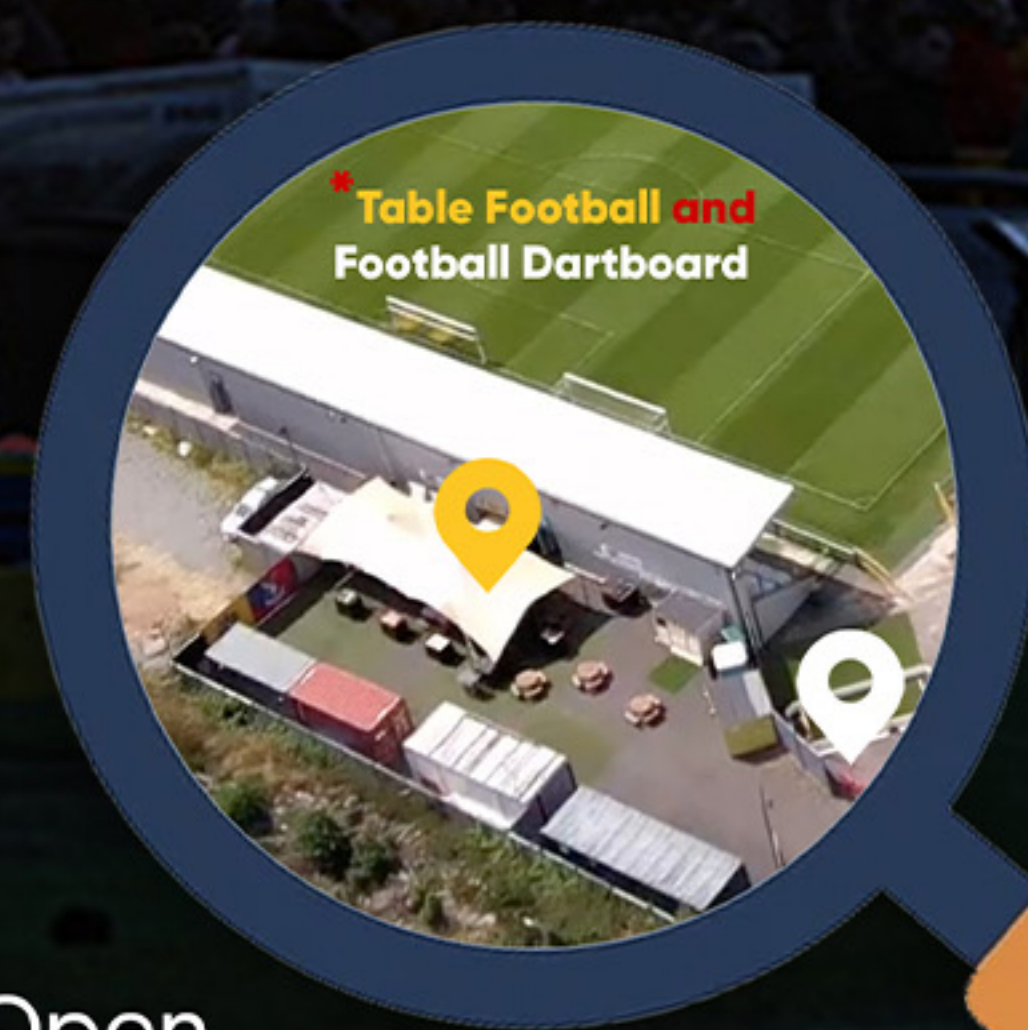

TIM TALKS

We welcome this afternoon's visitors to the VBS Community Stadium, Brackley Town, for their first visit to the ground.

Something no other club in the league can be claiming this season. So that gives them something in common with Shrewsbury Town. Which is of course good timing seeing as the news from Brackley on Thursday was of the departure of their manager Gavin Cowan to the Shrews' hotseat.

Whilst we offer the travelling supporters and dignitaries our best welcome, let's hope that doesn't extend to the scoreline. No doubt billed as another six pointer, that would be a little harsh on mid-table Brackley, but it would be fair to say this is one of the successive "winnable" fixtures that we looked forward to from the discomfort of the relegation zone around Christmas time as we entered a run of difficult games against teams in the promotion zone.

That tricky run of credible performances, with few points, was reversed last weekend. Whilst a trip to Tamworth rarely credits the label of "easy", a professional performance was delivered and three points added to the tally with our second away win of the season. It lifted the club to the dizzy heights of 18th in the table.

Which is as high as we have been since the twin opening draws of the season – a long time ago. Indeed a win today can take us just a point behind Brackley, and depending on other results the optimists could be calling us mid-table, and the delusional even play-off contenders!

The last time we met found us in a similar position to our guests today. Unlike the successes of Gavin Cowan, whose departure is upwards into the Football League, we had just relieved Steve Morison of his duties and it was for Jon Meeney to be galvanising his troops as we set about rebuilding our season. Morale was clearly at a low ebb, and it would be wrong to deny the winners their spoils on the occasion, but it was a dreary match back in September. With the game goalless with five minutes to go, that point was taken away from us with a late goal against the run of play in the second half.

It felt as though that Saturday summed up the season and the mood in the camp. I would argue though that the previous visit was even more disappointing, as we were put to the sword by a team that clearly wanted it more, and dealt with the conditions much better than we did, as we softly exited the FA Trophy to lower ranked opposition. Whilst those words can be dated to 2018 I think it's fair to say they could have been written many years prior and since. What is it with a club associated with such a wonderful cup history that we are just as guilty in disappointing? There will be a few in the ground today that were at that fixture and I am sure all will be wishing someone other than Tommy Wright will be in the record books as a Sutton United scorer against them – and even a winning goalscorer we hope.

As January comes to a close, so will the transfer window. Whilst it's true this doesn't apply to us it is necessarily the case its opening has a big bearing on activity at this level. Chris has made no secret of wanting to turnover his squad, and whilst his starting eleven – when it is available to him – is now more settled, and he is comfortable they can compete at this level, that hasn't applied to the "squad". Players have gone out on loan, or permanently, and the reverse has been true also with loan arrivals and extensions coupled with permanent transfers in. We welcome all the new additions, and wish the best to the departures. It has certainly been a busy season for player paperwork and the numbers issued to the squad.

