TIM TALKS

We welcome this afternoon's visitors to the VBS Community Stadium, Wealdstone, who have the opportunity to do the double over us this season following our away fixture at the end of October.

One of the weirder afternoons at the club, and an introduction to Chris of how far from perfect we were. A delayed kick off due to a club oversight (agreed with the referee), a dominant first half that might have seen us four or five goals up but ended with us just 2-1 ahead following a mistake from an otherwise untroubled novice goalkeeper in on loan, followed by a second half where only one team turned up. Probably over the two halves 80% of the action took place "down the other end" from the perspective of the away supporters, who went home head-scratching in bewilderment at the 4 - 2 loss they had just witnessed.

The oversight that day won't be repeated this afternoon for sure, but with Jack Sims injured on Tuesday, Chris Haigh sent off and consequently suspended, and Tuesday's forced replacement coming off the bench with an injury in David Azaiya, could it be a novice goalkeeper between the sticks? That crazy afternoon can't be repeated...

For two games running our team has shown absolute commitment and a good measure of great football. Whatever was behind the Boston and Brackley performances has hopefully been extinguished and we have discovered precisely what the supporters want to see. An added time equaliser, and a hitherto absent defensive powerhouse display, both when down to ten men, have shown both our quality and the desire needed to climb this division's tight table. **I guess it's down to Chris now to pick his ten men and decide who is to be sacrificed, and when, for an afternoon banished to the changing room by the referee.**

Looking at the form table we have one loss in six, with the visitors one win in six. That came from a win over Woking, our most recent opponents. A four point gap could be narrowed to just a single point this afternoon with a home win. With our visitors currently in 16th spot we would be just behind them, and with Woking in 12th playing the table toppers a potential loss for them would have all three clubs closely packed enough that come this week's midweek fixtures the positions could be reversed. It's that close a division at the moment. From relegation to mid table in the space of ten days.

Wealdstone, like Woking, are a side we have played so many times. Over 100 in fact, of which Sutton have won nearly half, dating back to 1928. That sounds like a successful century of rivalry to me. Yet I would say today, a single scrappy goal in the last minute securing three points would still tick the box regardless of that past for most, me included. Looking at some of the scores though, including 7 – 1 wins, 6 – 4 and 6 – 3 victories, and a number of five, four and three goal margins too suggests there is a propensity for high scoring, and one sided, matches that would be enjoyed more than a late one – nil. In recent times the televised away fixture in our promotion season ending in a last gasp 3 – 3 draw and point (another match in which we could have been five goals up at halftime yet forgot how to play football in the second period) reflects another exciting example the neutral would be salivating at if repeated this afternoon.



Former Tottenham Hotspur midfielder Sam Cox has returned to Grosvenor Vale for his second spell, taking permanent charge of Wealdstone.

The 35-year-old only retired in 2023, ending a 14-year career that began in Spurs' Academy after trials with Watford and Arsenal. Loan spells at Cheltenham Town, Histon and Torquay United preceded a permanent move to Barnet. Cox later starred for Boreham Wood, earning Player of the Season and captaining them to promotion, before spells at Hayes & Yeading United and Wealdstone, where he won multiple supporter awards. While playing, he began coaching Spurs' youth sides.

Further appearances for Hampton & Richmond Borough, Braintree Town and Welling United followed. After serving as interim boss and securing survival, plus a short spell at Oxford City, Cox now leads the Stones permanently.



THE STOPPER
DANTE
BAPTISTE

Dante Baptiste began his career in the youth setups at Norwich City and later Watford, starring for Watford's under-18s in the FA Youth Cup. While at Watford he had loan spells with Hendon and Farnborough to gain senior experience before signing for Wealdstone in 2022, and during his early time there spent periods on loan at Chesham United and Bracknell Town. At Wealdstone he has established himself as a regular first team goalkeeper in the National League, known for his shot-stopping, and has made 29 appearances this season.

