# CHRIS'S COLUMN

**A warm welcome to Kevin Maher, his staff, players, Southend United's Board of Directors, and most importantly supporters - I hope you have a safe journey to and from Gander Green Lane for today's National League contest.**

Today is another tough test in terms of the opponent's league position, but as performances and results have shown it's these tests that have brought the best out in our young group.

I'm sure the supporters are at times just as frustrated as me at our up and down performances, Rochdale we were magnificent, Aldershot horrible, Scunthorpe superb, Truro horrific.....but it comes with the territory, we have the youngest squad in the league and my goodness it shows in the consistency of our performances. We know what we need to do and we also know that we have a very talented group on their day, the challenge is adding more senior players to help the group. # CHIEF OPERATING OFFICER, TIM ALLISON



## TIM TALKS

**We welcome this afternoon's visitors to the VBS Community Stadium, Southend. Another club we have got to know in recent years following their recent troubles and relegation to the National League in 2021.**

That of course was the year of our ascent to the English Football League. Swapping places meant we didn't play in League Two, but on our relegation and return we met for the first time, and in our second season back at this level this represents the fourth meeting between the clubs.

Last Saturday was a match of pride as we took the league leaders to being minutes away from a defeat. Minutes that turned out to be two more than expected seeing a defeat for us instead of a draw that was the minimum deserved. That wasn't diminished by the surprise defeat of Rochdale by Morecambe on Friday. That missing point though would have put us ten points clear of the drop zone as it stands before kick-off. Nine should be enough with just four games remaining, and will be even if we are defeated this afternoon should Morecambe and Brackley lose. Truro are now relegated, and Braintree are unable to pass us even if not relegated yet themselves.

The division is so tight – as it always seems to be each season – with only one other club in the bottom half winning on Friday. Last weekend we were as high as 12th in the live “as it stands” table, but kick-off today in 17th place, still above Aldershot having shared our points on Friday, and just behind Altrincham who we next face at the VBS Community Stadium.

The three previous meetings between the clubs have finished with a win for each side and a draw. The most recent of those being the defeat over the Christmas period when a penalty was, some might say harshly, conceded at Roots Hall. Even more harshly – and later admitted – was the scorer not being the original taker from the spot, but a player who had encroached early into the box to ensure he was first to the rebound. Our win was away from home and one of the highlights from the previous season, turning over a strong side that went on to reach the play-off final.

Few players have turned out for both clubs. Three could be in view today though. Ben Goodliffe started on the bench on Friday but would no doubt relish the opportunity to be playing at his previous home – especially as he missed out on the return fixture due to a suspension for allegedly pulling an opponent’s hair. For the Shrimpers another potential returnee is Charley Kendall. He never really got an opportunity on his short stay at Sutton, featuring just seven times in an amber shirt, but would like most strikers be looking to score against a former club now as an opponent. For the U’s though it is Jack Sims facing his former employers, and he will be looking to be play as well as he did in December, this time turning out for the winning side whilst frustrating our opponents.

Whilst the League season is rapidly drawing to its close two interesting cup fixtures are approaching. The semi-final of the Surrey Senior Cup is to be played on Tuesday week, a date having been agreed by Farnham who we now know to be our opponents. Few would have predicted back in July that they would be our most played opposition and most frequently visited ground this season. In May our Academy team are playing against Halifax in the final of the National League Academy Cup. This is at the England St George’s Park Training Camp. I hope to see as many of you as possible at both games. In the meantime let’s hope we are seeing three points this afternoon from the possible twelve remaining to confirm our mid-table league finish.