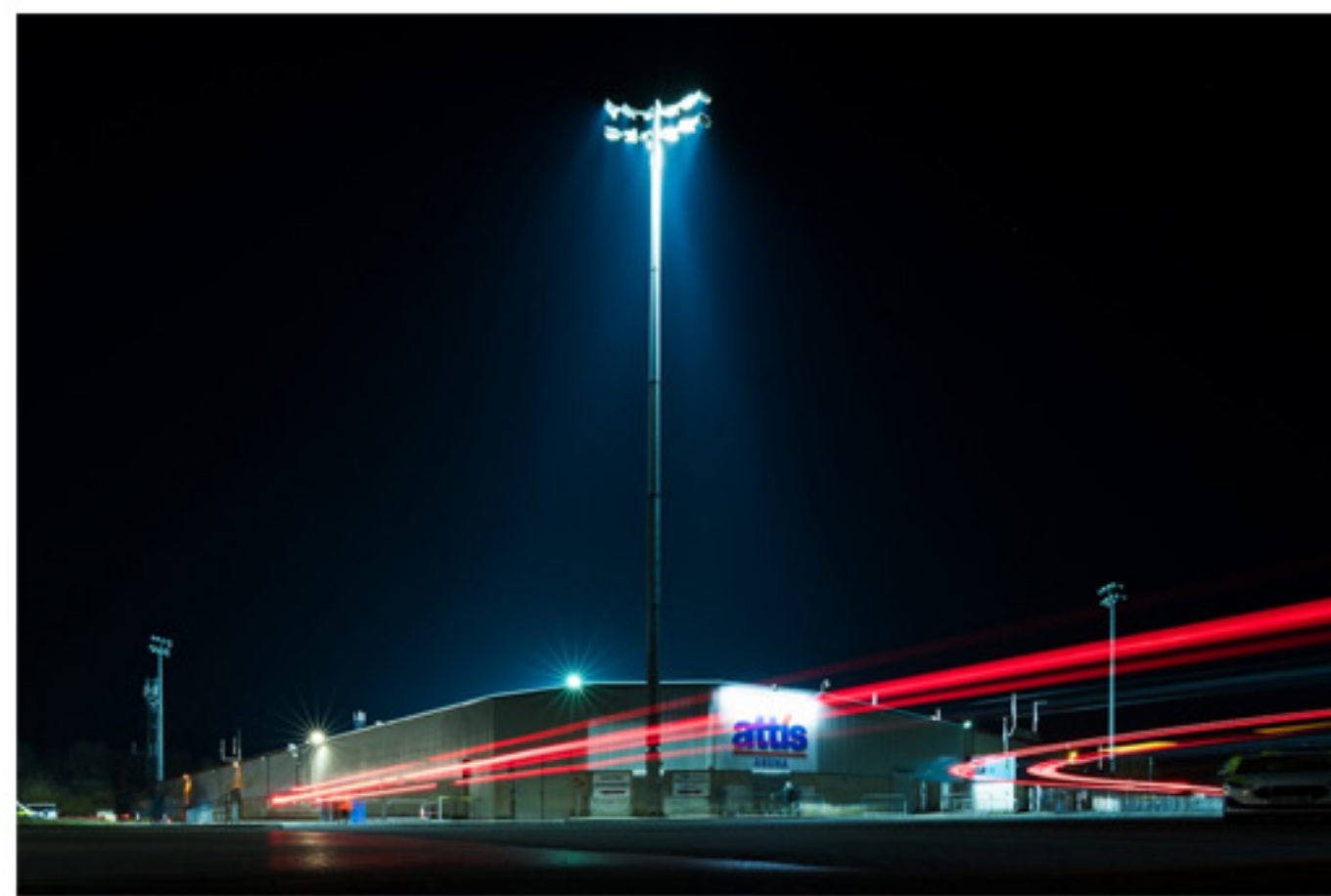

Club captain Gareth Dean has been at the club since the 2016/17 season, making over 350 appearances in all competitions for the club in a career which has spanned well over 500 games.

Although the bulk of his career has come at Brackley, he made over 100 appearances for Nuneaton Town, and spent a season at Solihull Moors beforehand, where he established himself as a reliable defender. Dean then joined Brackley in 2016 and quickly became a cornerstone of the squad, known for his leadership and consistency. One of the standout moments of his career came in the 2018 FA Trophy final at Wembley, where he scored a dramatic added-time equaliser to help secure victory, and was also named in the National League North Team of the Season in 2024/25, having led them to promotion. Beyond his playing duties, Dean has most recently has been named as Gavin Cowan's temporary successor, where he will be assisted by Alastair Worby.

"Remember the name" might jig a few people's memories at this man, however since then Scott Pollock has been a tempo controlling midfielder who has been well received in the National League so far.

The 24-year-old was part of the infamous YouTube series "Hashtag Academy" where he won a contract to be part of now Isthmian Premier League side, Hashtag United. He caught the eye of Northampton Town where he earlier spent time as a youngster, making several EFL appearances.



THE TEMPO-SETTER **MORGAN** **ROBERTS**

Winger Morgan has been at Brackley since 2023, and has ultimately been a standout in the club's rise up the National League pyramid.

A graduate of Northampton Town's youth system, he made six first team appearances in League One & League Two before eventually leaving for Banbury United.

A 20 goal haul in 42 games caught the eye of Swindon Town, as he returned to the football league just a year later. Following his release, he rejoined the Saints after a short loan spell 3 years prior, which saw him named in the National League North Team of the Season for the 2023/24 season.



THE FINISHER CONNOR HALL

Striker Connor Hall has been one of the standout performers for the reds so far this season, scoring on four occasions.

Being able to play anywhere across a front three, he has experience at various EFL levels with several clubs, most notably being part of Sheffield United's & Bolton Wanderers' academy sides early in his career.

Loan spells at Woking and Accrington Stanley followed, where he joined the former on a permanent deal in late 2020. Since then, spells at Chorley & Solihull Moors are key to note.

21 | Cameron Gregory

Goalkeeper

Recently trusted to take on the number one role in goal, Cameron Gregory has had an extended run of several starts in his first few months with the club. Graduating through Shrewsbury's academy, spells at Kidderminster Harriers & Boston United preceded the young shot stopper joining The Saints.

