# CHIEF OPERATING OFFICER, TIM ALLISON



**We welcome this evening's visitors to the VBS Community Stadium, Woking, for the return visit of the match back in September, that match being under the caretaker tenure of Jon Meeney as the club adjusted to life without Steve Morison.**

It was an evening of anticipation and for periods of the match it looked likely we would double our wins for the season. A goal from ex-Amber Chin Okoli changed that, and some "interesting" refereeing decisions with, as seemed par for the course luck-wise at that stage of the season, an extremely soft penalty awarded against us, and a more likely one not given to us. Another ex-Amber in Harry Beautyman being denied by Jack Sims righted the moral compass somewhat, meaning the goal scored by Charlie Bell on his debut first team start produced a final scoreline of a 1-1 draw.

Charlie will be missing this evening having picked up a three match suspension following his red card against Braintree. The gaffer will also be "missing" with a touchline ban following his third caution of the season. That was expected to be served on Saturday but with Hartlepool's pitch resembling the constituency of porridge on Friday morning a postponement was inevitable and players and supporters alike were informed to ensure unnecessary travel was avoided – even if the club's costs weren't recoverable. Ultimately a similar outcome occurred with Woking, albeit travellers from as far as Manchester, and as close as Woking, were at the ground, with the referee's decision being relayed just an hour before kick-off.

This match, of course, itself is a rearrangement, with the original scheduled for earlier in the season, and unusually it was the unplayable pitch of the away team that caused the postponement, with a postponed FA Trophy fixture being switched to the date on which we should have met, FA competitions taking precedence over league games. In a season where we would want as much certainty, and no fixture backlogs, it feels harsh that we have had three matches postponed through no fault of our own (and considerable costs incurred too). Having made the investment decision to have a new pitch of Championship quality at the stadium, coinciding with a league position that sees us once again in the bottom four at kick off, is it controversial to suggest the National League needs to look at all member clubs' abilities to fulfil fixtures and to invest adequately in their stadia rather than in the playing squad from their available funds?

As to the football, Woking find themselves in relative safety in a mid-table 12th spot. A run to the play-offs, or a fall into the relegation spots, can't be ruled out in the remaining couple of months of the season, but that would appear unlikely. Recent form suggests there isn't much between the two teams with their seven points from the last six games only just beating our six. Indeed an Amber optimist would point out their three losses to our two over that period. You can't but help feel that a good run is needed soon to lift us back into midfield though, and defer angst as the number of remaining games drops into single figures. It seems mad that only a couple of weekends ago we were at Boston and calculating that a win there would have taken us above them in the table. Instead, Boston's one goal winning margin has now led to a four game winning streak for them and the resulting twelve points have lifted them from the relegation scrap to a point above Woking and now in 11th place!

The importance of the match itself can't be diminished but should Woking leave triumphant this evening the baton of "top team in Surrey" feels as though it will have slipped from our grasp once more. Woking last finished higher in the football pyramid than us in season 2019-20, assuming the unfinished Covid season's table is believed – not universally considered true. Before that it last held in the year of our triumph as National League South Champions in 2016/17, with Woking in mid-table one division higher.

Of course, we all know the true measure of who is the best team in the county is reflected in the Surrey Senior Cup. Sutton as winners with Woking having exited in the second round would be a good season on that measure.

The rivalry between the clubs extends over multiple seasons, indeed decades, and Woking are in the top five of league opponents ever measured by number of games, and one of the few whose rivalry remains regularly tested with the likes of matches against Carshalton, Tooting & Mitcham, Enfield and Hendon consigned to the "very infrequent" category now. This also means we get to see ex-Ambers as opponents. There are several in the current Woking squad for instance, with Harry Beautyman and Chin Okoli (mentioned already) joined in that list by Ollie Sanderson, Aiden O'Brien and Joden Trickett. It's not been unheard of this season that more ex-Sutton players have scored for Woking at the weekend than current Sutton players have scored for us!

That statistic won't hold true this midweek come the end of ninety minutes I hope.





Former York City boss Neal Ardley replaced Michael Doyle in December and inspired a superb turnaround that steered Woking clear of relegation. A former midfielder, Ardley made over 200 appearances for Wimbledon FC in the 1990s during an 11-year spell, before joining Watford in 2002 and adding 111 outings. He later featured for Cardiff City and Millwall prior to retiring in 2007.

