

## TIM TALKS

**We welcome this afternoon's visitors to the VBS Community Stadium, Rochdale, a club we have only got to know in recent years, following our EFL adventure from 2021 onwards.**

Now both relegated, and both wanting to return, it has been great this season and last to once more be competing against each other on that green rectangle for ninety minutes. Other than today we wish them all the best and hope to miss our encounters for just a single season before resuming our place in the EFL 72 again to join them.

Last Saturday it was wonderful to see so many people inside the stadium, and my chapeau is doffed to all those that put in so much work in making that happen. Similarly, and Harry already knows, but the work from him and his teams across the Foundation is so vital to the Club and its Community outreach, and that was on full display last week too. A big thank you from me for that too.

That said it was somewhat disappointing, on a day that clearly mattered so much in our efforts to bring the club to so many new supporters – truly the way to greater success that we all want as supporters – to witness some of the behaviours that don't help from our own supporters.

Whilst it is obviously disappointing to underperform on the pitch, and lose in front of so many home supporters (many of whom haven't seen the wonderful and successful displays away from home), that shouldn't be an excuse. Swearing and behaving unsupportively in front of our potential new fans, who we are trying to impress and encourage to return (and bring others too) is not just unhelpful on the day, but can have a longer term negative impact too. I can't see how it helps the players and staff either.

Enough said about the Truro game then, other than to use it to reemphasise how good by way of contrast Tuesday's match was. Once again it was the dedicated away following that got to see the run of form away from the VBS Community Stadium extended. Wins at Hartlepool and Scunthorpe (and a creditable point at Halifax) have now been added to by a convincing victory at Eastleigh – and that first double of the season I wrote about in these notes last time. Whilst that second goal took some time to get, and no doubt we were assisted by an early (and deserved) sending off, it was a fine win. The only disappointment – unlike the previous two – was the relatively short drive home to enjoy it in.

If you have followed football for as long as I have – and this club in particular – nothing should surprise you. We aren't out of the woods yet. But it feels as though we have already done (just) enough to be safe. I would have more faith in that sentence were we to have picked up more than a single point on offer from the three games against clubs in the relegation zone as they were at the start of the month. Three points are never easily won, but I don't think anyone really thought we wouldn't pick up the majority of the points on offer in those games. However, with the points less obviously attainable now in the bag, we are in the same place as if we had beaten both Morecambe and Truro, and lost to Hartlepool and Scunthorpe (and with no doubt much less concern and noise in the process too).

That means that even were we not to pick up another point in our remaining fixtures, for the likes of Brackley and Braintree to now go past us they would need to win three and four games respectively given our superior goal difference (despite those gut wrenching eight goals!). With them having won only nine and eight times in the league from 40 this season, that looks a tough ask from just six games. To give that some context it would be a run that neither of them have managed to do this season – and they couldn't even beat each other when they met recently.

I would also like to think the chances of us doing an Aldershot and losing six games in a row – one of which would be against them in less than week's time – is also a long shot. It's not without precedent though having watched us lose seven league games in a row (after beating Notts County and scoring five goals in the process!) at the beginning of our 23/24 relegation season. Given what I have written I wouldn't be at all surprised if we now win against today's opposition, defeating the league leaders after disappointing against the bottom club last weekend.

Scoring five would be ambitious to predict, but statistically speaking Rochdale are an interesting opponent. This is the fourth season we have met in the league, and over those seven matches the home team has always come out on top. Whilst we have scored at Spotland it remains the case that the Dale have never tested the back of the net at the VBS. Those are the kind of statistical runs we want to see continue this afternoon!

Jermaine Francis represented Grenada for the first time since making the move to South London from Hartlepool United, with an international friendly against Rwanda (Friday, 27th March; 7pm KO), as part of the FIFA Series.

Francis and the Spice Boys have already been eliminated from FIFA World Cup Qualification after finishing third of Group B in the Second Round of CONCACAF qualifiers, but returned to action with a trip to Stade Amahoro to take on a Rwanda side who have also missed out on this summer's tournament, having finished fifth in Group C of the CAF qualifiers.