13 | Alistair Worby

Goalkeeper

Spending time at two professional youth set-ups in Coventry City & Scottish side St. Johnstone, goalkeeper Alistair Worby went on to play for The Saints across two spells with time at Kettering Town in between. He is now the current goalkeeping coach at the club, whilst also serving as the backup in between the sticks.

2 | Tyler Lyttle

Defender

Right back Tyler Lyttle spent time at both Wolverhampton Wanderers & Bristol Rovers as a youngster with spells in between at Truro City & Nuneaton. The defender bounced between various non-league clubs before landing his current move ahead of the 2023/24 campaign, being part of the squads which made back-to-back play-off campaigns.

3 | Riccardo Calder

Defender

Being of Jamaican descent, this defender is a product of the Aston Villa academy, spending over three seasons there at professional level with several loans to the EFL & Scottish Premiership. After a short career break, he worked his way through non-league football before starting a three & a half year spell with his current club.

5 | Kyle Morrison

Defender

Hailing from Birmingham, the 29-year-old defender began his career at Alvechurch before making the move across to Leamington. Time in the National League across three sides including Kidderminster, AFC Fylde & Solihull Moors preceding him leaving for NN13 for the start of this season.

12 | Michael Nottingham

Defender

Former St Kitts & Nevis international Michael Nottingham is a vastly experienced defender who has spent time at several notable clubs. The now 36-year-old has been on the books of Blackpool, Crewe Alexandra & Livingston, before settling in Brackley for the start of the season.

19 | Zak Lilly

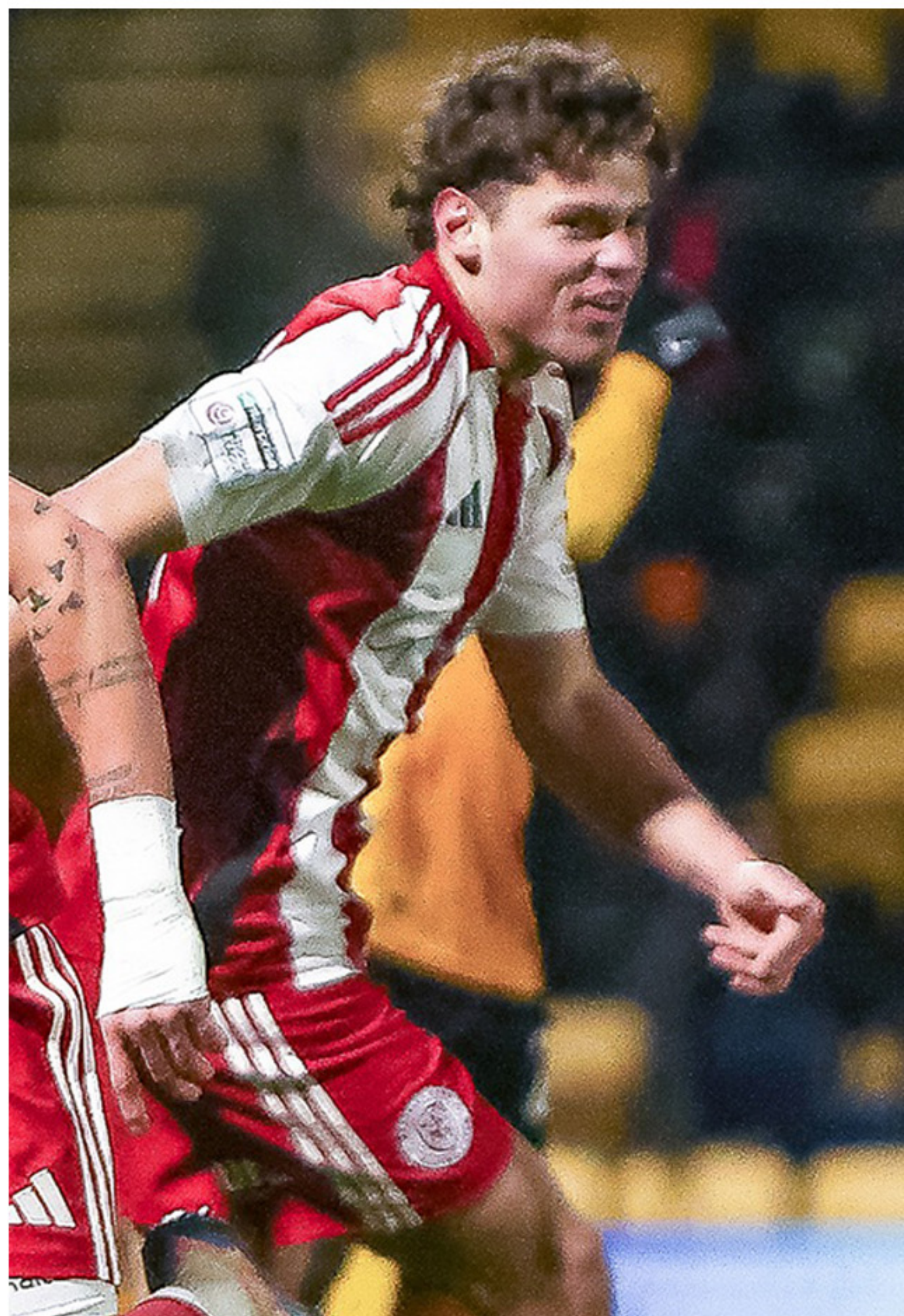
Defender

Defender Zak Lilly has been an instrumental part of this season's backline, starting several games & being part of the team that ultimately won promotion last campaign. After a superb spell at the back and earning promotion via the play-offs from the National League North, Lilly was rewarded with a new contract which will keep him at St James Park until the end of the 2025/26 season.

22 | Bryan Pendleton

Defender

Loanee Bryan Pendleton is currently applying his trade with Birmingham City's academy and has been there for several years. Currently on a development plan, he already spent time on loan in the National League before joining The Saints this season with a brief stint at Yeovil Town. He arrived in NN13 at the start of December to provide competition to the right hand side of the defence.



