# CHIEF OPERATING OFFICER, TIM ALLISON



## TIM TALKS

**We welcome this afternoon's visitors to the VBS Community Stadium, Altrincham. It has no doubt felt a long campaign for both clubs, and whilst last weekend saw results across the league that ensure both clubs are now safe from the drop, with two games to go it may feel a desire to finish the season already is more important than the outcome on the pitch.**

How different that feels to last season's fixture, with the U's starting out on their National League adventure once more after the three-year stay in the Football League, and the euphoria of a 5-0 home victory. Previous to that was our promotion year with an end of season romp winning by (just!) four goals away from home. The two games since have both been won by Altrincham as the home side by single goal margins.

The match back in September was yet another frustrating game at the start of our season where it felt we couldn't get anything out of games, which ultimately led to the managerial switch a few games later. In honesty we played well, were the better team, took the lead, but still lost. It was also witness to one of the most bizarre booking mistakes I've ever seen – later recognised by the referring panel – when Junior Eccleston was kicked in the face karate style by an out of control opponent only to receive a yellow card and the referee awarding a free kick against us as we strived in vain to equalise and grab a deserved minimum of a point.

Of the ten outfield starters that day for the U's only three are still with us and playing, with the entire back five now absent for one reason or another. It has been a long season!

Today, marking the last home game of the season, will have many of the usual celebrations. The final Strikers Are Key draw sees the safe emptied – no matter how many attempts that takes – and will today be in the MBA Lounge before the end of season awards, which are scheduled to start shortly after 6pm, with six trophies being collected. After that will be a live band performing in the MBA and a Legends' Match on the pitch as choices of how to say goodbye to the (home) regular season.

Of course, we still want to see as many of you as possible at the final match of the season at Boreham Wood, and still have matches at the VBS Community Stadium for the Women's team, the Disability side, the Academy and the College Programme teams. Indeed, with Crystal Palace Women and Under 21s still to feature it will be a busy month here. Even then there is the annual Supporters' Match for the Shoebox Trophy to take place. We don't want to be saying goodbye to you yet, before the hopes and dreams of our pre-season schedule kick in once more in July.

Today though does mark the likely final appearance in front of many supporters for a number of our players. Some will have been here longer, and made more appearances, than others. Please take the opportunity to thank all that have worn the shirt, and to wish them the best in whatever comes next for them. As a club we have always wished the best for the future careers of those that have worn amber, and as a result have maintained good connections with many, some of whom have later returned to grace the turf once more.

Two contrasting cup games took place during the week. Hugely disappointing – and I am holding back my frustrations a little here given the importance of this competition to me – to go out on penalties in the Surrey Senior Cup on Tuesday at Farnham. Those that have followed the club as long, or longer, than me might know, but it has to be unusual to finish a season with the most frequently played side not being a league opponent. Being the better side and dominating possession counts for nothing when your opponent's plan is to park the bus from the outset and aim to win on penalties. We simply had to score and rarely looked like doing so sadly. Silverware is a rare thing in a playing career. Hopefully participants won't be looking back at the end of theirs, in what could be a relatively short time, with regrets.

By contrast our women played out an end-to-end scrap with Dartford, coming away at the end of the ninety minutes as 2-0 victors, and deservedly so for their tenacity, in the Combined Counties League Cup. Fewer than 100 in attendance but a great evening. Maybe give it a go as a supporter and spectator in the next round against Chatham which is also at home. Dartford sit towards the top of the same league as our women, yet they have lost only once in that competition all season. That was also against us!

Our Academy side also have their own Cup Final to be looking forward to in May, so despite the ending of the first team season nearly upon us, there is still plenty of supporting, and football action to come.

Sutton's Cerebral Palsy team have picked up their first piece of silverware in their inaugural season winning the National Cerebral Palsy Shield after picking up two wins last week over Brighton & Hove Albion and Chelsea.

The opening game of the day saw the Sutton pick up a 2-1 victory over Brighton with goals from Ashley Cunliffe and Reuben Taylor-West – an important victory as this secured the Shield for the U's.

The second game of the afternoon saw Sutton take on Chelsea, where the U's came out 3-1 winners. Callum Christie opened the scoring for the U's followed by goals by Hassan Dabre and Ned Kelly, allowing the newly formed Cerebral Palsy side to sign off the day in style.

Neil Gibson replaced long-serving manager Phil Parkinson at Altrincham at the end of 2025.

Born in St Asaph, Wales, Gibson began his career in Tranmere Rovers' academy, spending five years there before making appearances for the first team. He went on to play for several clubs, including Rhyl, Sheffield Wednesday, Southport, Halesowen Town, Leigh RMI and Prestatyn Town.

