improved our fortunes – and reintroduced that winning at home feeling. It feels as though we are pulling ourselves away from that uncomfortable collection of relegation threatened clubs. Aldershot's recent form might be considered a similar pattern, though in an earlier stage with two wins from their last two league games. It certainly won't be an easy fixture, or one that will be taken for granted.

Let's hope our result and performance today matches some of the greatness from Boxing Day celebrations of the past.



Goalkeeper

Marcus Dewhurst came through Sheffield United's academy and represented England at youth levels up to under-20. He had already well over 100 senior appearances in the National League North and National League during loan spells and most recently with Wealdstone, before joining Aldershot in 2024.

16 | Pat Nash

Goalkeeper

Pat Nash is an English goalkeeper who progressed from Everton's academy into senior men's football, starring for Farnham Town with over 50 appearances and 30+ clean sheets, helping secure promotion. In 2024 he moved to National League club Aldershot Town to compete for first team opportunities and further his professional career.

2 | Josh Brooking

Defender

Josh Brooking is a centre-back currently at Aldershot Town in the National League. He progressed through Reading and Chelsea's youth systems, captained Chelsea's U23s, and played for Dorking Wanderers in 2024/25. He has also represented England at U16 and U17 levels, showcasing strong defensive leadership and versatility.

3 | Ollie Harfield

Defender

Ollie Harfield is a defender at Aldershot Town, known for his crossing and versatility across the left flank. He joined from Weymouth in 2022 and has made over 100 appearances, earning the vice-captaincy and winning Player of the Season, as well as signing a new deal while working back from injury.

4 | Luke Jenkins

Defender

Luke Jenkins joined Aldershot in June 2024 after a season at Chelmsford City, signing from AFC Wimbledon, from whom he had spent time on loan at Tonbridge, Hampton & Richmond and Weymouth. Known for aerial strength and tenacity, he's also been capped by England C and was formerly in Sutton's academy, joining from Crystal Palace.

11 | Ryan Jones

Defender

Ryan Jones joined Aldershot Town in July 2024 after spells with Bristol Rovers, Weston-super-Mare, Bath City, Hungerford Town and Bromley. A versatile left-sided player known for creativity, forward runs, goals and assists, he contributes technical play and attacking threat from deeper areas while recovering from injury setbacks.

15 | Christy Grogan

Defender

Christy Grogan joined Aldershot Town on loan from Stockport County after a decade at Stoke City's academy and a senior loan at Wythenshawe Town. He made a couple of senior appearances for Stockport and has represented the Republic of Ireland at under-18 level, bringing physical presence and defensive promise.

21 | Ashley Akpan

Defender

Born in Poland, Ashley Akpan came through Chelsea's youth system before returning to join Wisła Kraków, before moving to Aldershot, where he signed professional terms in 2023. He has spent time on loan at Hartley Wintney and Gosport Borough.

22 | Olly Scott

Defender

Olly Scott began his career in non-league football, developing at clubs including Consett and Blyth Spartans before joining King's Lynn Town. In 2023, he moved to Aldershot Town, reuniting with his Linnets boss Tommy Widdrington, and has grown into a reliable performer.

25 | Will Nightingale

Defender

Will Nightingale's career reflects longevity and adaptability, developing through AFC Wimbledon's academy and becoming a reliable first-team presence there with over 200 appearances. He then experienced Scottish football on loan at Ross County before signing for Aldershot Town in 2025, where he brings seasoned defensive experience and leadership to the squad.

26 | Joe Lewis-Evans

Defender

Joe Lewis-Evans progressed through Aldershot Town's academy, joining as an under-11 and developing within the club's youth structure. He made his competitive debut for the Shots in the National League Cup Quarter-Final against Leeds United U21s.

28 | Archy Taylor

Defender

Archy Taylor has combined through non-league, turning out for Met Police, Cray Wanderers, Hartley Wintney, Westfield and Hampton & Richmond Borough before signing with Aldershot Town in 2025.

31 | Ryheem Sheckleford

Defender

Ryheem Sheckleford developed in Fulham's academy before establishing himself in senior football with Maidenhead United and on loan at Walton Casuals. He then spent three seasons at Chesterfield, featuring regularly in their promotion campaign, before joining Aldershot in November.

