CHRIS' COLUMN



TIM TALKS

We welcome this afternoon's visitors to the VBS Community Stadium, Morecambe, who have sadly followed our trajectory having been relegated to the National League from the EFL.

For us it was a brief three-year stay having peaked in League Two. Our guests however have seen a somewhat different trajectory, joining the Football League proper in 2007 via the play-offs, they achieved promotion to League One in 2021, also via the play-offs, and at that time somewhat remarkably had never been relegated in their history! Those dizzy heights lasted just two seasons however, since when a double relegation sees them competing with us once more in the National League. Indeed such is their current position a triple relegation is a distinct possibility. Only in the last few games has their form suggested they are not certain for the drop.

Today also represents the match this season where we demonstrate our association with Her Game Too, who are the leading promoters for gender inclusivity in sport in the country. I am blessed to be working in this fabulous and interesting industry, and I am fortunate to see first hand the contributions made by women at this club, and across the world of football. We no longer have a female on our board (sadly), but I feel our club from top to bottom is one of meritocracy, and one where gender is irrelevant compared to skill sets and experience in our recruitment and employment. Our list of club officials in this programme demonstrates this in practice, and that extends across our staffing too.

When I look through the various contacts across other clubs, in the league handbook(s), or in my phone directly, I am pleased to see the numbers increasing it seems each year, and I can genuinely count as good friends many women in football since starting my job here at Sutton. We are part of a genuinely diverse community, but one where work still carries on. It will be a good day when the need for publicity, and the existence of the likes of Her Game Too, disappears as no longer being needed or relevant.

Culture takes a long time to change, and the direction of travel is obvious, but as you look across the terraces this afternoon, no doubt they look different from how they were previously, and certainly in my case of nearly fifty years ago. But as a club we are genuine in wanting more and more supporters attending our fixtures. Whilst we are working hard in delivering that we can't do so alone, and seek your help. In doing so we ask you to consider: where are the sisters, aunties, daughters, mothers...? Football is becoming a family day out, it's not an opportunity for one (or two) of the family to "escape".

Whilst we have mentioned Morecambe's upturn in form above, they are in the top half of the form table in 11th with a remarkable symmetrical two wins, two draws, two losses, fourteen goals scored and fourteen goals conceded in the last six games – we are in 6th place ourselves. Were it not for a mad ten minutes in Yeovil we could have collected seven points from the three tricky away ties we faced, and instead of having eleven points in the form table we would be at fourteen, and in 2nd place only bettered by York City in the last six matches. That improvement always looked a possibility but few predicted our rise up the table in such fashion a month ago. Indeed some appeared to be predicting – even relishing – our potential relegation. We are still some way from that oft quoted safety mark of securing 50 points, but today's "six-pointer" could do much to deliver a degree of comfort around reaching that mark – and condemn our guests to ever greater difficulty in reaching safety. With fixtures to come against Gateshead and Truro it is very much in our hands how those potential nine points are decided. Let's secure the first three of those this afternoon!





Jim Bentley returned to Morecambe in February 2026, replacing Ashvir Singh Johal in the hotseat the Mazuma Mobile Stadium.

Born in Liverpool in 1976, he began his playing career with Manchester City before establishing himself in the lower leagues with Telford United, before becoming most closely associated with Morecambe, where he made over 300 appearances across all competitions and served as club captain.

After retiring as a player in 2011, he moved into management with Morecambe, leading the club for nearly a decade and guiding them to promotion from League Two via the 2021 play-offs. He later managed AFC Fylde and had a brief spell at Rochdale, before returning to the Shrimps in February after seven years away.

Miguel Azeez joined Arsenal at the age of five and signed his first professional contract in September 2019, before making his senior debut in a UEFA Europa League win over Dundalk, replacing Joe Willock.

He subsequently gained loan experience with Portsmouth, UD Ibiza and Wigan before leaving Arsenal permanently in 2024. He then joined Atlético Baleares, later moving to PAS Giannina for 2024/25. After spells across Europe, Azeez returned home with Morecambe in August 2025.