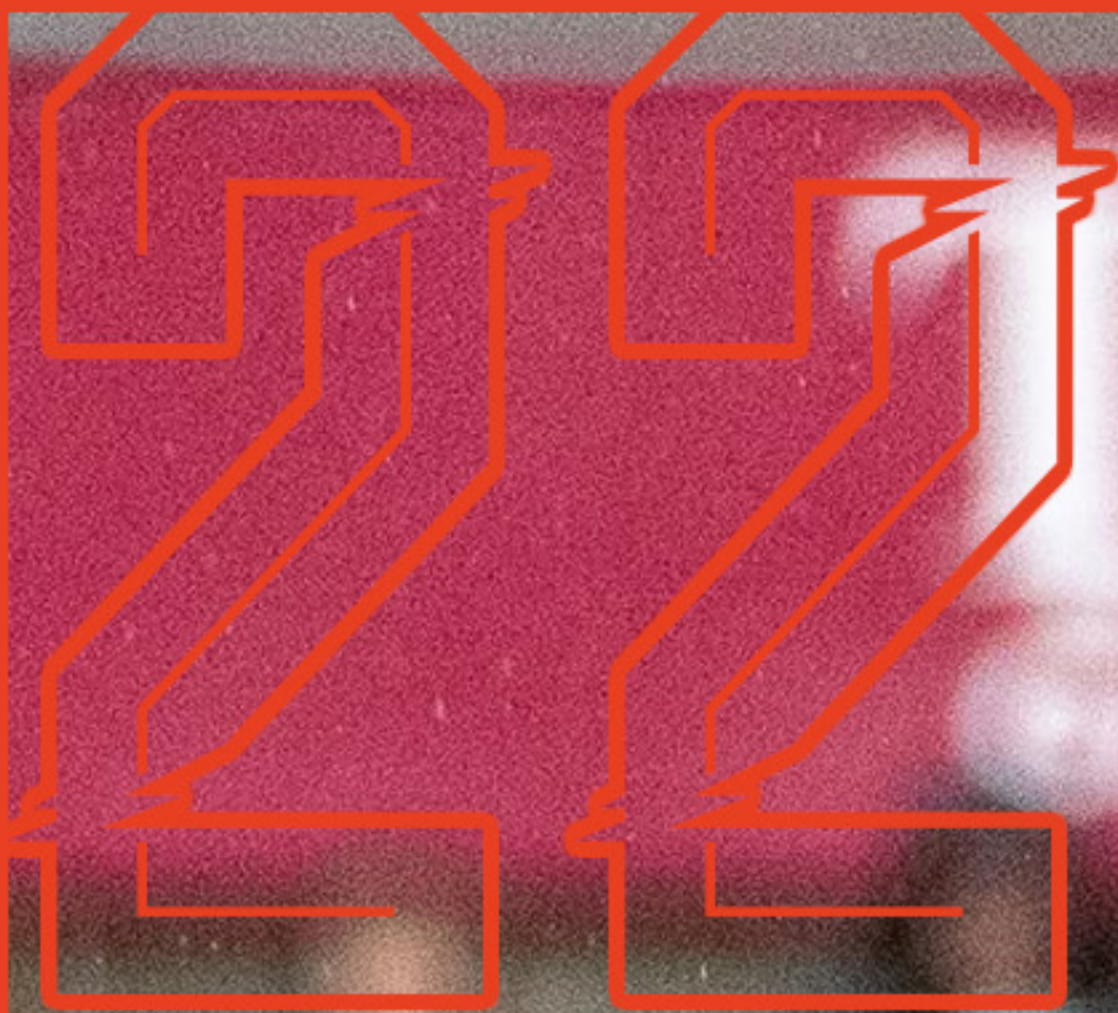
At Prestatyn, he enjoyed a long association, making over 100 appearances and serving 13 years as manager. He later managed Flint Town United and Connah's Quay Nomads before moving to Wealdstone midway through the 2024/25 season.

Gibson guided the club to survival but left by mutual consent due to travel difficulties. He soon returned to management with Altrincham, initially as interim boss, before being appointed permanently in November.



**THE ENGINE**  
**ISAAC**  
**MARRIOTT**

Isaac Marriott began his career in the youth system at Huddersfield Town before gaining senior experience through loan spells at Brighouse Town, Larne, Bradford (Park Avenue) and Warrington Town. He later joined Altrincham, becoming an inspired signing after a permanent stint at Bradford, establishing himself as an integral figure in central midfield. The Huddersfield-born terrier was a key figure in Alty finishing the 2021.22 season strongly and was an ever-present in the final 16 games, displaying dynamism, energy and hunger.



**THE LEADER**  
**TOM**  
**CRAWFORD**

Tom Crawford began his career in the youth system at Stoke before moving into non-league to gain senior experience, rising through the ranks at Chester, before moving on loan to Runcorn and Leek. He later moved to Notts County, where he impressed with his passing range and work rate in midfield, something he continued at Fylde and Hartlepool, winning promotion to the EFL during his spell in the North-East. Crawford went on to become a major free agent capture in the summer of 2024 for Altrincham, whom he now captains.



**THE FINISHER**  
**JIMMY**  
**KNOWLES**

Jimmy Knowles began his career in the academies at Nottingham Forest and Mansfield Town, progressing into the first team setup with the latter, before gaining experience on loan at clubs including Notts County, Greenock Morton and Kettering Town. He later joined Boston United where he developed into one of the most dangerous forwards in non-league, firing the Pilgrims into the National League with 19 goals, and went on to skip the division entirely with a move to Accrington Stanley. After playing a handful of times for the 'Owd Reds he rejoined Boston on loan, before making the switch to Altrincham.