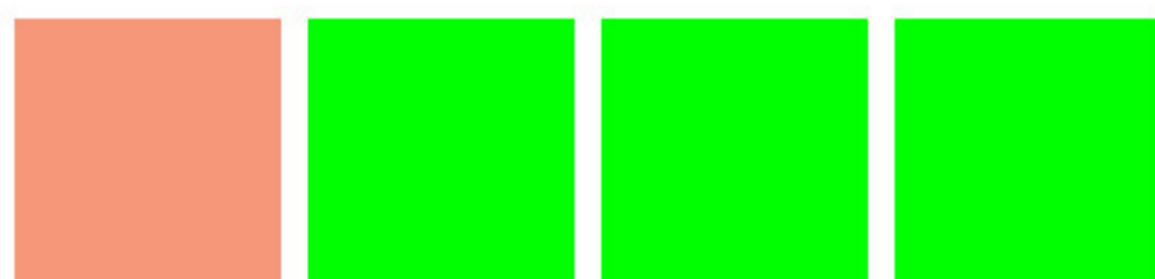

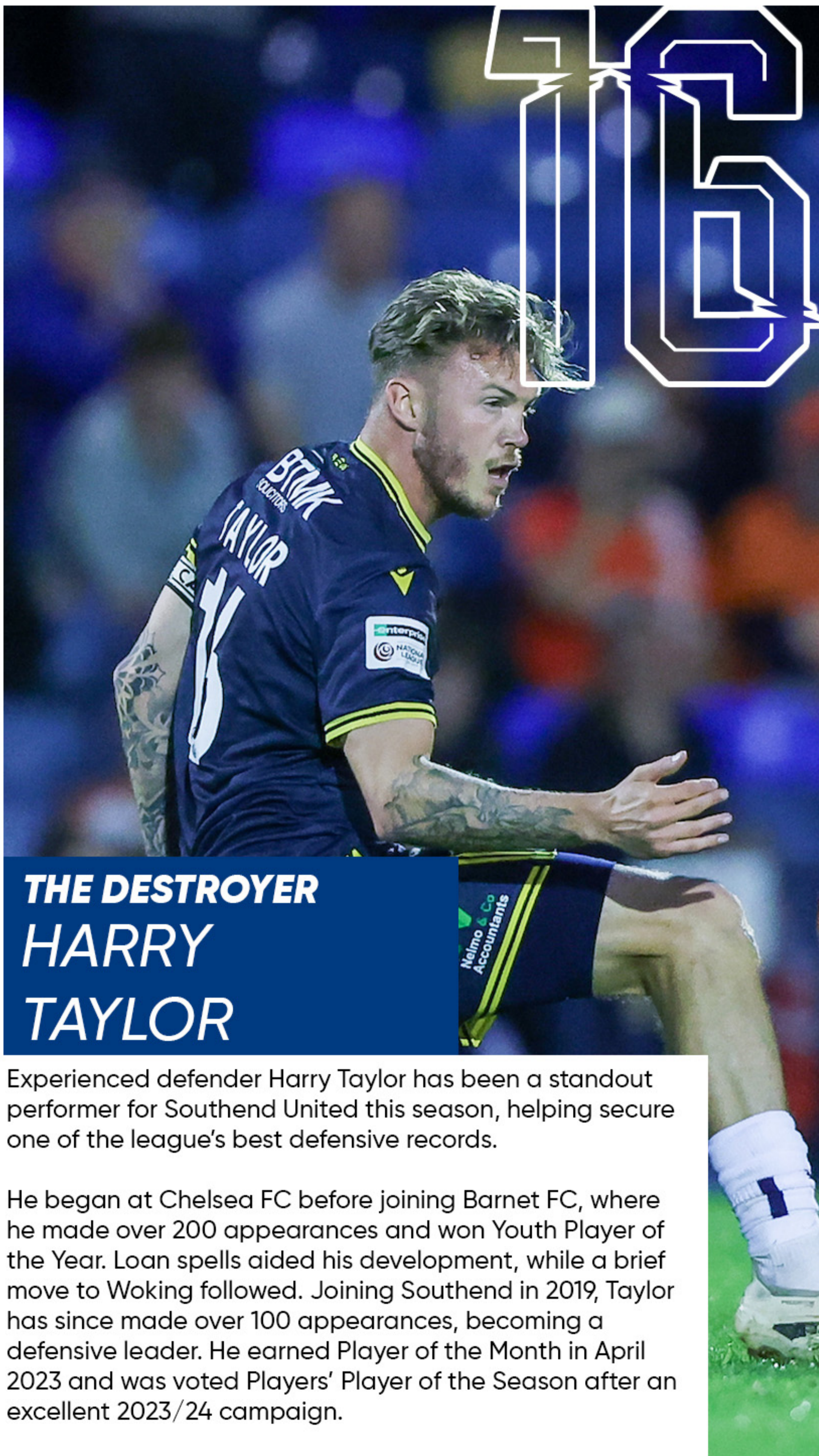
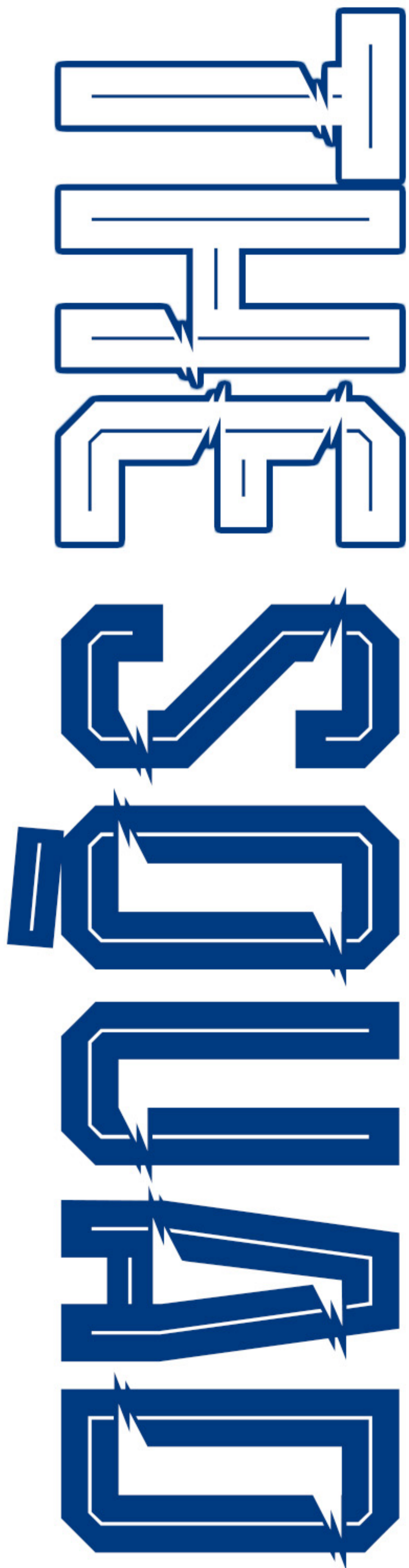


Former midfielder Kevin Maher is in his fourth season managing Southend United, the only senior club he has led. A product of Tottenham Hotspur, he joined Southend in 1998, spending a decade at Roots Hall. A near ever-present, he became captain, made over 400 appearances, and led the club to back-to-back promotions from League Two to the Championship.

After a brief loan at Gillingham FC, Maher played for several clubs including Oldham Athletic, Dagenham & Redbridge, Bray Wanderers, and Whitehawk before retiring in 2015 following a short spell at Chelmsford City.

He later returned to Southend in coaching roles, managed Chelmsford, and had a stint at Bristol Rovers, briefly taking charge. Maher rejoined Southend as Head Coach, succeeding Phil Brown, and has since kept the club competitive despite off-field challenges, steadily pushing them toward the play-off places.





**THE DESTROYER**  
**HARRY**  
**TAYLOR**

Experienced defender Harry Taylor has been a standout performer for Southend United this season, helping secure one of the league's best defensive records.

He began at Chelsea FC before joining Barnet FC, where he made over 200 appearances and won Youth Player of the Year. Loan spells aided his development, while a brief move to Woking followed. Joining Southend in 2019, Taylor has since made over 100 appearances, becoming a defensive leader. He earned Player of the Month in April 2023 and was voted Players' Player of the Season after an excellent 2023/24 campaign.



**THE CREATOR**  
**GUS**  
**SCOTT-MORRISS**

Flying wing-back Gus Scott-Morriss has become a key figure for Southend United, widely regarded as one of the best players in non-league football. He started his career at Royston Town, making over 150 appearances across even years and helping them win promotion in 2016/17, before spending a season at Hemel Hempstead Town. He joined Southend in 2022 and has since played over 100 games, earning multiple Team of the Season and Player of the Year honours, notably with an incredible 2024/25 campaign, scoring 17 goals from wing-back.



**THE FINISHER**  
**ANDY**  
**DALLAS**

Experienced forward Andy Dallas has impressed since joining Southend United, initially on loan from Barnsley.

Born in Glasgow, Dallas began his career at Rangers, gaining experience on loan at Stenhousemuir and Greenock Morton before moving to Cambridge United. After a spell at Weymouth, he joined Solihull Moors, scoring 32 goals in 77 games, earning a move up the leagues following a successful loan at Chesterfield.

Dallas scored six goals in 12 games for the Spireites, helping them reach the National League play-off final, which led to a 2023 move to Barnsley, before loan spells at Kilmarnock, Oldham, Barrow and Morecambe preceded a permanent switch to Southend, where he has scored 15 goals this season.

