CHRIS' COLUMN

After a mental month of travelling where the players have been in the main absolutely magnificent we return home to Gander Green Lane for today's huge game against Truro City FC.

The lads have done a great job of late to get us up to 15th in the league, so impressive to have jumped above nine teams when we reflect on the fact that we were bottom of the league at one point.....the form of late deserves huge credit, the players have been great.

A massive thank you to all the supporters that have followed us up and down the country, and not just in the last few weeks but across the whole season....YOU are fantastic supporters, and YOU give the team exactly what they need, positivity, encouragement, and togetherness....YOU have helped us so much - again thank you to each and every one of you!

With eight games to go it will take another massive effort across the board to make sure we stay in the National League next season....we have got ourselves in a great position and we need to finish the job off, and a key part of that will be our home form. Being honest I hated some of energy directed towards the players in our last game against Morecambe. If we play that game a hundred times it never plays out like that again, it was a perfect storm in favour of Morecambe, it was a harsh lesson that will have helped us go and get three points away at Scunthorpe a few days later. The players don't need more negative energy from the stand, behind the goal or behind the dugout - who does it help? I know who it helps - the opposition!!!!

Our home form has in the main been great, and that as I've always said has been down to our positive following, BUT since the Brackley game I've felt a shift, anti playing out from the back, anti the football that has got us from bottom to 15th, anti the football that got us to the 2nd round of the FA Cup where we pummelled Shrewsbury, anti the football that has meant in the time we've been here we'd now be just outside the playoffs in terms of league position, anti the football that has given us a hell of a chance with eight games to go, anti the football that has got us to the Surrey Senior Cup semi-final.

That football is here to stay, that football with your positive energy and support behind us will see us achieve something special over the next few years that we're together - trust me...trust us. I don't think we've let you down yet, and we won't let you down. Back the football, back the players, and we will repay you, like we have with eight points from our last four away games, and three of those games against teams pushing for promotion.

Bring the noise, bring the positivity, help the team.....and together we will achieve something amazing, we will get Sutton United back to where it should be - that's a promise.

TIM TALKS

We welcome this afternoon's visitors to the VBS Community Stadium, Truro City, and a rare opportunity for us to complete a double this season.

We haven't done it yet, and with just Eastleigh and Carlisle as possible doubles to come, today represents the only one of those opportunities to come with home advantage.

Truro have only won once on the road this season, but whilst not frequent visitors to the Borough they have never lost in the league here, although our record in Cornwall is unblemished. The stats and bookies odds all suggest we are favourites for this encounter but anyone that has seen us this season, or last, or for as many years as I have generally, will know the madness of relying on expected outcomes.

Our visit to the West Country in November saw us achieve our first away win of the season. Perhaps more comfortable than the 3-2 scoreline suggested, but we were certainly given a fright with their second half comeback before Kai Jennings' wonder strike ultimately settled things in our favour. The last time we faced them on home soil was as far back as 2017, when (and this sentence could have been written about any point in the last 20 years) Craig Dundas scored the winner in an FA Trophy

With the sun shining brightly this week, and the temperatures having risen, I am hopeful Truro will be able to match or even exceed the number we took there. That will be a testament to their support given the position they find themselves in currently. We are aware of how difficult and expensive it can be to follow your team away from home across a season but we always hope to be on the shortlist of visits made by away supporters – and when they have been once they want to return.

We have of course made this fixture even more appealing, and not just to away fans, by reducing prices across the board to the minimum, so entry for all will cost the usual price for children. The majority of any club's supporters adopt their team whilst a child, and make their first visit to watch them as a child too. We want to reconnect with as many supporters as possible, and to establish as many new supporter relationships for the future at the same time. We want to be releasing the inner child in everyone – and my "childish" parents will be here today cheering the team on. Every £2 entrant is a future supporter income stream to be nurtured. If we as a club water, fertilize and germinate "acorns" we grow potential "oak trees". We ask for your support in doing that too – as well as cheering the on pitch team – as we all plot the future for our club.