Jack Nolan began his career in the academy at Reading and became a regular in the Royals' Under-18 side from the age of 15, before joining Walsall in 2020. He made his senior professional debut with the Saddlers and went on to play a handful of times for the club, before spending three years at Accrington Stanley.

He went on to appear more than 50 times for the 'Owd Reds, but departed Lancashire for Gillingham in 2024, before dropping into non-league with Morecambe back in September. He is the Shrimps' top scorer this term with ten goals.

CHRIS
POPOV

Wales youth international Chrirs Popov has got off to a superb start to life at Morecambe, scoring six goals since signing for the Shrimps on loan.

Having begun his career in the renowned Manchester United academy, Popov joined Leicester City in 2021 and graduated into the first team after three years, making his senior debut in a 4-0 EFL Cup win over Tranmere Rovers. He later joined Barrow on loan, spending the 2024/25 campaign in Cumbria, before making the switch to Morecambe in February until the end of the season.

Internationally, he has appeared for Wales from Under-18 to Under-21 level, though he is also eligible to play for Bulgaria.

25 | Alfie Scales

Goalkeeper

Morecambe academy graduate Alfie Scales has risen from Under-18 level to the first team at the Mazuma Mobile Stadium, and spent time on loan at Tadcaster earlier this season.

40 | Jamal Blackburn

Goalkeeper

Former Chelsea goalkeeper Jamal Blackburn spent 15 years at Stamford Bridge, primarily spending time out on loan at Middlesbrough, Östersunds, Wycombe, Sheffield United, Leeds, Vitesse, Bristol Rovers and Rotherham. After departing West London in 2021, he spent time at LAFC before joining Huddersfield, Exeter, Burton, Shrewsbury and now Morecambe.

41 | Myles Boney

Goalkeeper

Myles Boney began his career at his hometown club Blackpool, appearing twice for the Tangerines across five years there, and otherwise spent time out on loan at Nantwich, Solihull and South Shields. After joining the Mariners permanently, he appeared over 150 times in the North-East, becoming a regular barring a loan stint at Darlington, before moving onto Matlock Town and now Morecambe.

2 | Lewis Payne

Defender

Lewis Payne came through the ranks at Southampton and gained experience on loan at Eastleigh, Newport County and Cheltenham Town. He later departed St Mary's without a senior appearance to his name, joining Morecambe last summer.

3 | Raheem Conte

Defender

Hailing from Brent, Raheem Conte spent time in the academies of West London rivals Brentford and QPR before joining Cardiff City. He spent three years in the Welsh capital where he played three times before joining Woking on loan, preceding his permanent switch to Morecambe last summer.

5 | Harlee Dean

Defender

Harlee Dean joined Morecambe in January with a wealth of experience, having appeared hundreds of times in the EFL. After beginning his career with Dagenham & Redbridge, loans at Redbridge, Bishop's Stortford, Thurrock, Braintree and Grays then preceded a switch to Southampton in 2010, from whom he rejoined Bishop's Stortford on loan, before moving to Brentford. He went on to rack up over 400 EFL games for the Bees and Birmingham City, with a spell at Reading then preceding his move into non-league.

6 | Ludwig Francillette

Defender

Guadeloupe-born defender Ludwig Francillette began his career in France with Dijon FCO and AS Quetigny, before coming over to England with a switch to Newcastle United. This preceded moves to Crawley Town and Eastleigh, racking up more than 150 appearances in English football, before joining Morecambe last summer.

12 | Kyle Jameson

Defender

Kyle Jameson appeared in the youth setups at Southport, Chelsea and West Bromwich Albion before moving to Barrow on loan in 2018/19. After departing the Hawthorns permanently that year, he turned out for Fylde, Oldham, Tranmere, Newport, Harrogate and now Morecambe.

15 | Ben Williams

Midfielder

Ben Williams returned to Morecambe last summer after spending time on loan at the Shrimps' academy from Blackburn Rovers. After departing Ewood Park permanently, a move to Barnsley preceded spells at Cheltenham Town and Carlisle United.