THE PLAYMAKER **NATHAN** **TSHIKUNA**

Nathan Tshikuna has established himself as a National League midfielder and is currently Wealdstone's joint top scorer since joining last summer. He worked his way up the English football pyramid with spells at Aylesbury United, Bedford Town, and AFC Rushden & Diamonds before joining Tamworth in 2023. At Tamworth, he scored nine goals in 42 appearances, helping them win the 2023/24 National League North title and featuring in their Emirates FA Cup Third Round tie against Tottenham Hotspur. After a brief stint at Eastleigh, Tshikuna moved to Wealdstone, scoring five goals in 29 appearances and cementing his role as a key, dynamic midfielder.

MICAH
OBIERO

Micah Obiero began his career in the academy at Leyton Orient and also spent time at the XYZ Academy before joining Huddersfield Town's youth setup, where he turned professional in 2018. He made his senior debut for Huddersfield in 2020 and had loan spells with Carlisle United and FC Halifax Town during the 2020/21 season.

In July 2022, Obiero signed for Boston United in the National League North before moving to Wealdstone in October 2022. At Wealdstone, he has established himself as a regular forward in the National League, contributing 22 goals in over 150 games as well as earning two contract extensions in 2023 and 2025.

13 | Endurance Johnson

Goalkeeper

Endurance Johnson began his career in the development squad at Brentford before joining Colchester United's youth setup. He moved into senior football with Hampton & Richmond Borough in 2022, spending much of that season on loan at Sutton Common Rovers before joining Wealdstone in August 2025.

2 | Jack Cook

Defender

Jack Cook began his career at Charlton Athletic's youth system before moving to Woking, where he won promotion in 2019. He joined Wealdstone in 2021 and has become a key member of the backline, with their club captain potentially making his 200th appearance this afternoon.

3 | Anthony Georgiou

Defender

Anthony Georgiou began his career in the academy at Tottenham Hotspur, progressing to the senior squad and gaining experience on loan at Levante B, Ipswich Town and Bolton Wanderers. He later joined AEO Limassol before moving to Leyton Orient, playing a handful of times before making the switch to Yeovil Town on loan. He later joined Enosis Neon Paralimni prior to his return to England with Wealdstone in 2024, where he has appeared 75 times.

5 | Deonysus Woodman

Defender

Deonysus Woodman began his career in the academy at Queens Park Rangers before moving into senior football with loans at Dulwich Hamlet, Wealdstone, Southend United and St. Albans City. He returned to the Stones on loan last summer and has appeared 25 times this season.

6 | Mason Barrett

Defender

Mason Barrett began his career in the academy at West Ham United and later Watford, progressing through the youth ranks with the Hornets before making his senior debut in an FA Cup tie against Tranmere Rovers. He joined Wealdstone in 2022 where he has appeared 55 times, before joining Farnborough on a 28-day loan last month.

16 | Moussa Diarra

Defender

Moussa Diarra began his career in France with OSC Élancourt before moving into English football, with spells at Horley, St. Albans, Hemel Hempstead, Hampton & Richmond, Barrow, Woking, Havant & Waterlooville, Barnet, Dartford and Eastbourne, prior to his move to Wealdstone in 2025.

22 | Connor McAvoy

Defender

Connor McAvoy began his career in the academy at Fulham before gaining senior experience on loan at Wealdstone, with two spells either side of a stint in Scotland with Partick Thistle and Ayr United. A Scotland youth international, he joined the Stones permanently in 2025.

29 | Junior Tiensia

Defender

A Millwall academy product, Junior Tiensia joined Havant & Waterlooville, Sutton, Dover and Dartford on loan before departing The Den permanently. Stints at Gloucester City, Solihull Moors and Barrow preceded a move to Wealdstone last summer.

30 | Joshua Clay

Defender

A former Crawley Town defender, Joshua Clay has since progressed through the ranks at Wealdstone and made his senior debut for the club in a National League Cup match against Nottingham Forest, before following it up with his second appearance against West Brom.

