## TIM TALKS

**A warm welcome to the supporters of Horley Town FC and their players, staff and club officials too as we host them at the VBS Community Stadium in the Surrey Senior Cup this evening.**

It's Quarter Final time in this, my favourite of all the cup competitions we enter as a club each season. I was first introduced to the club through an exciting cup tie and there is something about knock out football that always brings an edge to matches. I'm glad that with Chris now in charge we have a manager too that values the trophy and the chance of silverware this competition brings. In previous seasons the approach has been of leaving this competition to the academy youngsters alone, but Chris sees these matches as opportunities for all of the first team to be available and potentially involved, as well as a chance to see the U18 and U19 players, and how they might transition from training with the

first team to appearing alongside them for real.

Chris has been true to his word of wanting to win every match so far, and with the winners tonight being just a match away from the final, winning silverware is looking possible again.

In the previous round we faced Croydon Athletic and I commented in my notes how the Surrey Senior Cup gives the opportunity to play against local rivals, something that our progress up the pyramid has made less possible. The draw, with Horley's victory over Sheerwater, has paired the clubs together but our history is such we have only met competitively twice, and in this competition, the Ambers coming out on top both times. In 2019 a mixed first and youth team captained by Craig Dundas came out comfortable winners 3-0, with goals scored by Wayne Brown (on his return from injury after a year out), Aaron Jarvis and Tommy Wright (after previously hitting the crossbar twice!) in front of 156 supporters. In 2024 the venue was reversed as we visited Horley with the Scholars team running out 3 – 1 winners with goals scored by George Vorster and Vinnie Tume (twice).

I wonder how many watching that evening would have predicted subsequent first team opportunities for George Vorster, Adam Reeves, Dan Urpens, Liam Moore, Bobby Sheargold, Joden Trickett, Vinnie Tume, Sam Roberts and most frequently Junior Eccleston? Similarly what would the prediction have been for a certain Ashley Nadesan when he signed paperwork to play for Horley as a youth player in 2012? Nadders, now at Sutton, and fresh from scoring on Saturday, scored 99 times for The Clarets before jumping six rungs in the Football Pyramid to join Fleetwood Town in EFL Division One, with talk of him being their new Jamie Vardy.

Horley (Town or otherwise named) have never won this competition but we have made the final on 28 occasions, being the victors 15 times. A win tonight will bring us just 90 minutes from that 29th appearance and (thanks to the mighty Cobham in Round Two ensuring they can't meet us!) matching the record of Woking.



Tyler Chambers moved into coaching at a young age after an early end to his playing career, quickly building a strong reputation in youth and development football.

At Sutton Common Rovers, he achieved back-to-back Combined Counties League titles with the Under-23s, along with consecutive finals in the League Cup and Surrey Senior Cup. He continued his success across Surrey with Merstham, winning the Combined Counties League Cup, the Suburban South title, and finishing as Division 1 Challenge Cup runners-up. After five years in youth football, Chambers stepped into senior management, joining Croydon FC in 2022. He later moved to Horley Town, initially assisting Martin Rapson, before guiding the first team to successive mid-table finishes, rising from 17th to ninth place.





## **THE ROCK** **JOE** **CARRINGTON**

Joe Carrington has been a regular fixture in the heart of Horley's team this season, appearing more times than anyone else with 30 appearances.

Having been promoted from the club's Under-23s, he quickly established himself as a regular in the first team and was retained for the 2024/25 season, during which he won the club's Players' Player of the Year award.



## ***THE LEADER WILL KENDALL***

Hailing from Sheffield, Will Kendall came through the Sheffield Wednesday academy as a youth and has since become a regular forward in the non-league game. The striker is particularly known for his time with Epsom & Ewell where he made 27 appearances and scored nine goals, including a memorable hat-trick against Phoenix Sports in the FA Cup. He later joined Horley in March 2024, with his experience and link-up play being a catalyst in driving the Clarets' performances this season



## **THE FINISHER** **ARLIE** **DESANGES**

Arlie Desanges has impressed in his maiden campaign at The New Defence, having signed from Sutton Athletic in the summer, and has scored 13 goals this term.

The striker has been a consistent goalscorer within non-league, notably finishing as the Southern Counties East Football League Division One top scorer with 34 goals in 2016/17, before going on to establish his reputation as a proven goalscorer at Steps 4 and 5, finding the back of the net over 250 times for Sutton Athletic, Chipstead, Redhill and others.