28 | Tom Fogarty

Defender

Northern Irish defender Tom Fogarty joined Morecambe on loan from Birmingham City in February. Having progressed through the ranks at St Andrew's and featuring regularly across Birmingham City's development setup, he recently returned from his loan spell at National League outfit, Boston United.

33 | Timothy Akindileni

Defender

Morecambe signed Timothy Akindileni on loan from QPR in January, having previously made the move to Loftus Road from Aberdeen. His time in Scotland saw him gain international recognition, representing Czech Republic's Under-18s, before joining QPR's Development Squad in June.

10 | Jake Cain

Midfielder

Liverpool academy product Jake Cain played frequently on loan at Newport County, before joining Swindon Town permanently in 2023. Two years in Wiltshire preceded a return north with Morecambe.

17 | Paul Lewis

Midfielder

England C international Paul Lewis began his career at Macclesfield Town, before joining Cambridge and later Dover on loan in 2017. Two spells either side of a stint of Northampton then followed, before joining Morecambe in 2024.

19 | Ma'akel Bogle-Campbell

Midfielder

Fulham academy product Ma'akel Bogle-Campbell joined Peterborough's Under-21s and appeared in the Premier League 2, before joining Morecambe on loan.

20 | Mo Sangare

Midfielder

Liberia international Mo Sangare joined Newcastle from Accrington Stanley, and returned to the 'Owd Reds on loan in 2020 before rejoining the club permanently the following year. After spells at in Scotland with Livingston and Switzerland with Bellinzona, he joined Morecambe last summer.

24 | Yann Song'o

Midfielder

Yann Song'o began his career in Spain with Deportivo de La Coruña and Zaragoza, either side of a spell with Metz in France. He later turned out for Sabadell, Poble Mafumet before moving to America with Sporting Kansas City and Orlando, before two years at Blackburn preceded moves to Ross County, Plymouth, Scunthorpe, Morecambe, Bradford and Walsall, before returning to the Shrimps in 2023.

26 | Lennon Dobsen

Midfielder

Wigan-born midfielder Lennon Dobson has risen through the ranks at Morecambe, and made his senior debut in a League Two clash against MK Dons. He has appeared twice for the club in total.

27 | Adam Fairclough

Midfielder

Highly-rated midfielder Adam Fairclough has appeared seven times for Morecambe, having risen through the club's academy. He joined Lancaster City on a three-month loan in October.

28 | George Thomas

Midfielder

George Thomas began his career with Coventry City and appeared 42 times for the Sky Blues, after moving on loan to Yeovil Town a year after his professional debut. He later appeared for Leicester, Scunthorpe, ADO Den Haag, QPR and Cambridge before joining Morecambe.

9 | Harry Panayiotou

Forward

A product of the Leicester academy, Harry Panayiotou went on to turn out for Port Vale, Raith Rovers, Barrow, Salford, Nuneaton, Aittios Spara, Aldershot, Livingston, Maidenhead, FCB Magpies, Sirens and Larne, prior to his switch to Lancashire.

11 | Admiral Muskwe

Forward

Admiral Muskwe started out for Leicester before joining Swindon and Wycombe on loan, before making a permanent switch to Luton. Further loans at Fleetwood and Exeter preceded a move to Harrogate, which was followed by a spell in Finland with IFK Mariehamn, before returning to England with Morecambe.

18 | Ben Tollitt

Forward

Former Everton academy winger Ben Tollitt began his senior career with Widnes and Skelmersdale United, before joining Portsmouth in 2015. Spells at Tranmere, Wrexham, Blackpool, Macclesfield, Fylde and Oldham preceded loans at Kidderminster and Chester, before joining Morecambe in 2024.

21 | Joe Nuttall

Forward

A product of the Manchester City academy, Joe Nuttall moved to Scotland to begin his senior career with spells at Aberdeen, Stranraer and Dumbarton, before returning to England with Blackburn. He later appeared for Blackpool, Northampton, Scunthorpe and Oldham before moving to Cheltenham and Altrincham on loan.