The duo have been drawn in Group A alongside hosts Kenya and Estonia, with the second fixture on Monday, 30th March seeing the victors take on Kenya, this being Rwanda after sealing a 4-0 win over Grenada and Francis last night courtesy of goals from Leroy Jacques Mickels, Muhadjiri Hakizimana, Yannick Mukunzi and Gilbert Mugisha. Francis made way with five minutes to go as part of a quintuple change by Anthony Modeste, having just conceded the fourth goal.

Dillon De Silva, currently on loan at Maidenhead United, returns to the international stage with Sri Lanka at the end of the month, though the Golden Lions cannot qualify for the Asian Cup, sitting six points behind group leaders Turkmenistan with one game remaining.

Abdullah Al Mutairi's side will close out their campaign with an away match at Chinese Taipei (Tuesday, 31st March; 11am KO), who finished bottom of the group with zero points.



Jimmy McNulty entered his third full season as manager after taking charge at the end of the 2022/23 campaign, returning to the club where he spent nearly a decade as a player.

After youth spells with Liverpool and Everton, he began his senior career at Wrexham, later playing for Bangor City and Caernarfon Town, where he became captain. His performances earned moves to Macclesfield, Stockport and Brighton, along with a loan at Scunthorpe, before further spells at Barnsley, Tranmere and Bury. He finished his playing career with an eight-year stint at Rochdale, making over 200 appearances and helping them establish themselves in League One. Following relegations, he twice served as caretaker manager before being appointed permanently.

He led Rochdale to the National League play-offs and FA Trophy semi-finals, and has since guided them into a title race, pushing for a return to League Two.



**THE DESTROYER**  
**KYRON**  
**GORDON**

Kyron Gordon began his career in the academy at Sheffield United, progressing through the youth ranks to make his senior debut in 2021. Comfortable as a composed, ball-playing centre back, he gained early experience in cup competitions before featuring in the Premier League during the 2020/21 season, before spending time out on loan, including a spell with Boston United and Boreham Wood.

He later departed Bramall Lane permanently, joining AFC Fylde on a short-term deal, before making the switch to Rochdale in 2024, a place he has called home ever since, hitting the 100 appearance mark earlier this month.

## **THE ENGINE** **CASEY** **PETTIT**

Casey Pettit began his career in the academy at West Ham United before a spell with Millwall, later joining Luton Town at 16, with whom he captained both their U18 and U21 sides. In January 2022, he gained senior experience on loan at Lewes, and was also named on the bench for Luton's Championship first team.

After signing for Maidenhead in 2023, Pettit featured in every league game last term, making over 90 appearances across two seasons, establishing himself as a consistent presence in the National League before joining Rochdale on a two-year deal.



**THE FINISHER**  
**MANI**  
**DIESERUVWE**

Mani Dieseruvwe has made an immediate impact at Rochdale, continuing his strong goalscoring form at the 15th club of his career. Born in Leeds, he came through Sheffield Wednesday's academy and had loan spells at Hyde United, Fleetwood and Chesterfield, later joining Chesterfield permanently. After further moves, including Kidderminster and Boston, he signed for Salford City in 2017. There, he enjoyed a four-year spell, scoring in the 2019 National League play-off final and netting Salford's first-ever EFL goals.

Following a loan at Oldham, he played for Tranmere, Grimsby and Halifax, winning promotion with Grimsby in 2022 and the FA Trophy with Halifax. He then joined Hartlepool, scoring a career-best 25 goals. After adding 16 more the next season, he moved to Rochdale, scoring twice on debut and reaching 24 goals, among the league's top scorers.

## **1 | Oliver Whatmuff**

### **Goalkeeper**

Oliver Whatmuff joined Rochdale on a season-long loan from Manchester City, where he has progressed through the academy, earning recognition as a commanding shot-stopper. He has represented England at youth level and featured in Premier League 2 and UEFA Youth League matches last season.