We know our stadium, despite the many improvements since our promotion in 2021, has a capacity that ranks us just 18th out of 24 in the National League. On a similar measure our average attendance at home is ranked 13th out of 24. If, like me, you want more success we need to grow. We can't expect a play-off budget, and a play-off league position, with a mid-table (or lower) level of support and the matchday income that delivers. These can't be short term changes, we have to invest sensibly and grow gradually, just like acorns. Children take time to become teenagers then adults, so we are all used to such journeys. But for today let's all be children once again, and THEN collectively grow this club and take us on that fantastic journey into its future.

Today also represents the match this season where we promote all that is delivered – often unseen – by the Sutton United Foundation. I get the daily pleasure of working alongside Harry Dunne who, together with his team, do so much for the community we are in and live amongst. As we consider how many touchpoints we have as an institution across the Borough of Sutton it is hard to think of anything that has a bigger impact on the Borough's residents than we do at a local level. The growth in activities and reach from the Foundation over the same five years since that promotion into the EFL is phenomenal – and an inspiration to the club to replicate. It would be great to think of everyone benefiting from that reduced admission charge today making a small donation (of time or money) in the direction of the Foundation.

We are hopeful of a crowd approaching 4,000 this afternoon. Many of those will be a part of the Foundation themselves, but those that aren't will get to see over 100 parading on the pitch at half-time (and see a fun penalty exhibition) representing the full reach of the Foundation. I know you will support the team vocally for ninety minutes this afternoon, but please extend that noise and admiration for fifteen minutes at half time too!



John Askey was appointed manager of Truro City in June 2024, replacing Paul Wotton after he left to join divisional rivals Torquay United.

Born in Stoke-on-Trent, Askey began his playing career at Port Vale before joining Macclesfield Town in 1984. Over the next 20 years he became a club legend, making more than 500 appearances and scoring over 100 goals. After retiring, Askey had two spells managing Macclesfield. His second stint from 2013 to 2018 was particularly successful, as he guided the club back into the Football League despite major financial constraints, and his success earned him managerial roles at Shrewsbury Town and later a return to Port Vale.

Askey returned to non-league management with York City in 2021, leading the club to promotion from the National League North. After a spell with Hartlepool United, he joined Truro and guided them to the National League South title in 2024/25.



THE STOPPER
AIDAN
STONE

Aidan Stone joined Truro City ahead of the 2025/26 campaign, following his departure from divisional rivals Yeovil Town.

Born in Stafford, Stone is an England Schoolboy international who began his professional career at Premier League Burnley. While at Turf Moor, he had a productive loan spell with Lancaster before joining Mansfield Town in 2019. Stone's career has spanned the EFL and National League, including stints at Port Vale and Notts County. Last season, he made 13 appearances on loan at Boston United before returning to become the first-choice goalkeeper at Yeovil Town, concluding the term as the Glovers' number one.

THE TEMPO-SETTER **LIRAK** **HASANI**

Lirak Hasani was born to Kosovan parents in South Yorkshire and came through the academy at Doncaster Rovers, making his first-team debut as a teenager in March 2019. He later enjoyed loan spells with Gateshead, Matlock Town and Basford United before joining Gateshead on a permanent deal in 2022.


Hasani spent two years in the North East, though his time with the club also included further loan moves to Boston United, South Shields and Blyth Spartans. Twelve months ago he left Gateshead to join Torquay, playing an important role in their promotion push.



THE FINISHER
TYLER
HARVEY

Having come through the ranks at Plymouth Argyle, Tyler Harvey made 50 appearances for the Pilgrims before moving to Wrexham. He joined Truro City in 2017 and has been prolific ever since, including scoring the club's goal in an FA Cup first-round defeat to Charlton Athletic.