## **1 | Ethan Ross**

### **Goalkeeper**

Phil Parkinson signed goalkeeper Ethan Ross from Stockport County on loan, later making the move permanent in 2023. The 6ft 5in keeper, an Arsenal youth product, previously played for Colchester United and Stockport, helping them win promotion, and also gained experience on loan at several National League clubs.

## **27 | Louie Fallen**

### **Goalkeeper**

Louie Fallen has made great strides over the last couple of seasons, playing for Altrincham's Under-19s and reserves. He performed well in pre-season before being retained in the first team squad ahead of the 2025/26 campaign.

## **30 | Luke Hutchinson**

### **Goalkeeper**

A Bolton Wanderers academy product, Luke Hutchinson has worked his way up the divisions with a whole host of loan spells, including Atherton Collieries, Bamber Bridge, Radcliffe, Hyde United, Marine and Crawley Town. He added Alty to his list of clubs last summer, and has been a regular figure in between the sticks this term.

## **2 | Lewis Banks**

### **Defender**

Potteries-born Lewis Banks captained Stoke's Under-21s and Under-23s, winning Player of the Year with the latter at 21 years of age. After a stint at Stafford Rangers, he excelled at Sligo Rovers with over 100 appearances, gaining European experience in the Conference League against Motherwell and Viking Stavanger, before a short spell at Arbroath preceded his move to Altrincham in 2023, bringing leadership and defensive solidity.

## **3 | Sam Reed**

### **Defender**

Sheffield-born left back Sam Reed spent a ten-year period at Young Owls JDC which included a three-year stint at Sheffield United, before departing the former to join Brighouse Town in 2019. He amassed 82 appearances at Step 4 before moving to Sheffield Wednesday, from whom he has gained senior experience on loan at Boston and Scarborough, prior to a permanent switch to Altrincham last summer.

## **4 | Lewis Baines**

### **Defender**

Lewis Baines joined Altrincham in summer 2022 from Chorley, where he earned England C honours and was named Players' Player of the Year for 2021/22, following spells at Fleetwood, Bamber Bridge, Ashton and Stockport. A powerful left-sided defender, he became an almost ever-present in 2023/24, contributing key goals and a commanding presence in Alty's defence.

## **5 | Jake Cooper**

### **Defender**

Joining Altrincham on loan from Rotherham United in February 2022, Jake Cooper quickly became a steadying presence alongside Toby Mullarkey in central defence, adding to his experiences at Gateshead, Hartlepool and Darlington. He joined the Robins permanently in 2023.

## **15 | Billy Sass-Davies**

### **Defender**

A Wales youth international, Billy Sass-Davies came through Crewe Alexandra's youth system with loans at Colwyn Bay, Leek Town, FC United of Manchester, Altrincham, Telford, Ashton, Yeovil, Woking and Boreham Wood preceding a permanent switch to Hartlepool. He has since becoming a key defensive presence for Altrincham.

## **19 | Lucas Edwards**

### **Defender**

Lucas Edwards became the third of the Robins' 2025 Academy graduates to join the first team ahead of 2025/26, having become the first Alty Under-16s player to make it into the Reserves team. He previously impressed in the Cheshire Senior Cup and FA Youth Cup, before stepping up to senior level.

## **23 | Tylor Golden**

### **Defender**

Tylor Golden joined Altrincham in summer 2024 as a free agent after a brief pre-season trial, appearing almost 100 times for the club. A former Wigan Athletic prospect, he played for Droylsden and Nantwich Town on loan before moving to Salford City and FC Halifax Town, winning the FA Trophy in 2023 and helping Halifax reach the National League play-offs in 2024, either side of a brief loan at Notts County.

## **24 | Sam Barnes**

### **Defender**

Sam Barnes was spotted playing for Lammack and joined local side Blackburn Rovers, spending 11 years at Ewood Park where he captained the Under-18s. A brief loan at Marine gave him his first taste of senior action before joining Barrow, playing four times before making the switch to Altrincham last summer.

## **26 | Anthony Forde**

### **Defender**

A Republic of Ireland youth product, Anthony Forde started his career at Wolverhampton Wanderers and played for Walsall, Rotherham and Oxford prior to a switch to Wrexham, being a part of the side that won three promotions in four years. He later moved to Burton, before returning to non-league with a move to Altrincham.

### **31 | Charlie Olson**

#### **Defender**

A Blackburn Rovers academy product, Charlie Olson gained his first taste of senior experience with a loan move at Altrincham, where he won the Robins' Young Player of the Season award. A brief loan at Oldham then preceded a permanent return to Alty in February.

### **34 | Dan Sassi**

#### **Defender**

Dan Sassi came through the ranks at Stoke City and Burnley before moving to Blackpool, ahead of loans at Rochdale, AFC Fylde and Altrincham. He extended his move to the Robins until the end of the season in January.

### **6 | Josh Grant**

#### **Midfielder**

A former Chelsea youth player, Josh Grant moved to Bristol Rovers after loans at Yeovil and Plymouth, prior to further switches to Wealdstone and Carlisle. He joined Altrincham on loan in January. Internationally, he has represented England at Under-18 and Under-20 level.