## **13 | Ben Winterbottom**

### **Goalkeeper**

Ben Winterbottom spent seven years in the Blackburn Rovers academy before departing for the youth setups at Liverpool and Brentford. Loan moves to Welling United and AFC Fylde, the latter seeing him appear over 40 times, preceded a permanent switch to Barrow, from whom he joined Rochdale on loan earlier this week.

## **20 | Tom Myles**

### **Goalkeeper**

Tom Myles joined Rochdale for the 2025/26 season after leaving Manchester United. Having progressed through the Red Devils' youth system since age six, he played for Runcorn Linnets and Leek Town on loan, before impressing in three pre-season friendlies ahead of signing a 12-month contract with Dale.

## **3 | David Tutonda**

### **Defender**

David Tutonda, a left-sided defender born in Kinshasa, joined Dale in July 2025 on a one-year deal. He began his career at Cardiff City, from whom he had loan spells at Newport County and York City, before turning out for Barnet, Bristol Rovers and Gillingham prior to his switch to Morecambe in 2024.

## **6 | Ethan Ebanks-Landell**

### **Defender**

Ethan Ebanks-Landell joined Dale in July 2022 on a two-year deal, later extended to 2026. He debuted professionally at Bury and had loan spells at Sheffield United and MK Dons, before playing over 100 League One games with Shrewsbury Town. Returning to Rochdale after a 2018/19 loan from Wolves, he now acts as club captain.

## **14 | Tobi Adebayo-Rowling**

### **Defender**

Tobi Adebayo-Rowling joined Dale in July 2024 on a one-year deal, later extended by 12 months. A Brighton & Hove Albion academy product, he played for Eastbourne Borough, Peterborough United, Sligo Rovers, Cork City, Bromley, and Ebbsfleet, before winning National League promotion with Notts County ahead of making 19 League Two appearances last season.

## **22 | Dan Moss**

### **Defender**

A Burnley academy graduate, Dan Moss captained Millwall's U23s and had loan spells at Yeovil Town and Leyton Orient before signing permanently with Woking, making over 130 National League appearances and primarily playing at right-back. He joined Rochdale on a one-year deal last summer.

## **23 | Bryce Hosannah**

### **Defender**

Bryce Hosannah became Dale's first signing of summer 2025, joining on a one-year deal. A Crystal Palace academy graduate, he later played for Leeds United, including a loan at Bradford City, and Wrexham, helping them earn promotion to the EFL. He most recently made 35 appearances for AFC Fylde.

## **25 | Callum Perry**

### **Defender**

A former Birmingham City academy player, Callum Perry progressed through Coventry's ranks and captained their U21s, before spending a loan at AFC Rushden & Diamonds. He impressed Frank Lampard during pre-season against Real Betis before joining Rochdale on an initial one-month loan.

## **29 | Bryant Bilongo**

### **Defender**

Bryant Bilongo progressed through the AFC Wimbledon and Hanworth Villa academies, later trialling at Chelsea after being spotted at Kingstonian. He signed a deal with Middlesbrough, from whom he featured out on loan at Woking and Ebbsfleet, before making made 14 League One appearances for Bristol Rovers. A loan at Harrogate Town preceded his switch to Rochdale in January.

## **33 | Sam Beckwith**

### **Defender**

A Luton Town academy graduate, Sam Beckwith won the Hatters' Young Player of the Season in 2020 before moving out on loan, with spells at Biggleswade Town and Maidenhead United. He made over 50 appearances last season, earning consecutive National League Team of the Season honours, before joining Rochdale in the summer.

## **4 | Ryan East**

### **Midfielder**

After developing at Reading, Ryan East moved to Swindon Town in 2021, making 23 appearances in their League Two play-off season, before joining Bradford City and spending the first half of last season on loan at Dale. He made the move permanent in 2023, making over 50 appearances for the club.