### **1 | Sammy Saward**

#### **Goalkeeper**

Woking goalkeeper Sammie Saward has enjoyed a successful dual-registration deal at Horley, having joined the club in October 2025. He began his career in the Brentford youth system before moving into the Woking setup, where he continues his progression between the sticks as part of the club's development sides, and has appeared 14 times for the Clarets.

### **2 | Ben Dyson**

#### **Defender**

Ben Dyson joined Horley from Broadbridge Heath in the autumn last year, quickly becoming a squad favourite with his bombing displays down the right flank and won the 2024/25 Goal of the Season. Prior to his move to The New Defence, he featured for Tooting Bec's reserves before stepping up to Horley's first team.

### **3 | Cameron Gyeabour**

#### **Defender**

Cameron Gyeabour joined the youth setup at Holmesdale FC and later Sutton Common Rovers, before joining Croydon FC, making his debut against Sutton Athletic in March 2022. Known for his work rate, physical presence, and goalscoring ability, Gyeabour joined Horley in 2022.

### **5 | Joe Bell**

#### **Defender**

Joe Bell signed for Horley from Kingstonian, whom he joined in October 2024. Before that move, he had a brief spell with Raynes Park Vale, and also enjoyed two separate spells at South Park (Reigate) as well as a period at Carshalton Athletic. A defensive-minded player, he has appeared nine times for the Clarets so far this season.

### **6 | Bailey McCarthy**

#### **Defender**

Bailey McCarthy joined Horley from Croydon in July 2023, and has played sporadically during his two seasons at The New Defence. He has previously turned out for Sutton Common Rovers and Merstham, prior to his move to Croydon in 2022.

### **15 | Liam Trevatt**

#### **Defender**

Liam Trevatt came through the ranks at Dorking Wanderers before joining Horley in August 2024, spending the bulk of the campaign with the Clarets before making the switch to Reigate Priory on Deadline Day for the final six games of the season. He had appeared 28 times for Horley last term, scoring five goals.

### **7 | Aaron Moody**

#### **Midfielder**

Aaron Moody made his loan move from Raynes Park Vale permanent in the summer, having spent the backend of the 2024/25 campaign at The New Defence. The versatile youngster has featured in both defence and midfield since joining the Clarets, having racked up plenty of pedigree at Step 4.

### **8 | Adam Allen**

#### **Midfielder**

A box-to-box midfielder, Adam Allen is an experienced, powerful presence in the centre of the pitch. He previously turned out for AFC Whyteleafe, Hartley Wintney, Whitehawk, Merstham and Croydon, before joining Horley ahead of the 2025/26 campaign, offering the Clarets proficiency with the ball at his feet, a clinical eye in front of goal, along with bursts of energy and goalscoring ability.

### **10 | George Craig**

#### **Midfielder**

George Craig enjoyed a superb debut campaign with the Clarets, featuring 39 times and being ever-present as they reached the Combined Counties League Premier Challenge Cup Semi-Final. A product of the Dorking Wanderers' youth setup, the technical, box-to-box midfielder had become their first summer signing ahead of the 2024/25 campaign, joining from Scottish Highland League side Huntly.

### **11 | Sam Mercer**

#### **Midfielder**

Sam Mercer emerged into Horley's First Team squad towards the end of the season, establishing himself as an energetic, tireless midfielder with superb passing ability. His performances saw him named as the Clarets' Young Player of the Year.

### **12 | Adam Azia**

#### **Midfielder**

Adam Aziz joined Horley in October 2025 from Isthmian South Central side Westfield. An exciting, attacking player who can play in midfield or out wide, Aziz previously appeared for AFC Whyteleafe.

### **13 | Jack Marney**

#### **Midfielder**

Jack Marney joined Horley after a short spell with Horsham YM in the Southern Combination League. A technical ten and set piece specialist, he previously came through the youth setup at AFC Whyteleafe before appearing for AFC Croydon Athletic, Farnham Town and Sheppey United, prior to his move to Horley in October 2025.

#### **14 Lewis Pearch**

##### **Midfielder**

Lewis Pearch is in his third spell at Horley, having returned to the club in December.

The attacking midfielder turned out for Leatherhead, Merstham and Epsom prior to his move to Horley in 2023/24, going on to score 34 goals in 70 appearances including a whopping 28 last term. He then began the current campaign at The New Defence before a brief stint away at Fleet Town, before returning after two months.