### **12 | Kian Breckin**

#### **Midfielder**

Kian Breckin began his career with Manchester City, playing every minute of the 2023/24 EFL Trophy campaign, as well as winning the Premier League 2 title in 2023. Senior loans at Wycombe and Crewe preceded a permanent switch to Altrincham earlier this year.

### **14 | Matty Kosylo**

#### **Midfielder**

Matty Kosylo entered his sixth year as an Altrincham player, having signed from Fylde in 2020. Throughout an eye-catching spell as FC Halifax Town's attacking mainstay, and during a less successful time at Fylde, Kosylo's fortunes were closely monitored by Phil Parkinson, having helped to launch his career at Nantwich Town. He was previously at Stockport, Salford, Vauxhall, Ashton, Hyde and Droylsden.

### **18 | Owen German**

#### **Midfielder**

A product of the Alty academy, Owen Herman spent the 2023/24 season on loan with Wythenshawe Town, Warrington Rylands and Stafford Rangers before signing a new contract in the summer of 2024. A talented midfield anchor, the 20-year-old spent time on loan in the National League North with Alfreton, Town, before returning to Alty from Chorley in March.

### **28 | Liam Humbles**

#### **Midfielder**

Born in Miami Beach, Florida, Liam Humbles spent his early year playing for Weston, before moving to England at 14 to pursue a professional career, which started at AFC Wimbledon. He later made the switch to Salford, from whom he gained experience on loan at Nantwich, Altrincham and Gateshead, before returning to Alty permanently via a brief stint at Rochdale.

### **7 | Olly Crankshaw**

#### **Forward**

Olly Crankshaw signed for the Robins from Stockport County in August 2023, after spending time with Wigan, Bradford and Motherwell. He had previously turned out for the youth teams at Preston and Morecambe, before joining Ramsbottom, Clitheroe, Colne, Curzon Ashton, prior his move to Wigan.

### **10 | Otis Khan**

#### **Forward**

A Pakistan international, Otis Khan made Altrincham his 17th club in January. After coming through the ranks at Manchester United and Sheffield United, he has gone on to appear for Buxton, Matlock, Barrow, Barnsley, Yeovil, Mansfield, Newport, Tranmere, Walsall, Leyton Orient, Grimsby, Hartlepool and Oldham, with a brief return to Yeovil on loan then preceding a switch to Malaysian side Kelantan Red Warrior.

### **17 | Lucas Weaver**

#### **Forward**

Lucas Weaver is a goalscoring winger who signed for Alty in May of 2024 after a blistering season in the NWCFL with Colne, where he scored over 40 goals during the 2023/24 campaign. A product of Preston North End's academy, Lucas was playing in the West Lancashire League before being signed by Colne in 2022.

### **20 | Kahrel Reddin**

#### **Forward**

Kahrel Reddin moved to The J.Davidson Stadium after an extended pre-season trial in the summer of 2024. Formerly with Stoke City and Aston Villa, the winger won the FA Youth Cup with the latter before his move to the Potteries.

### **40 | Charlie Kirk**

#### **Forward**

A product of the Crewe Alexandra academy, Charlie Kirk appeared almost 200 times across a five-year stay at Gresty Road, before moving to Charlton in 2021. Loans at Blackpool and Burton preceded a brief return to Crewe, before playing a handful of times for Barrow last season. He joined Altrincham in July.

# HISTORIC RAMBLINGS

## Three from the 18th April

A busy date in the calendar, this being the fifth consecutive season that Sutton have played on this date, last season's 1-1 draw at Aldershot being played on Good Friday. That was the last of 29 matches contested prior to this afternoon. Of those, ten have been away from Sutton including the harrowing 6-0 reverse to Kingstonian in the 2000 FA Trophy semi-final, second leg. Perhaps the stand out result was the 4-1 defeat of Kettering Town at Rockingham Road in the GMVC in 1987 adding to U's 8-0 home victory against The Poppies earlier in the season. U's away record is W3 D4 L3.

The first U's match on this day as a senior club was in 1914 defeating Redhill in the South Suburban League (West) by 2-1 (Trendall and Moore) played at The Find, Grove Road. Sutton's heaviest home defeat on this day was in the Isthmian League in 1964, 1-4 against Bromley while their best win is 6-2, a 1927 friendly v Epsom Town; competitively it is the 5-1 Athenian success against Finchley in 1953. There have been three cup ties. The first is detailed below, the most recent, just two years ago, saw a Surrey Senior Cup exit at the semi-final stage to Farnham Town. U's home record is W8 D7 L4.

## The Match

A nine goal thriller over 120 minutes of football as U's entertained Dorking in the Surrey Senior Shield in 1931. This semi-final was played on a heavy GGL pitch with rain adding to the poor conditions throughout. There was a breeze too and U's opted to have that on their backs for the first half and the visitors' goal was under pressure from the off, Griffin saving one effort while Tommy Delventhal fired wide. The dam was breached soon after (3rd minute) when H Lewis netted from a T Brown pass. However, Dorking scored next (6th minute) as they broke out with speed and Youdale ended a fine solo run by shooting past Tommy Bedford. And in the 7th minute, Archie Mason found W Hadkiss and he netted with a fine drive. Dorking improved while U's decided to go long as the pitch condition worsened. Chances were missed but in the 42nd minute, Arthur Hance neatly gave Lewis the ball and he fired in his second goal. A minute later Morton made fine progress for Dorking before firing past Bedford.