22 | Josh Eppiah

Forward

Belgian forward Josh Eppiah began his career with Leicester, before moving on loan to OH Leuven and Northampton. A spell in Brazil with Amazonas preceded a move to Morecambe in September.

23 | Daniel Ogwuru

Forward

Daniel Ogwuru began his career with Bolton, before joining the Manchester City youth setup in 2019. He later moved to Norwich and spent time on loan at Buxton before joining Morecambe in 2025. Loans at Ashton United and Workington preceded his return to the Shrimps last month.

HISTORIC RAMBLINGS

Three from the 7th March


As a senior club (1910), U's have played twelve home games and six away matches on this day in history prior to today. The first was at Cheshunt in the Athenian League in 1925, a 4-2 defeat. Of the other five away fixtures, the stand out is the 9-3 win at Merstham in the Surrey Senior Cup in 1981; a replay after a 1-1 draw. The away record is W3 L3.

At Sutton, U's have won six, the most recent a 3-0 defeat of Crawley Town in EFL L2 in 2023 (indeed, U's last L2 win of that season) drawn three and lost three. One of those victories is featured below.

The Match

Back to 1964, the club's first season in the Isthmian League but on this day a local derby and a cup tie at GGL. The visitors were Tooting & Mitcham United in a Surrey Senior second round tie. In the week leading up to the tie, Sutton right back Derek Gamblin had been called up to play for the GB Olympic XI. They defeated the then Third Division (now League One) leaders Coventry City by 1-0. T&M had already reached the London Senior s-f while Sutton had exited the Amateur Cup in a replay at home to Barnet the previous week. U's had defeated The Terrors 2-1 in an IL match back in October '63 and sat fourth in the table to T&M's tenth.

The weather was very cold accompanied by a strong wind and this didn't help the entertainment on offer, and T&M gave away an early goal never to really recover. That was in the tenth minute when Roy Osborne pounced on an error by Bambridge to fire past Tooting and future Sutton 'keeper Derek Shewring. For the visitors Gowland weaved past four Sutton players only to fire wide with just Dave Roffey to beat. In the 30th minute Micky Goodall made it 2-0 from an Osborne pass and two minutes later Osborne headed his second goal from Dave Hermitage's cross. Gowland, set up by Northcott, reduced the arrears in the 44th minute.

In the 48th minute, U's scored a fourth through Paul Bates and Goodall made it five in the 78th minute. Gowland registered his second goal three minutes from time as U's progressed rather comfortably by 5-2. Their s-f tie with Croydon Amateurs would be an even simpler progress as they recorded a record for a SSC s-f (still is) 10-0 victory at Sutton.

The Player

This afternoon's focus is on SUFC royalty, that being Peter Molloy. That he would become such a great figure in the history of the club was probably not expected considering he started with Carshalton Athletic and also played for Tooting & Mitcham. It was after his second spell at Carshalton (also played for Millwall as an amateur) that the left winger joined Sutton in October 1956 to make his debut against his former colleagues on the tenth of that month. This was also the first time the Borough's two clubs had met in league football; it finished 1-1. After making his debut, Peter missed just one match for the rest of that season. The following term would be the best the club had experienced to that point, winning the Athenian League and the prestigious London Senior Cup. Peter missed just two matches scoring thirteen goals in all competitions. The club lost its successful manager George Smith that summer to Crystal Palace, and while Peter patrolled the left wing for much of the season, the '58/9 campaign was a disappointment even with Malcolm Allison as coach. Allison moved on and U's were in need of a manager and so, after much deliberation, Peter Molloy was named as Sutton's manager for the 1959/60 season. He stayed in charge for the next three seasons, although did offer his resignation at one point as the club's fortunes failed to match expectations.