31 | Charlie Waller

Defender

MK Dons defender Charlie Waller captained the U18s and debuted in the EFL Trophy for the Dons, before enjoying a successful loan at Sutton last season. He subsequently joined Rochdale, and now Wealdstone, for the remainder of the season. He has previously spent time at AFC Rushden & Diamonds, Billericay, and Banbury.

4 | Omar Mussa

Midfielder

Belgium-born midfielder Omar Mussa began his career with his native KV Mechelen before signing for Walsall in 2019. He later turned out for Dover, Weymouth, Dagenham and Torquay before signing for Wealdstone last summer. Internationally, he has represented Belgium at Under-18 level and Burundi at senior level.

8 | Dylan Kadji

Midfielder

Highly-rated midfielder Dylan Kadji came through at Bristol City, where he appeared twice, whilst gaining senior experience on loan at Bath, Swindon, Forest Green and Aldershot, before joining Weston-super-Mare on a permanent basis. He has appeared 19 times for Wealdstone after signing last summer.



11 | Sakariya Hassan

Midfielder

Netherlands-born midfielder Sak Hassan came through the ranks at Leyton Orient, Queens Park Rangers and Tottenham Hotspur before dropping into non-league with Saffron Walden Town. He rose through the pyramid with spells at Springfield, Hornchurch, Tower Hamlets, Redbridge, Barking and Sudbury before getting his break at Hashtag United, and subsequently his move to Wealdstone. Internationally, he represents Somalia.

18 | Kieran Petrie

Midfielder

Former Swansea City midfielder Kieran Petrie joined Queens Park Rangers in 2022, spending three years at Loftus Road before joining Wealdstone in November. He later joined St. Albans City on loan.

23 | Terrell Agyemang

Midfielder

After starting out at Charlton, Terrell Agyemang joined Manchester City prior to a move to Middlesbrough, and was followed by loans at Hartlepool United and Airdrieonians in Scotland. He joined Morecambe permanently last summer, but made a loan switch to Wealdstone two months later.

24 | Shay Spencer

Midfielder

Reading academy product Shay Spencer embarked on his first senior loan with a move to Wealdstone in January. He previously made his first team debut for the Royals in a 3-1 win over West Ham United in the EFL Trophy, before appearing in the league against Crawley Town, prior to signing a contract extension.

28 | Elijah Dixon-Bonner

Midfielder

Formerly of Arsenal and Liverpool, Elijah Dixon-Bonner got his first team break with a move to Queens Park Rangers, where he has appeared 28 times. He has since embarked on loans at Västerås SK, Morecambe and now Wealdstone. Internationally, he has represented England at youth level.

7 | Enzo Boldewijn

Midfielder

While suspended this afternoon, Sutton fans will have fond memories of Enzo Boldewijn. The Dutchman enjoyed his early career in his homeland with SC Voorland, SV Almere, Utrecht, Den Bosch and Almere City before moving to England with Crawley Town. A three-year spell at Notts County preceded a move to Sutton, where he appeared almost 100 times, before joining Wealdstone after a stint at Eastleigh.

9 | Olufela Olomola

Forward

Olufela Olomola came through the ranks at Arsenal and Southampton before opting for a path in the lower leagues. Spells at Yeovil, Scunthorpe, Carlisle and Hartlepool preceded his first stint at Wealdstone, with his form earning him a move back into League Two with Bromley, before returning to North London last summer.

12 | Michael Adu-Poku

Forward

Highly-rated forward Michael Adu-Poku has risen through the ranks at Watford, and made his senior debut in an FA Cup against Reading after signing at Under-13 level. He has since embarked on senior loans at Kings Langley, Maidstone, Solihull, Rochdale, Barrow and now Wealdstone, with his spell with the latter being extended until the end of the season.