U's narrow lead at the break would be tested in the conditions however, Lewis struck the woodwork but after Sutton had enjoyed some attacking play, Dorking levelled through former Sutton player, T Barling in the 72nd minute. Shortly after, Dorking were awarded a penalty. During the incident Fred Lever was sent off for allegedly striking an opponent but the visitors missed the opportunity to win the tie, the penalty kick placed wide of the goal, leading to extra time.

The ten men of Sutton took a 100th minute lead, Hance setting up Lewis for his hat-trick goal, but back came Dorking through Barling again. The semi-final was finally settled from the penalty spot, Bill Shepherd's successful spot kick sending Sutton through to the final. Thus, The Chicks' run of seven consecutive victories was ended while Sutton had a final with Wimbledon at Plough Lane to look forward to.

### **The Player**

Appearing for U's in a top of the table clash with Kingstonian in the Isthmian League in 1998 was attacking wide player Andy Salako. Andy commenced his career with Charlton Athletic moving on to Welling United, Bromley and Tonbridge Angels before Carshalton Athletic for the 1994/5 season. He was well known to Sutton fans having caused their favourites a number of problems over the years. He joined Sutton during the summer of 1997 enticed away by his former manager at Carshalton, John Rains. His competitive debut came on the opening day of the '97/8 season, a 2-0 defeat of Hitchin Town in the IL on 16/08/97. Two days later he had his first Sutton goal as U's thrashed Purfleet by 6-0 at The Hotel. Andy was pretty much ever-present until picking up an injury in January before returning to end the season with six goals in his last nine starts. One of those ended with an IL Cup winners' medal as U's thrashed Oxford City 6-1 in the final. He ended that first season with 13 goals from 55 appearances. The following season, Andy's involvement was obstructed by more injury woes but he did score his only hat-trick for U's (against Farnham in the SSC and taking a winners' medal as U's defeated Carshalton in the final). Unfortunately, he missed much of the run-in as U's took the Isthmian title, Andy involved in 23 league matches that season. The 1999/2000 term saw Andy's appearances seriously curtailed as U's GMV Conference return lasted just the one season and he made just six competitive appearances before re-joining Carshalton Athletic. JR brought Andy back to GGL for the 2000/1 season and he scored Sutton's late leveller in a rather fortunate opening day draw at Aldershot Town. His final goal for Sutton came three days later as U's defeated Basingstoke Town but he was soon back at Colston Avenue before moving on to Croydon, and later Horsham. Andy will always be remembered for his pacy wing play best exhibited at Dagenham & Redbridge in December 1997 when he ran the length of the pitch with the ball to set up a Nassim Akrouh headed goal. It was brilliant. Andy made 120 appearances for Sutton scoring 25 goals.



### **The Programme**

A return to the beginning of the 1970s and U's Isthmian trip to Wycombe Wanderers' infamous sloping Loakes Park pitch. The Wanderers' programme was one of the better Isthmian efforts in those days with dark blue print on twelve light blue pages, representing the club's colours. The front cover is on the right (is that Denis Law depicted in action?) while the inside cover listed club honours and current officials. A page of adverts followed with the Castle Café vying for after match custom with the British Legion. Page five held club notes welcoming their old manager and Sutton's then coach Sid Cann back to Loakes Park.

As ever, the middle spread listed the teams (surprisingly one of the linesmen hailed from High Wycombe) surrounded by adverts including one for the Bucks Free Press, the local rag. Over the page and a pen pic (with accompanying photo) of left back Charlie Gale, who was enjoying his tenth season as a WW player. Other club info followed including the Supporters' Club's section describing a recent trip to Barking as "long". No M25 back then so East London was indeed a bit of a jaunt. Another page of adverts before the IL table with Wycombe's home and away results shown next to each club appearing on the inside back page. This was a big match with the hosts top and one point in front of Sutton. However, Enfield had many games in hand and while this match ended 2-2 it would be the then Middlesex side who would take the title, their third in a row. The back page held an advert for Murrays Department Store in High Wycombe. All for 6d (2.5p)

## SUFC v Alty

The Robins make their ninth visit to GGL, all contested at GMVC/NL level. Alty were successful on their first visit back in September 1986 by 3-2 and won here again in November 1990. Sutton have won five and drawn one of the other six, last season's misleading 5-0 success the biggest margin of victory between the two clubs. Altrincham's narrow 2-1 home win earlier this season gives them the edge in these fixtures as before that the comparative home records mirrored each other. However, U's 4-0 win at Moss Lane in April 2021 is the biggest between the two clubs at that venue, Alty recording a 3-0 success in March 2000. Sutton's only previous success in Cheshire was in November 1987 by 1-0 (Micky Stephens). **U's home record W5 D1 L2 F20 A11.**

Sutton's top scorer in matches with Altrincham is Lenny Dennis with three goals. Players to have played for both clubs include midfielders Peter Byrne and Alastair Smith, and striker Nick Welton.