33 | Sam Inwood

Defender

Sam Inwood began his career in Bolton Wanderers' academy and signed professional terms there before making three senior appearances. In 2025 he moved on loan to Aldershot Town to gain regular first-team experience, and he has also represented Northern Ireland at under-21 level.

36 | Will Armitage

Defender

Will Armitage progressed from Cheltenham's academy into Southampton's youth setup, before gaining regular first-team experience on loan at Aldershot Town. Across his first loan he made 24 appearances, before a short spell at Brackley preceded his return to Aldershot.

42 | Matt Penney

Defender

MattPenney progressed from Sheffield Wednesday's academy into senior football, making 32 first-team appearances before a loan spell in Germany with St. Pauli. He later returned to England to play for Ipswich, with further loans at Motherwell and Charlton Athletic. After brief non-league stints, he signed for Aldershot Town.

6 | Theo Widdrington

Midfielder

Theo Widdrington progressed through Portsmouth's academy before moving to Bristol Rovers and gaining experience with Havant & Waterlooville, Bognor Regis Town, Welling United, Hemel Hempstead Town, Lewes and King's Lynn Town. Since joining his father, Tommy, at Aldershot in 2023, he has made over 75 first-team appearances.

7 | Cameron Hargreaves

Midfielder

Cameron Hargreaves developed through Exeter's youth system before making 20 EFL appearances with Bristol Rovers. After gaining loan experience at Hungerford and Chippenham, he played regularly for King's Lynn Town before joining Aldershot, making 52 appearances and scoring five goals.

8 | Tyler Frost

Midfielder

Tyler Frost developed through Reading's academy and spent time on loan at Havant & Waterlooville before joining Crawley Town and Harrogate Town, prior to his move to Aldershot in 2023.

12 | Keane Anderson

Midfielder

Keane Anderson came through Aldershot's academy and signed his first professional contract in 2022, making his senior debut in cup competition before gaining experience on loan at Leatherhead, Kingstonian, AFC Totton, Sholing and Havant & Waterlooville. He spent a month on loan at Torquay United earlier this season.

14 | Ciaran Gilligan

Midfielder

Ciaran Gilligan came through Burton Albion's academy, progressing into their first team and making over 70 senior appearances in League One. In October 2025 he joined Aldershot Town on loan. Internationally, he represents the Republic of Ireland at youth level.

17 | James Henry

Midfielder

James Henry came through Reading's academy and spent early years on loan at Nottingham Forest, Bournemouth, Norwich and Millwall before joining Millwall permanently. He later played for Wolves, Bolton and Oxford, making over 500 EFL appearances, and in 2024 signed for Aldershot Town as a player/coach.

18 | Kiban Rai

Midfielder

Kiban Rai came through Newport County's youth system and made his senior debut as a teenager before moving on loan toMerthyr Town. After being released by Newport, he signed for Aldershot, where he continues his development as an energetic, creative midfielder.

19 | Ryan Hill

Midfielder

Ryan Hill established himself in the National League with lengthy spells at Eastleigh and Dagenham & Redbridge, where he made over 150 appearances and scored regularly before signing for Aldershot Town in June.

34 | Dejan Tetek

Midfielder

Dejan Tetek progressed through Reading's academy into the senior squad, making 17 Championship appearances before leaving in 2023 and signing for Aldershot Town later that year, where he has become a regular figure in midfield.

9 | Kwame Thomas

Forward

Kwame Thomas came through Derby County's academy and made his professional debut in the Championship, followed by loan spells at Notts County and Blackpool before permanent moves to Coventry City, Solihull Moors, Doncaster Rovers, Burton Albion and Wrexham. After playing for Sutton United and Dundee, he joined Aldershot Town in 2023, returning in 2025 after a spell at Ebbsfleet.

30 | Tristan Abrahams

Forward

Tristan Abrahams began at Leyton Orient before moving to Norwich City, gaining Football League experience with Exeter City, Yeovil Town, Newport County, Carlisle United and Grimsby Town. After spells at Eastleigh, Gillingham, Welling United and Maidenhead United, he signed for Aldershot Town in June 2025.