17 | Dominic Hutchinson

Forward

Dom Hutchinson began his career in the academy at Watford and spent time on loan at Eastbourne Borough before joining Wealdstone in 2022. Further loans at Slough Town and St Albans City preceded a resurgence within the Stones' first team, and has appeared more than 50 times in total.

21 | Jeffrey Sekyere

Forward

Belgian winger Jeffrey Sekyere joined Wealdstone in December 2024 from Rupel Boom. He has appeared four times for the club, including once against Sutton last season, before joining Leverstock Green on loan.

26 | Marcus Day

Forward

Bristol City academy graduate Marcus Day made the switch to Wales with Barry Town where he appeared 31 times, before spells at Taunton Town and Frome Town preceded a move to Wealdstone last summer.

27 | Sean Adarkwa

Forward

After rising through the youth setup at West Ham United, Sean Adarkwa joined Queens Park Rangers before joining Maidstone on loan, prior to a permanent exit from Loftus Road. He subsequently joined Arbroath and later Wealdstone in 2023.

HISTORIC RAMBLINGS

Three from the 21st February

This afternoon is the seventeenth fixture U's have played as a senior club on this day. The first was in the South Suburban League (West) in 1914, U's losing to Croydon by 2-0. This was a totally separate club to the existing Croydon. The second played at home is featured below. That was the first of seven home matches the first six of which ended in victory, the spoiler being a 0-0 draw with Northwood in the Isthmian League in 2004.

Including the 1914 match, U's have played nine away matches, the last three ending positively. Before that the previous six had yielded just two draws with the heaviest defeat coming at Enfield in 1959 in the Athenian League, Sutton losing by 6-1.

The Match

All the way back to 1920 for today's match and the visit of British Motor Colts FC in the South Suburban League (West) played at The Adult Ground (GGL). A strong wind blew diagonally across the ground and as a result the match was not the best. BMC at one stage found themselves down to nine men as they picked up a couple of injuries, one of which ended the unlucky player's participation.


BMC had the advantage of the wind in the first half and started well scoring an early goal. The Cabbies 'keeper then saved well from A Davis before W Ladbrook levelled with a strong shot after W Smith had seen his effort saved.

Level at the break but with wind advantage, Sutton set about the visitors and, following a scramble in which BMC lost a defender to injury, Davis scored. Having already lost one player this reduced BMC to nine men and U's took full advantage. Davis headed in from a fine J Weaver cross and the latter scored the hosts' fourth following a corner. In the last minute, with BMC now restored to ten men, Weaver, well, weaved his way through to fire home U's fifth goal.

This wasn't one of Sutton's better performances and they perhaps were fortunate with regards to BMC's numerical disadvantage but the result kept them in the hunt for the title; an eventually fruitless chase as Tooting Town won all of their twenty SSL(W) matches that season.

The Player


Today's pick was playing on this day in 1970 for Sutton against Corinthian-Casuals in the Isthmian League at centre-forward. Trevor Waughman was signed by Sid Cann in the summer of '69 (I think there's a song title there) after impressing for Woking. He had started at Chelsea as a junior and then played for Lion Sports, a Surrey Senior League side. Trevor scored on his first start for Sutton, a pre-season friendly with a Charlton Athletic XI and then repeated the feat on his competitive debut in a 5-0 thrashing of Ilford in the IL. Trevor exhibited his versatility playing at c-f, inside right and on the right flank and played in the first two rounds of the FA Cup at Dagenham and Barnet. However, he lost his place to the returning Micky Mellows (not helped by a run of sixteen matches without scoring) and was unused substitute when U's hosted Leeds United in the fourth round. By the end of the season, he had scored eight goals in 48 appearances but did feature in the Surrey Senior Final, U's defeating Walton & Hersham by 4-0 in a replay. The following season with Mellows gone, Trevor only missed one match all season but the goal tally was still unremarkable compared to the likes of Trevor Bladon and Peter Drabwell. However, during the 1970/71 season he represented the FA and was called up for the GB Olympic training squad. U's missed out on the Isthmian title to Wycombe Wanderers by one point that season.