## **Sutton United Academy 2-1 Eastleigh Academy**

Sutton secured a ninth win in ten National League Academy South games as Bobby Sheargold scored a late winner after an own goal cancelled Rashaad Drysdale's penalty. Sutton United defeated Dartford to reach the Combined Counties League Cup quarter finals, having already handed them their only league loss this season. A tight first half saw chances for both sides, with Millie Cutler and Cassie Chase going close and Lizzy Knight making an important save.



The breakthrough came midway through the second half when a free kick resulted in an own goal by former Sutton defender Gabby Howell. Dartford pushed hard for an equaliser, creating chances but were repeatedly denied by resolute defending and key saves from Lizzy Knight. As the visitors committed forward, Sutton capitalised late on, with Millie Cutler finishing a well-worked move to secure the victory and confirm Sutton's place in the next round.

**Despite seven of the twelve National League fixtures last weekend seeing fewer than two goals in each game, there were plenty of talking points across the division heading into the penultimate weekend of the season.**

York started the weekend's games off with a 1-0 victory away to Tamworth. A first-half goal from Ollie Pearce, his 33rd of the season, was enough for the Minstermen and continued their incredible away record. Stuart Maynard's side have the best away record in the division with 52 points from their 22 away games, with their final away game of the season at title rivals Rochdale.



Jim McNulty's side kept their title chances alive with a come-from-behind victory against FA Trophy finalists Wealdstone. Having seen York win earlier in the day, Dale knew that a win was necessary to remain in the race for automatic promotion, and despite Deon Woodman giving Wealdstone the lead, Rochdale managed to gain the three points. Ian Henderson scored his fourth goal in six games to level the game before Luke Hannant scored in the 90th minute to secure a dramatic win for Dale. York and Rochdale both kick off at 17:30 today against Yeovil and Braintree respectively, with a final day showdown between them on the horizon if both sides get maximum points.



Carlisle's 3-0 win against Sutton means they are one win away from securing third place and a semi-final spot in the end-of-season play-offs. Chasing them down are Boreham Wood, who swept past Hartlepool thanks to a hat-trick from Matt Rush. The striker jumped to second in the National League goalscoring charts with 26 goals for the season as Hartlepool's stuttering run of no wins in four games continued.



Scunthorpe's 1-0 victory against Brackley was secured thanks to Callum Roberts' 20th goal of the season in the 13th minute. It is now one defeat in eight games for Andy Butler's side, who look set for a play-off eliminator at the end of the season. Having won the National League North title last season, the defeat confirmed Brackley's relegation back to the sixth tier. Being the second-lowest scorers in the division has undoubtedly led to a run of one win in nineteen league games and has seen the Saints slip out of the National League in their first-ever campaign at the level.



Forest Green secured their place in the end-of-season play-offs with a 3-1 win against already relegated Braintree. D'Mani Mellor's third goal in four games opened the scoring for Robbie Savage's side before Lewis Walker's fourth goal in seven games levelled the game. The Green Devils had too much for the Iron, though, and two goals in two minutes from Tom Knowles and Nick Haughton secured the win in the second half.



Despite drawing 0-0 with Solihull Moors last weekend, Southend extended their good run of form on Tuesday to one defeat in twelve after a 2-0 win at Aldershot. The victory secured the Essex side's place in the end-of-season play-offs. Southend have been helped by Halifax's poor run of form, which continued last Saturday with a 0-0 draw at Yeovil. It is now one win in five games for the Shaymen ahead of their lunchtime game against Kevin Maher's side today.



Jim Bentley suffered what he described as the lowest point in his managerial career after Morecambe's 5-1 defeat at Woking confirmed their relegation from the National League. The Shrimps started the season late due to a number of off-field issues and never recovered from the poor decision-making both on and off the pitch. Relegation to the National League North means they will be playing at step six for the first time since 1995. Harry Beautyman opened the scoring for the Cardinals with his tenth goal of the season before goals from Aaron Drewe, Sam Ashford, and a brace from Oliver Sanderson gave Jermaine Defoe his first win as Woking manager. Bentley's side has conceded the most goals in the division with an average of 2.2 goals per game and will look to rebuild in the National League North next season.



Gateshead have secured the greatest of escapes after a 1-0 win at Aldershot. A first-half strike from Harry Chapman secured a fourth win in five games for the Heed. A run of thirteen league defeats on the bounce left Gateshead eleven points adrift of safety in mid-February. Since then, Elliot's side have picked up 31 points from 15 games with nine wins and four draws.



Today's opponents, Altrincham, beat Eastleigh 1-0 thanks to Tom Crawford's deflected effort in the first half, with the defeat extending the Spitfires' run of games without a clean sheet to 34 consecutive games. Paul Hurst's Boston also secured victory over Truro by the same scoreline after Jordy Hiwula's goal separated the two sides. It is one win in fifteen games for the Cornish side, who will hope they can end their home campaign on a high today against Carlisle.