### **1 | Owen Mason**

#### **Goalkeeper**

Owen Mason joined the Shrimpers on loan from Mansfield Town in January 2026. A Stags academy graduate, he has had loan spells at Guiseley, Farsley Celtic, Wexford, and Gateshead. The Irish youth international notably saved a penalty on his Shrimpers debut in a 1-0 Isuzu FA Trophy win over Chatham Town.

### **30 | Collin Andeng Ndi**

#### **Goalkeeper**

Collin Andeng Ndi signed professional terms with the Blues in September 2021 after being spotted by Steve Tilson at South Essex College. The Italian-born goalkeeper debuted in the FA Trophy versus Dorking Wanderers and made his league debut against Stockport County. In 2022/23, he kept 13 clean sheets in 23 games, winning Young Player of the Season.

### **3 | Nathan Ralph**

#### **Defender**

Nathan Ralph joined Southend from Dundee in 2019, but his first season was disrupted by a shoulder dislocation. Formerly of Peterborough, Yeovil, Newport, and Woking, he won Dundee's 2018/19 Player of the Year. Despite later cruciate ligament injury, the Shrimpers' skipper has surpassed 200 appearances, scoring 13 goals.

### **6 | Ben Goodliffe**

#### **Defender**

Ben Goodliffe joined the Shrimpers permanently from Colchester United in the summer after a loan spell last term. A former Tottenham trainee, he played for Boreham Wood, Wolverhampton Wanderers U21s, Dagenham & Redbridge, and most notably Sutton, making 182 appearances and earning promotion to League Two with the U's. He has over 275 senior appearances, scoring in the 2025 play-off semi-final for Southend.

### **15 | Joe Gubbins**

#### **Defender**

A Queens Park Rangers academy product, Joe Gubbins played for Oxford and Aldershot and made 37 League Two appearances for Accrington Stanley in 2023/24, all on loan, either side of a loan spell at Southend, with whom he joined permanently in 2024. Gubbins has over 60 Southend appearances, known for defensive grit and technical skill.

### **26 | James Golding**

#### **Defender**

James Golding joined the Shrimpers on a short-term loan from Oxford United after spells at Banbury, Dartford, and Maidenhead. A former AFC Wimbledon academy player, he has nine appearances for Oxford and scored across previous loans. He netted three goals in 17 games for the Shrimpers before returning on loan in February 2026.

### **33 | Harry Boyes**

#### **Defender**

Harry Boyes joined the Blues in summer 2025 as a free agent after leaving Sheffield United. A Manchester City and Blades academy graduate, he has had loans at Solihull Moors, Wycombe, Lincoln, and Fleetwood, playing over 60 EFL games, and has gone on to be a regular left wing-back this season, scoring his first goal in February 2026.

### **7 | Jack Bridge**

#### **Midfielder**

Jack Bridge returned to Roots Hall in summer 2021 after three years away from his hometown team. After earlier spells at Southend, Northampton, Carlisle, Concord Rangers, and Bromley, he had a standout 2022/23 season with 13 goals, including braces against York City and Dagenham & Redbridge. The 28-year-old midfielder has over 200 appearances and 30 goals for Southend.

### **8 | Noor Husin**

#### **Midfielder**

Noor Husin joined the Blues permanently from Dartford in January 2022 on a two-and-a-half-year deal. The Afghanistan international, formerly with Reading, Crystal Palace, Notts County, and Stevenage, has made 150 Southend appearances, scoring six goals. He debuted for his country in 2019 but suffered a season-ending ACL injury in September 2025.

### **10 | Sam Austin**

#### **Midfielder**

Sam Austin joined Southend United after leaving Notts County following the 2024/25 season. Previously captain at Kidderminster Harriers, he led the National League in assists in 2022/23, helping Notts County earn EFL promotion via the play-offs. Austin scored on his Southend debut in a 3-0 opening-day win over Gateshead.

### **17 | Cav Miley**

#### **Midfielder**

Cav Miley joined the Shrimpers in summer 2022 from Eastleigh. Hailing from Jersey, he was spotted whilst playing for St Pauls and moved across the channel to make 178 league appearances for the Spitfires, scoring seven goals. Miley quickly became a key midfielder at Southend, winning Player of the Year and Goal of the Season for a solo strike versus Torquay, and has made 150 appearances.

### **19 | Leon Pavillon**

#### **Midfielder**

Leon Parillon progressed through Oxford United's academy, assisting on his senior debut. After three league appearances, he joined Slough Town, making 65 appearances before signing for Southend in January 2025. He debuted in a 2-1 win over Aldershot Town and scored at Wembley in the 2025 play-off final.

## 22 | Keenan Appiah-Forson

### Midfielder

A West Ham United academy graduate, Keenan Appiah-Forson won a UEFA Conference League medal and spent 2023/24 on loan at Dagenham & Redbridge. The energetic box-to-box midfielder has made over 75 appearances for the Shrimpers, scoring three goals, since joining the club in August 2024.

## 23 | James Morton

### Midfielder

James Morton joined the Shrimpers in December 2023. A Bristol City academy graduate, he had three loan spells at Bath City and played for Forest Green Rovers, Grimsby Town, and Gillingham in the EFL. Morton has made over 90 Southend appearances, scoring once in April 2024 against Boreham Wood.

## 25 | Noah Mawene

### Midfielder

Noah Mawene, son of former Preston defender Youl Mawene, joined the Shrimpers on loan from Preston North End in March 2025. He captained Preston's youth teams and made his senior debut in December 2022 against Blackburn Rovers. Mawene had a 16-game loan at Newport County in League Two during the 2024/25 season.

## 28 | Oliver Coker

### Midfielder

Oli Coker, a lifelong Blues supporter, joined Southend's youth system in 2011 and debuted in October 2020 in the EFL Trophy. He made his league debut in 2020/21 and impressed in 2023/24 with goals against Oldham and Dagenham. Coker has over 110 Southend appearances, scoring 14 goals.

## 11 | Josh Walker

### Forward

Josh Walker joined the Blues on a two-year deal in July 2024 from League One side Burton Albion. He previously played in the National League for Barnet and Dagenham, scoring 32 goals in 106 games, including a hat-trick in 2022/23. Walker has over 70 Southend appearances, netting 13 goals.