The following campaign, Trevor signed for Wycombe Wanderers and then joined Kingstonian, playing for his former Sutton skipper Ted Powell. He returned to Woking for the '74/5 season and then back to K's before moving on to Hampton, Farnborough, Hampton and Farnborough again, featuring in the team that knocked U's out of the London Senior Cup in 1982. While at Sutton Trevor made 104 appearances, scoring 22 goals.

The Programme

The mid-90s and a midweek trip to the south coast for an Isthmian Full Members Cup tie (details shown on front cover below). The glossy cover protected a 36 page programme on matt paper. The inside cover gave comprehensive club info (officials etc) and club honours including the Littlehampton Hospital Cup in 1930 and 1934 (there's no such building here now). Editor's Notebook was on page three followed by SUFC club history across two pages and then two pages of pen pics separated by two pages of adverts including Bike-A-Cycle Workshop. A look back on matches on the 21st February in 1970, 1986 and 1991 was followed by a full page advert for Reynolds & Co Furnishers Ltd, BRT's main sponsor. Statistics and a non-league round up before the middle spread showing fixtures and results with the line ups. Also listed was the IFMC sponsored by Carlton sponsorship awards. £3k on offer to the winners and that would end up in Sutton's coffers. The content perhaps lessened in the second half of the programme with a number of tables including a form guide for both Premier and First

Divisions of the IL. With U's second in the former and BRT lower mid-table in the latter an expected comfortable ride for United, but extra-time was needed to win the tie. A decent effort, Bognor's issues were always well worth the money and it is quite sad to see the Nyewood Lane club now languishing in Step 4 football especially for the brilliant Jack Pearce.

SUFC v Wealdstone

U's and 'Stones go back a long way, meeting each other for the first time in the 1928/29 season in the Athenian League. Sutton did the double that season, Wealdstone having to wait until '36/37 to return the compliment. The two clubs met fifty-eight times in the AL United winning twenty-eight, 'Stones twenty. The first Isthmian League encounters were in the 1964/5 season, Sutton winning at home and drawing away. That rivalry lasted just seven seasons as Wealdstone turned semi-pro and joined the Southern League for the 1971/2 season and the two clubs didn't meet in league competition again until the 1986/87 term in the GMV Conference. Wealdstone's relegation restricted that cameo to just six matches, with both sides winning once at home and the other four drawn.

Sutton's relegation back to the Isthmian brought the two sides together in league football again for the 2008/9 campaign and since then we have met as Isthmians and at Conference/National League South and, as today, National League levels. Sutton's biggest win here was in February 1935, 7-1 in the AL, Wealdstone's 5-2 in Feb '56. Matches between the two sides in recent years have often been decided by very late goals, particularly in the early years of Paul Doswell's time as Sutton manager. Last season Sutton were perhaps fortunate to win by 1-0 at Grosvenor Vale while the match here finished 2-2.

U's home record (league only) W22 D12 L11 F105 A72

Sutton's top goal scorer in league matches with Wealdstone is Basil Solly who scored seven times during the 1930s.

We should welcome back this afternoon the highly likeable and current 'Stones' skipper Enzo Boldewijn, although if he is here he will be looking on from the stands following an uncharacteristic dismissal last Saturday, along with Charlie Waller, who spectacularly scored our winner at Wealdstone on his debut early last season and has recently moved to Grosvenor Vale, again on loan from MK Dons. Others to have played for both clubs include goalkeepers Ken Addai and Alan Thomas and defenders Paul Benning, Tony McGuinness, Gerry Olson, Steve Smart and Billy Hawes. Midfielders include the late Steve Browne and John Wall; the latter featured in a recent programme for his long stint as reserve team manager at GGL. Attacking players Bradley Hudson-Odoi, Bernard Bryant, Steve Galloway, Dave Pearce, Simon Quail, Richard Jolly and more recently Henry Sandat also wore the colours of both clubs.