HISTORIC RAMBLINGS

Three from the 26th December

One of the busiest days on the football calendar, U's Boxing Day matches as a senior club stretch back to 1913 and a friendly with the exotic sounding Arabian United, Sutton won 7-0 and six years later another home friendly produced a 6-1 defeat of Chiswick Town. Those were the first of twenty-six home matches played by Sutton on Boxing Day out of sixty-five in total. Since 1992, U's have hosted just four times so today is a rarity. Other friendlies have produced a fair few goals; 7-2 v Luton Amateurs in 1926 and three war-time matches producing a 16-13 aggregate in Sutton's favour. The first competitive home match was a 4-0 reverse to West Norwood in 1925 while three years later, United recorded their best Boxing Day competitive home win, 6-1 v Kingstonian. Both those matches in the Athenian League. At Sutton, U's competitive record is W15 D2 L4, the last of those four defeats was in 1959 to Carshalton Athletic.

Away from Sutton, the best win is 4–0 at Boreham Wood in 2017 (Wood ending that match with nine men) while the same scoreline represents the heaviest defeat, at Tooting & Mitcham in 1950. Sutton's competitive record away from home is W15 D7 L12. One of those defeats was at Aldershot in 2002 by 3–2. Overall, Carshalton Athletic have provided the opposition thirteen times, T&M nine. The biggest gate recorded was at AFC Wimbledon in 2023 while two Boxing Day matches at Boreham Wood produced an aggregate attendance of 687.

The Match

Sixty-two years ago, Sutton hosted their first Boxing Day clash as Isthmians. The visitors were Woking who U's had defeated by 4-0 five days earlier at Kingfield. United were going well in their first IL season and sat third, albeit a position slightly distorted by games played. Woking were third from bottom, their successes of the late '50s somewhat behind them. And this match would prove only a festive occasion for the hosts.

In the ninth minute Paul Bates fired home after Woking 'keeper Farris had parried his initial effort. Two more strong goal attempts followed before The Cards levelled against the run of play. Sutton's centre-half Bob Adam fouled Tindell and Woking legend Charlie Mortimore netted the resultant penalty. U's were back in front when Bates scored direct from a free-kick and in the 39th minute Trevor Bladon netted with a spectacular 30 yard drive from Roy Osborne's pass. After the break, U's slipped into second gear before rallying to be awarded a 70th minute penalty, Bates put the first attempt over the bar but the referee ruled that Farris had moved too soon and Bates completed his hat-trick at the second attempt. In the 80th minute, Ted Powell raced through the middle to collect Osborne's pass and score with a simple finish. A minute later Bladon struck a shot against a post but the match finished 5–1. Two days later Bates followed up that treble with another as U's defeated Enfield by 4–3 in the Isthmian League.

The Player

Appearing on three separate occasions for U's on Boxing Day and scoring on two of them was the diminutive forward, Dennis Dodd. Dennis played across the whole forward line for Sutton and made his senior debut against Redhill in the Athenian League in February 1947 having joined from Balham & District League champions Malden United. His first goal came in his second match a fortnight later in a 4–1 loss at Hitchin Town. The following season Dennis played just a handful of matches before joining neighbours Carshalton Athletic for the rest of the season, gaining Corinthian League representative honours. A brief turn at Banstead Athletic before Dennis returned to Carshalton for the 1948/9 campaign but he was back at GGL in September 1949 making a further 33 appearances for Sutton, netting six



goals. Dennis continued at Sutton for the '50-'51 campaign although did lose his place during February and March, but his goal scoring form for the reserves made him hard to ignore. The following season, Dennis was very much in the selection committee's thoughts and he played in 42 of the 49 matches scoring ten times. He picked up his only silverware as a Sutton player, a Wycombe Hospital Cup winners' medal (if there was such a thing!). Dodd missed nine matches during the 1952/3 season but the following season while he started at Sutton, he joined Leatherhead. He was soon back at Carshalton Athletic where he stayed for a further four seasons. While at Sutton, Dennis made his Surrey FA XI debut scoring a hat-trick and his other representative honours included the Royal Navy and the Balham & District League. Dennis made 149 appearances for Sutton scoring 49 goals. While at Sutton, Dennis also "guested" for Epsom.