Ardley began coaching with Cardiff's academy, helping develop Joe Ralls and Theo Wharton, before returning to lead AFC Wimbledon. In six years, he guided the Dons to League One, winning the 2016 League Two play-off final. After leaving in 2018, he managed Notts County and Solihull Moors, narrowly missing promotion with the latter. A short stint at York followed before he took charge at Woking, where he lost just one of his first 17 games and secured a 15th-place finish.





## THE STOPPER WILL JÄÄSKELÄINEN

Will Jääskeläinen joined Woking in February 2023 to compete with Craig Ross but soon became first choice, starting 14 of the final 15 matches. His performances helped the Cards secure a fourth-place finish in the National League and reach the play-offs for the first time at that level. He was rewarded with a new one-year contract that summer. A Finland youth international, he previously gained extensive Football League experience with Crewe Alexandra, making nearly 100 appearances. He played 35 league games as Crewe finished runners-up in League Two in 2019/20, earning promotion, and added 45 more outings in League One over the next two seasons. A move to AFC Wimbledon followed in 2022 before his switch to the Cards.





## **THE DESTROYER** **CHIN** **OKOLI**

A product of Millwall's academy and gained senior experience on loan, including three National League appearances for Torquay United at the start of the 2022/23 season. He joined Bromley ahead of 2023/24 after a successful trial, making 20 appearances in the first half of the campaign and contributing to the Ravens' historic promotion to League Two. A subsequent loan spell with Sutton saw the defender burst onto the scene, playing every minute of his first six matches and being named September Player of the Month and made nine league appearances before departing. Okoli has since joined Woking permanently, where he now serves as vice-captain.



## **THE PLAYMAKER HARRY BEAUTYMAN**

Harry Beautyman first signed for Sutton in 2011 after leaving Leyton Orient, where he had captained the reserves. Across two seasons he scored 24 goals in 105 games, won the Supporters' Club Player of the Year award and earned England C recognition, before joining Welling United in 2013 prior to stepping into the Football League with Peterborough United a year later. A spell with Northampton Town followed in 2016/17 prior to a move to Stevenage, and he subsequently rejoined Sutton United in January 2018 to make over 200 appearances, scoring more than 50 goals. His 17 goals from midfield in 2019/20 earned him Club Player of the Year, Players' Player of the Year and Supporters' Club Player of the Year, and earned him inclusion in the National League Team of the Season.

After six more years at Sutton, including a promotion and an appearance at Wembley, he made the switch to Woking, where he now serves as club captain.

## 13 | Craig Ross

### Goalkeeper

A Woking academy graduate, Craig Ross returned in September 2018 after a host of spells away in both non-league and the EFL. He went on to enjoy five successful seasons back at the Cards with 198 appearances and sweeping Player of the Season awards in 2019/20 and 2020/21, before returning again after a stint at Maidenhead. He now serves as player/coach.

## 40 | Mikey Verga

### Goalkeeper

Mikey Verga joined the Cards in 2023 from Abbey Rangers, and has gone on to rise through the ranks. A loan move to Westfield in 2024/25 saw him gain senior experience, and he now acts as the club's third choice in between the sticks.

## 2 | Aaron Drewe

### Defender

Aaron Drewe joined Queens Park Rangers at the age of nine, progressing through the youth teams and enjoyed loan spells at Chelmsford City and Oxford City before debuting for QPR in January 2022. He later joined Weymouth on loan before being released, with the defender returning to Oxford to make 37 appearances, including an FA Trophy quarter-final, prior to his move to Woking last summer.

## 3 | Caleb Richards

### Defender

A Blackpool academy graduate, Caleb Richards debuted for the Tangerines in August 2017 before moving to Norwich City in 2018. After several loans, including Tampa Bay Rowdies, he joined Kidderminster permanently in 2021. Over 216 appearances, he won Young Player and Players' Player of the Season as well as helping them secure promotion, before joining Woking.

## 5 | Timi Odusina

### Defender

Timi Odusina progressed through Norwich City's ranks and had a loan spell at AFC Fylde, winning the FA Trophy in 2019. He joined Hartlepool United in 2020, earning promotion via the National League play-offs and Young Player of the Season in 2021/22. After moving to Bradford City in 2022, he joined the Cards permanently in May 2024.