Dillon De Silva (currently on loan with Maidenhead United) is another of the current players with links to the two clubs while Lewis Simper had a spell on loan at Wealdstone while with Cambridge United. Alan Gane, of course, managed both clubs. Another name who also should be listed is 'keeper Chris Vagg, who, like Enzo, will also be watching from the stands.

THE DAVID WEIR DIARIES

The latest news from David Weir Leisure Centre; the home of the Sutton Academy and Women's teams.

A powerful second half performance, making the most of the conditions, saw Sutton storm in to the semi finals of the National League Academy Cup against South Division leaders Southend, who had also recently reached the fourth round of the FA Youth Cup.

After trailing 1-0 at half-time while playing into the wind, Sutton U's produced a dominant second-half display to win 4-1. Rashaad Drysdale and Bobby Sheargold each scored twice, with Sheargold coming on for the injured Jayden Obarotimi. Keeper Klevis Muca made several fine saves, but Nikolay Zlatev gave Southend the lead before the break. Drysdale equalised soon after half-time and later blasted home his second. Sheargold put Sutton ahead with a composed finish, then sealed victory late on after a defensive error. The win completed a hat-trick of 4-1 League Cup victories and sends Sutton to a semi-final at Slough, while Chester host FC Halifax Town in the other tie.



A brace from Nadia Sabania wasn't enough as Sutton United Women were knocked out of the Capital Senior Cup following a dramatic second-half comeback by AFC Wimbledon Women at Imperial Field.

Despite facing opponents two tiers above them, Sutton made a bright start, with Emma Spear twice going close before Sabania headed home against her former club to give the visitors the lead. Sabania then doubled the advantage before half-time with a stunning half-volley that crashed in off the bar, handing Sutton a deserved 2-0 lead at the break. However, Wimbledon responded quickly after the restart, pulling one back before Hincks levelled and then added her second to complete the turnaround. Goals from Taylor Bell and another from a corner stretched the lead to 5-2. Substitute Eden Clark capitalised on a goalkeeping error to reduce the deficit, but despite late saves from Megan Taylor, Sutton couldn't recover as Wimbledon progressed to the semi-finals.

"It's A Really Proud Moment For Me"

Lewis Simper hailed the importance of Sutton's 2-1 win over Woking, as well as citing pride in his own journey during his time in South London, having completed his 100th U's appearance since signing from Cambridge United last season.

Chris Agutter's side secured a vital home victory to boost their survival hopes, as goals from Kai Jennings and Brandon Njoku either side of a Jack Turner leveller sealed an invaluable triumph at the VBS Community Stadium.

The win, which came despite being reduced to ten men in the first half, was described as a long-awaited breakthrough on home soil after a battling display in front of the Sutton faithful.

"Yeah, really important win," he said. "It's been a bit of a long time coming, especially here at home winning the game. Really, really proud of the boys digging in. It's a massive three points."

The evening also marked a personal milestone, with Simper's hundredth appearance being a landmark he admitted meant a great deal, especially coming amidst a crucial win with the U's locked in a tight battle towards the bottom end of the table.

"It's a really proud moment for me," he reflected. "I came here to try to play as many games as I can and to reach that milestone is huge – and to do it at this club is even better. So yeah, I'm really enjoying my time here."

"I think the last 15 minutes against Braintree Town was really important for us, and we've taken that into tonight. So yeah, let's just keep this going."


As mentioned, that late spell at Braintree, where Sutton impressed with ten men, proved useful preparation when Chris Haigh was shown a red card before the break, giving Sutton the task of defending a narrow lead throughout the entire second half.

Simper said that the result provides renewed belief for Sutton as they look to build momentum, with confidence growing after a resilient and disciplined performance.