Harvey scored 25 goals during Truro's previous Step Two campaign before briefly moving to Bath City at the start of the 2019/20 season. His stay at Twerton Park was short, however, as he returned to Truro just two months later. The 30-year-old later became the first Truro player to score a competitive goal at the club's new Truro City Stadium. He enjoyed another outstanding season last term, scoring 27 goals in all competitions and winning both the National League South Player of the Year and the National League South Golden Boot.



1 | Dan Lavercombe

Goalkeeper

Dan Lavercombe joined Truro City in June 2024 from Taunton Town. He previously played for Torquay United and Wigan Athletic, also featuring for AFC Fylde and FC United of Manchester. Lavercombe played every minute last season as Truro won the National League South title.

30 | Will Howard

Goalkeeper

Will Howard came through the ranks at Torquay United and later Yeovil Town, spending time on loan at Tiverton Town before departing the Glovers at Under-18 level Truro. He has so far appeared on the bench in the National League Cup whilst spending time on loan at Tavistock and Brixham.

2 | Zac Bell

Defender

Zac Bell came through the academy at Bristol City, earning four caps for Wales U19. He had loan spells with Bath City, Yeovil Town and Taunton Town before joining Maidenhead United. After a loan for Truro, he signed permanently for the Tinnars in March 2025.

3 | Connor Riley-Lowe

Defender

Connor Riley-Lowe began his career at Exeter City, making 14 appearances after progressing through the academy, before two loan spells at Truro City led to a permanent move in 2017. After a year with Bath City, he returned to Cornwall in 2020, later captaining Truro to the National League South title.

5 | Tom Harrison

Defender

Tom Harrison joined Truro City in November 2023 on loan from Oxford City, before making the move permanent. A Bristol-born player, he came through Bristol City's youth system and spent time on loan at Hereford United, Weston-super-Mare, Chippenham Town and Gloucester City. Harrison was a regular until a February 2025 knee injury ended his season.

6 | Sam Sanders

Defender

Sam Sanders joined Truro City permanently in July 2024, having spent the previous season on loan. He began at Nottingham Forest and featured for York City, helping them win National League North promotion under John Askey.

12 | Christian Oxlade-Chamberlain

Defender

Christian Oxlade-Chamberlain joined Truro City on loan from Kidderminster Harriers ahead of the 2024/25 season, with the move later made permanent. Born in Portsmouth, he progressed through Portsmouth's academy and had spells at Notts County, Gosport Borough, Aldershot Town and King's Lynn Town. He is the brother of Alex Oxlade-Chamberlain.

16 | Tyler Love-Holmes

Defender

Taylor Love-Holmes joined Truro City in July 2024 after a successful trial, signing a two-year deal. The 20-year-old previously starred for Saltash United, winning Manager's Player of the Year and the Tim Halford Award. Love-Holmes came through Plymouth Argyle's academy and also spent time on loan at Plymouth Parkway, featuring regularly for Truro in 2024/25.

20 | James Law

Defender

James Law joined Truro permanently in summer 2023 after a 2019/20 loan spell, where he won Young Player of the Year and Goal of the Season. The 24-year-old has Football League experience with Plymouth Argyle and Gillingham, plus National League spells at Torquay United and Yeovil Town. Law excelled in central defence as Truro claimed the National League South title.

21 | Max Kinsey

Defender

Max Kinsey joined Truro on loan from AFC Bournemouth. Born in Guildford, he came through Southampton's academy, debuted for Bournemouth's first team in 2023/24, and captained them to a Professional League South Group title before losing in the play-offs.

25 | Shaun Donnellan

Defender

Shaun Donnellan joined Truro initially until January 2026, a deal he has since extended. Born in London, he progressed through West Bromwich Albion's academy, featuring on loan at Worcester City, Stevenage, Dagenham & Redbridge and Walsall, and later played for Yeovil Town, Maidstone United, Woking, Maidenhead United and Torquay United before moving to Scotland with Livingston.

33 | George Cooper

Defender

George Cooper joined Truro on loan from Mansfield Town in January 2025, with whom he debuted in the EFL Trophy. He later moved on loan to Kettering Town, where he appeared more than 50 times, before stints at Kidderminster Harriers and Drogheda United preceded his move to Cornwall.