## 14 | Tariq Hinds

### Defender

A Tottenham Hotspur academy graduate, Tariq Hinds left Spurs in February 2021 for Portuguese side Lusitano de Évora before returning to England with Billericay Town in October 2021. He joined Tonbridge Angels in October 2022, making 87 appearances and scoring five goals over two years, before a brief stint at Braintree preceded his switch to Woking.

## 16 | Tunji Akinola

### Defender

A versatile defender, Tunji Akinola joined the Cards in July 2023 after a successful trial. He began at West Ham United, making 33 League Two appearances on loan at Leyton Orient and featuring for the U21s. After 15 years with West Ham, he moved to Partick Thistle, making 45 appearances before joining Woking.

## 33 | Sonny Parkes

### Defender

Sonny Parkes spent time in the AFC Bournemouth youth system before joining Woking in July 2025. Primarily a left back, he has gained experience at Christchurch prior to his move to Surrey, before further loan spells at Hayes & Yeading and Moneyfields alongside his development in Woking's academy.

## 6 | Jamie Andrews

### Midfielder

A West Bromwich Albion academy graduate, Andrews signed a professional contract with the Baggies in July 2021. He had loan spells at Leamington, Yeovil Town and Grimsby Town before making his West Brom first team debut in an FA Cup win over Chesterfield, prior to joining Woking permanently in summer 2024.

## 8 | Dale Gorman

### Midfielder

A Northern Ireland under-21 international, Dale Gorman began his career at Stevenage in 2013, making 71 appearances before joining Leyton Orient in 2018, helping them win promotion. He then played for Glentoran and Yeovil Town, before joining Barnet in 2022, making 87 appearances and captaining the side. He signed for Woking in May 2024 and was named club captain last summer.

## 11 | Matt Ward

### Midfielder

Matt Ward progressed through the Wroxham academy, earning a move to Ipswich after scoring three goals in five games during 2020/21. He debuted for Ipswich in November 2022 and later had loan spells at Derry City and Braintree Town, scoring four goals across both stints, before joining Woking after a successful trial.

## 15 | Roy Syla

### Midfielder

A product of the Barnet academy, Roy Syla had early loans at Kings Langley and Hampton & Richmond Borough before moving to Brentford's B team. He later played for Ayr United in Scotland and had a short spell in Albania with Bylis, before signing for Woking last month. Internationally, he has been capped by Albania from Under-17 level to Under-21 level.

**18 | Jack Turner****Midfielder**

A Southampton academy graduate, Jack Turner signed professionally in July 2021 and debuted for the first team in February 2022. He spent time on loan at Braintree Town, scoring twice in 16 appearances, before joining Queen's Park in June 2023. Over two seasons, he made 90 appearances, scored 18 goals, and starred in a Scottish Cup win over Rangers, before joining Woking last summer.

**23 | Timmy Akinola****Midfielder**

An Arsenal academy graduate, Timmy Akinola spent time at Lincoln City and Huddersfield before joining the Gunners in 2020. Loan spells at Dundee United and Chesterfield, plus stints at Al Bidda and Solihull Moors, preceded his permanent move to Gateshead, where he impressed with tenacity and energy prior to his move to Woking.

**25 | Jake Forster-Caskey****Midfielder**

Jake Forster-Caskey joined Woking with extensive Football League experience. A Brighton & Hove Albion academy graduate, he has made over 200 professional appearances for Brighton, Charlton Athletic, Southend United, and Stevenage.

**10 | Aiden O'Brien****Forward**

A Millwall academy graduate, Aiden O'Brien made over 200 appearances for the club, scoring 44 goals and helping secure League One play-off promotion in 2017. Subsequent spells at Sunderland, Portsmouth, Shrewsbury Town, Gillingham, Sutton and Shelbourne preceded a move to Woking. Internationally, he debuted for the Republic of Ireland in 2018, scoring against Poland, and has picked up five caps.

**19 | Jake Hyde****Forward**

Jake Hyde joined Woking in July 2018, scoring 31 goals in 73 appearances, including memorable strikes against Swindon in the FA Cup and a playoff-winning goal against Wealdstone. After spells at Halifax, Wrexham, Yeovil, and Chelmsford, he has returned to the Cards in his first coaching role, acting as player/S&C coach.