On Tuesday night, Wealdstone grabbed a 94th minute equaliser from Olufela Olomola, which cancelled out Jacob Hazel's penalty as it ended 1-1 between them and Boston at Grosvenor Vale. Woking extended their unbeaten run at home to ten games and ensured Jermaine Defoe remains unbeaten as manager after a 0-0 draw with Solihull Moors.

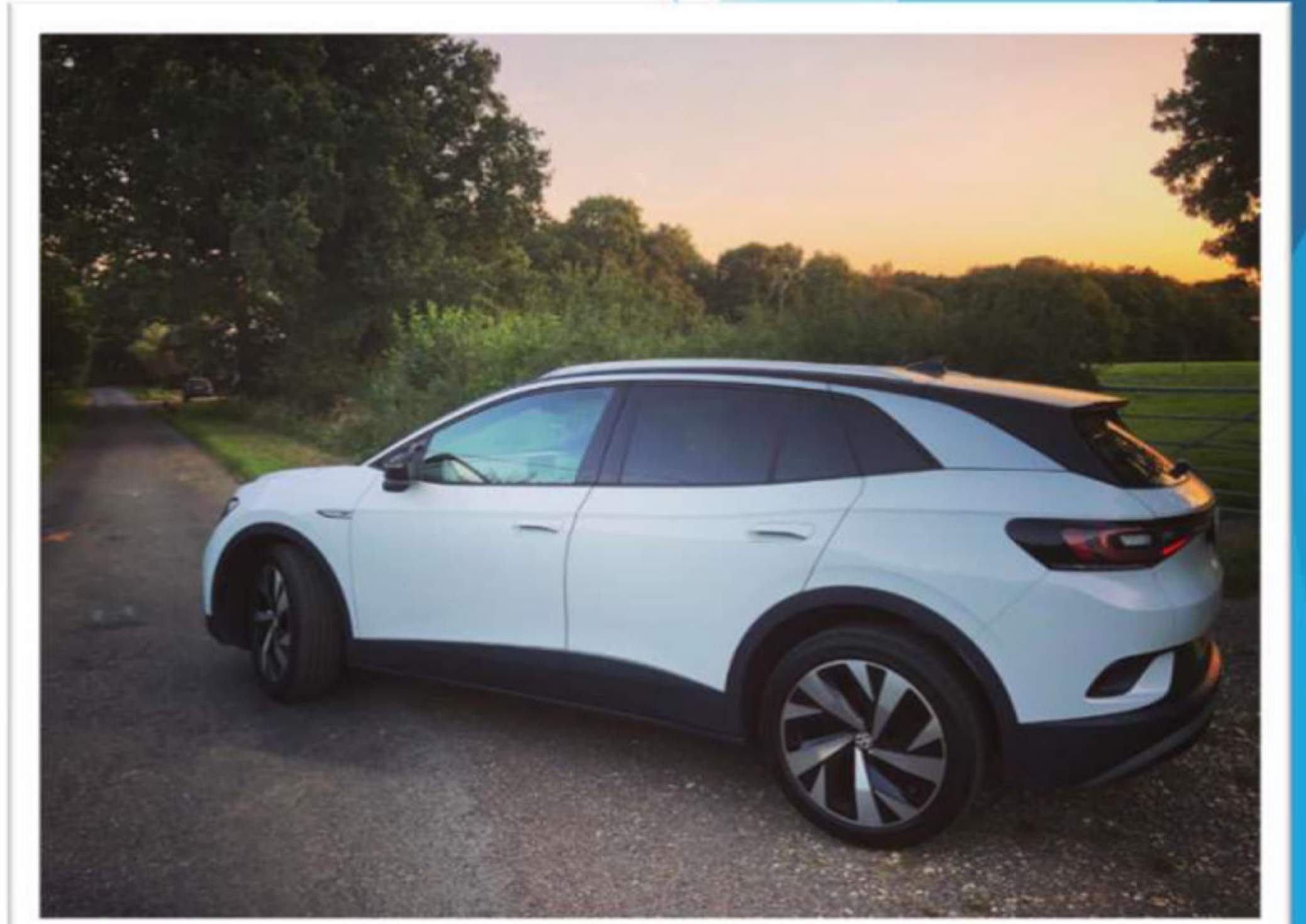


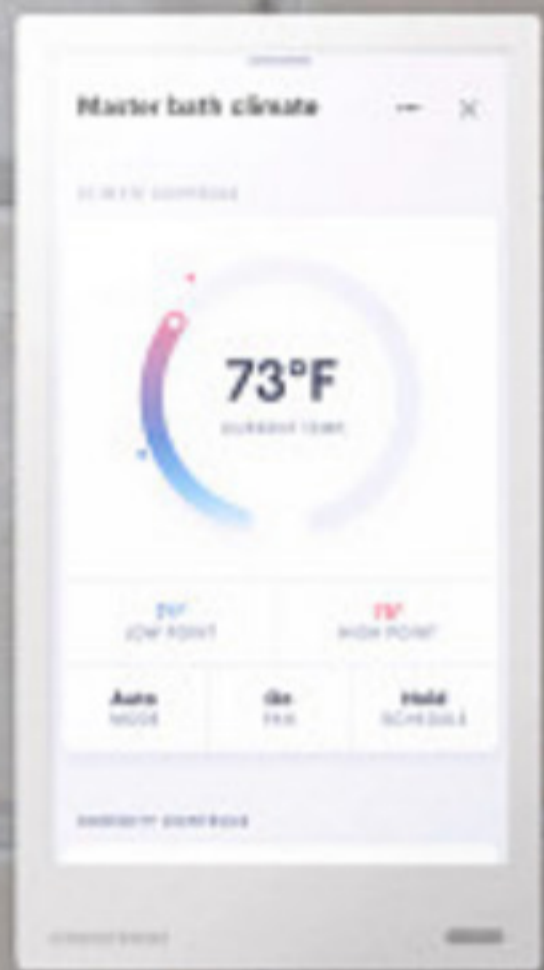

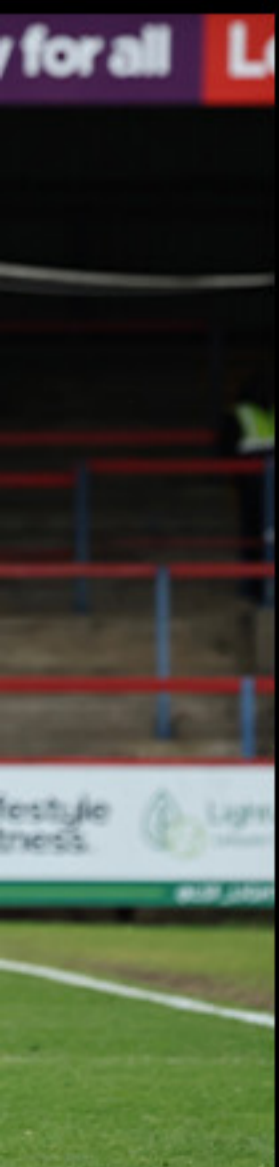

**"I'm Not Going To Get Used To Losing"**

Chris Agutter delivered a brutally honest assessment of Sutton's Surrey Senior Cup exit on penalties to Farnham Town.

Despite dominating possession for long periods, the U's failed to turn control into clear chances, ultimately paying the price in the shootout, with Lewis Simper and Charlie Bell both missing either side of two successful spot-kicks, while Farnham secured their passage into the final by converting all four of their kicks from 12 yards.

The Head Coach acknowledged his side had plenty of the ball but lacked the cutting edge required to break down a well-drilled Farnham side, and pointed to tactical tweaks throughout the match, including changes in shape that he felt improved aspects of their play.

***"We had loads of the ball, loads of possession, but we didn't do enough to disrupt them" he said.***

***"Credit to Farnham – they were organised, just like in the FA Cup games – but with the level we're at, we have to do more."***

***"We changed shape a couple of times and that helped, but the subs didn't have the impact. And when players are asking why they're not starting, that last 20 minutes is exactly why."