#### **9 | Warren Colman**

##### **Forward**

Warren Colman rejoined Horley from East Grinstead Town, less than a year after originally departing the club. A versatile, attack-minded midfielder, he has previously appeared for Chessington & Hook United prior to his move to Sussex, and immediately became a mainstay in the starting XI with his slick passing and work rate across his two spells at Horley.

#### **18 | Coby Acquaye**

##### **Forward**

Coby Acquaye is a product of the Raynes Park Vale academy, appearing for the Under-18s and Under-23s before hitting double figures in his first senior season for Colliers Wood United. He later joined Horley in August 2024, and hit home a hat-trick in their last outing against Guildford City.

# HISTORIC RAMBLINGS

## Three from the 3rd February

Sutton have played sixteen matches on this date as a senior club (1910), eight of which have been cup ties. Of these cup encounters, five have been at GGL. They include two Amateur Cup exits in 1934 to Dulwich Hamlet and 1962 to Wycombe Wanderers as Athenians hosted Isthmians. In 1968 U's defeated Northern League club Evenwood Town by 3-0 in a replay. The 1982 Surrey Senior replay with Met Police is featured below, while U's defeated Bath City in the GMAC (an inter-league competition) by 4-0 in 1987, with Micky Joyce netting a hat-trick. Away from Sutton U's lost at Summerstown in 1924 in the Surrey Charity Shield semi final by 4-3 and in 1998 by 4-0 to Kingstonian in a SSC tie (U's first defeat at Kingsmeadow), while more recently in 2018 the club's first ever match with Brackley ended in a 3-1 reverse in the FA Trophy.

U's first match was in 1912, a 2-0 success over Old Kingstonians in the South Suburban League (West) while the next home league encounter was the most recent, a 1-1 draw with Doncaster Rovers in 2024 in EFL L2 (a last minute aberration by Dean Bouzanis costing Sutton what would have been a vital two points). Away from Sutton five league encounters produced three wins and two draws.

## The Match

As stated above we travel back to 1982 for a SSC replay, a match played on a Wednesday evening that proved far less dramatic than the original tie the previous Saturday. Trailing by 3-1 to hosts lower down in the pyramid with just seven minutes to go, first Chris Sparks fired in from twenty yards before Steve Rogers hit one of his trademark thunderbolts a further five yards out than Sparks's effort.



And to the replay. Sutton were without their main strike pair of Joyce and Peter Sharratt and had struggled to break down The Met's defence until the 39th minute when a Rogers shot was handled on the goal line and he converted the resultant penalty. Two minutes later he netted the second with a twenty yard strike after a free-kick had been tapped to him. Then in the 42nd minute Nicky Cripps headed in a Micky Stephens cross.

The second half was played out with U's happy to play keep ball and 3-0 it finished.

## The Player


Appearing in the Sutton defence on this day in 1996 was Paul Gates as he helped U's to a 2-1 Isthmian defeat of Chertsey Town. Paul joined Sutton from Chipstead making a fair leap up the ranks to play Conference football in the summer of 1989. He was comfortable playing as a orthodox right back, a right wing back or even as a centre back. Paul made 47 appearances that first season and would be a near constant in the team over the seven full seasons he spent at GGL. There was a fair wait for his first Sutton goal, a stoppage time equaliser in a league game at Hendon, but his second (later that same season) was an even more important strike as he helped U's come from behind to defeat Warrington Town to set up a two-legged Trophy semi final with Wycombe Wanderers.



While at Sutton, Paul won the Bob Lord Trophy, two Isthmian Full Members' Cups (captaining the side in the 1992 success) and one Surrey Senior Cup. A fully paid up member of SUFC's "300" club he just fell short of making the more exclusive 400 variety as he made 387 appearances (3 goals) before leaving at the start of the 1996/7 season to join his local club, Whyteleafe. A very consistent performer with a very good disciplinary record, picking up one red card for an alleged second yellow offence (he was fuming about the ref after that match against Chesham) and just one other yellow card.

## The Programme

This evening's programme from the past goes back fifty-two years and a trip to St Albans City in the Isthmian League, the match ending 1-1. In its third season this design was a marked improvement of the four page production City used in the 1960s. The front cover is shown and gives a lovely view of the main stand at Clarence Park. The inside cover listed club details including their honours and the then club officials although they were out of date with regards their manager, listing John Drabwell. Page three presented club notes and this refers to Drabwell's recent departure to Cheshunt. The middle spread held the team lists on one page and the IL table on the other. These were surrounded by adverts including one for the Herts Advertiser and another for Top Footwear, a shoe shop in the city for men. Over the page was Supporters' notes and next to that was a list of results, although a month out of date. The inside back cover held a fair sized advert for Xerox copying service at St Albans Photoprint. More adverts adorned the back page ranging from rubbish disposal by Hales Containers Ltd to Jeans for Ski and other outside pursuits clothing. All on glossy paper for 3p, arguably a better effort than the SUFC programme of the era.