"I think maybe the Braintree game was a really good experience for us because we knew how good we were with ten men in that game," he explained.

"So when we had the 2-1 lead, it was about keeping going, keeping believing and sticking together – and we came out on top."

This last week has been a pivotal one in the race for the title and the battle to avoid relegation, with significant results and performances across the National League.

Despite going back to the top of the division in midweek, it is two draws on the bounce for Rochdale. Jim McNulty's side failed to gain maximum points in either game despite having thirty-seven attempts on goal across the two games. 1-1 draws at Yeovil and at home to Scunthorpe have seen their lead at the top of the table cut to one point. Dale find themselves on a nine-game unbeaten run with a home game against our Tuesday night opponents, Woking, today.



For Scunthorpe, they put behind a shocking 6-3 defeat at home to local rivals Boston from last weekend. The Pilgrims were 3-0 up after twenty-three minutes, and despite a Callum Roberts brace, the away side secured a fourth win on the bounce thanks to a Tom Cursons hat-trick. The treble took his total to five goals in three games since joining from Harrogate at the end of January.



York made light work of today's opponents, Wealdstone, in a 3-0 win at Grosvenor Vale. Morgan Williams, Zak Johnson, and Daniel Batty all scored their first goals for the Minstermen to give them the three points and extend their unbeaten run to twenty-one games. The Stones had former U's winger Enzo Boldewijn sent off in the second half, and he will now miss today's game after the midweek postponement for their game against Hartlepool.



Carlisle made it back-to-back wins against fellow playoff chasers as they triumphed 3-1 against Forest Green at the New Lawn. Three goals inside eighteen first-half minutes took the game beyond Robbie Savage's side, with the third an outstanding solo goal from our former attacker David Ajiboye. The Gloucestershire side find themselves on a run of one win in their last eight games and will need to get something from today's clash against another top-seven rival, Boreham Wood.



Luke Garrard's side come into the fixture two points ahead of their play-off rivals after a 2-2 draw at Eastleigh last time out. Despite coming from behind to lead 2-1 at half-time, Jake Tabor grabbed his first goal for the Spitfires to draw them level and take a point. The point has left the Hertfordshire side with one win in their last six games, albeit with games in hand on a number of the sides around them.



Southend managed to keep up the pressure on those sides in the play-offs with a 5-1 win at home to Morecambe. There were five different scorers for the Essex side, with Gus Scott-Morriss opening the scoring with his fifth goal in eight games. Harry Boyes, Andy Dallas, Josh Walker and Tom Hopper all got on the scoresheet to give Kevin Maher's side a first win in four in the league. The defeat left Morecambe without a win in ten games in all competitions and nine points adrift of safety, having played a game more than the majority of those in the relegation battle.



Despite sitting two points outside of the play-off places, Southend will be confident that they can break into them soon, given the form of Halifax. Will Harris bagged his sixteenth goal of the league campaign in the eighty-eighth minute to secure a 1-0 win over struggling Truro. Despite this victory, the Shaymen were brought back down to earth in midweek after a 2-1 defeat to bottom of the table Gateshead. Goals from Kenton Richardson and Mark Beck left the Yorkshire side with one win in six games in all competitions for the Yorkshire side. For the Heed, they managed to end a run of seventeen defeats on the bounce and secured their first league win since the 30th of September. If they are to have any chance of pulling off the great escape, they will likely have to pick up three points on their trip to Truro in the 17:30 game today.



Our midweek victory over Woking saw Braintree slip back into the relegation zone. The Iron picked up their sixth 0-0 draw of the season last weekend at home to Solihull Moors.



Aldershot managed to extend their unbeaten run to five matches over the last week. Charlie Warren scored a stoppage-time equaliser in a 1-1 draw at Tamworth last weekend. The Shots followed this up with a dominant display in a 2-1 win at Yeovil in midweek. Goals from Oliver Scott and Sean Patton, either side of Terrell Works' equaliser, meant that John Coleman's side have picked up twenty-three points from their previous ten games. Their points total is only bettered by York during the same time frame.