On taking the role, Peter had hung up his boots although did make one appearance in the last AL match of the '60/61 season. The club changed policy and decided to pay a manager for the first time, and Sid Cann was appointed for the 1962/3 season. A decade on and Peter was announced as club chairman to replace Andrew Letts who became Club President. Between them, they manoeuvred SUFC through the change from amateur to semi-pro status and slowly built the club up to take back-to-back Isthmian titles in the mid-1980s and enter the GMV Conference for the first time. Financially prudent but not lacking in ambition, it is therefore sad that Peter passed away from MND in the summer of 1988 a few months before U's defeated Coventry City in the FA Cup in 1989. As a player he made 115 appearances scoring 30 goals while as the manager he took charge of 138 matches winning exactly 50% of them. However it was his achievements away from the actual football field that should, arguably, be remembered as being of more importance to the

The Programme

The 1980/81 season is remembered for U's third visit to Wembley, this time in the FA Trophy, but on this day in '81, Sutton were playing a nuisance fixture in the Surrey Senior against Merstham. A nuisance because the London Spartan League side had forced a replay at GGL the week before. The match programme cost 10p (cover below). There were eight pages of the striking amber paper all but one being for adverts. The one that wasn't, page three, held club information. Adverts ranged from the local chippy called Crazy Plaice to Merstham Glass (early exponents of aluminium double glazing). The content was on just four pages inserted, albeit stapled well in the middle. Notes suggested the draw at Sutton was

Merstham's finest result in their history to that point. There was a brief history of SUFC and then over the page were the team line ups and below Merstham's goal scorers, former Suttonian Steve Cosham leading that table – he would score once in this game – with former Sutton player and future director Lee Wallis also on the list. A LSL table followed and the final page of content was the Isthmian League table. All very basic but this was standard for the level.

SUFC v Morecambe

This is Morecambe's third visit to Sutton, the first being at this level but in the GMV Conference in April 2000. Morecambe won by the only goal as U's headed for relegation. More recently in October 2023, Morecambe defeated U's by 3-2 in the EFL L2. U's have played today's visitors at two different venues for their away matches. In December 1999, they lost 6-2 at Christie Park after making what looked like a decent comeback only to lose more goals in the second half. In February 2024, U's lost 1-0 to an early goal at the Mazuma Mobile Stadium as Steve Morison sought to keep U's in the EFL. And of course, earlier this season, Sutton clawed back a two goal deficit to earn a point.

Six players have scored the six goals that Sutton have registered in the above matches; Andy Riley, Mark Watson, Ben Goodliffe and Harry Smith. Back in October Ashley Nadesan and Lewis Simper were on target.

The latest news from David Weir Leisure Centre; the home of the Sutton Academy and Women's teams.

Barnet Academy 2-3 Sutton United Academy

Jayden Keteku scored a first-half hat trick as Sutton beat Barnet 3-2 at The Hive, ending a run of three consecutive EFL Youth Alliance defeats. Keteku opened the scoring from the penalty spot after being fouled in the area, before adding a second from Geri Katana's cross and completing his treble just before half time by converting a rebound. Sutton dominated the first half but faced a strong Barnet response after the break, conceding twice and surviving late pressure. Goalkeeper Klevis Muca made an important close-range save as the hosts pushed forward, but Sutton held on through eight minutes of stoppage time to secure an important victory.

Sutton United Academy 2-1 Maidstone United Academy

Sutton climbed to third place in the National League Academy South Division after coming from behind to beat Maidstone at River Lane, completing a double over the visitors after their 4-0 win earlier in the month. Maidstone took the lead five minutes before half time, but Sutton responded in stoppage time when Jayden Keteku, fresh from his hat trick against Barnet, scored from close range. Seven minutes into the second half Kai McKenzie produced the winner, showing neat skill inside the area before finishing calmly. Sutton held on to secure the victory, moving within four points of leaders Southend with a game in hand ahead of their meeting with Eastleigh.

Eastleigh Academy 1-2 Sutton United Academy

For the second time in two days Sutton came from behind to win, moving above Eastleigh into second place in the National League Football Academy South, four points behind Southend with a game in hand before the sides meet next week. Eastleigh took the lead when George Cole headed home from close range, but Sutton gradually grew into the game. Adam Reeves equalised in first half stoppage time, heading in Jayden Keteku's corner. Ten minutes after the break Rashaad Drysdale produced a brilliant solo run and finish to put Sutton ahead. Sutton

controlled the second half and could have extended their lead as Eastleigh struggled to respond.