## 14 | Tom Hopper

### Forward

Tom Hopper returned to Southend in January 2025, five years after his first spell. A product of the Boston and Leicester academies, he initially joined in 2018 from Scunthorpe, scoring seven goals in 14 games before an ACL injury. After stints at Lincoln City and Colchester United, Hopper has scored 15 goals across both spells for the Shrimpers.

## 18 | Slavi Spasov

### Forward

Slavi Spasov, an Oxford United academy graduate, moved from Bulgaria to the UK and became the youngest goalscorer in Oxford's history with a debut penalty. After scoring 18 goals for Slough Town in 2024/25, he joined Southend, netting his first goal at Wealdstone and a last-minute winner at Yeovil Town in 2025.

## 21 | Harry Cardwell

### Forward

Harry Cardwell rejoined Southend on loan from Forest Green Rovers in December 2025, marking his second spell at the club. A former Scotland U21 international, he progressed through Hull City and Reading, then played for Grimsby Town, Chorley, and Stockport County. Cardwell scored 27 goals in 81 National League games for the Shrimpers and netted on his second home debut against Truro City.

## 24 | Charley Kendall

### Forward

Charley Kendall joined the Shrimpers in December 2024 on an 18-month deal from Woking. An Eastbourne-born forward, he progressed through QPR's academy and had spells at his hometown club, Lincoln City, Sutton United, Bromley, and Dagenham & Redbridge. Kendall scored seven goals in 35 games for Woking before netting Southend's winner in the 2025 play-off eliminator round against Rochdale.

# HISTORIC RAMBLINGS

## Three from the 6th April

This afternoon U's hit the quarter century of matches on this date as a senior club. Fourteen have been at home starting with the first on 06/04, a friendly in 1912 with Herne Hill Rovers (3-3) played on a ground at Rose Hill. The most recent was in 2024 when Paddy Madden netted his second hat-trick of the season against Sutton in a 3-1 win for Stockport County. U's best home win was a Surrey Senior Cup semi-final with Croydon Amateurs in 1967 (5-0) while the heaviest defeat came against Tooting & Mitcham United in the Athenian League in 1953, 1-5. U's record is W5 D5 L4.

Away from Sutton the biggest win is featured below while the heaviest defeat came at Hitchin Town in the AL in 1957, 1-5. In 1978, a midweek trip to Bishops Stortford produced one of the finest (if not the finest) individual goals I have seen from a Sutton player, Norman Milne's virtuoso second half goal as U's won by 2-1 in the Isthmian League. One other stand out result was the 2-0 defeat of IL reigning champions Enfield in 1971 by 2-0; Trevor Bladon scoring both goals. U's record is W5 L5. No draws.

## The Match

The first season after WWII was heading for its finale as U's hunted a second Athenian League title. This visit to Bromley found Sutton in fourth place, six points behind leaders Tooting & Mitcham but with three games in hand (with two points for a win). The hosts were way behind in their AL fixtures having played just half of their games and the thirteen outstanding matches were scheduled to be played in a matter of nineteen days.

U's left winger Arthur Crisp showed some fine early form with a mazy run but it wasn't until the 18th minute that they scored when Charlie Vaughan fed Jack Novis who fired home. After Ken Scott had twice gone close the hosts equalised on the half hour mark, Stone netting after Ralph Carr had parried a shot. From the re-start Vaughan sent Novis away and he carried the ball for thirty yards before netting his second with a powerful drive.



Bromley started the second half on the attack but the United defence held firm and, on the break, in the 60th minute, Vaughan netted after holding off his marker. Two minutes later Viles held off H Shrimpton to bring the score to 2-3 but a move involving Steve Callegari and Novis was finished off by Vaughan. From this point Sutton had total control and Vaughan completed his treble while Callegari rounded things off with a tidy back header from a Novis cross; 6-2 to U's.

Vaughan's second goal was his 50th of the campaign as the title race began in earnest.

## The Player

Netting from a penalty in a 3-3 Athenian draw at home to Walton & Hersham on this day in 1963 was centre-forward Paul Bates. He was brought to GGL by then manager Sid Cann, under whom he had enjoyed a successful spell in the mid to late 1950s at Wycombe Wanderers and later a brief spell at Tooting & Mitcham United, but he started the '62/63 season with Hendon. Paul made his debut on Boxing Day 1962, coincidentally against W&H, Sutton losing 4-3. Prior to that he had made a number of reserve team appearances having joined the club in October. The winter of 1963 was one of the harshest on record and thus Paul's next appearance wasn't until 16th February, a scoring one, as United began their Amateur Cup run with a 4-1 defeat of Clapton. The well-built but mobile centre-forward who had power in both left and right feet would lose his place later in the season but featured in the AC final at Wembley and the Surrey Senior final, both ending in defeat.