## **7 | Tarryn Allarakhia**

### **Midfielder**

A Leyton Orient academy product, Tarryn Allarakhia played for Aveley, Maldon & Tiptree, Colchester United, Crawley Town and Woking, before joining Wealdstone in 2022, prior to his move to Rochdale in 2024. Internationally, he represents Tanzania, appearing at the 2024 Africa Cup of Nations.

## **8 | Harvey Gilmour**

### **Midfielder**

A former Sheffield United player, Harvey Gilmour gained league experience with Tranmere and Stockport before making around 80 appearances for Halifax and helping them win the 2023 FA Trophy with a Wembley victory over Gateshead. He joined Rochdale in 2023.

## **11 | Anthony Gomez Mancini**

### **Midfielder**

Born near Lyon, France, Anthony Gomez Mancini progressed through Saint-Priest, Olympique Lyonnais, Tours, and Angers, earning France U18 and U19 caps. He later played in Burnley's U23s, before spells at Accrington Stanley and Hartlepool, making 39 appearances last season, ahead of a move to Rochdale.

## **12 | Luke Hannant**

### **Midfielder**

A Norwich academy and Cambridge United scholar, Luke Hannant played for Dereham Town and Team Northumbria, Gateshead, South Shields, Port Vale, Colchester, and Dundee, amassing over 300 professional appearances. He joined Oldham last summer, before departing on loan for Rochdale this month.

## **17 | Joe Pritchard**

### **Midfielder**

A Tottenham Hotspur academy product, Joe Pritchard went on to appear for Bolton Wanderers and Accrington Stanley - scoring 18 goals in over 100 appearances - before moving to MK Dons. He later helped Oldham secure promotion via the play-offs last season, before joining Rochdale last summer.

## **18 | Aidan Barlow**

### **Midfielder**

A Manchester United academy graduate, Aidan Barlow signed professionally in 2017 before moving on loan to Norwegian side Tromsø. He later played for Doncaster Rovers and Eastleigh, before moving to Rochdale in July 2024. Internationally, he has represented England U17 and U18 level.

## **19 | Jake Burger**

### **Midfielder**

Jake Burger joined Dale in July 2024 on a two-year deal from Luton Town. A Hatters academy graduate, he helped their U18s win the 2023 EFL Youth Alliance South East title before gaining senior experience on loan at St Albans City, making 14 appearances.

## **36 | Ed Francis**

### **Midfielder**

A Manchester City academy graduate, Ed Francis played for Almere City, Wolverhampton Wanderers, Harrogate Town, Notts County, where he won promotion, and Gateshead, where he lifted the FA Trophy. A move to Exeter in 2024 preceded a return to non-league with Rochdale last month.

## **10 | Devante Rodney**

### **Forward**

A Manchester City and Sheffield Wednesday academy graduate, Devante Rodney began his career professionally with spells at Hartlepool and Salford, from whom he enjoyed loans at Halifax and Stockport. He later finished top scorer at Port Vale before moving to Walsall.

## **21 | Connor McBride**

### **Forward**

A former Celtic and Falkirk academy player, Connor McBride had a loan at Stenhousemuir before moving to Blackburn Rovers' U21s, ahead of a return to Scotland with Queens Park. He later featured for Raith Rovers before moving back across the border with moves to Gateshead and now Rochdale.

## **30 | Manny Duku**

### **Forward**

Amsterdam-born forward Manny Duku spent time in the lower leagues of Dutch football early in his career, before making the move to England with Chesham. A prolific season at Hayes & Yeading then preceded moves to Cheltenham, Barnet, Halifax, Torquay, Raith Rovers, Inverness Caledonian Thistle, York, Manchester 62 in Gibraltar, and Wealdstone, Solihull Moors, and Tamworth.

## **38 | Tyler Smith**

### **Forward**

A Sheffield United academy graduate, Tyler Smith had loans at Barrow, Doncaster and Bristol Rovers, before joining Dale in 2020. Stints at Hull City, Oxford United, and Bradford City followed before rejoining Barrow on loan last season. This preceded a return to Rochdale in October.