***

***"With the greatest respect, we should be winning that game. We didn't create anywhere near enough. On that basis, we probably deserve to go out."***

When asked about his overall emotions, Agutter admitted it was difficult to fully express his feelings publicly, but made it clear that both he and his staff were far from satisfied after a result that also represents a missed opportunity to compete for silverware – something he had stressed as an important target in recent weeks.

***"We're not happy at all," he added. "It's incredibly frustrating. I can't say exactly how I feel on camera, but we're very disappointed."***

***"It's a real opportunity gone. Our supporters deserved the chance to see us lift a trophy, and we've gone out with a whimper."***

***"There are players in there fighting for their futures. Not just at this football club, but potentially at this level."***



***"Certain behaviours and performance levels keep cropping up," he admitted. "Some players have done well, but there are others who won't be here in two weeks' time."***

While he acknowledged the squad's overall efforts across the season, he also highlighted recurring issues that continue to surface, with the result serving as another reminder of the work still to be done.

***"It's about personal pride now," he said. "Delivering performances that our supporters deserve. That's the most important thing."***

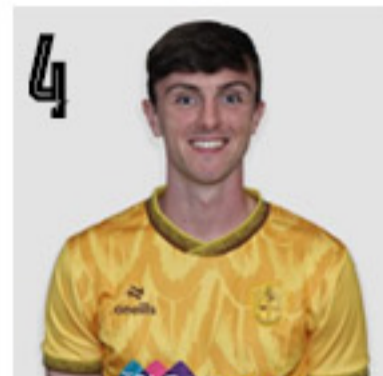

***"I'm not going to get used to losing. Not now, not ever. We'll do whatever it takes to get back on the right track."***

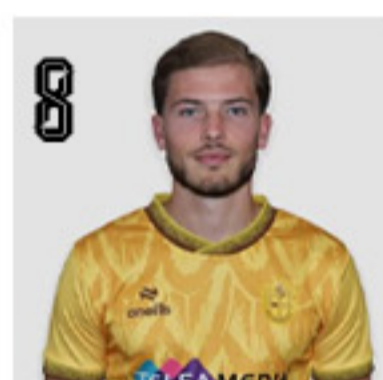