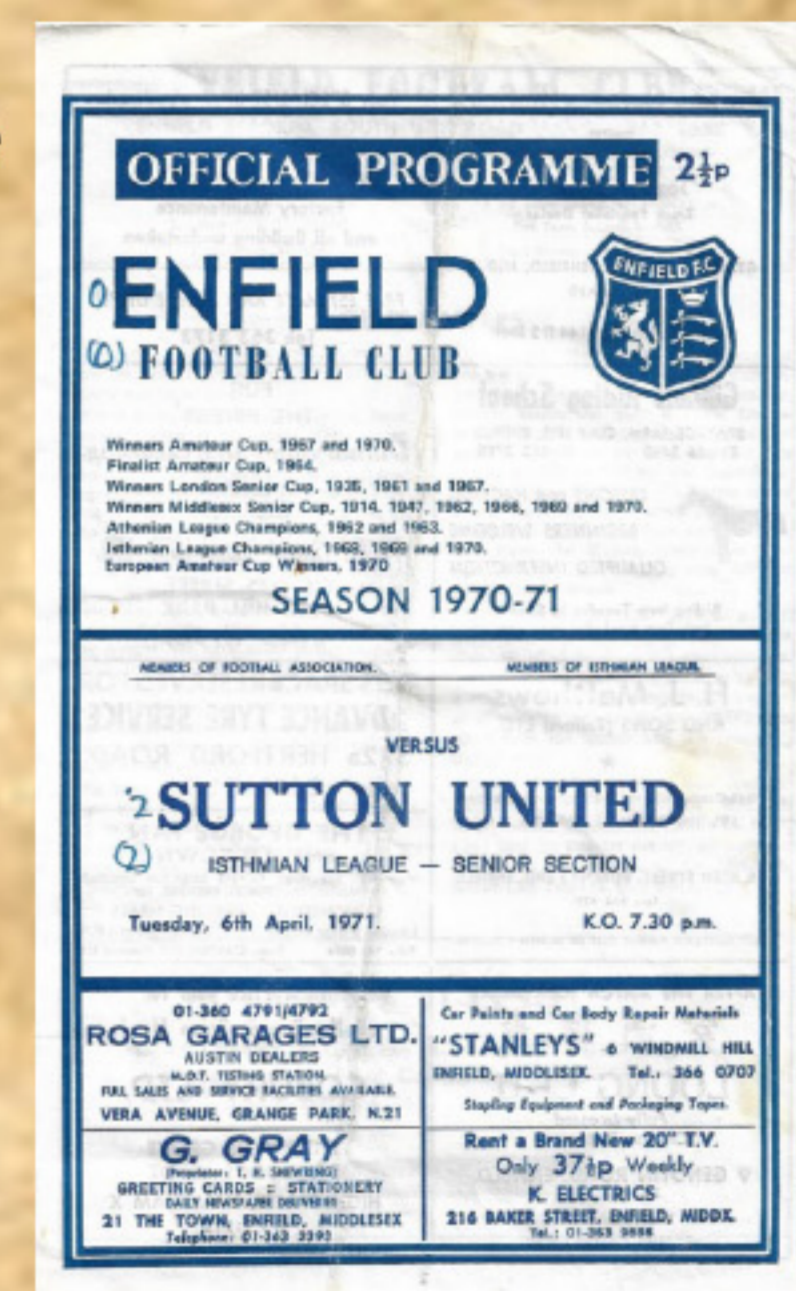


The following season was the club's first in the Isthmian League. Paul missed just four matches, all late in the season, and was again part of the team that lost a SSC final. He enjoyed a fine festive season scoring consecutive hat-tricks against Woking and then Enfield, the first on Boxing Day, the second two days later. While at Sutton he represented the Berks & Bucks FA (somewhat odd considering he left Wycombe in 1962). By the end of that season Paul had played 69 times for Sutton scoring an impressive 39 goals. He returned to Wycombe the following season staying there for three seasons.

In his two spells at Wycombe he was capped by England amateurs and played in the 1957 Amateur Cup final; he was on the losing side on that occasion too.

## The Programme

Back to 1971 and a match briefly mentioned above. The Enfield programme had changed little for a couple of decades, the same size, blue print and eight pages (cover right; please excuse my nine year old scribbling). The inside cover contained eight square adverts including one for Gillians Riding School (horses) based on a local farm while riders could get their jodhpurs cleaned by Purity LDRy Ltd in Bush Hill Park. Page three was topped by a section displaying club officials and underneath were club notes giving a brief resumé of Sutton's IL season as well as notice of Enfield's involvement in the London and Middlesex Senior Cup finals. The teams were presented across the middle spread surrounded by adverts including one for greyhound racing at Walthamstow Stadium, "The Stow". Page six was mainly adverts but in the middle the Supporters' Club advertised the new edition of Attack, the EFCSC magazine for 5p. Described as excellent (and it was) and one of the first such publications by an amateur club. The inside back cover was again adverts but in the middle were IL senior and reserve section tables, U's a point behind Wycombe in a title struggle that would see U's miss out by one point, ending Enfield's three season grip on the IL. The back page held Enfield's fixtures and results and a list of their goal scorers headed by Ken Gray. Standard fare for 2.5p.

## SUFC v SUFC

Prior to last season, competitive football between the two clubs was restricted to the Capital League, a competition considered as reserve team level. Last season U's won at Roots Hall by 3-1, arguably the club's best result of the 2024/25 campaign as the hosts struggled for early term form. However, by the time they arrived at GGL on the corresponding Saturday to today, Southend were pushing for a highest place as possible in the play-offs and will count themselves unfortunate to only have taken a point with Ashley Nadesan's 94th minute goal cancelling out former Sutton favourite Ben Goodliffe's 33rd minute opener. Of course, back in December U's lost to a Gus Scott-Morriss goal after Jack Sims had saved Harry Cardwell's penalty; no comment about the initial awarding of said spot kick.

As well as Ben, other players to have appeared for both clubs include goalkeepers Steve Arnold, Carl Emberson and Jack Sims, midfielder Nicky Bailey and left winger Wilf Solari (1950s). Henry Sandat and Matt Rush both started their football careers at Southend while in Southend's current squad Charley Kendall had a brief loan spell here.

# INTERNATIONAL

ROUND-UP

**Jermaine Francis and Dillon De Silva were both in action during the March international break.**

Francis started twice for Grenada as the Spice Boys fell to successive defeats in the FIFA Series.

The North Americans began their campaign with a trip to Stade Amahoro in Kigali, Rwanda, taking on Amavubi on their home patch in the maiden game of the 2026 edition of the competition.

After several missed chances Rwanda netted the opening goal two minutes into added time with a stunner by Leroy Jacques Mickels that rested at the corner of the net past the Grenada goalkeeper Chad Leron Jaime Philip, and four minutes later Jojea Kwizera made it 2-0 for the hosts as the match headed for a break.

Skipper Djihad Bizimana also got his name on the scoresheet with a long range shot that beat the Grenada goalkeeper after 69 minutes, with Hakim Sahabo making it 4-0 after 83 minutes to seal a comprehensive victory for the East Africans.

Francis had gone close to pulling a goal back prior to Rwanda's fourth, missing the target with a long range effort.

Rwanda went on to face Estonia in the final on Monday night, having edged Kenya 5-4 in penalty shoot-out, and saw Grenada take on the Harambee Stars in the third place play-off.

After playing 85 minutes in the first game, making way with five remaining as part of a quintuple change by Anthony Modeste, Francis was named in the starting XI for a second time at the same ground, taking on a Kenya side which includes Grimsby Town midfielder Clarke Oduor and Tranmere Rovers midfielder Zech Obiero.

Goals from Austin Odhiambo and Ryan Ogam giving Kenya a 2-0 advantage within the opening 18 minutes, with Viljay Valcin turning the ball into his own net with nine minutes to go to condemn Grenada to a 3-0 defeat.





Over in Asia, on-loan Maidenhead United winger De Silva started and produced two crucial contributions as Sri Lanka secured a remarkable 3–1 victory over Chinese Taipei on their home soil, marking the second consecutive win against them away from home.

As such, the Golden Army closed out their AFC Asian Cup Saudi Arabia 2027 Qualifiers Final Round Group campaign in impressive style, Goals from Rahul Suresh and Niloshan Senthurvasan gave the Golden Lions a 2-0 advantage heading into half time, with an own goal from Christopher Tiao all but confirming the win despite Yao-Hsing Yu's consolation goal two minutes later.