## **40 | Ian Henderson**

### **Forward**

Ian Henderson, Rochdale's record goalscorer, has netted 160 goals in 486 appearances, just 45 shy of Gary Jones' club record. A former Norwich, Northampton, Luton, Colchester, and Ankaragücü player, he joined Dale in 2013, returning in 2022 after a spell at Salford. Now in his eleventh season, he became one of only five players to feature for Dale after turning 40.


Prior to this afternoon, Sutton have played twenty-three matches on this day as a senior club, ten of which have been at GGL. The first two of those were friendlies against FC Bonn in 1959 and 1964. U's lost the first by 2-1 but won the second 3-0. One other defeat was the exit to Farnborough Town in the Hitachi (Isthmian League) Cup semi final by 3-0 after extra time, thus ending a league and cup double opportunity for the '84/85 term. There have been three other home victories, the last in 1987 against Frickley Athletic in the GMV Conference. Since then, Sutton have drawn all four home matches, the last of which was thanks to a brilliant late strike by Roarie Deacon in 2017 as U's held up Lincoln City's passage to the National League title. The home record is W4 D4 L2.

The first six matches on this day were all played away, the first a South Suburban League (West) defeat at Summerstown, 0-2. The fifth of those matches is detailed below. The most recent fixture saw a SUFC academy side defeated by 5-0 in the Surrey Senior Cup by Metropolitan Police while in 2009, Dover Athletic confirmed their Isthmian title at Crabble winning by 6-0 as U's capitulated in Paul Doswell's first season in charge. U's away record is W3 D2 L8.

## The Match

On this day in 1936 U's contested an Athenian League fixture with Uxbridge. This match was played at the RAF Stadium. The weather was fine but this still failed to attract the locals and a poor crowd witnessed what would be a goal fest. Neither side was enjoying AL life although U's had played seven matches fewer than their hosts who had lost thirteen of their nineteen matches and sat second from bottom in the table. Cup football and the weather resulted in this being United's first AL match of 1936.



Sutton skipper Bill Shepherd opted to play with the wind advantage in the first half and centre-forward Richard Tarrant forced the home 'keeper into two early saves. But in the tenth minute he netted, heading home from a Tipper Pratt cross. Pratt missed an acceptable chance soon after but the home attack, including Cyril Britchford who would be a pivotal figure during Sutton's WWII seasons, was nigh on impotent. Tarrant doubled his and Sutton's tally in the 15th minute after running on to Tommy Delventhal's through pass. Basil Solly and Tarrant both found the woodwork with shots while Shepherd cleared a certain goal off the line.

U's extended their lead immediately after the break when Dusty Miller, inches from the touchline and just inside Uxbridge's half, fired a high shot towards goal and the ball held up in the wind to find the top corner of the net. Outrageous. Sam Manners, struggling with an injury, saw his effort blocked by former U's centre-half, J Sancaster. The hosts had a foothold when J Whistler first collided with Ralph Carr and then put the ball in his own net. United went 4-1 up when Manners

accepted the chance made by Pratt. In the 80th minute, Long fired in direct from a free-kick and five minutes later, Shepherd and Whistler messed up to allow Jones a simple chance and place Sutton under considerable pressure for the last five minutes; 4-3 it finished. A week later, Sutton completed the AL double over Uxbridge by winning 5-2 at GGL as they commenced a fifteen-match April.

### The Player

Scoring for Sutton as U's preserved their unbeaten run in to the National League South season, coming back from 2-0 down to Whitehawk in 2016, was Bedsente Gomis. The French midfielder made his debut against FC Romania in the FA Cup on 27th September 2014 registering his first goal in early December at Basingstoke Town. Bedse had signed from Southend United but before that had started his career in his native France with the likes of Lens and Almeria in their B teams.



He made 34 appearances scoring four times that '14/15 season and was voted Supporters' Club Player of the Year. The following term Bedsente missed the early weeks of the season not returning until mid-September, only to be dismissed for the second time as a Sutton player (the first was overturned) in just his second match at Ebbsfleet United. However, he was an integral part of the squad as U's enjoyed a twenty-six match unbeaten run as they overhauled Ebbsfleet for the NLS title. A mobile, attacking midfielder, Bedse enjoyed a tackle or two but ended that successful season with another seven goals.