4 | Jack Price

Midfielder

A product of the Wolves academy spending several years there as a youngster, two loan moves in between to Yeovil Town & Leyton Orient helped his development before making the move to Colorado Rapids. A return home would lead to him joining Shrewsbury Town, before finally making the move to Brackley ahead of this season.

8 | Zak Brown

Midfielder

A West Bromwich Albion academy graduate, this versatile midfielder can play in either a defensive or attacking role. Alvechurch first noticed his talents following his release from the Baggies, which prompted swift movement from Kidderminster Harriers. Three years followed there, before joining The Saints at the start of the season.

11 | Matt Lowe

Midfielder

An incredibly versatile player, Lowe can be played practically anywhere on the pitch having spent time this season as a centre forward, right winger, right back & in central midfield. Scoring on three occasions this season with one assist, he will be a danger man to more than one when he comes to Gander Green Lane.

20 | Yahya Bamba

Midfielder

The current Forest Green Rovers midfielder joined Brackley on loan from the start of the season, and since then the midfielder has made 16 appearances in the National League so far. Formerly of Sevenoaks & Cray Wanderers, the midfielder got his break joining Eastbourne Borough in March of 2024, and is now gaining valuable experience at Step 1.

23 | Shane Byrne

Midfielder

Either deployed as an eight or a ten, Shane is a product of Leicester's youth academy. He's spent time both on British shores & in Ireland, at the likes of Bury, Boston United & Kidderminster Harriers. He's into his second spell with the club now, after spending five years previously at the club between 2016 & 2021.

15 | Ben Wodskou

Forward

Another one in this side also on loan from Birmingham City, the centre forward has played on six occasions for the club so far, averaging a goal every two games. After spending time on loan at Yeovil Town earlier in the year, the striker made the switch like fellow teammate Byron Pendleton.

28 | Danny Newton

Forward

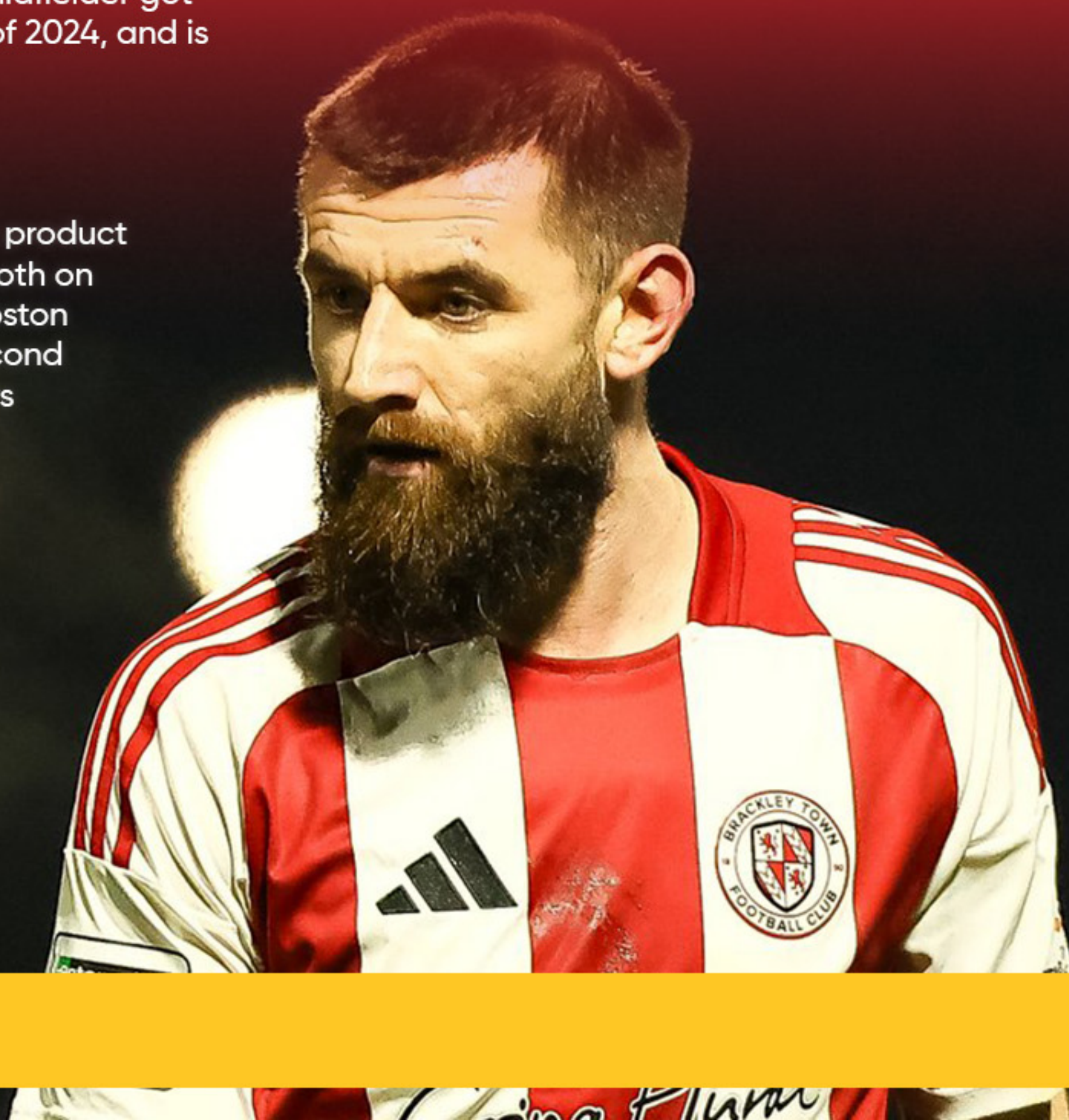
Joining on loan from Harborough Town to return to the club after a few years away, the fan favourite brought hard work, a physical presence and an eye for goal to the club. Formerly of Hinckley, Nuneaton, Barwell, Leamington, Tamworth, Stevenage, Solihull and Boreham Wood, he has bagged two assists since his return, adding to a tally of just over 30 goal contributions in red and white over several spells.

29 | Kian Harratt

Forward

Loanee Kian only arrived in NN13 this week and has had a career spanning across several clubs in the EFL which include the likes of Port Vale & Bradford City.