Bromley Academy 0-4 Sutton United Academy

Sutton United Academy 2-0 Southend United Academy

Sutton closed the gap to National League Academy South leaders Southend to just one point with a controlled victory and a second consecutive clean sheet. Dan Urpens opened the scoring in the first half, heading Adam Reeves' corner into the far corner for his first goal of the season. Sutton continued to create chances, with Ronny Ruiz and Jayden Keteku going close before the break. Early in the second half Keteku doubled the lead with another header from a Reeves corner, extending his excellent scoring run. Southend threatened briefly and disputed a possible penalty, but Sutton remained comfortable and nearly added a third late on.

Sutton United Women 1-1 Newhaven Women

Lucy Clark's side were held to a 1-1 draw with Newhaven in a scrappy contest at Cobham. Sutton made a bright start and took the lead after seven minutes when Emma Spear's corner found Emily Oliver at the far post, who volleyed home. Newhaven almost responded immediately, hitting the post a minute later with Megan Taylor beaten. The rest of the first half lacked clear chances as Sutton held their advantage. Newhaven improved after the break and equalised just after the hour through Emilia Rahaus, whose looping 35-yard strike caught Taylor out. Sutton pushed for a winner, but Newhaven defended resolutely to secure a valuable point.

Women: Hannah Baptiste Selected By Guyana

Hannah Baptiste has received a recall by the Guyana Women's National Team ahead of the Lady Jags' upcoming 2026 CONCACAF W Championship qualifiers.

The Golden Jaguars are set to face Dominica (27th February) and Antigua & Barbuda (5th March) in the next batch of matches, and will be aiming to bounce back from defeat in their maiden clash with Nicaragua back in December.



"To celebrate a big win at a big football club with our fans is what you do it for," he added. "The players have been magnificent and have given the supporters exactly what they deserve. I hope they enjoyed it as much as we did."

Despite a reduced set of fixtures due to the FA Trophy, the National League continued to deliver its usual drama last weekend. Only one home win was secured in the nine games played last weekend, with six away victories.

Rochdale bounced back from their disappointing 2-2 draw at Halifax with an impressive performance and victory at in-form Aldershot. A brace from Emmanuel Diseruvwe secured a 2-0 win for Dale and ended a seven-match unbeaten run for Aldershot. The defeat was the first time John Coleman's side had failed to find the back of the net since their 0-0 draw with the U's on Boxing Day.



Our opponents today, Morecambe, were very close to doing a huge favour for Rochdale in DAZN's live game last weekend. Despite Paul Lewis being sent off early in the second half and York failing to convert the penalty, the Shrimps' defence was eventually breached when Ollie Banks scored in the ninety-ninth minute to seal a 1-0 win and make it nine wins in a row for the Minstermen.



Third-place Carlisle secured all three points on their visit to Eastleigh. After a goalless first half, Georgie Kelly scored his fifth goal in five games to open the scoring for the Cumbrians. Stephen Wearne added a second for Mark Hughes' side before Temi Eweka scored a consolation for the Hampshire side. The victory was Carlisle's fourth in five games as they look to secure third spot and a home semi-final in the end-of-season play-offs.



Forest Green bagged a vital three points in a 2-0 win at relegation-threatened Gateshead. Goals either side of half-time from Tom Knowles and Chibuzo Nwoko gave Robbie Savage's side their first win in six games. The defeat extended Gateshead's winless run at home to nineteen games, but the Heed picked up their first win at the Gateshead International Stadium since the 23rd August in midweek, beating Braintree 1-0. Keaton Ward scored a screamer in the ninety-fourth minute to put them within seven points of safety, having played the same number of games as Brackley.



Another side in the play-off whose poor run of form continued last weekend was Scunthorpe. The Iron are on a six-game winless run after their 3-3 draw with Solihull Moors. Despite being 2-0 down at half-time, a Danny Whitehall hat-trick put the Lincolnshire side in full control, especially given former U's defender Tyler French was shown a red card during the second half. However, Isaac Moore's ninety-fifth-minute equaliser secured a draw for Millington's side, who themselves are on a five-game winless run.