**21 | Josh Kelly****Forward**

A Maidenhead United academy graduate, Josh Kelly scored 39 goals for Walton Casuals in 2017/18 and went on to make over 130 appearances for Maidenhead, including scoring 17 in 41 games in 2021/22. He later impressed at Solihull Moors before joining AFC Wimbledon, helping them gain promotion to League One, before returning to the National League with Woking.

**26 | Joe Gbodé****Forward**

A Gillingham academy product, Joe Gbodé has appeared nearly 50 times for the Gills alongside loans at Margate, Folkestone Invicta, Hastings United, Maidstone United and Aveley. He later joined Luton Town last summer, and departed Bedfordshire for a temporary switch to Woking.

**27 | Louis Flower****Forward**

After starting out at Cambridge United, Louis Flower joined the youth setups at Chelsea and Brighton before moving on loan to Gateshead, playing a handful of times prior to a permanent switch to Crawley Town. He joined Woking on loan earlier this month and scored on his debut.

**30 | Olly Sanderson****Forward**

A Fulham under-9s graduate, Olly Sanderson impressed on loans at Oxford City, Sutton United, Bradford City, and Harrogate Town, scoring regularly in both National League and EFL campaigns, before joining Woking on loan last summer. He is their top scorer with nine goals.

**32 | Joden Trickett****Forward**

Joden Trickett joined Sutton from Harrow Borough's Under-18s, and made a handful of first team appearances in both the National League Cup and the Surrey Senior Cup. A loan at Ashford Town (Middlesex) saw him appear 13 times before joining Woking last summer. He spent three months on loan at Ascot United this season and has recently returned from a loan at Abbey Rangers.

# HISTORIC RAMBLINGS

## Three from the 17th February

Prior to tonight's encounter, SUFC has contested sixteen matches on this date as a senior club (1910), ten of which have been at home. The first was in the South Suburban League (West) in 1912 as U's overcame Fulham St Andrews by 7-3. Of the other seven league matches, U's have won just two and lost four. The victories were notably against Carshalton Athletic (1962 – Athenian) and Darlington (1990 – GMV Conference). The most recent home match was the only draw, 1-1 with Wrexham in 2018. The two cup ties were a 1-0 defeat of Slough Town in an Amateur Cup replay in 1968 and a 2-0 defeat of Redhill in the Surrey Senior (1983), a week after the original game had been abandoned due to snow with Redhill 2-0 up.

Away from Sutton, the six fixtures have produced just two wins and one draw, that at eventual GMVC champions Lincoln City in 1988. The first of the two wins is featured below. The most recent match was a 1-0 reverse at Bradford City in EFL L2 in 2024.

### The Match

War-time football for this evening as, while The Allies continued their push towards Germany, U's took on a Coldstream Guards team in the second leg of the Surrey Senior semi-final. It always amazes me that while the army fought across Europe, a military unit could put a team out to play a football match.

This was in effect a dead rubber, as Sutton led by 6-0 from the first leg and this second tie played at Pirbright saw U's comfortably through to their first County Cup final. The Guards took a fifth minute lead but Bob Ridgewell ended a fine move to fire in the leveller. The same player netted following a goalmouth scramble just before the break and on resumption had a third disallowed for an apparent offside.

Tommy Young registered U's third goal but The Guards, whose attacks were limited by Sutton's dominance, soon reduced the arrears to one goal. Not to be outdone, goal scoring legend Charlie Vaughan scored a fourth for Sutton to take the aggregate to 10-2 and a later date with Tooting & Mitcham United.



## The Player

Scoring and later receiving the second of two yellow cards on this day at Lincoln City in 1988, was Francis Awaritefe. He was a slightly built but lithe attacking player who had started his career at Wimbledon before joining Tooting & Mitcham. While at Sandy Lane, he had gained a reputation for goal scoring and Sutton paid money to sign him in December 1986, his debut coming at Maidstone United on Boxing Day. His first goal came fifteen days later in a home defeat of Boston United and he ended that first season with thirteen goals in nineteen matches. He also won a SSC winners medal as U's defeated tonight's opponents by 4-0.