Graduating through Huddersfield Town's academy, he notably scored the winner in the National League play-off final to send Oldham Athletic to the football league.

HISTORIC RAMBLINGS

Three from the 31st January

A slow(ish) day on the calendar probably affected by the weather as much as any other reason as SUFC has played just fifteen previous matches on this date as a senior club. The first was a Surrey Senior Cup second round tie against Redhill in 1914. Played in front of what was described as a huge crowd at The Find, the tie finished 2-2 with one of U's early playing legends, Charlie Chippendale, on the score sheet. Just six weeks later Charlie was being buried, his funeral attracting 2,000 mourners following his death in a railway accident.

Of the other eight home matches, three ended in defeat and one was drawn. One of the four victories is featured below. Away from The Find/GGL three 1-1 draws have been recorded, two wins and a defeat, that being in 1959 in the Surrey Senior Cup by 2-1 in a replay at Walton & Hersham.

The Match

Back to 1970 and a week after the visit of Leeds United in the FA Cup fourth round a calmer GGL saw U's entertain Leatherhead in the Surrey Senior Cup. Isthmians v Athenians in a first round tie. This was just my fifth match in attendance and the second involving The Tanners, they being the opponents for my first visit eight weeks earlier. U's were forced into giving former Crystal Palace junior Brian Eastick a debut in goal as Dave Roffey had a groin injury, while Trevor Waughman replaced Micky Mellows who had college to attend. Leatherhead included former U's players Bob Adam and Tony McGuinness in their half back line while future Suttonian Jim Strong also featured.

Dario Gradi set up two of U's goals.



Eastick had a fine afternoon as the visitors enjoyed much of the first half, the debut-making 'keeper forced into a number of saves. And when he was beaten by Mick Howard the woodwork came into play. At the other end Tanners' custodian Cuthbert had to make one brilliant stop to deny a deflected shot from Ted Powell. Adam was excellent at the back while Strong kept a tight rein on Waughman.

U's, perhaps fortunate to be level at the break, were a different prospect in the second period. They did survive a goalmouth scramble following a cross by Leatherhead favourite "Nobby" Skinner but in the 53rd minute Larry Pritchard was found by Dario Gradi and he shot past Cuthbert. Four minutes later Peter Drabwell had a simple finish after Powell's effort had rebounded off the frame of the goal. In the 64th minute the contest was over when John Faulkner headed in from Gradi's corner kick, his last goal in Sutton colours before his move to Leeds in March. Shortly after, Drabwell missed an open goal but it was of no consequence; 3-0 it finished.

The Player

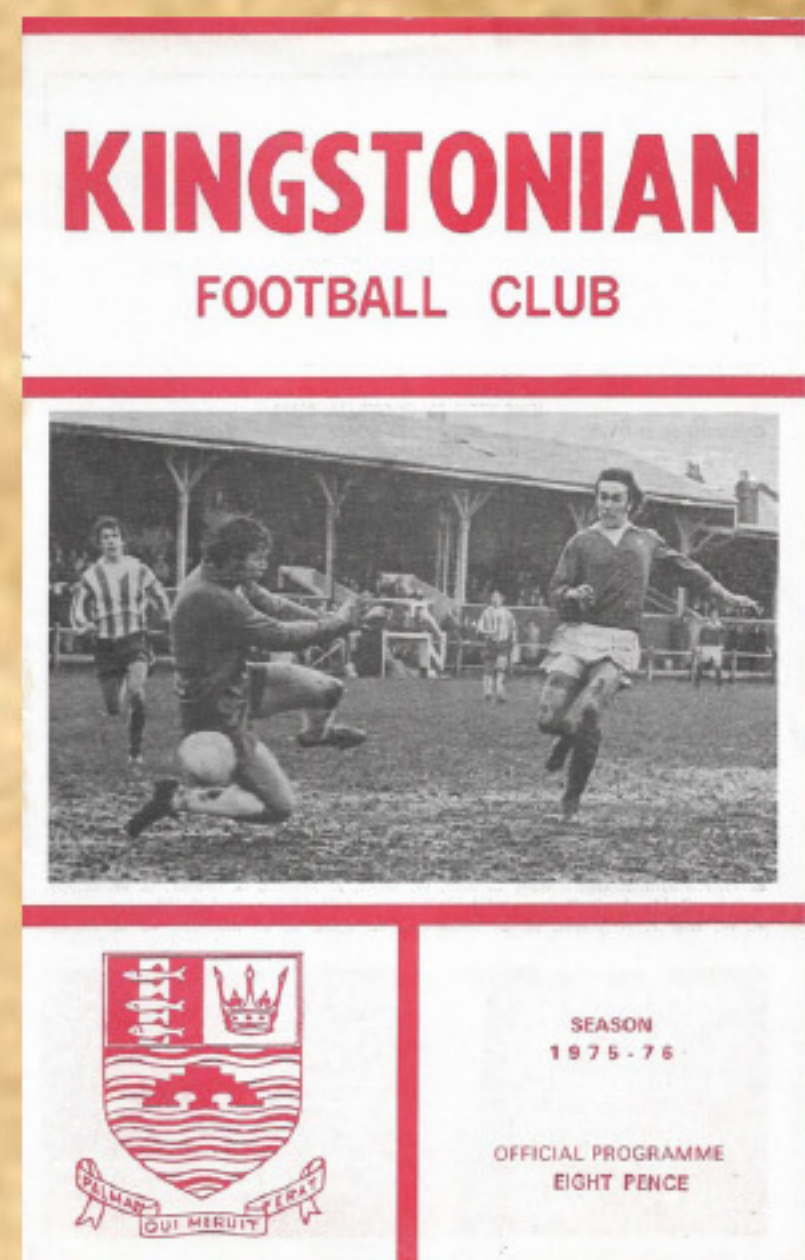
Today's featured player is actually most notably remembered for his tremendous service to manager Sid Cann as his assistant throughout Cann's tenure. Playing in the defeat at W&H mentioned above, Johnny Wall's main role was as reserve team manager, however he did make fifteen appearances for the first XI commencing with his debut on 25th October 1958 against Hitchin Town in the Athenian League. John was a half back although he had featured in other positions during a playing career that started at Banstead Athletic in the late 1940s and took in Wealdstone, Redhill and Carshalton Athletic as well as signing amateur forms with Crystal Palace while with the Robins. He played half a dozen matches during that 1958/9 season and those fifteen appearances came across four seasons before he took the reserve manager role, appointed by Cann on his arrival for the '62/3 term. It was a tough assignment as U's reserves had achieved the Athenian League and Cup double the previous season, missing out on a treble after losing to Wimbledon in the Surrey Intermediate final, with John heavily involved as the regular right half and captain.