8 | Will Dean

Midfielder

Will Dean joined Truro City permanently in 2021 after leaving Exeter City. Born in Hedge End, he debuted on loan at Truro in 2019-20, earning Players' Player of the Year. Dean has been a key figure, featuring in the title-clinching win over St Albans City.

7 | Yassine En-Neyah

Midfielder

Yassine En-Neyah rejoined Truro ahead of the 2024/25 season after winning the Southern League play-offs in 2023. Moroccan-born, he came through Nottingham Forest's academy and also played for Shelbourne, Waterford, Colchester United, Maldon & Tiptree.

8 | Dan Rooney

Midfielder

Dan Rooney returned to Truro for his third spell in summer 2023 from Plymouth Parkway. He previously joined on loan from Plymouth in 2018, later making it permanent, and also had brief stints at Bury and Bath.

10 | Billy Palfrey

Midfielder

Billy Palfrey returned to Truro in summer 2023 from Plymouth Parkway, four years after leaving. A product of Plymouth Argyle's academy, he had a brief spell at Torquay before joining City, and returned from a pelvic injury to contribute to Step Two survival.

29 | Harry Kite

Midfielder

Harry Kite became Truro City's first signing for their maiden National League season, joining on a two-year deal. Born in Crediton, he came through Exeter City's academy where he made over 100 appearances and played a role in their 2022 promotion, later featuring for Yeovil Town.

32 | Harry Charsley

Midfielder

Harry Charsley signed an 18-month deal with Truro in January 2026, following his release from Oldham. He came through Everton's academy and featured in the Europa League, as well as turning out for Bolton, Mansfield, Port Vale and Newport. Internationally, he has two Republic of Ireland youth caps.

Tom Dean

Midfielder

Tom Dean joined brother his Will at Truro on loan from Exeter City, after rising through the Grecians' academy. The 20-year-old debuted in 2023 and signed professionally in 2024, before joining Plymouth Parkway on loan. This season, he has made nine appearances across senior and under-21 levels.

11 | Dominic Johnson-Fisher

Forward

Dominic Johnson-Fisher joined Truro from Whitehawk in January 2024. Previously at Steyning Town, he impressed in the FA Trophy and featured in every matchday squad last term, scoring key goals against Chesham and St Albans City.

15 | Luke Jephcott

Forward

Luke Jephcott, born in Wales and raised in Ponsanooth, Cornwall, came through Plymouth Argyle's academy. After a loan at Truro City in 2019/20, he helped Argyle win promotion and earned Wales under-21 honours. Jephcott later played for Swindon Town, St Johnstone, and Newport County before returning to Truro permanently in 2025.

18 | Freddie Issaka

Forward

Freddie Issaka was born in Truro and joined Plymouth Argyle's academy at a young age. He became the club's youngest ever player at 15, has represented both England and Wales, and signed a professional contract at 17. Issaka has made 39 Argyle appearances and featured on loan at Bristol Rovers.

19 | Rekeil Pyke

Forward

Rekeil Pyke joined Truro City after his 2025 release from Grimsby Town. Born in Leeds, he began at Huddersfield Town, with loan spells at Colchester United, Wrexham, Port Vale, Rochdale and Shrewsbury Town, later playing for Salford City, Scunthorpe and Eastleigh.

23 | Ben Starkie

Forward

Ben Starkie joined Truro City permanently after a successful trial. Born in Leicester, he progressed through Leicester City's academy, played in Germany, and starred for Harborough Town in their 2024/25 FA Cup run. Starkie has also been capped at senior and youth level by Tanzania.

27 | Saikou Janneh

Forward

Born in The Gambia, Saikou Janneh came through the ranks at Bath City before turning out for Cadbury Heath, Clevedon Town and Bristol City, with further loans at Torquay, Newport and Shrewsbury. After a switch to Cambridge and a loan to AFC Wimbledon, he briefly moved to Kuwait with Al-Jazeera, prior to his switch to Truro last summer.