Sri Lanka, who moved onto nine points with the win, went in front when De Silva swung a right-footed cross into the box from the left, finding the head of Garrett Kelly and he nodded the ball back across goal for Suresh to volley first-time into the roof of the net.

Eight minutes later the visitors doubled their lead with De Silva again at the heart of the move, making his way to the byline and cutting the ball back to Suresh, whose clever flick set up Senthurvasan to slam his low strike into the bottom corner.

Niloshan was involved again as Sri Lanka claimed their third, surging down the left flank to send in a dangerous cross that the unfortunate Tiao redirected past goalkeeper Huang Chiu-lin, but within two minutes, Chinese Taipei claimed a consolation as Tiao redeemed himself with a decisive run down the left, skipping past Anujan Rajendram to bend in a cross towards the far corner of the six yard box that Yu Yao-hsing headed home.

De Silva was replaced by Aman Faizer with eight minutes to go, having played a key role in Sri Lanka closing out their AFC Asian Cup campaign victorious, and dmeans they finish third in Group D, only four points behind Thailand and Turkmenistan to cement their fine effort, as well as nine points ahead of Chinese Taipei, who failed to pick up a single point, though it wasn't enough to claim a berth at next January's Finals in Saudi Arabia.

However, with Chinese Taipei ranked 174 and Sri Lanka at 194 prior to the match, the result is expected to significantly boost Sri Lanka's FIFA ranking, potentially climbing to around 190.

## Millwall Lionesses 2-2 Sutton United Women

For the second time this season Millwall and Sutton couldn't be separated as Beth Humphrey's penalty eight minutes from time ensured that U's came away from their visit to the Den with a point, the game at the David Weir earlier in the season also having finished level.

Sutton shaded the early stages but were unable to take advantage of several promising set pieces, one of which saw a collision between Nadia Sabania and the home goalkeeper which could have produced a penalty and forced Sabania off for the rest of the afternoon.

Millwall did have the ball in the net, but only after the offside flag had gone up, but in the 24th minute a ball played in to the penalty area found Ciara Watling in acres of space to slot the ball past Megan Taylor.

Sutton levelled nine minutes before half time through a superb individual goal from Millie Cutler, who attacked on the right (below) and beat two defenders before squeezing a shot in to the net from a narrow angle, but in first half stoppage time a cross from the Millwall right found its way to Liva Helt, who controlled the ball before sending a left foot shot in to the corner of the net.

There was little goalmouth activity for much of the second half, Sutton's best moment coming early on as Emma Spear's cross was just out of the reach of Brianna Gilbert-Lawal, and in an at times bruising half of several stoppages U's made a change of goalkeeper midway through the half as Lizzy Knight replaced Taylor. The chance U's were waiting for came with eight minutes to go as the home goalkeeper flattened K'Shaela Burch-Waldron as they contested an Ella Meehan free kick that had been sent high in to the goalmouth, and Humphrey, as she had done in the home game against Millwall, put the penalty firmly in the corner of the net.

With nine minutes of stoppage time there was still plenty of time for a winner, and Millwall came closest, first when a cross from the left deceived Knight and bounced just over, and then when a shot from the edge of the penalty area hit the bar, but Sutton survived those scares to come away with a deserved point.

# LATEST FROM THE LEAGUE

**Despite two 0-0s on Good Friday, there were a total of 35 goals across the Enterprise National League with a number of crucial results at the top and bottom of the division.**

League leaders at the beginning of the day, Rochdale, slumped to a 4-2 defeat at home to relegation-threatened Morecambe. Despite Aidan Barlow giving Dale the lead, a Lewis Payne brace alongside goals from Jack Nolan and Ben Tollitt secured a first win in five for Jim Bentley's side. The victory for the Shrimps keeps their survival hopes alive, with six points separating them from safety.



York capitalised on Dale's defeat by taking top spot after their 1-0 win at Boston. Ben Brookes' first goal of the season, three minutes into the second half, ensured the Minstermen returned to Yorkshire with all three points. The victory was their first at Boston since December 1970 and saw them leap ahead of their title rivals on goal difference.



Third-place Carlisle couldn't find a way past Gateshead at Brunton Park in a 0-0 draw. The point gave the Heed a six-point gap between themselves and the relegation zone, and was their first clean sheet away from home in the league since October 18th. Scunthorpe also drew 0-0 at home to a Hartlepool side who had shipped seven at Wealdstone the game before. The point secures a play-off spot for Scunthorpe, having won promotion through the National League North play-offs last season.



Boreham Wood secured their play-off place in emphatic style after beating Wealdstone 5-1 at Meadow Park. James Clarke stole the show for the Wood after bagging a hat-trick, with Zak Brunt and Abdul Abdulmalik getting their fourteenth and eleventh goals of the season respectively. It is eight home games without defeat for Garrard's side.



Forest Green edged closer to confirming their place in the end-of-season play-offs with a comfortable win over Brackley. Robbie Savage's side were helped when Zak Brown was sent off in first-half injury time for a second booking. Former U's loanee D'Mani Mellor bagged his second goal in consecutive games before Kyle McAllister, Jili Buyabu, and Laurent Mendy added to the scoreline. The Green Devils have scored eight goals in two games ahead of their trip to Truro today.



Today's visitors, Southend, extended their good run of form by beating Essex rivals Braintree. An Andy Dallas brace within thirty-three minutes gave Kevin Maher's side a 2-0 lead at half-time. Oliver Coker scored what turned out to be the winner not long after half-time as Ryan Battrum and Sahid Kamara scored for Braintree to make it a nervy end for the Shrimpers. The defeat for the Iron means they will be relegated from the National League today should Eastleigh win, Gateshead draw, and they fail to beat Woking at home.



Dan Creaney haunted his former club, Solihull Moors, with his goal, the only one of the game, securing a 1-0 win for Tamworth. Three goals in four games for Creaney have helped the Lambs pick up four wins from their previous five games. Jermaine Defoe's first game in charge of Woking ended up being a thrilling 3-3 draw against Eastleigh. Despite Harry Beautyman's fourth goal in six games giving the Surrey side a 1-0 lead, they surrendered it with Eastleigh going 3-1 up with twenty minutes left of the contest.