In his first season as reserve team manager Sutton did retain the League Cup and on moving to the Isthmian League for the 1963/4 season, U's lost out in a play-off with Kingstonian for the 1966/7 reserve section title, a disappointment softened by the winning of the SIC for the first time. Johnny had already taken them to the final in 1965 losing out to then Beddington based Fisher Athletic by 2-1. A fresh challenge in the guise of the Suburban League arrived for the 1971/72 season and U's finished second behind Leatherhead and repeated that form in John's last season as reserve team manager, on that occasion to Woking - both by a point. His last silverware came at the end of that first SL season, as U's defeated Croydon Amateurs in the 1972 SIC final by 3-1 after a 2-2 draw, both matches at Tanners' Fetcham Grove ground. During its inaugural season, Johnny also took charge of the Suburban League representative XI. The life of a second string manager cannot be easy with first team call ups disrupting the flow of selection while looking to improve the younger players and ready them for the set up, but Johnny Wall withstood that for ten full seasons and with some success.

The Programme

The mid-1970s and on this day in 1976 Sutton made the short trip to Richmond Road for an Isthmian League match against Kingstonian; Sutton won by 4-0. K's programme improved from their late '60s to early '70s efforts. The front cover is below and features the late Terry Molloy, son of then U's chairman Peter, while on the inside club officials were listed. Page three held club notes and mentioned their former player/manager Ted Powell and also captain Micky Preston's inclusion in the Sutton set up (Powell as manager). Over the page was an Isthmian League results table followed by a page of adverts including Alto Acoustics Ltd based in the High Street and, a couple of units up the road, Walturdaw Ltd selling Cinema and Television Projection Equipment. The middle spread held the teams (K's goalkeeper was Surrey and England cricketer Graham Roope), surrounded by more adverts and on page nine, fixtures and results, appearances and goal

scorers and the IL table. Page ten had a pen pic of the referee Andy Isaacs, who sadly died the following season. Below was a list of disciplinary points received (one for a yellow, four for a red). Barking were "top" with thirteen, while the fewest was just one yellow card, a three-way tie including Sutton. The inside and back cover were both full of adverts ranging from two separate coachwork companies and a local greengrocers.

SUFC v Brackley Town

Brackley make their first visit to GGL this afternoon looking to complete a NL double having won with a late Connor Hall goal at St James Park back in September. Prior to that the only other match between the two sides was in the FA Trophy third round in February 2018, also at SJP. A second-half comeback secured back-to-back wins for Sutton in the EFL Youth Alliance South Division.

Northampton started brightly and took an early lead when Harry Stephenson fired low into the bottom corner from the edge of the box. Sutton responded with several first-half chances, Rashaad Drysdale and Bobby Sheargold both going close, but Jamie Morrison stood firm in the hosts' goal to preserve the advantage at the break.

Glen Nichols' half-time message to maintain energy paid immediate dividends. Within a minute of the restart, Jay Coombes headed home Adam Reeves' corner to level the scores. Sutton continued to press, with Omotolani Bello and Sheargold both denied by Morrison. Substitutes Leo Ginger and Jayden Obarotimi made an instant impact, and Sutton completed the turnaround on 70 minutes when Reeves headed in another corner to make it 2-1. Northampton offered little response as Sutton saw out a deserved away victory, extending their strong run of form ahead of a trip to Stevenage next weekend.

Sutton completed a hat-trick of victories over Wealdstone this season with a narrow win at Brunel University.

This contest proved far tougher against an improved home side fresh from a draw with league leaders Southend. The decisive moment came in the 16th minute. Kai McKenzie found space on the edge of the area and drove a low shot that was only parried by the Wealdstone goalkeeper, allowing Rashaad Drysdale to react quickest and slot home the rebound. With wind