## SUFC v Horley Town

Tonight is U's third county cup meeting with Horley. In November 2019 at GGL, a first round tie ended 3-0 in favour of the hosts, Wayne Brown scoring one of his two goals for the club. In March 2024 at The New Defence, Vinnie Tume (2) and George Vorster scored in a 3-1 third round success for Sutton. Prior to that two friendlies at the ND had been played. In July 2004, Sutton won by 3-0 and four years later, U's were successful by 2-0.

Of course, Horley is where Ashley Nadesan began his career and his prolific goal scoring feats earned a move up the pyramid. Another to play for both clubs was right back Paul Snape, who was a youngster who came out of the reserves to play during the difficult second half of the 1976/77 season. Further back in the 1950s was Peter Tester who made one appearance for Sutton during the 1949/50 campaign against Met Police in the Surrey Senior Cup. Prior to joining Sutton, he had played for Kew Association and Horley. A young winger, he played on the left flank and earlier that season had represented the Surrey FA at youth level. He later played for Redhill.

# SUFC FOUNDATION

**"Alone we can do so little; together we can do so much."**

Social isolation is an issue affecting many people across our borough. Whether due to age, health challenges, changes in family circumstances, or simply a lack of opportunities to connect with others, many residents experience loneliness that can have a serious impact on wellbeing and mental health.

At the Sutton United Foundation, we see first-hand how powerful community and shared activity can be in bringing people together. Football has always been about more than the game, and our work aims to create spaces where people can meet, talk, and feel part of something again.

Our Walking Football sessions continue to provide a welcoming environment for older residents and those returning to physical activity, offering both gentle exercise and, just as importantly, friendship and routine. Similarly, our community coffee mornings give people a relaxed space to chat, meet new friends, and build connections that often continue beyond the sessions themselves.

We are also proud of our growing Parkinson's active sessions, which support participants not only through movement and exercise but by creating a supportive network where people share experiences and encourage one another.

Recently, members of the Men's 1st Team visited St Raphael's Hospice, where their Wellbeing Hubs provide another vital space for people to meet, talk and support one another. Seeing how these hubs help individuals and families facing difficult times reinforced how important community spaces are in tackling isolation.

Through partnerships and programmes across Sutton, the Foundation remains committed to using the power of sport and community engagement to ensure fewer people feel alone. Whether on the pitch or over a cup of coffee, sometimes the biggest impact comes simply from bringing people together.

We thank all supporters of Sutton United who help make this work possible in our community.

# LOAN WATCH: JANUARY

**A whopping 15 Sutton players have continued to gain crucial minutes in their legs throughout the non-league pyramid, with a whole host of loanees from both the first team and academy in action during the opening month of 2026.**


Eduino Vaz began life out on loan on the bench as Hampton & Richmond Borough prepared to face Dorking Wanderers. Having completed the move on the eve of their home clash with Marc White's side, the Guinea Bissau was introduced for the first time as a Beaver with an hour played, replacing player-assistant manager Max Kretzschmar, though he was unable to prevent Alan Dowson's men from defeat, having come on with the score at 2-0.

He subsequently made his first start the following week, playing the first hour as they were defeated by Chesham United, before making way for Sutton teammate Nana Boateng with 12 minutes to go in a 1-1 draw with a Salisbury side that contained Mo Dabre, with three Sutton players involved in the clash at the Beveree Stadium, and followed it up by playing the full 90 minutes in Hampton's stunning 1-0 win over league leaders Worthing.

As for Boateng, the former Millwall man joined Vaz in TW12 after missing out on Hemel Hempstead Town's opening two games of the year, with his loan spell in Hertfordshire concluding shortly before his switch to Hampton. He was left out of Dowson's side though in the opening couple of games, but finally made his debut when he replaced Vaz with a late throw of the dice as the trailing Beavers looked to rescue a point, something which came to fruition when Reece Grego-Cox headed home Sam Deadfield's cross with three minutes left.