On the managerial front, Brackley Town have appointed Andy Whing as their new manager having seen Gavin Cowan depart for Shrewsbury at the end of January. Whing joins the Saints having been dismissed from his position at Barrow in December after winning 32.6% of his games during his time at Holker Street.








"I'm Pleased To Be Building Momentum"

Chris Agutter is relishing the chance to build further momentum as Sutton prepare for another crucial home fixture in the Enterprise National League.

The U's host Wealdstone this afternoon, and have the opportunity to make it two wins in a row after beating Woking on Tuesday night.

The upcoming encounter also marks another chance to continue their strong home record, and the Head Coach remains determined to turn the VBS Community Stadium into a fortress, with just one defeat at home in 90 minutes since taking charge.

"I'm pleased to be building momentum. One loss in seven, so it feels like we're back on the right track after a difficult December. Really pleased with where the players are at, really pleased with what we've seen, especially in the last week."

"We always said we want it to be a fortress for us and somewhere we can really cash in in terms of points. I think we're getting closer to that."

"Obviously you want to win every game at home, you want to win every game in general, but one loss in however many games at home is a positive record. We want to preserve that, build on it and improve it."

The mood in camp has remained high following the midweek victory over Woking, as goals from Kai Jennings and Brandon Njoku set the U's on their way to a first league win in nearly a month, but one that saw them continue a positive streak that includes just one defeat their previous seven games in all competitions.

"In the lead-up to the Woking game itself the mood had been really positive anyway. It's only really the Boston game in recent weeks where we fell short of expectations and the standards that we've set."

"In the main, bar Boston, we've been really good and we've been picking up points. Winning in that fashion, backs against the wall as well, ten men etc, in front of our home support, it adds even more emotion to the situation. That type of emotion is what you do it for and it can't not help build what is already a very good morale amongst the group."

Looking ahead to the visit of Wealdstone, Agutter said he expects a stern test, but one that will be a positive one for the neutral due to a clash of similar styles.

"They're one of the best possession-based sides in the league. Really nice brand of football. From a defensive perspective they're aggressive, front foot, they try and counter-press."

"A nice variety as well, similar to Woking in terms of set-up and shape, but generally, regardless of the shape and set-up, the behaviours of the team are pretty consistent. They try to dominate the football and when they haven't got it they try to get it back, as basic as that sounds. Very good from set pieces, well organised, very well coached. I think Sam [Cox] and his staff have done a brilliant job there."

"It should be a really good game for the neutral – two teams that want the football, two teams that are stubborn in their beliefs of how they want to go about it. That could lead to a really decent encounter."

The boss added that he believes the key battle will revolve around intensity and aggression.

"I find with teams that play similar styles it can often be who wins the battle, who wins the fight, who comes out on top in the first and second balls and in the duels. That's the platform for the nicer stuff and the bits both teams want to do. Without labouring the point, we'll continue to double down on wanting to be aggressive and combative against the ball."

Wealdstone have notably dropped from 11th to 16th in the span of just two games, something that epitomises the closeness within the division. With the table tightly packed, the opportunity to climb with back-to-back victories is clear, and with three successive home games on the horizon, the Sutton boss once again highlighted the importance of the supporters.

"It's really tight, really competitive. If you can string back-to-back wins together you can jump four or five places, especially with games in hand as well."

"That's why we haven't got hung up on the league table because we've got games in hand and other than that December period we've always picked up points. We know it's an opportunity with back-to-back wins to climb and get closer to the position in the table that we want to be."

"I thought they [the fans] were brilliant on Tuesday night. When we went down to ten men, the energy in the place went up a level – two or three notches. So more of the same. If we get that, it gives us even more of a chance to put another three points on the board and continue to climb the table."