The following season, Francis continued to impress and was part of the team that reached the FA Cup third round, taking Middlesbrough to extra-time in a replay at Ayresome Park. However, the one issue with Francis was discipline. His first red card came at Macclesfield following an altercation with a home defender. The second at Lincoln came late in the game and while his action was perhaps foolish for a player already on one booking, the vociferous home crowd's reaction did not help matters. However his third, a week later, for landing a punch on Enfield 'keeper Andy Pape who had gathered the ball and was looking to clear was unforgiveable. (I did ask Andy some years later what had prompted Francis' action but he declined to comment.) There was no going back and Francis was dropped to the reserve team and finally went out on loan to Barnet. He left Sutton with twenty-two goals in sixty-two matches. After Sutton, Francis left the UK for Australia and carved out a playing career there and later coached Melbourne Victory. He also became a well-recognised TV pundit.

## The Programme

To 1990 for tonight's prog from the past and the visit of Darlington in the GMV Conference. Sutton's programme was A5 size on glossy paper, comprising forty-four pages; all for 60p. The front cover is iconic as it shows both U's goals scored against Coventry in January 1989. The inside cover displayed adverts for a couple of motor related companies. Page 3 listed club officers and the vast ranks of Vice-Presidents (well over 150 paid up members) while two pages on, Tony Dolbear's Club Chat included a paragraph on the up and coming fixture with Norwich City, one of the Tony Rains/Micky Stephens' testimonial events. Other items in the production included a column by manager Keith Blunt, a very comprehensive GMVC table (Darlington top, Sutton sixteenth), two pages dedicated to the visitors before the middle spread held the teams listing. Another page displayed two photos of Efan Ekoku in action in a recent match against Boston. Results, scorers and line-ups were spread across pages 32 and 33 and the nostalgia piece concentrated on five, ten and twenty years ago.

On page 40, For The Record gave details on recent matches and perhaps the only thing missing from the SUFC programme at this time was match reports. Sponsors Reed Publishing took the back page. Sutton's programme favoured well against its counterparts in the GMVC back then and it's easy to see why.

## **SUFC v Woking**

While matches between U's and The Cards commenced back in the early 1930s, the first league encounter wasn't until December 1963 during Sutton's first season in the Isthmian League. U's won that at Kingfield by 4-0 and five days later, on Boxing Day, won the return by 5-1. At GGL, U's Isthmian record is favourable, Woking winning just four of the twenty-one played, with two draws.

There has only been one Conference South match here and that was an eye-opener for U's as they lost 5-0 on the opening day of the 2011/12 season. At our current level, U's are unbeaten at Sutton winning four and drawing two, with the 6-2 win on New Year's Day 2020 only bettered by a 5-0 success in the IL in October '67.

The draw at Kingfield earlier this season ended a record of four wins for Sutton and two for Cards at this level. In the Isthmian, Sutton won twelve and lost six of the twenty-one matches contested while the only Conference South match ended 4-1 to the hosts giving them fair bragging rights that 2011/12 season, which they ended as champions.

### **U's home record (league only) W19 D4 L5 F67 A31**

Sutton's top goal scorer in league matches with Woking is Legend of the 'Lane Larry Pritchard with seven goals. In more recent times Harry Beautyman leads the way with four league goals; enough for the time being, thank you.

Woking's squad this evening includes the above-mentioned Harry B as well as Chinwike Okoli and Ollie Sanderson, who have of course both appeared on loan for Sutton, along with Aidan O'Brien (and Joden Trickett)

The rest of the list is understandably extensive and includes a number of Sutton legends. Goalkeeper Dave Collyer gave both clubs excellent service from 1970 to the early '80s. Defenders include Gwynne Berry, Alan Cook, John Cooper, Paul Jablonski and the highly popular Micky Preston. In midfield Paul Barrowcliff, Trevor Pearce, Micky Sorensen, Roger Steer and U's former manager Alan Pentecost appear.



# THE DAVID WEIR DIARIES

The latest news from David Weir Leisure Centre; the home of the Sutton Academy and Women's teams.

**Sutton suffered a narrow defeat to high-flying AFC Wimbledon in the EFL Youth Alliance, denied a dramatic last-gasp equaliser by an offside flag as the hosts secured a 12th straight victory.**

It was a tight contest with few clear chances. Sutton's best early opportunity came inside five minutes when Rashaad Drysdale charged down a clearance, allowing Bello to fire against the inside of the post. Drysdale later shot over from range, while Klevis Muca produced a smart low save at the other end. The decisive moment arrived two minutes before half-time when a low cross was bundled in from close range.

Sutton defended resolutely after the break against a prolific Wimbledon side, with Jayden Obarotimi's runs offering occasional threat. In stoppage time, Dan Urpens' long throw led to Bello hooking home, but celebrations were cut short by an offside decision, confirmed before the final whistle.