Moving down the divisions, Alex Woodyard made his debut for Folkestone Invicta with his first set of minutes since November, having last featured in Sutton's 2-2 draw with Morecambe, while this was notably his first start since August, having last began a match in the U's second game of the season against Solihull Moors.

Coming straight into the side, the midfielder was a part of the Seasiders' side who swept past Wingate & Finchley, with Donell Thomas opening the scoring inside the first minute, before Jake Hutchinson doubled the lead before the game had even reached the tenth. It was soon three when ex-U Adam Lovett added his name to the scoresheet, before Montel McKenzie added a fourth before the half-hour mark, with



Woodyard playing the opening 15 minutes of the second half before being replaced by Mikey Berry, and saw the Stripes see out a comfortable second half to extend their stay at the top of the Isthmian League Premier Division, as well as increasing their gap to 14 points after Brentford Town lost to Dulwich Hamlet.

Inciwta then continued their impressive run of form by beating Welling United; Woodyard playing 77 minutes as goals from Donell Thomas and Liam Smith secured a crucial three points in their pursuit of the championship.

Kane Crichlow got off to a delayed start to 2026, with Chelmsford's opening three games against Maidstone United, Slough Town and Farnborough all being postponed. The Clarets finally got the new year underway with the visit of Weston-super-Mare, with the Bermuda international playing an hour before

being replaced by Ricky Holmes, before Lyle Taylor notched the winning penalty late on to kick-off the year with three points, more than two weeks into the month.

This was followed by another start for the midfielder against Horsham, who came close to doubling the Clarets' narrow lead in the latter stages of the first half, before being replaced by Taylor with 22 minutes to go as Angelo Harrop aimed to restore their advantage, having been pegged back by Shamir Fenelon's strike moments earlier.

This then led to a chaotic finale, with the Hornets briefly taking the lead themselves through James Hammond's penalty with nine minutes remaining, but would be a moment that preceded unfortunate events for the hosts, who were soon condemned to the most dramatic defeat when Harry Barbrook – twin brother to former U's loanee, Finley – levelled things up just five minutes after going behind, before James Odegah dealt the deadly blow shortly before stoppage time, and soon proved enough to seal the three points in Sussex.

The Bermudan followed it up by going close to an opener against Slough Town, slamming a shot into the box that brought cries for a handball, before being replaced at half time with the ten-men Clarets down 3-0; the Essex-side going on to fall to a 5-0 defeat at Arbour Park.

Dillon De Silva began the year on the bench for Dagenham & Redbridge, but was one of a triple change with 20 minutes to go as the Daggers fell to defeat against Hemel Hempstead Town, before coming on as a late change the following week against former club Wealdstone, who knocked De Silva's side out of the Isuzu FA Trophy.

He was subsequently named in the starting XI as Dagenham took on Salisbury, being given the chance to face off against Sutton teammate Mo Dabre, and notably flashed a half volley wide of the goal midway through the first half. He went on to play 81 minutes before being replaced, with the ten men Daggers going to fall to a third defeat in a row when Nathan Odokonyero struck moments earlier, having being given a man advantage when Stan Leech was sent off shortly before half time.

The Sri Lanka international was later dropped to the bench against Dover Athletic, with Lee Bradbury's side securing a narrow win to end their run of defeats, before missing out all together as they prepared



to visit an Ebbsfleet United side that contains former U Josh Coley, with Josh Wright's side going on to seal a narrow win over the Daggers.

This subsequently brought an end to his January, with a downpour of rain causing the Daggers' clash with Farnborough to be postponed late on.

Speaking of Dabre, the Italian midfielder got off to a delayed start to the year, just as Crichlow did, with Salisbury's clash with Hornchurch being postponed due to a frozen pitch. However, he subsequently extended his loan deal until the end of the season and marked his extension with a start against highflying Worthing, reuniting with former First Team Coach Jon Meeney at Woodside Park.



It was Dabre who had the Whites' first chance of the half as he picked up the ball on his left foot before curling an effort towards the far corner, forcing Joshua Jeffries into a fingertip stop. He continued his fine form with an outstanding run that began deep in his own half as he chased an over-the-top pass, latching onto the ball before seeing his effort saved, and completed the full 90 minutes as Salisbury shocked the league leaders with a dramatic 5-4 win, with Josh Hedges scoring at the death after a thrilling contest.