34 | Jack Stretton

Forward

Jack Stretton joined Truro City after spells at Derby County, Stockport County, Carlisle United, Woking, Oldham Athletic, Burton Albion and Drogheda United. Born in Burton-upon-Trent, he made his Derby senior debut during the COVID-19 disrupted 2020/21 season.

Kieran Wilson

Forward

Kieran Wilson moved to Truro on loan following a curtailed loan at Torquay United, where he scored three goals in 17 games. After spells with Livingston and Airdrie, he joined Exeter in 2023 and turned professional in 2025, appearing nine times for the Grecians this term.

HISTORIC RAMBLINGS

Three from the 21st March

Home football dominates on this day for SUFC as a senior club with just five of the previous nineteen matches played being away from Sutton. The Surrey Senior Cup also features and in particular the semi-final. The first away match and SSC tie (second round replay) were one and the same and the programme is featured below. Of the other four, two were drawn and one ended in victory while the loss was a London Senior Cup s-f replay at Leatherhead in 1978. Sutton have not played on this date since 2017, a 1-1 draw at Maidstone United in the National League.

U's first match as a senior club on this day was in 1913, a 1-0 reverse to South Tooting in the South Suburban League (West). Three SSC semi-finals have been contested, the first features below while the other two were against Epsom & Ewell. A 0-0 draw in 1981 (U's lost the replay) and a 5-0 win six years later. U's home record is W8 D3 L3. The second of those draws was the last time U's entertained on this day, 1-1 with Boreham Wood in the Isthmian League in 2009.

The Match

We return to 1964 and a Surrey Senior Cup semi-final with Croydon Amateurs at GGL. The visitors had stepped up from County level football to the Spartan League and had defeated Redhill and then Woking to reach this stage. However, first choice 'keeper Stanley was injured the previous week and it would prove a difficult afternoon for replacement Jones.

Sutton sat fourth in the table, their first season as Isthmians, and they put the visitors to the footballing sword. The scoring commenced in the second minute, Micky Goodall heading in Roy Osborne's cross. Jones made some fine interventions before the second goal arrived in the 24th minute, Dave Hermitage netting with a low shot. Five minutes later Trevor Bladon raced away from deep in his own half to fire in the third and six minutes before the break Osborne thumped a fine strike past Jones.

The Amateurs kept going but were no match for the hosts and after the break the goals kept flowing. Hermitage added his second goal in the 48th minute, centre-forward Paul Bates got in on the act nine minutes later, and the seventh arrived two minutes after that through Goodall. Hermitage completed his hat-trick in the 66th minute. There was a twenty minute wait for the ninth goal and that came from the head of Ted Powell from a Bladon cross, and then the obligatory own goal that also seems to arrive during these sort of thrashings brought the tally to double figures, Jim Overall the luckless provider. This remains the record winning margin for a SSC s-f and it took U's to a third consecutive final.




Jim Overall, Croydon Amateurs' centre-half, temporarily clears the danger by heading a Sutton attack away on Saturday. Another picture is on the back page.

The Player


Appearing at right half for Sutton in a 3-1 defeat of Dulwich Hamlet in the Isthmian League at GGL in 1970 was Ken Grose. Ken was a defender who had signed from local club Youth Centre 21 that was based opposite The Plough in Sutton Common Road. Ken signed for U's early in 1966 spending the whole of that season in a successful reserve team. He made his first appearance on the left flank and scored but from November was employed in the half back line (no 4 or 6) and finished that season with a Surrey Intermediate Cup winners medal. His only first team involvement that season was as an unused substitute in April '67. That was against Kingstonian and having featured in the only pre-season friendly, Ken made his senior debut at centre half on the 22nd August 1967 in the Isthmian League, also against K's. Once again, his opportunities were limited though, and he played just four more times sitting on the bench on seven occasions. The 1968/69 season was when Ken finally made his mark on senior football taking the left back role and making fifty appearances in all scoring his first senior goal in the final match of the season in the London Charity Cup final at Dagenham, U's lost by 3-1. Of course, the crowning moment of that season (if defeat could ever be described as such) was the Amateur Cup final at Wembley. Ken was just twenty-one at the time. The arrival of centre-half John Faulkner in the summer of '69 saw Dennis Clarke move over to left back and once again Ken was shunted back to reserve team football.