**A brace from Nadia Sabania wasn't enough as Sutton United Women were knocked out of the Capital Senior Cup following a dramatic second-half comeback by AFC Wimbledon Women at Imperial Field.**

Despite facing opponents two tiers above them, Sutton made a bright start, with Emma Spear twice going close before Sabania headed home against her former club to give the visitors the lead. Sabania then doubled the advantage before half-time with a stunning half-volley that crashed in off the bar, handing Sutton a deserved 2-0 lead at the break. However, Wimbledon responded quickly after the restart, pulling one back before Hincks levelled and then added her

second to complete the turnaround. Goals from Taylor Bell and another from a corner stretched the lead to 5-2. Substitute Eden Clark capitalised on a goalkeeping error to reduce the deficit, but despite late saves from Megan Taylor, Sutton couldn't recover as Wimbledon progressed to the semi-finals.

# CHRIS AGUTTER:

## "We Know The Direction We're Heading"

Chris Agutter said that his Sutton United side are determined to build on the positives of recent performances as they prepare to return to action against Woking, with the mood in the camp described as upbeat despite a frustrating postponement at the weekend.

The U's had been set to travel north to face Hartlepool United, but the fixture was called off shortly before departure. Instead, attention has remained on reinforcing the encouraging signs shown in the midweek draw with Braintree Town.

*"We looked at the Braintree Town game and the positives from that performance. It's about how we can build on that. That was very much the message going into the Hartlepool United game at the weekend.*

*"Despite that game being called off, it's more of the same in terms of building on the best bits of this recent period where we've had one loss in six. It feels like we're getting closer to being on the right track.*

*"It doesn't happen too often, which is fortunate, it impacts the rest of the programme because that game gets moved somewhere else.*

*"In some respects it's quite well received because we've played a lot of games at this time of year. It's a busy schedule, so what little opportunities you get to rest and recover, you try and take – especially after what was a really demanding game in midweek.*

*"But equally it's kicking the can down the road because the game's got to be put in somewhere. We've just got to deal with it, adapt and move forwards."*

A weekend off gave opportunities to other sides to build ground on Sutton, but the bulk of the teams around the drop zone failed to capitalise, with only Brackley Town winning with a 2-1 triumph over Gateshead which saw them jump to 14th. As such, with results elsewhere keeping the bottom half of the table tightly packed, Agutter knows that victories – rather than draws – will be key in the weeks ahead.

*"It's incredibly tight in that bottom half of the table. The fact that pretty much everyone dropped points around us means we're presented with another opportunity."*

*"When games in hand come around, we need to capitalise. If we're drawing games as opposed to winning games, that's two points dropped. There are only a couple of teams who've drawn more games than us this season. We need to convert those draws into wins. If we do that, we'll be in a really healthy position."*

*"It was only really the Boston United game and the Aldershot Town game where we looked at the performance as a whole and thought that's not great. Against Boston there was nothing there. Against Braintree there was plenty. The challenge is to produce the same level of performance with 11 players as what we did with ten in that final period. If we do that, we'll keep winning games and putting points on the board."*

*"The mood within the camp is pretty positive. We've lost one game in six, so we're not on the worst run of form we've seen this season. December and January were annihilated by injuries and suspensions, but now we've got players back and added a few new faces. The Boston game dampened the mood, but we've put that behind us. The vibe in the camp is good and we're looking forward to the next game."*

That next test comes against near neighbours Woking, a side the manager holds in high regard.

*"They're very good. Very well organised and adaptable. The manager has massive experience and has had loads of success – I think his team is a reflection of that."*

*"Depending on the opposition, Woking will change and be flexible in their organisation. It's going to be a tough test. It's close enough to be a derby, so if we needed any more motivation, there's that added incentive."*

*"They are very well organised. When you're prepping for games, you try to pick holes and understand where you can hurt them. Credit to Woking – we're having to look incredibly hard to find gaps."*

*"But if we produce the same level of performance we did against Halifax, Shrewsbury, Forest Green, Hartlepool in the first half, and the final 20 minutes against Braintree, then it doesn't matter what the opposition are doing."*

*"When this group are fully committed, playing with intensity, energy and enthusiasm, we've got a hell of a chance of winning. On their day, they can beat anyone in the league."*