and rain in their favour, Sutton enjoyed the better of the first half, although clear chances were limited and Tolani Bello saw a goal ruled out for offside. 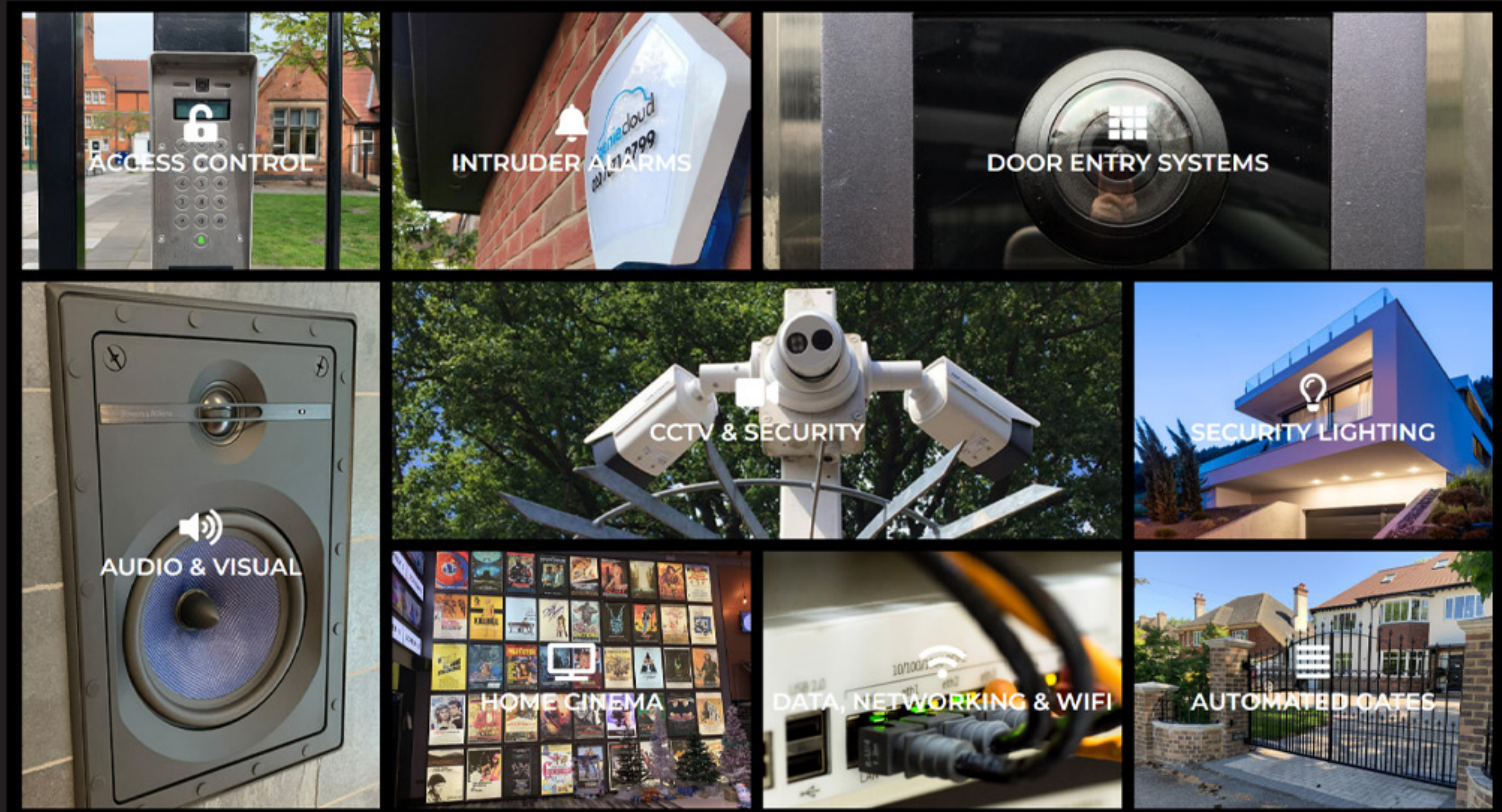

JERMAINE FRANCIS:

"This Is Definitely One Of The Best Clubs I've Been At"

Jermaine Francis arrives at Sutton United full of excitement, belief and a clear sense of purpose as he begins the next chapter of his career.

The midfielder has made the permanent switch from Hartlepool United in a move motivated by the chance to return closer to home, having originally moved up to the North-East in the summer.

After taking part in his first training sessions with the club, Francis sat down with Sutton United FCtv to discuss his journey to the VBS Community Stadium.

"It feels great," he said. "I know a lot about the club, and I know the manager as well – how he plays and what he wants from his teams – so that really excited me. Especially coming down here too, closer to home. I'm just grateful to be here."

"A few people played a part in it, I played with Bes [Topallaj] at Hartlepool and I've played against Lewis Simper a couple of times – a very good player as well. But most importantly, the manager spoke to me directly. He said he wanted me here, wanted to give me the chance to show my ability and give me game time. I'm really grateful for that."

Francis brings solid non-league experience with him and feels ready to make an impact, and discussed his path from the lower echelons of non-league, which saw him turn out for the likes DTFC and Hashtag United earlier on in his career, before making the step up to the National League with stints at Barnet, Braintree Town and Hartlepool, the latter two seeing him appear for the first time against Sutton.

"I was at Chelmsford City two years ago. I was at Barnet and went on loan to Braintree, so I've shown what I can do at this level," he said. "Then I went to Hartlepool – things didn't quite work out there in terms of minutes – but I'm here now and ready to finish the season strong."

The 23-year old notably scored against Sutton in the 3-3 draw with Hartlepool back in October, giving him his first taste of Chris Agutter's style months before the Head Coach chose to bring him to his new club.

"The system [at Sutton] is good," he said. "We [Hartlepool] had to switch formations in that game because we had to match up. I like the way the team plays out from the back and how ruthless they want to be going forward. Hopefully I can work my way into the side. I know the manager can improve me, the lads can improve me, and I can help them as well."

Having begun his career in originally in academy football with QPR and Reading, the midfielder went on to touch on the lessons he's learned from playing senior football, having opted for the path of non-league after his departure from the Madejski Stadium.

"It's a massive difference, academy football is very different to non-league. When I first went into non-league, I thought it might be easier, but you get humbled quickly. You take kicks, you get bruises. I'm used to that now. I'm at the top end of the non-league pyramid and my aim is to keep working my way up to the Football League – and hopefully one day the Premier League."

Most notably, a standout spell with Hashtag United helped raise his profile and confidence, with the Tags of course renowned for the exposure they have compared to other clubs in non-league, having begun as a YouTube team following their formation in 2016 under Spencer Owen, before making the move into the non-league pyramid only two years later. Francis subsequently got the chance to play a key role within their early history, scoring ten goals in 26 games as they won promotion Isthmian League Premier Division, while he displayed his confidence within himself by describing himself as 'the best player in the division that year'.

"It was massive – great exposure. I want to thank the club and the manager there for allowing me to express myself. They always said to me, 'try to be the best player in the league' – I felt that season I was, in my own opinion, and I'm trying to continue that now." Hashtag gave me a big platform. A lot of managers and players know what kind of player I am, but I've improved since then and feel more like myself now."

Francis then spoke about his aims and how he intends to fit into the side under Agutter, with the Head Coach previously saying he wants at least two players in each position, something which displays while he has opted to bring in the 23-year old following the arrival of Dubem Eze at the start of the month. Early impressions of the dressing room have been extremely positive, having already got the opportunity to hit the ground running in training.

"Robust," he said. "I don't stop running. I've got hunger and desire. Technically, I can always improve – especially when I get tired – and sometimes it's about mentality. I know I've got the mindset to keep improving. Competition makes you better. You can't slack here – everyone's a good player in their own way. You might be less technical than someone else, but you might outwork them. Hard work and dedication matter, and the talent follows. The lads are friendly, but most importantly they demand from each other. That's something I really like and haven't always seen throughout my career. This is definitely one of the best clubs I've been at."

Looking ahead, his focus is firmly on the collective, with his first game set to be in front of the home support as Sutton take on Brackley Town on Saturday.