However, perhaps the finest moment (away from a Wembley appearance) of his career came as he replaced centre-forward Ray Hutchins with U's trailing 1-0 to lowly Bromley at GGL with fifteen minutes left. A real gamble by manager Sid Cann but it paid off as Ken scored a hat-trick to turn the match on its head. When Faulkner left for Leeds United in March 1970, Ken was given more first team appearances and he finished the season with a Surrey Senior Cup winners medal. The 1970/71 term saw Ken start at left back before playing later in the season in a more central role as U's missed out on the Isthmian League title by one point. The next season he was the centre-half until he lost his place late in the season. The '72/3 season saw Ken join Kingstonian before joining Dulwich in the summer of '73. Ted Powell coaxed him back to GGL in November 1974 and he started the '75/6 season with Sutton before joining another former playing colleague, and now manager, Ted Shepherd at Croydon where he stayed until the 1981/2 season before retiring. Ken made 216 appearances for Sutton scoring seven goals, three of them in just fifteen minutes.

The Programme

Back ninety years for today's programme and the distinctive pink and blue of Dulwich Hamlet. The Champion Hill club retained that colour scheme for their programmes until the beginning of the '73/4 season. There were different designs and this 1936 programme was basically a double sided sheet, folded to make six pages. The cover is below while inside, page two displayed "Notes", the content including a decent look at Sutton's honours both club and player (representative appearances). The next page held the team layouts and below the only advert (other than the Sunday Pictorial on the cover) beseeching people to read Eddie Hapgood in The Star. More notes followed with a focus on previous Dulwich/Sutton matches included.



Continues

On the first of two outside pages was a list of return trains from East Dulwich to various London locations and Sutton and Cheam. Rather helpful. The final page listed results for all four of Hamlet's teams, the most eye-catching an 11-0 win against Gosport in the Amateur Cup six weeks earlier. The only real missing content was the Isthmian League table but this may have been because it was a cup match. All for one old penny. A beautiful piece of football history. For the record, Sutton won by 3-2, Athenians toppling legendary Isthmian hosts.

SUFC v Truro City

The Cornish club make their fourth league visit to GGL this afternoon, all previous three in the National League South; they have yet to lose. The first was in December 2011, a 2-2 draw, and in March 2013 they made the long midweek journey here for the second season running to record a 1-0 win as they unsuccessfully fought relegation. Their last league match here, again in midweek, also ended 2-2 but is better remembered for the ruinous performance by the referee, both sides ending with ten men because of so-called technical offences for second yellows that were totally incorrect (Truro's preventing them from being awarded a late penalty and the offending Sutton player from being sent off). Their most recent visit to GGL was in the FA Trophy in December 2017, U's winning by 1-0 (Craig Dundas off the bench). At Truro, at whose new ground we played for the first time in November after previous games at their former Treyew Road ground, Sutton have won all four visits with a 10-3 goal aggregate.

The position of Sutton's top scorer in league matches against City is shared by Harry Beautyman, Dan Fitchett and, thanks to his match winning performance back in November, Kai Jennings with two goals each.

With less than ten games to go for the majority of teams in the National League, each goal scored and point gained is increasingly vital for sides up and down the division.

York gained another three points with a 3-0 win at Aldershot, applying pressure on title rivals Rochdale, who kicked off later in the day. Goals from Ollie Banks, Alex Newby, and Josh Stones gave the Minstermen their fourteenth victory on the road this season. Stones' goal was also the one-hundredth scored by Stuart Maynard's side in the National League this season. Reaching this total in thirty-eight games is the quickest that a fifth-tier side has achieved this figure. The defeat was Aldershot's fourth on the bounce ahead of a local derby at Woking in the lunchtime kick-off today.