The following season, Sutton's first back at National League level since 2000, Bedsente only missed three league matches and just one of the club's historic FA Cup run. That would be his last season at GGL as he joined Barrow for the 2017/18 term before returning south to join Dover Athletic and then link up again with Paul Doswell at Havant & Waterlooville. He returned to France for the end of the 2020/21 campaign but was soon back on the English south coast at Gosport Borough. While at Sutton he made 129 appearances scoring fifteen goals, although that should have been sixteen but he was denied a clear goal at Dover during the 2016/17 season (Lampard for England v Germany levels).

### The Programme

We head back to the early 1950s for today's programme. A friendly as Isthmians Kingstonian hosted Athenian Sutton in 1953. Usually in this era, the K's programme print was red but for this it was black to mark the passing of Queen Mary, in Coronation year too. The inside cover held adverts including for Jordan's Stores that sought new registered customers.

Page three had a top banner with brief details of current club officials and below, Club Notes, the opening paragraph a sombrely worded tribute to the royal bereavement. The notes also described K's Easter programme and the visit of two Northern League clubs Northern Nomads and Shildon Colliery Welfare while the last paragraph warned those spectators of likely police

intervention for those using local household gardens as a short cut out of the ground. The middle spread of this eight pager held the teams layout surrounded by more adverts, Bentalls prominent. Over the page, sandwiched between an advert at the top and bottom, were K's results and the Isthmian League tables for senior and second teams. There was also an A section table which Kingstonian led and they were going well in the other two as well. The inside back page and back cover were full of adverts, although the inside page was separated with a narrow space reserved for W Korner esq, "The Gay Adventure", Hersham. Standard fare for the era for 3d (1.5p).

## **SUFC v Rochdale AFC**

'Dale make their fourth visit to Sutton this afternoon not only looking for their first win but their first goal. In March 2022, Sutton won by 3-0 and eight months later by 1-0 – both in EFL L2. Last season's National League game finished 1-0 thanks to a late own goal by Kyron Gordon. Sutton have lost all four of their visits to what I prefer to call Spotland including the 1-0 reverse earlier this season. Of the others, ten-man Sutton fought back from 0-2 to 2-2 before losing to a fine last minute strike in October 2021 but were well beaten by already relegated Rochdale 4-1 in April 2023. Last season another last minute goal gave 'Dale a 2-1 win.

Top scorer for Sutton against Rochdale is Enzo Boldewijn with three goals, his only competitive goals for the club.

One player to play for both clubs was centre-back Alan Reeves who spent three years at Rochdale in the early 1990s but played one match for Sutton, at Newport County, in October 2006. More recently Kevin Amankwaah, a member of our 2016 championship squad, and Sam Hart have worn both teams' colours, along with Charlie Waller, who played four times on loan at Rochdale earlier this season, his second taste of National League football after his successful stint with Sutton last term. In addition, Danny Cashman, who joined from Crawley Town this week, appeared 23 times on loan at Rochdale in 2021/22.

## Sutton United Football Club is delighted to confirm the signing of Danny Cashman from League Two side Crawley Town.

The forward becomes the U's final signing of the 2025/26 campaign, putting pen to paper on a loan deal until the end of the season ahead of the National League's registration deadline, and reunites with Chris Agutter after linking up at Worthing last term.

Hailing from Crawley, Cashman joined Brighton & Hove Albion at the age of 12 following a successful trial, and went on to spend almost a decade at the AMEX, rising through the ranks to captain the Under-18s ahead of a permanent departure by mutual consent, opting instead to join Coventry City in 2021.

Two years in the Midlands saw him enjoy successful loan spells at Rochdale, Walsall and Altrincham, before returning to Sussex in order to join Worthing, a place where he soon began to enjoy his best form.