However, for the second time in a week the Spitfires saw a two-goal lead slip from their grasp with Ollie Sanderson and Kian Pennant earning the Cardinals a point, extending their good run to one defeat in ten games. That point for Eastleigh, coupled with Will Merry's 94th minute winner for Yeovil against Truro, confirmed the Tinnners' relegation from the National League. Despite winning that division less than twelve months ago, the Cornish side will play in the National League South again next season after one win in their previous thirteen games.



Halifax kept their hopes of securing a play-off spot alive with a 94th minute winner at Altrincham in a 1-0 win. Jay Turner-Cooke's second goal of the season secured a league double over the Robins for Adam Lakeland's side. The Shaymen put back-to-back defeats behind them to secure the three points and are one win away from our visitors, despite playing two games more.

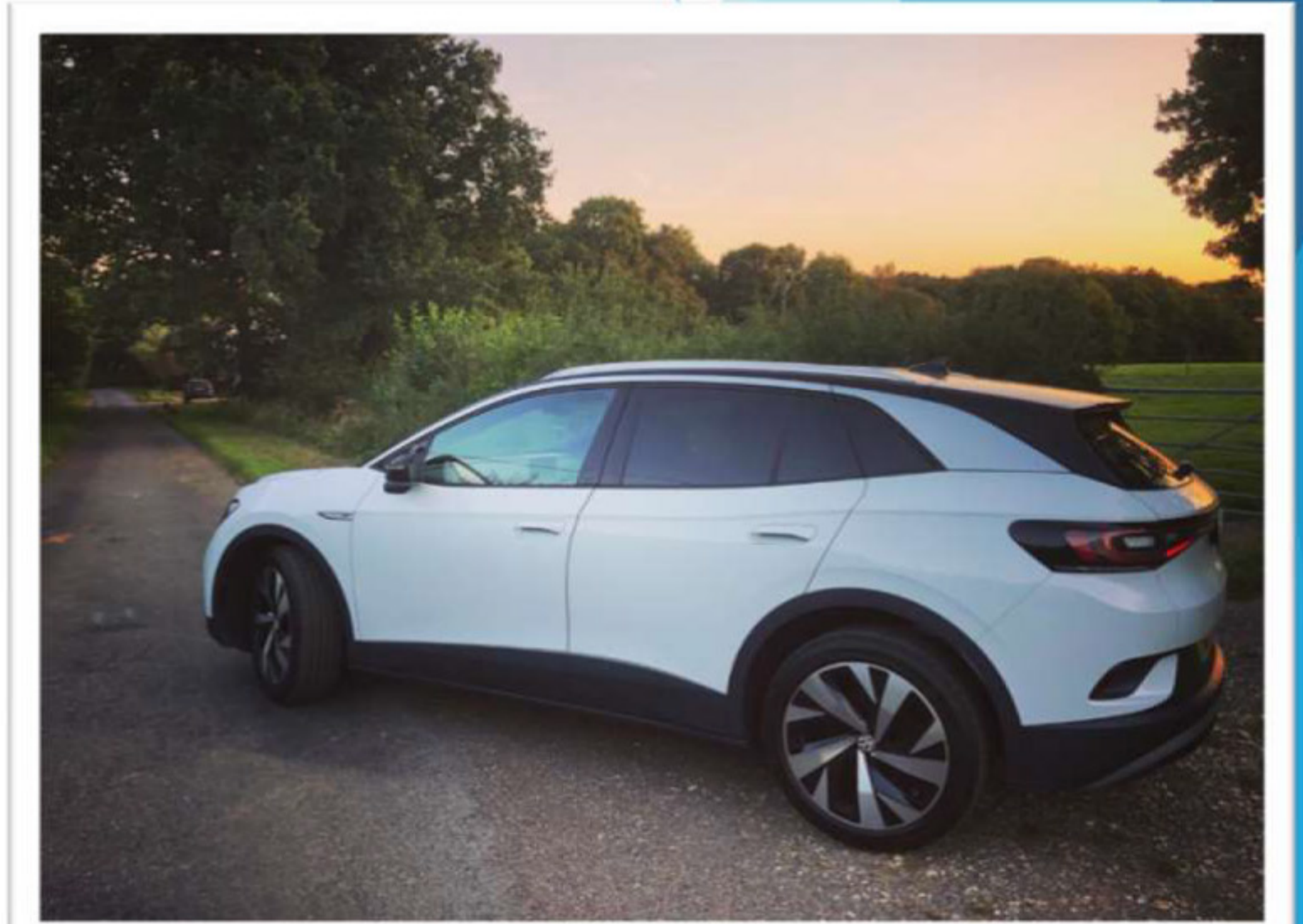


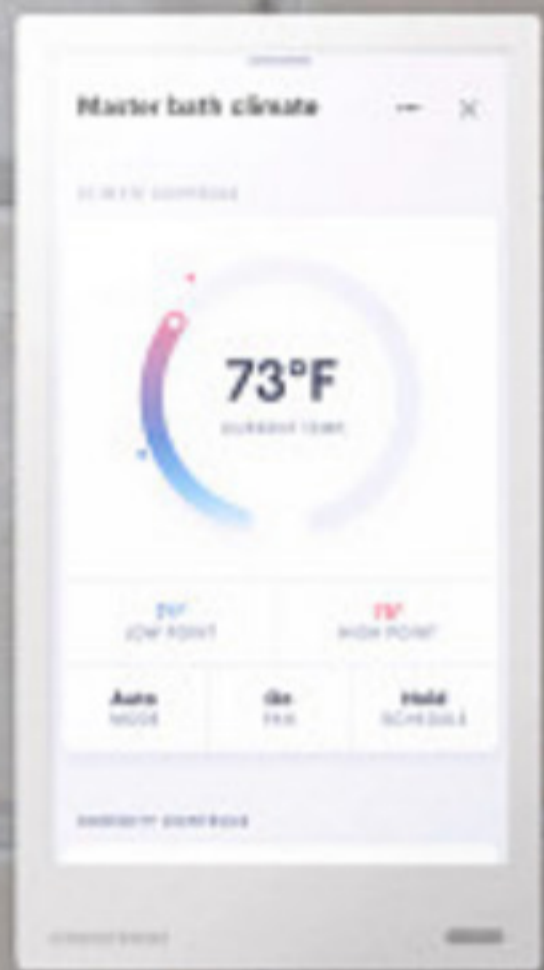

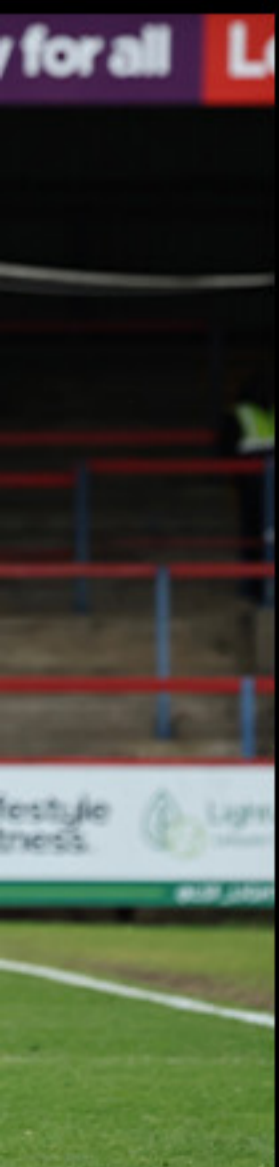

# LOAN WATCH: MARCH

**As the 2025/26 season reaches its climax, a whole host of Sutton players continued to gain minutes across the country. We run down each one in our March edition of Loan Watch.**