Despite the pressure applied by York, Rochdale responded with ease as they swept Eastleigh aside at the Silverlakes Stadium. Emmanuel Dieseruvwe opened the scoring with his twenty-fourth of the season before Casey Pettit and Ethan Ebanks-Landell scored their first and second goals of the season, respectively. Despite Jake Tabor's consolation, the 3-1 victory made it fifteen unbeaten for Dale and put them back top of the table at the end of the weekend.



The three sides directly below the top two at the start of play all fell to defeat. Despite taking the lead, third-placed Carlisle lost 2-1 at Tamworth. A twelve-minute brace from Oliver Lynch secured a first win in four games for Andy Peaks' side.



Boreham Wood suffered a 3-2 defeat to fellow play-off chasers Halifax, with Josh Hmami opening the scoring with a header. Despite coming from behind twice and having the greater share of chances, Wood found themselves leaving Yorkshire with nothing to show from their efforts. Owen Bray's eighty-sixth-minute goal proved to be the winner for Lakeland's side and made it one defeat in fourteen at home for Halifax, who will look to get another three points in the late kick-off tonight at Solihull Moors.



Southend secured their second win against a top-seven side at the twelfth time of asking with a 2-0 victory against Forest Green. Goals in either half from James Golding and Gus Scott-Morriss, his tenth of the league campaign, secured a valuable three points for the Essex side. Their first win in five league games left Forest Green nervously looking over their shoulders at the chasing pack outside of the play-offs.



Scunthorpe put their defeat against the U's behind them last weekend with a come-from-behind victory at home to Altrincham. Lucas Weaver gave the Manchester side a 1-0 lead at half-time, but second-half goals from Joe Starbuck and Alfie Beestin secured a second win in nine games for the Iron. Andy Butler's side have now won twenty-two points from losing positions this season, winning six and drawing four of them.



Both Wealdstone and Boston continued good runs of form with victories at home to sides out of form. The Stones thumped Solihull Moors 5-1 at Grosvenor Vale in the early kick-off on Saturday. The victory was a third win on the bounce for new manager Gary Waddock, with twelve goals scored in those three games. Boston made it six wins in ten games after a 2-1 win over Billy Rowley's Yeovil. Despite opening the scoring through ex U's striker Aaron Jarvis, the Glovers failed to hold onto the win, and Jake Rooney and Jordy Hiwula made it six home games without defeat for the Pilgrims.



Today's visitors, Truro, suffered a sixth home defeat on the bounce as Charlie Caton's goal just after half-time gave Hartlepool the three points on their 876-mile round trip to Cornwall. Another side whose poor run of form continued on Saturday was Brackley. Four goals in eleven second-half minutes from Woking gave them a 4-1 victory over Andy Whing's side. Ollie Sanderson took his total for the season to fourteen and five in his last four games for the Cardinals and inflicted a seventh defeat on the bounce for Brackley.

A late equaliser from Braintree's Tyler Walker in their visit to Morecambe kept their hosts in the bottom four for another week at least. Despite Jack Nolan scoring an eighty-seventh-minute penalty for Jim Bentley's side, the points were shared in the relegation six-pointer. An assist from Braintree keeper Mason Terry helped the Essex side remain level on points with their opponents despite one win in eight for Steve Pitt's side.



Rochdale are top of the league heading into the weekend's games, but failed to take advantage of their game in hand on Tuesday night as Southend beat them 3-2 at Roots Hall. Maher's side were outstanding from start to finish, and goals from Dallas, Golding, and Hopper secured a vital win for the Shrimps. Dale's lead at the top remains two points, but their fifteen-game unbeaten run came to an end.