The 25-year old scored 28 goals in 79 games for the Rebels, notably firing Agutter's side to a record points tally last term as well as to the National League South play-off final the year before, where they were defeated by a Braintree Town team which included Jack Sims.

His form in the sixth tier led to much interest last summer, and saw him make the jump up two divisions to join hometown club Crawley, where he has featured five times; injury problem limiting him to just a handful of appearances.

Nonetheless, he had established himself as one of the most talented players in all of non-league while at Worthing, with the lure of a reunion with his former boss enough to convince him to join the U's ahead of the final seven game of the season.

Internationally, he has also represented England at Under-16 and Under-17 level.

After securing his final signing of the season, Agutter said:


*"Delighted to have the opportunity to work with Cash again, we've already had some great times together at a previous club and I look forward to plenty more whilst at Sutton United."*

## Sutton United Academy 3-0 Boreham Wood Academy

Sutton strengthened their position at the top of the National League Academy South Division with an assured performance, taking full advantage of difficult weather conditions to secure a three-goal lead by half time. Playing with a strong wind behind them, they opened the scoring in the 17th minute when Derrell Ashia won the ball in midfield and found Kai McKenzie, who set up Rashaad Drysdale to finish confidently across the goalkeeper.

Boreham Wood had a brief opportunity to respond but failed to convert, and Sutton continued to control possession. Drysdale remained influential, first assisting McKenzie for a close-range finish, then combining again to set up Jayden Keteku, who produced a composed strike into the far corner despite heavy pressure.

After the break, Boreham Wood improved with the wind in their favour, but Sutton's defence remained solid. Goalkeeper Klevis Muca made an important save from a free kick, and aside from a few long-range efforts, the visitors created little danger. Sutton looked comfortable throughout the second half and nearly extended their lead late on, only for the goalkeeper to deny Drysdale.

The result leaves Sutton two points clear of Dartford, while Southend remain in contention despite dropping points in a draw.



U's now don't play in this competition until Wednesday 8th April, when they host Eastleigh to begin a run of nine NLAS games in thirty days, but in the meantime have three EFL Youth Alliance games away to Orient (1st April) and at home to Wimbledon (28th March) and Gillingham (4th April). The two home games will be at Knaphill FC, kick off 10.30.

The Division F side lost 4-1 at Bromley, Alfie Ang scoring U's goal. They now don't have a game until the 22nd April.


## Combined Counties League Cup Third Round Draw

Cat joined the club in July 2009 on a part-time basis, volunteering alongside club Physio Bobby Childs as the club went on to win the Isthmian League in 2011. Her support was instrumental in keeping the team fit during five years in Conference South, culminating in the 2016 league title. Cat continued to be involved for the next five years seasons, including the historic FA Cup run of 2016/17 of National South, before taking on a full-time position as the club won the National League and was promoted into the Football League, enjoying Wembley for the 2022 EFL Trophy Final.

# Tony Dolbear




The Voice of Sutton United for almost four decades, Tony has been being responsible for the matchday PA at more than a thousand games. His inclusion into the Hall of Fame recognizes his immense contribution to promoting the club and advising supporters of everything from transfer news to cancelled trains.

After watching the 1968 Amateur Cup semi-final, Tony became a regular follower in 1973 and joined the Supporters' Club Committee in 1979, helping run the Club Shop, before joining the Management Committee in 1988 as Press Secretary, with responsibility for the PA system and the award-winning match programme, as well as hosting media on match days. In his first season Tony announced the famous winning goal against Coventry City and in 2017 was still going strong for Jamie Collins' winning penalty against Leeds United.

He still commentates at most away games and has contributed match reports to various newspapers for forty years, and was responsible for the club website from 2008 until 2024.

Tony has been a contributor to numerous club books and also served as Company Secretary between 2014 and 2019.