Tamworth ended February unbeaten after a 3-2 win over play-off chasing Boreham Wood. Despite a Matt Rush brace for the visitors, the Lambs secured the three points after a Stefan Mols goal on either side of an Oliver Lynch brace. Andy Peaks' side's six-game unbeaten run came to an end in midweek as they suffered a 2-0 defeat at Yeovil. The Glovers bounced back from defeat in the FA Trophy by National League North side Southport, with goals from Ryan Jones and Declan Skura, with the away side failing to have a shot-on-target during the game.



Truro suffered a sixth defeat on the bounce in all competitions, having let a 2-1 lead slip at home to relegation rivals Braintree. The Tinnars took the lead in the game after a horrendous own goal from Ben Drake, followed by Freddie Issaka's first goal for the club. Despite this, a brace from defender Aiden Francis-Clarke secured a vital away win for the Essex side. It is the first time that Steve Pitt's side have scored more than two goals in a game since 20th September.



It was a damaging defeat for the Cornish side, but they backed it up with an impressive point on the road at Southend in midweek. The Essex side had secured a 2-1 win at Horsham last weekend to progress to the FA Trophy semi-final, but failed to take the three points against John Askey's side, who picked up their seventh point on the road this season with the 1-1 draw.



Andy Whing's poor start at Brackley continued, succumbing to a 2-0 defeat at home to Altrincham. The Saints failed to have a shot-on-target all game, and the Manchester side secured the three points after Jake Southern-Cooper opened the scoring before half-time and Declan Howe bagged his eighth of the season in second-half injury time after missing a penalty earlier in the game. The Robins have won three out of their last four and given themselves some breathing space from the relegation zone.



Despite scoring two goals in midweek, Brackley succumbed to a fourth defeat on the bounce at Rochdale. Dieservwe bagged his third brace in four games to help McNulty's side to a 3-2 win and extended their unbeaten run to thirteen games.

The victory took Dale back to the top of the league with York suffering their first defeat since the 1st October, losing 3-2 at Boreham Wood. Despite Pearce opening the scoring with his twenty-ninth goal of the league campaign, Wood scored three goals in the second half before Banks bagged a late consolation for the Minstermen.



Woking's first game since the sacking of Neil Ardley ended in a 2-2 draw at Boston on Tuesday. The former AFC Wimbledon manager was dismissed after the Cardinals were knocked out of the FA Trophy by Marine, and it brought an end to his seventy game reign at our Surrey rivals.



Gary Waddock's first game in charge of Wealdstone ended in disappointment with a 3-2 defeat at home to Morecambe. The Stones' new manager's last role was in 2019 with Aldershot, and the West London club find themselves in the midst of a run of two wins in their previous fifteen league games. For Morecambe, their visit to the VBS Community Stadium today will give them the opportunity to get back-to-back away wins in the league for the first time this season.








As the club's ambassador for Her Game Too, I'm proud to tell you that the campaign is now approaching its fifth anniversary and getting stronger every year.



For those not familiar with it, we are a movement dedicated to tackling sexism and championing women in sport. The work we do has benefited women and girls in sport all over the country (and beyond, as the campaign continues to gain support in France and elsewhere). We work in partnership with clubs, leagues and governing bodies to raise awareness, provide education and create safer, more inclusive environments for female fans, players and staff. In the five years since the campaign's formation, we've influenced reporting mechanisms to support women and girls to speak up against discriminatory behaviour, ensured women's voices are heard in conversations about how the game is run and advocated for girls to have more opportunities to play football and other sports.

By embracing the principles of Her Game Too, we are choosing to build a culture where everyone feels they belong and to send a clear message that any behaviour that seeks to work against it is not welcome here.

When we give support, we gain momentum as a club. When we give opportunity, we gain progress as a club. When we stand together, our whole club moves forward both on and off the pitch.