Woking remained unbeaten under the caretaker charge of players Craig Ross, Jake Hyde, and Dale Gorman after they saw off Yeovil 1-0 in Surrey. A first-half goal from Sutton legend Harry Beautyman was enough to give the Cardinals the three points. It is now one point from seven away games for the Somerset side, who find themselves four points above the relegation zone.



That gap was closed due to Gateshead's 1-0 win at home to Wealdstone. Ashley Boatswain scored his first goal for the North East side and condemned Gary Waddock to his first defeat in charge of Wealdstone. The Heed have taken eighteen points from their previous nine games, having taken two from their sixteen games prior.



Brackley also ended their run of defeats with a 1-1 draw at home to Solihull Moors. Despite being a goal and a man down for the last thirty minutes, Matt Lowe's equaliser gained a first point in charge of the club for Whing. Moors are winless in eight but seven points clear of the drop zone.

Scunthorpe made it back-to-back 2-1 victories after their long trip to Truro was a successful one. An eleven-point buffer to eighth-place Halifax was achieved thanks to first-half goals from Leo Farrell and Alfie Beestin.

Chris Agutter felt his side earned a valuable point after a 1–1 draw away at Gateshead.

Dubem Eze's first league goal with a little under ten minutes to go was enough to seal a point, having previously gone behind in the first half after Harry Chapman curled a brilliant strike beyond Jack Sims.

Facing a side revitalised under Rob Elliot, the Head Coach described the contest as a hard-fought encounter and was satisfied to leave with a result.

"It was a closely fought encounter. A big point for us," he said.

"I do believe there are six-pointers and this was one of them. So to come away from today's game with a point against a side that is much improved under Rob Elliot, who have been on a great run of late, we'll definitely take it."

"From our last four away games – Halifax, Hartlepool, Scunthorpe and now Gateshead – within a two-week period we've taken eight points. That's a fantastic return and it's put us in a really good position with only a few games to go."

Despite taking the point, Agutter admitted there was frustration over missed opportunities and the manner of the goal conceded, and those issues allowed Gateshead to create the opening goal before the interval.

"I think we should be one or two up," he said. "We've missed some unbelievable chances which is disappointing – really good chances. The goal we conceded is incredibly avoidable."

"We didn't get our press right in the first half. The front two are getting after it and the midfield are in a different postcode, which isn't conducive to forcing turnovers. That leads to them getting an opportunity around our box and we don't defend our box well enough."

"So we go in 1–0 down at half time after missing chances and conceding a

very avoidable goal, which was very frustrating."

"We took our foot off the gas a little bit from the Scunthorpe game again in that first half, so you can imagine what half time was like."

The second half, however, saw a clear improvement in intensity and structure; Agutter praising the impact of his substitutes in helping the team build momentum.

"We were probably not as good on the ball in the second half but what we did do was run hard and commit to it. The back line was higher, the midfield was closer to the front line and that allowed the forwards to apply proper pressure on the ball."

"That forced them into mistakes and into going longer, and athletically I think we're stronger than them, so we started to dominate the first and second balls."

"We started switching play more and having more of the football."

"Coupled with the improved energy and intensity we built momentum towards the end of the game and deservedly got back on level terms."

A notable inclusion saw Charlie Bell deployed as a makeshift left back until a hamstring injury sustained by Jake Taylor brought a league debut for Dan Urpens, a player who received plenty of praise from his boss, with his team selection being influenced by a number of defensive absences.

"We're light at the back," he said.

"Bes [Topallaj] is unavailable after becoming a dad – massive congratulations to him and his family again – and [Hayden] Muller isn't 100 per cent fit either."

"So Belly did a job at left back and was very good. I mean he's 18 years old and he's some player."

"Jack Taylor pulled out with a hamstring injury which meant he had to go back inside," Chris said.

"Then Dan Urpens came on for his debut and, not getting carried away, that is one of the best debuts I've seen from a young defender."

"To defend with that maturity and quality at 17 years old is outstanding. That's a massive pat on the back for the academy."