# Jimmy Dack



Jimmy's election to the Hall of Fame reflects an association with the club spanning more than 30 years. Jimmy came to the club's attention when playing in Epsom & Ewell's youth team, making his Sutton debut against Telford in August 1990 and winning a Bob Lord Trophy medal in 1991. Spells with Crawley and Carshalton followed before Jimmy rejoined the U's in 1995, holding down a regular place for three years before another brief sojourn, at Aldershot, returning to Sutton to feature in the Isthmian League championship winning side of 1998/99. In total Jimmy scored 35 goals in 264 appearances.

Jimmy took over as Caretaker Manager in April 2008 but declined the offer of the full-time role. He then enjoyed a successful coaching career, culminating in promotion into the EFL as Assistant Manager with Newport County, where he progressed to the Manager's role in 2015.

Jimmy returned to Sutton in January 2022 as Director of the football academy, steering it to the coveted Category 3 status.

# BYRON

**"I'm Back, Older  
And Ready To Get  
Going"**

Toby Byron spoke with excitement after completing a return to Sutton, a side with whom he spent a brief portion of youth career back in 2019/20.

Now 24 years old, the defender has developed into a powerful, versatile player who has played at a number of levels within non-league, most recently with Worthing, where he has been a key part of the Rebels title hopes in the National League South.

However, the lure of National League football and a reunion with Chris Agutter – the man who initially brought him to Woodside Park last summer – proved too good to turn down, with Byron completing a permanent switch to Gander Green Lane ahead of this Thursday's transfer deadline.

Byron's senior Sutton career began in the stands as he watched on as his new teammates were defeated by Truro City on the weekend, before taking part in his first training session the following Monday ahead of the U's trip to Eastleigh, with preparation continuing amidst a hectic few days for the defender.

He subsequently completed his media duties before sitting down with Sutton United FCtv to discuss his move, describing the past few days as a whirlwind as he sealed his comeback to the club.

*"It feels great," he said. "Obviously it was a few years ago that I was here, but I'm back, older, and ready to get going."*

*"It's been exactly that, a bit of a whirlwind," he said. "But I'm just excited to get it over the line. I've been here before, so I'm excited to get back into it and hopefully there are good things to come this season."*

After taking part in his first training session since rejoining, following on from his first impressions last weekend, he said the environment felt instantly familiar.



*"It was good," he said. "It reminded me of the old sessions that we used to do [under Agutter at Worthing], so it wasn't a stranger to me."*

*"The boys were nice as well, welcoming me in, so it was a good first day."*

*"Everyone was very welcoming and the fans were good as well [on Saturday]. All the boys said hello and asked how I've been, so it's been really positive."*

Reflecting on his early career, he explained how his initial move to Sutton came after being spotted during trial matches following his release from Luton Town, who he had developed with until the end of his scholarship in 2019.

*"I believe I was playing in trial games and I think some of the scouts here saw me," he said.*

*"I came in and played with the under-21s for a while, then started training with the first team. I also went out on loan and played a couple of senior cup games, which was a great experience."*

*"I'll be honest, I don't remember loads," he added. "But I remember it being my first proper big crowd, which was a great experience and something I learned a lot from."*

He later experienced different styles of football during spells away from England, something he believes helped his development, with stints in Greece and France giving him a fresh, unique experience, even if it was something of a daunting prospect at the time.

*"It was definitely different," he said.*

*"There was a lot more aggression and physicality in one place, while in Greece it was more technical. I think I gained a lot of experience from both."*

*"It was a bit of back and forth on whether I should go, but I don't regret it. I learned a lot and I wouldn't change my journey."*

After returning to England, spells with Hornchurch and Folkestone Invicta preceded perhaps his most successful season at the time, winning two awards at the end of his only campaign with Wingate & Finchley, seeing him progress through non-league football saw him earn individual recognition, which helped rebuild his confidence ahead of a big move up to the sixth tier with Worthing.

*"It was great," he said. "It was the first time I could really play freely and I think it showed in my performances."*

*"The coach there helped me a lot and gave me the confidence to push on. I think it took me a while to adjust to the league, but I know I adapt quickly and I think I showed that. I started to understand how to really show my skill set."*