The Programme

A war-time home programme from 1944 when U's hosted Banstead Hospital winning this Christmas friendly by 8–3. This four page style, black print on white paper, was used during the later years of WWII through to and including the 1948/9 season. The front cover, not in the best condition, is below. The first inside page exhibited the teams' layout topped and bottomed by adverts, the latter for Lewis & Co Furniture Removals and Builders' Merchants on Sutton By-Pass. The second inside page showed the SE Combination, U's second behind Bromley, and below were "Random Notes", bemoaning selection issues before a recent Surrey Senior tie. Leading scorers were listed with Charlie Vaughan on 28 leading the way. The back page held fixtures and results and an advert for C P Martin greengrocers on Cheam Broadway. Considering the era a very neat publication.



SUFC vs Aldershot Town

Sutton played the original club twice, both FA Cup ties at GGL. In 1963, The Shots won 4-0 in the first round but Sutton gained revenge in 1987 with a superb 3-0 victory also in the first round.

Since reforming, U's have played Aldershot in both Isthmian and National Leagues. Here at GGL in the IL U's were unbeaten, two wins and two draws including a 5-0 hammering that confirmed Sutton as 1998/99 champions.

Continues

The second of the draws in 2003 confirmed Aldershot as champions in front of a crowd of 2,002. In the NL today is their sixth visit, the 2019/20 season match not played because of Covid. United have won four and drawn one of the previous five, the draw coming on New Years' Day last season. Matches at both venues tend to be tight with both sides enjoying home advantage more than being on their travels.

U's record (league only) at GGL W6 D3 L0 F19 A6

Top scorer for Sutton against Aldershot (both venues) is former Shots player Jamie Collins with three goals.



THE DAVID WEIR DIARIES

The latest news from David Weir Leisure Centre; the home of the Sutton Academy and Women's teams.

Mehmet Halim's goal fifteen minutes from the end secured Sutton a narrow but valuable victory away at Welling at Greenwich University, lifting the U's back into the top six of the National League Football Academy South.

The hosts edged a tight first half and came close to taking the lead early on when a seventh-minute free kick struck the crossbar with Klevis Muca beaten. Welling continued to create the better openings, forcing Muca into a sharp save at his near post after Adam Reeves underhit a back pass, while a close-range header from a left-wing cross drifted over. Sutton's main threat before the break came when Halim turned sharply from a Dan Urpens throw-in, but his effort was blocked at the near post.

Sutton improved significantly after the interval and began to control proceedings. Muca was rarely troubled, apart from making one smart low save following a poor clearance. At the other end, Urpens headed a corner against the bar, while Halim missed a clear chance when put through by Charlie Bell.

Halim made amends moments later, finishing calmly after Callum Lee's low cross to seal the win, which Sutton saw out comfortably.

Sutton's Division F side were unable to capitalise on an early breakthrough as they fell to a 2–1 defeat away at Woking, extending their losing run to four league matches.

The visitors made a perfect start when Josh Jenkins, returning from injury, opened the scoring after just two minutes, toe-poking past Jack Roles from Ezekiel Yohannes' through ball to claim his sixth goal of the competition.

Woking gradually took control, hitting the bar before equalising six minutes before half-time when Joel Jennison-Leppa tapped in after a spilled free kick. The hosts struck again two minutes into the second half, Timothy Francis heading home the winner. Sutton struggled to respond, while Woking hit the woodwork twice late on.

Sutton's hopes of reaching the fourth round of the Adobe Women's FA Cup were ended by higher-tier Chatham Town, who secured victory with two goals in five minutes early in the second half.

The hosts began brightly, with Emma Spear firing narrowly wide from distance, but Chatham struck with their first attack as Otesha Charles forced her way through challenges to score low past Megan Taylor. The visitors went close to extending their lead before the break, hitting the crossbar through Ellie Jeffkins and seeing Romany Wellington head just wide. Sutton struggled to create clear chances, despite the return of Gabby Williams, while injuries to captain Tessa Allen and Beth Humphrey disrupted momentum.

Chatham started the second half strongly, hitting the bar again before Amelia Woodgate doubled the lead with a low shot that bounced beyond Taylor. Five minutes later, Amy Russ's deflected free kick sealed the tie. Sutton continued to battle, but Chatham saw the game out comfortably.



For the second time in four days, Sutton were knocked out of a cup competition by Chatham, but a patched-up U's side again gave a strong account of themselves against an in-form team a tier higher in the FA Women's Pyramid.

With nine players starting who had featured in Sunday's FA Cup tie, Sutton were further hampered by injuries to Tessa Allen, Beth Humphrey, Emily Oliver and Amy Warren, forcing midfielders Phoebe Langley and Hannah Baptiste to fill defensive roles.