Already becoming a firm fans' favourite during his brief stay so far at The Raymond McEnhill Stadium, Dabre continued to make use of his more advanced position under Brian Dutton, going close to opening the scoring the following week against De Silva's Dagenham & Redbridge when some tidy touches in and around the box led to a chance for the midfielder, who struck his shot agonisingly wide, before being replaced on the hour-mark.

The Italian then reunited with another couple of Sutton players, going toe to toe with Eduino Vaz's and Nana Boateng's Hampton & Richmond Borough, with the midfielder twice going close to scoring in each half before being replaced in stoppage time, with the Whites being held to a 1-1 draw thanks to a late strike from Reece Grego-Cox which cancelled out Josh Sommerton's opener.

This was followed by a defeat to Dorking Wanderers, with Dabre going close to pulling a goal back moments into the second half, before being booked three minutes into stoppage time as they fell to a 3-0 loss.

Moving up north, Jaiden White was another player who suffered from the cold temperature with Hereford's clash with Alfreton Town being postponed to cause yet another delayed start to 2026, before suffering the same fate ahead of their visit to Scarborough Athletic. The delay was then almost extended to three games, but despite a pitch inspection ahead of their clash with AFC Fylde, the pitch at Edgar Street was deemed fit for action, and allowed the on-loan Sutton man to begin the year with a start, playing 180 minutes in their Isuzu FA Trophy clash in which he came close to opening the scoring early on, producing a tricky run on the left flank before firing over the crossbar.

An end-to-end affair subsequently led to a four-goal thriller, with the Bulls coming from 2-0 down to draw level thanks to second half strikes from Lawson D'Ath and Lewis Hudson, and sent the tie to a penalty shootout in which White produced his final contribution in a white shirt, keeping his cool to successfully dink the penultimate spot-kick down the middle and keep Hereford in it, though this wasn't enough to secure the victory as two misses saw Fylde go through to the next round. He has since returned to Sutton following the conclusion of his loan, along with Siju Odelusi following his spell at Dover Athletic, who is yet to feature this year due to injury.



As for the academy, several players continue to gain valuable non-league experience on loan, with George Vorster standing out after returning to Burgess Hill Town. The winger made an instant impact, scoring a late winner on his return and contributing goals and assists in subsequent matches. Vorster impressed with his pace, creativity and end product, registering goal contributions against Lewes, Hashtag United and Billericay Town, and earning multiple Man of the Match awards. He also scored twice against Dartford, including a penalty, and played a key role in Burgess Hill's emphatic 6-2 win over Hashtag United.

In the Isthmian League South East Division, Luke Ashburn joined Merstham on loan and began the year with a trip to face Jersey Bulls, ending in a 2-0 defeat. He was an unused substitute against Faversham and in a 2-1 away win over Ashford United, before returning to action from the bench in a 2-0 loss to Herne Bay. Ashburn then started against Three Bridges but was replaced at half time as the Moatsiders suffered a heavy 5-0 defeat.



Closer to home, Noah Nzuzi has spent the season on loan at Carshalton Athletic, continuing to gain valuable experience. The centre-back started the year strongly, scoring his second goal of the campaign against Chichester City, though Carshalton were beaten 2-1. After missing the Folkestone Invicta match, he returned against Cheshunt and went close to an assist in an entertaining 3-3 draw. Nzuzi was on the bench for a heavy defeat to Chatham Town but returned as a substitute in draws against Cray Wanderers and Whitehawk, featuring late on in both 2-2 encounters.

The defender then did so again against Whitehawk, replacing Mathias Bakare with 13 minutes to go as the Robins drew 2-2.

Moving down south, Tito Salaam began his first loan spell away from Sutton at Hastings United, making his debut from the start against VCD Athletic after a postponed fixture with Crowborough. Hastings opened the year with a 3-0 win before suffering a 4-1 defeat to AFC Croydon Athletic, with Salaam completing 90 minutes in both matches. He then featured in the rearranged clash with Crowborough, making his home debut in a 2-1 defeat. Salaam later appeared from the bench against AFC Whyteleafe in a goalless draw, before starting and playing the first half in a 5-1 loss to Faversham Town.

Ned Hepburn became the 15th Sutton player to head out on loan, joining Grays Athletic for his first professional spell. He made his debut from the start in a narrow 1-0 defeat to Stanway Rovers, playing 74 minutes before being substituted, and was later named on the bench against Brantham Town. Hepburn then returned to action just after the hour mark with Grays leading 2-1 and made a decisive impact, scoring his first senior goal. Picking up the ball on the left, he drove into the area and finished confidently to seal the victory for the Blues.