"You take it game by game," he said. "This league is tight – anyone can beat anyone. A good run of five games can put you right in the mix. I've got my own ambitions, the club has ambitions, the gaffer has ambitions – but we stay focused on each game."

"I'm really looking forward to it," he said. "I'm ready to show what I can do, but most importantly we need three points. We want to build on last week's win and keep that momentum going."

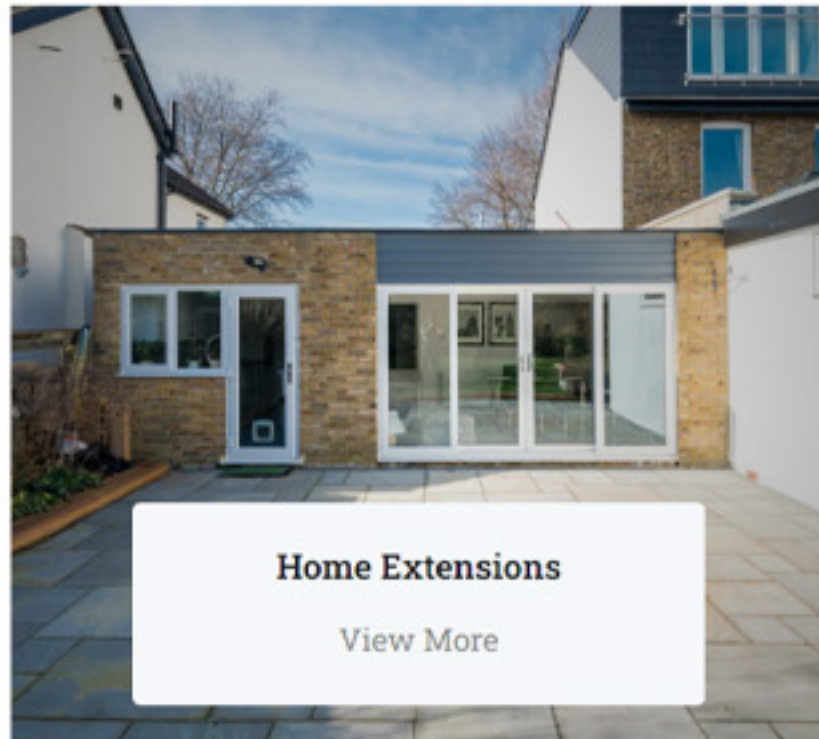

Despite the slightly reduced fixture list, the nine games in the National League last weekend saw a total of thirty goals scored and seven sides securing maximum points.

Arguably, the biggest win of the weekend came in the late kick-off as Scunthorpe beat Forest Green 3-2 in an entertaining affair at the Attis Arena. Ricardo Rees returned from his suspension to score his third goal for his new club and give them the lead early on before goals from Danny Whitehall, Zain Westbrooke and Carlton Ubaezuonu were enough to see off the Gloucestershire side.

The win for the Iron made it seven unbeaten in the league, picking up nineteen points to put them firmly in the title race. Their title challenge will be tested in February with games against Southend, Carlisle, Rochdale and York to come. The defeat for Forest Green capped a miserable month for them. Robbie Savage's side picked up one win in six games and fell nine points behind league leaders Rochdale, with more games played than those above them.



Another side who've fallen behind in the title race is Boreham Wood. Luke Garrard's side suffered back-to-back defeats for the first time this season after a 3-1 defeat to Altrincham. Regan Booty's lovely free-kick was a mere consolation after goals from Oliver Crankshaw, Otis Khan and Jake Southern-Cooper gave the Robins a commanding lead. The win for Neil Gibson's side was their first since the 29th November and lifted them five points clear of the relegation zone.



York made light work of relegation-threatened Braintree in a 5-0 win at the LNER Community Stadium. The Minstermen were quick out of the blocks and raced to a 4-0 lead within twenty-eight minutes. Ollie Pearce completed his hat-trick in the second half and took his total for the season to twenty-six goals in the National League. The victory made it a tenth game without defeat at home for Maynard's side. For Braintree, the defeat, coupled with Sutton's win at Tamworth, saw them slip into the relegation zone for the first time since 22nd November.



Off the back of pitch renovations, Rochdale played their first game at the Crown Oil Arena since 29th November last weekend and dispatched Truro 2-0. Two first-half goals from Tyler Smith and Ian Henderson were enough for Dale to secure the three points. The scoreline flattered the Tinnars as Jim McNulty's side had sixteen attempts on goal and hit the woodwork five times. They made it four wins on the bounce in midweek after coming from behind to beat Southend 2-1 at home. A 90th-minute winner from Harvey Gilmour secured the three points for Dale, who host Boreham Wood on Tuesday night.



The Essex side had a poor few days, having drawn 3-3 with relegation-threatened Boston last Saturday. Despite taking the lead, the Shrimps found themselves 3-1 down after an hour, after a Lenell John-Lewis brace either side of a Frankie Maguire penalty. Andrew Dallas scored a brace of his own before Slavi Spasov's eighth of the season in all competitions drew them level. Despite rescuing a point, they managed to drop out of the top seven after Halifax's 3-2 win at Eastleigh.



The Shaymen are a point clear of Southend after picking up their fifth win in their last six games. Will Harris bagged his eleventh and twelfth goals of the National League campaign, with one of them an acrobatic bicycle kick. Florent Hoti added a third just after half-time, which proved decisive, with Lloyd Humperies getting a goal back for Eastleigh with ten minutes to go. The Spitfires sit six points ahead of the relegation zone and today's opponents, Braintree.



Solihull Moors picked up a first clean sheet in eleven games in all competitions and kept up their play-off hopes with a comfortable 2-0 win at Morecambe. Goals in each half from Connor Wilkinson and Darius Lipsiuc gave them the victory. The defeat was Morecambe's fifth from their last six games in all competitions and leaves them five points from safety ahead of today's fixtures.



Today's opponents, Brackley, kept their eighth clean sheet of the season last weekend in a 0-0 draw with Hartlepool. It extended their unbeaten league run to five games, but the Saints come into today's game with Gareth Dean in interim charge after Gavin Cowan took the Shrewsbury Town vacancy on Thursday.