Chatham struck early through Kerisha Iton after four minutes, but Sutton responded with a disciplined defensive display despite playing into a strong wind. Zoe Walters produced a crucial goal-line clearance, while Chatham were often wasteful in attack. Sutton enjoyed more possession in the second half but created few clear chances. Iton's early goal proved enough to send Chatham into the Isthmian Women's Cup semi-finals.



DAVIDE RODARI: No-breiner



The Swiss-born Italian striker made the switch to Sutton to work with Chris Agutter for a third time, having established himself as a lethal goalscorer during their time together at Hastings United. After trying to sign him last season at Worthing, Agutter has finally got his man, with Rodari putting pen to a paper on a permanent deal at Sutton, having spent the first half of the season at Hampton & Richmond Borough.

"I'm delighted to come here and play under Agi again for the third time and being back into full-time football. So I'm buzzing to get going."

"I was delighted to be back into step two again, try to score some goals, you know, help the team. But ultimately, when there's a full-time club coming for you, you know, it was a no-brainer for me to go back up, as my aim is always to get back in the Football League."

Born in Switzerland but raised in Italy, Davide had said that he considers himself purely Italian, and before arriving in England, he spent time within one of Europe's most prestigious academies – Italian giants, Inter Milan – an experience that left a lasting impression.

"It's good. I played in Italy, Switzerland, then I moved to the UK at 16. So, you know, I've been a bit everywhere playing football, but my dream was always to come to England and play football here, so kind of living my dream."

"It [coming over to England] was more a decision that I took as I wanted to grow as a person and I think the

best way to do that is just by, not in a bad way, but living your family, so you've got to look after yourself, grow as a person, mentally especially."

"I remember because I was coming from one of the lowest team in Italy, like a really low academy, but then just training with Inter Milan players and one of them was [Andrea] Pinamonti, who now plays in Serie A [at Sassuolo] and bangs goals at that level. So yeah, it was good."

Since settling in England, Rodari has steadily worked his way up through non-league football, earning opportunities at higher levels along the way.

His first senior opportunity came under Agutter at Hastings, and he has since utilised the football pyramid by climbing as high as League Two, with Crawley Town, while maintaining his reputation as one of the most dangerous forwards in non-league, with it being at Hastings where he truly made his mark, enjoying his most prolific spell in front of goal.

"I started at Eastbourne Borough's Under-18s, under Agi, then I moved to Hastings with him. I was there for four years, and then I got brought by Crawley Town. I was there for two and a half years. I had a few spells at Worthing and Dartford and Dorking as well, and then back to Hastings for two seasons and then Hampton and Richmond for the last six months."

"I scored 35 under Agi [in his first spell at Hastings] and then 27 last year, so that was my best spell, yeah. I've always thrived under him, so I'm hoping to do the same here. I want to put the stats on the pitch, you know, goals, assists. Ultimately play well as well and win, and win games, especially."

Reflecting on his time in the Football League with Crawley, Rodari has also gained valuable experience despite setbacks, and is looking forward to playing at his highest level since his spell with the Red Devils.

"I think the first few months I went there, it was really good, got myself a goal as well. But after that, one injury that killed me a little bit just before the start of the season and then obviously everyone else is a lot ahead of you and the only way to get back was going out on loan.

To be fair, I didn't mind that because I played a lot of football. I nearly won promotion through the play-offs with Dorking, we were in the semi-final, and I've had a good spell even with them when I was out on loan."

"I've been on both sides, you know, I've been in a winning team and in a relegated team, so I know what it feels like."


Now reunited with Agutter in a full-time setting, Rodari is eager to push on once again.



The weekend started with league leaders Rochdale's dominant display at Altrincham. Despite injuries to key players including Sam Beckwith and Emmanuel Dieseruvwe, goals from Joe Pritchard, Connor McBride and Tyler Smith secured Dale's 3-0 win at the J Davidson Stadium. The victory was a sixth on the bounce for Jim McNulty's side in all competitions and secured them top spot at Christmas. They will be hoping they can become the third side in seven seasons to be top at Christmas and the end of the season.

Harvey Bunker's sending off had no effect on the scoreline and Forest Green extended their unbeaten run in the league to eight games.