**Ashley Nadesan's** loan to Worthing couldn't have got off to a better start, with the 31-year old taking just seven minutes to get off the mark for the Rebels.

Nadesan finished from close range from Joe Cook's knock back to give Worthing the lead against Chelmsford City, with Adam Hinshelwood's side sealing a 2-0 win that saw them return to winning ways and maintain a six-point gap from league leaders Dorking Wanderers.

The forward was then rewarded with a second successive start, with goals from Teddy Jenks and Wiktor Makowski sealing a 3-0 win over AFC Totton, a crucial result that lifted the Rebels up to second in the league, before playing 89 minutes in a 3-2 win over Weston-super-Mare and 87 minutes as they were held to a 1-1 draw by Enfield Town, maintaining a six-point gap to the summit in the process.

**Siju Odelusi** began his Maidenhead United career with a brief cameo against AFC Totton, helping the Magpies secure a 2-0 win alongside teammate **Dillon De Silva**. Both featured off the bench in a dramatic victory over Maidstone United, with De Silva assisting a stoppage-time penalty that clinched the points. Odelusi earned his first start against Worthing, reuniting with former coach Jon Meeney and ex-Sutton teammates Harry Ransom and Ashley Nadesan in a goalless draw.

He started again versus Eastbourne Borough, being substituted in the second half as Liam Dulson scored the late winner. After a brief unbeaten run ended by Ebbsfleet United, Odelusi and De Silva contributed as substitutes before starting against Dorking Wanderers, where De Silva scored and Odelusi netted his first goal since October. International duty saw the duo miss matches, though Odelusi returned to play a key role in Maidenhead's victory over Bath City, helping the team climb into the play-off positions for the season's final month.

**Will Tizzard** began life at Torquay United under legendary manager Neil Warnock, who stepped in as caretaker following Paul Wotton's dismissal. Tizzard featured in Warnock's first Gulls XI since 1993, playing the full 90 minutes in a 2-2 draw with Farnborough, and started again in a 3-0 defeat at Ebbsfleet United. He then helped Torquay secure back-to-back 2-1 victories over Salisbury and Chesham United, though a second yellow saw him sent off against the latter. Tizzard served HIS one-match ban as Torquay fell 1-0 to



Dagenham & Redbridge, now led by interim boss Andy Carroll, while Jimmy Ball took over as Warnock's permanent successor at Plainmoor.

Returning to the side, Tizzard played in a 2-2 draw with league leaders Dorking and subsequently extended his loan until the end of the 2025/26 season. He maintained a run of starts, helping Torquay record a 2-0 win over Horsham and earning his first clean sheet since joining Plainmoor in his seventh appearance.

**Nana Boateng** continued his resurgence alongside **Eduino Vaz**, helping Hampton & Richmond make a strong start to March. Boateng scored his second goal of the season with a powerful strike against Enfield Town, though a second-half goal from Henry Hawkins earned the visitors a 1-1 draw. The Beavers bounced back the following weekend, defeating Dover Athletic 2-0 at the Beveree Stadium through first-half goals from Ronan Silva and Reece Grego-Cox, with Vaz also creating chances.

The pair started together as Hampton beat Slough Town 3-1, then suffered a 2-0 loss at Weston-super-Mare, before Daniel Nkrumah's debut brace secured a win over Horsham. A first-half hat-trick from Stan Leech led to a 3-1 defeat to Dagenham & Redbridge, leaving Hampton two places above the drop with an eight-point cushion. Their consistent performances earned both Boateng and Vaz nominations for Hampton & Richmond's Player of the Month award.



**Liam Vincent's** Dorking Wanderers began March with a high-profile visit from KSI-backed Dagenham & Redbridge. The on-loan wing-back was an unused substitute as Dorking's ten-game unbeaten run ended with a 1-0 defeat, followed by a 1-1 draw with Chelmsford City that cut their lead to three points.

Vincent made his first start against Ebbsfleet United, playing 87 minutes in a 2-1 comeback win that extended Dorking's top-of-the-table lead to five points. He retained his place as they triumphed 4-2 at Enfield Town but played the full match in a 2-0 setback at Maidenhead United. He continued starting in crucial fixtures, including a 2-2 draw with Torquay and a 1-0 victory over Hemel, playing 75 minutes as Jason Prior's late penalty secured the win, keeping Dorking on track for the National League South title.

**Kane Crichlow** enjoyed a strong March start with Chelmsford City, coming off the bench in a 7-1 rout of Bath City, the Clarets' biggest league win since 2014. He continued to make substitute appearances as Chelmsford held high-flying Dorking to a 1-1 draw and returned to the starting XI in a 2-0 defeat at Worthing, playing 53 minutes in a crucial title race clash. Crichlow then featured from the bench in successive losses: he replaced Joe Grimwood at half-time against Dover Athletic as Chelmsford fell 2-1, and came on late in a 4-2 defeat at Farnborough. The Clarets bounced back before month's end, with Crichlow unused in a 1-0 win over Chippenham Town and a 1-1 draw with AFC Totton. Chelmsford maintained their proximity to the play-off places, keeping pressure on rivals as they headed into April.

In addition, **Jaiden White** failed to feature at all for Chester, while in Step 3, **Alex Woodyard** started every game as Folkestone Invicta took a huge towards the league title, remaining unbeaten last month and maintaining a 14-point gap to second-placed Aveley. As for the academy, **George Vorster** made it 15 goals for the season for Burgess Hill Town in wins over Wingate & Finchley and Ramsgate, while **Noah Nzuzi** and **Ned Hepburn** featured a handful of times for Carshalton Athletic and Grays Athletic respectively.
